Listed as among one of CAPONE's associates still active around Cicero was JOSEPH AIUPPA, alias JOE O'BRIEN, described as an old CAPONE beer runner who then ruled Cicero's rackets for the syndicate.

The DILLINGER Gang

- battle between FBI Agents and the members of the DILLINGER mob at little Bohemia, JOEY O'BRIEN came to Aurora, Illinois, with Doc BARKER, HOMER VAN-METER, JOHN DILLINGER and JOHN HAMILTON. HAMILTON had been shot in the liver where the bullet mushroomed and he died soon thereafter. Further, the above gangsters brought a long period of heat on the CAPONE gang in Chicago and therefore, they stayed out of Chicago at that time.

This article reflected that AIUPPA's big spot was the 4811 Club (Frolics Club), 4811 Cermak Road, with the others being used as "sneak" spots when the heat was on.

Turf Club

advised on March 12, 1958, that at that time the Turf Club, 4833 West Cermak Road, Cicero, was being run by JOEY O'BRIEN, which is an alias of JOSEPH AIUPPA, and BOBBY TAYLOR. At that time a handbook was in operation at the Turf Club patronized by appreximately 100 patrons each day. During the evening hours and on week ends, there were approximately five card games, two dice tables, and a roulette wheel in operation. This activity was carried on in a room between the Turf Club and the adjoining Towne Hotel. Investigation on July 11, 1961, determined that Taylor and Company and Hunt and Company are located on the second floor at 173 South Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

Aluppa owns an interest in a company which makes
gambling equipment.

An article appearing in the Chicago Daily Tribune, dated July 31, 1961, indicated that the United States Marshal's Office was searching for Aluppa in order to serve him with a subpoena from a United States Senate subcommittee. This article described Aluppa as one of the "foremost manufacturers of crooked gambling equipment sold to casinos across the country". Aluppa's firm is described as a main line of supply for gambling houses. The company has a stock of regular crap tables, roulette wheels and dice. It also does a brisk business in the sale of "gimmicked" gambling equipment. Crooked dice sell for \$2.60 a pair in lots of more than 300.

The article refers to a conspiracy trial in federal court at St. Paul, Minnesota, in March of 1961, at which time an affidavit by BENJAMIN GRIER, an AIUPPA handyman, was read into the record of the trial. GRIER is office manager of Taylor and Company and his affidavit described 318 pairs of "queer" dice that the company sold to one of the defendants for \$825. Although the invoices of sales show perfect dice, the specification chart shows that the manufacture of the dice was to concave and convex specifications.

The article states that authorities believe he may have been the victim of knockout drops as he became violently sick soon after leaving the Frolics and died within 36 hours. This article states that the Cicero and State Liquor License Records indicate that ORTENZI resides at 1733 23rd Avenue, Melrose Park, and that O'DONNELL resides at 6838 Know, Lincolnwood, Illinois. The majority stockholder is LOUIS RUSSO, 1703 Broadway, Melrose Park.

This article also goes on to advise that the hotel at the site of the Turf Lounge was once the headquarters of the CAPONE mob in Cicero, and that AIUPPA, reputedly the syndicate's gambling boss in Cicero, has been linked with labor racketeering and a multimillion dollar Cicero handbook operation that was running in 1947 at the site of the Turf Lounge.
