



associated with company. Reported to be an owner of the Towne Hotel, Cicero, and an officer on Rosmar Realty Company, Melrose Park, Illinois. Information concerning United States Savings Bonds owned and redeemed by subject set forth. No record found for deed transfer indicating sale of farm in Hanover Township, Illinois, which subject claimed to have sold in 1955. Information from 1958 through 1960 income tax returns set forth. SUBJECT REPORTEDLY A TRIGGER MAN FOR CHICAGO HOODLUMS AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

previous investigation revealed that subject claims birth on December 1, 1907, at Melrose Park, Illinois. A birth certificate was filed for the subject on February 16, 1943, stating that he was the first child of the marriage of SAM AIUPPA and ROSE GRECO who had been born in Italy. An affidavit supporting this birth was filed on February 16, 1943, by ANTHONY P. AIUPPA, who was a younger brother of the subject.

On October 3, 1961, Investigator, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Chicago, advised SA that one SIMONE AIUPPA who was born September 8, 1883, in Italy, was naturalized in the Circuit Court of Cook County on April 4, 1919, by Petition Number 26905. There was no record concerning ROSE AIUPPA who would have gained citizenship through SIMONE. There is an indication in this record that a son, JOSEPH AIUPPA, was born in Melrose Park, Illinois.

In August, 1961, adivsed that he had known JOSEPH AIUPPA for many years and that he believes that he used to travel frequently to Palm Springs, California and Las Vegas, Nevada. He believes that AIUPPA probably stayed at the Dunes Hotel while in Las Vegas.

II. PROCESS OUTSTANDING

On August 23, 1961, Deputy United States Marshal WALTER SHANAHAN advised that his office had a writ for the appearance of JOSEPH AIUPPA before the Senate Sub-committee which was investigating gambling. He said that his office had been unsuccessful in locating AIUPPA.

On August 24, 1961, Marshall SHANAHAN advised that process had been dismissed on Aluppa and that they were no longer interested in locating him.

He is the President of the Turf Lounge which is located in the Towne Hotel and can usually be found in an office located one door east of the Towne Hotel.

IV. LEGITIMATE ENTERPRISES

An article in the "Chicago American" on September 22, 1961, indicated that Grand Jury action was being taken against four female dancers and the manager of the Frolics who had been arrested in a raid on July 11, 1961. No action was being taken on eighteen others arrested at that time.

An article appeared in TONY WEITZEL's column in the 'Chicago Daily News' on September 29, 1961 which indicated that JOE AIUPPA could usually be found at the Towne Hotel in Cicero.

JOSEPH AIUPPA and SAM GIANCANA were alleged to have an interest in the Towne Hotel. A review of the records located in the County Recorder of Deeds, Chicago, Illinois, revealed that Document 17914449 pertained to a lien on the Towne Hotel property for \$395 filed on July 21, 1960, by the Allied Fire Equipment Company. This claim was paid and the lien released on October 18, 1960.

On September 22, 1961, Special Agent
Internal Revenue Service, Chicago, Illinois,
advised SA
Number 969 at the Central National Bank and Trust Company
relating to the Towne Hotel revealed that on October 28,
1960, the Rosmar Realty Corporation was deeded 50%
of the trust. The remaining 50% was deeded to the Rosmar
Corporation at a later date so that Rosmar presently
holds 100% interest in the trust.

On October 12, 1961, advised that the Rosmar Realty Corporation is in reality the Towne Hotel and is operated by JOE AIUPPA, ANTHONY ORTENZI, and ROBERT ANSANI who are listed as owners. He said that the Rosmar Realty Company was located at 10 North Broadway, Melrose Park, Illinois.


A review of the records located in the County Recorder of Deeds, Chicago, Illimis, on September 12, 1961, reveals the following documents pertaining to the above mentioned farm:

Document 15695683 is a deed dated July 31, 1953, conveying the property from ROBERT J. LUNDQUIST, Jr. and wife JO MARIE to JOSEPH AIUPPA and wife ANGELA. This document bears tax stamps valued at \$88.

Document 15695684 is an indefiture dated August 6, 1953, between JOSEPH and ANGELA AIUPPA and the Chicago Title and Trust Company in which the property is mortgaged to secure a \$25,000 installment note to DOMINIC LISUZZO or wife CATHERINE LISUZZO, 2115 Main Street, Melrose Park, Illinois. The document is notarized by WILBUR J. DRAKE on August 11, 1953 and calls for payments of \$3,000 on the 6th of February and August of each year

commencing February 6, 1954. The final payment was due February 6, 1958, and interest on the note was set at 42%.

Document 16329314 is a release from the Chicago Title and Trust Company to JOSEPH and ANGELA AIUPPA dated August 10, 1955 and pertains to the above indenture dated August 6, 1953. A copy of this document was to be mailed to EUGENE L. BERNSTEIN, 77 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois.



In connection with the above, the Chicago Sun-Times issue dated November 9, 1961 carried the following newspaper article concerning the Dream Lounge:

"PATRON CHARGES HE WAS BEATEN IN CICERO BAR

"An Oak Park man charged Wednesday that four of his teeth were knocked out and he was thrown unconscious into the street by bouncers in a Cicero strip-tease joint.

"Paul G. Smith, 24, of 826 Highland, Oak Park, said the beating occured after he and a companion, James L. Graves, 24, of 1232 Euclid, Berwyn, refused to pay for drinks solicited by B-girls Sunday night.

"Employes at the Dream Lounge, 1312 Cicero in Cicero, denied the charges and said that Smith was intoxicated and making lewd remarks.

"Charge Drunkenness

"'When the bartender told him to behave himself,
Smith hit him,' an employe said. 'He was drunk, so we threw
him out and had him arrested.'

"Smith and Graves admitted having a few drinks but insisted they were not drunk when they sat in the lounge watching a dancer behind the bar.

"Smith said when he and Graves refused to pay for drinks solicited by two B-girls, the bartender reached across the bar and struck him in the face, knocking out four teeth."

"Other men beat him with rubber hose before throwing him into the street, he said.

"Arrested By Police

"Graves said Smith lay unconscious on the street for about 30 minutes before police appeared and took him to the station.

"Smith said police jailed him on a disorderly conduct charge and refused demands by his companion that he begiven medical attention.

"He was released at 11:30 a.m. Monday on bond pending appearance before acting Police Magistrate Henry Klosak in Cicero Police Court Nov. 13.

"Sign Complaint

"Complaints against the bartender and bouncer, Mike Carter, of 3029 N. Nashville, charging them with aggravated assault, were signed by Smith and Graves.

"A hearing on these warrants is also set for Nov. 13 before Klosak.

"Smith's attorney, Irwin M. Berkley, said he would not risk trial of his client in Cicero and planned to file suits charging Cicero police with false imprisonment."

IV. UNION ACTIVITIES

ba, bab on August 30, 1961, advised that there has been no change in the leadership of Local 450. He said the local is being run outwardly by but he still believes it is controlled by JOEY AIUPPA.

V. PROCESS OUTSTANDING

On November 28, 1961, Deputy United States Marshal EUGENE L. BISSELL, advised that his office had a writ for the appearance of JOSEPH AIUPPA to appear before the Senate Sub-Committee at Washington, D.C. on January 9, 1962. He was to

be questioned by the Rackets Committee about vice, call girl operations and gambling. Deputy Marshal BISSELL stated as of November 28, 1961 he had been unsuccessful in locating AIUPPA to serve the writ. He stated he has left word at every known hangout of AIUPPA's which includes his residence and the Town Hotel in Cicero, Illinois. He stated he was informed by at the Town Hotel, that

had not seen Aluppa for the last two months and he did not know his current whereabouts:

In connection with the above, the Chicago Daily News issue dated December 6, 1961 carried the following item concerning Aluppa's appearance before the Senate Rackets Committee:

"JOEY AIUPPA, CICERO VICE BOSS, GIVES UP

"Joey Aiuppa, the syndicate's vice and gambling boss in Cicero, came out of hiding Wednesday and accepted a subpena to appear Jan. 9 in Washington before the Senate rackets committee.

"Aiuppa, who prefers to be known as Joey O'Brien, had been sought for months but managed to evade process servers. He was in hiding in Phoenix, Ariz., then in Wisconsin, but with Christmas approaching wanted to spend the holiday here with friends.

"But deputy U.S. marshals, armed with Senate subpenas, covered all of his usual hangouts, including the Town Hotel, Cicero.

"Aiuppa finally wearied of being unable to appear in public and arranged to accept the subpens at a downtown office building.

"He is one of four Chicagoans scheduled to be questioned by the rackets committee about vice; call girl operations, and gambling.

"PROCESS servers have not yet caught up with Frankie La Porte, the south suburban boss who was seen Sunday evening dining in a restaurant not far from his home in Flossmoor.
