STEFANOWICZ attacked WARD's prosecutor, JOHN STAMOS, for failure to bring in "even one disinterested witness out of the 150 witnesses who might have substantiated the state's evidence."

He referred to the audience at the performance and said that if even one of them had testified for the state, he would have found the dancers guilty.

"That would be a ridiculous situation," WARD commented.

"These people were patrons of an exhibition of obscenity and perversion. And we are to use such witnesses? When we bring in witnesses, we vouch for their credibility."

SWANSON said that discounting testimony of policemen on the ground that they are not disinterested would set up a situation in which "the only believable witness then would be one who was indifferent to morality or to the enforcement of the law."

He added, "It seems strange indeed that the testimony of persons who paid to watch what police found to be an illegal and indecent performance should be preferred to that of the officers themselves, whose only motive appeared to have been performing their duty."

SWANSON asserted that the patrons could hardly be described as "disinterested" because they had paid money to watch the performance. He also said that the defense failed to bring in a single one of the 150 patrons to refute the police accusations of lewdness.

Judge STEFANOWICZ replied last night that SWANSON had not been in court during the trial and suggested that SWANSON study the transcript of the case before commenting on it. He said the Supreme Court has ruled that when conflicting testimony creates a reasonable doubt the court has no choice but to find the defendants not guilty.

ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES

On June 6, 1962, the "Chicago Daily Tribune" contained an article captioned, "Bar Probing Freeing of 5 in Cicero Case, Asks Stefanowicz to Explain Ruling." This article which pertained to the arrest of five individuals in a vice raid at the Frolics Club, a strip tease establishment reportedly owned by AIUPPA read as follows:

"The Chicago Bar association has launched an investigation into Judge Sigmund Stefanowicz's acquittal of five persons arrested in a Cicero vice raid, it was disclosed yesterday.

"R. Newton Rooks, association president, said he "referred" the matter to the association's judiciary committee as a result of "newspaper clippings."

"The 45 member committee, headed by Thomas J. Johnson Jr., set up a nine member subcommittee Monday to conduct the inquiry, and a transcript of the trial was asked yesterday from Daniel Ward, state's attorney.

"Will Ask Judge to Appear

"Johnson said Stefanowicz and representatives of the state's attorney's office who conducted the raid and prosecuted the case would be "invited" to appear at subcommittee hearings to be held during the next few weeks.

"The acquittals by Stefanowicz in Criminal court have been assailed by Ward, Cicero ministers, and Virgil Peterson, operating director of the Chicago Crime Commission, among others.

"Those acquitted were four dancers and the manager of the Frolics, a strip tease establishment at 4813 Cermak Rd., Cicero, owned by Joseph Aiuppa, crime syndicate hoodlum.

May 'Clean Up Smoke'

"The women, acquitted May 4, are Virginia Cloe, 32; Wilma Ziegler, 27; Jean Fitzgerald, 26, and Debra Lane, 31. Witnesses testfied the women performed lewd acts and danced in the nude. The manager, Sam Rizzo, 49, had been freed earlier on a charge of keeping a house of ill repute and a place for the practice of lewdness.

"Johnson said the subcommittee, within a few weeks, will report to the full committee, which in turn will submit a report to the bar association's board of managers.

"The investigation could very well clear up the smoke and could provide complete clearance of the judge,' Johnson said.

"The board of managers, he said, simply could take no action or could vote condemnation of Stefanowicz.

"Johnson said he thought Rooks ordered the inquiry because of newspaper publicity and comment about the case; that it was ordered 'for protection of the good name of the bar.'

'Asked if he would appear before the subcommittee, Steranowicz said, 'I have no statement to make at this time.' Ward said he would appear, if asked.

"Ward has termed the decision a victory for the crime syndicate."

On June 15, 1962, the "Chicago American" contained an article relating to the Senate Committee investigations captioned, "Aiuppa Balks Strip Quiz, Blistered by McClellan." This article read in part as follows:

"WASHINGTON - An angered Sen. John L McClellan (D., Ark.) today stung Joseph (Joey) Aiuppa, crime syndicate clip joint boss in Cicero, with an attack that made the gangster writhe in the witness chair.

"If these charges are true, stormed McClellan, You are just a cheap racketeer, a parasite living off the flesh and blood of honest, decent people."

"Aiuppa took the 5th amendment to all questions at the Senate rackets subcommittee hearing into alleged crime syndicate domination of the American Guild of Variety Artists union of which strip tease dancers are members.

"McClellan asked the balding Aiuppa, a one-time prize fighter:

"'Let me ask you one more simple question, and I hope you can reply. Do you live off the wages of prostitution?'

"When the gangster replied that he felt 'my answer might tend to incriminate me, McClellan snapped:

" 'You ought to know.

"The committee was supplied with an affidavit in which Roswell T. Spencer, chief investigator of the Cook county state's attorney, described Aiuppa as a 'notorious hoodlum and gangster' who operated three clip joints in Cicero - the Frolics, Magic lounge, and Turf lounge.

"Worst Kind

"Spencer's affidavit described the resorts as the worst kind of strip joints, where lewd and obscene dancing, stripping to complete nudity, prostitution and every kind of immorality and public indecency have flourished without interference from Cicero authorities despite a constant barrage of criticism from pulpit, press, and public."

"'Establishments such as these are an integral and important part of the crime organization's establishment ... for pandering to the basest appetites and desires.'

"Spencer added that the 'real purpose of such joints is cheating, robbing and gouging' the patrons and 'taking their money away from them by any means necessary from jack-rolling to knockout drops.'

ACTIVITIES OF AIUPPA

advised that through conversations with individuals connected with the hoodlum element in the Chicago area, he has been led to believe that a JOKY AIUPPA is the individual who is in charge of gambling devices and juice operations in the Cicero, Illinois area.

On August 14, 1962, the "Chicago Sun-Times" contained an article captioned "3 Syndicate Dives Lose Licenses". This article reflected in part as follows:

"The Illinois Liquor Control Commission revoked the licenses Monday of three of the most notorious Accardo mob dives in the western suburbs.

"Also ordered closed were the Magic Lounge, at 4820 W. Cermak, and the Frolics Lounge, at 4813 W. Cermak, both in Cicero, on vice charges.

"The action resulted from repeated raids by state's attorney's police led by Roswell T. Spencer, chief investigator.

"Spencer and State's Atty. Daniel P. Ward could not be reached for comment, but Ward's first assistant, Edward J. Egan, said:

" 'That's the best news I've heard in months. Both Ward and Spencer will be very pleased, I'm sure.

"Ward's staff had fought the dives with raids and legal actions for months. They lost every legal decision - except the last one, before the state commission.

"The Magic and the Frolics, strip-tease joints, were operated openly for years by Joseph (Joey) Aiuppa, wealthy leader in the Accardo mob.

"Spencer described them in an affidavit read before a Senate committee hearing in Washington two months ago as providing nude and lewd floor shows of the worst type.

"The Casa Madrid was raided sporadically over a quarter century, particularly during election campaigns, but never was closed for more than a few days or weeks.

"In the case of the Magic Lounge, Cicero Justice of Peace Eugene White dismissed charges against the manager and employes arrested in a raid on June 11, 1961.

"Ward's staff then appealed the case to Criminal Court, where Judge Sigmund J. Stefanowicz threw out the charges. The rulings of both White and Stefanowicz were criticized."

"In attacking Stefanowicz, whose decision Ward called 'avvictory for the crime syndicate', Ward loosed his first blast against Criminal court judges since he defeated Benjamin's S. Adamowski, a bitter critic of the judiciary, in 1960. Ward campaigned on a criticism of Adamowski's 'unlawyerlike' abuse of the bench.

"Moses' report said of Ward: "The state's attorney was not justified in attacking the judge in the press, but he should have asserted them in one of the ways provided by law.'

"By 'them', Moses apparently referred to numerous criticisms of Stefanowicz's decision and other action made by Ward after the controversial ruling in early May.

"Moses also said Ward 'could have submitted his charges to the Bar association for investigation in an orderly and fair manner.'

"After Stefanowicz's decision in the Cicero case, ward was joined by Virgil Peterson, operating director of the Chicago Crime commission; Warren Swanson, former special vote fraud prosecutor and a leader in the Citizens of Greater Chicago, a civic organization; and clergymen and citizens in Cicero.

"All criticized Stefanowicz's freeing of a bartender and four 'exotic dancers'. They had been arrested in a bar at 4813 Cermak rd., Cicero, owned by Joseph Aiuppa, a top hoodlum in the west side hierarchy of the crime syndicate.
