Synopsise

AIUPPA continues to reside at 4 Yorkshire Woods; Elmhurst, Illinois. Auto registration of AIUPPA revoked for improper registration. AIUPPA at meeting in Town Hotel, Cicero, Illinois, on ROBERT TAYLOR (true attended by his associate name ANSANI), and Chicago hoodlumsSAM GIANCANA and GUS ALEX. Subject arrested 10/1/62 by Federal Game Agents, Fish and Wildlife Service, U. S. Department of Interior in violation of Migratory Bird Act. AUSA, Chicago, advised venue being changed to Wichita, Kansas. Subject and approximately 35 individuals arrested by Cook County States Attorney's Office in gambling raid at Town Hotel, Cicero, Illinois, on 11/1/62, and subject being charged with SUBJECT REPORTEDLY A TRIGGER MAN resisting arrest. FOR CHICAGO HOODLUMS AND SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

BACKGROUND

Investigation during this period reveals that AIUPPA continues to maintain his residence at 4 Yorkshire Woods, Elmhurst, Illinois, where he resides with his wife, ANGELA.

On October 4, 1962, the "Chicago Daily Tribune" contained the following article concerning the subject:

"Joseph (Joey O'Brien) Aiuppa, Chicago crime syndicate hoodlum, has been ordered to surrender the license plates of his 1961 Ford automobile, issued to him at 4827 Cermak rd., it was learned yesterday.

"Aiuppa's name is on the list of 11 hoodlums whom police accuse of using phony addresses in their applications for state auto licenses.

"Has Number 711-711."

"The license plates were brought to the attention of police Tuesday when federal agents arrested him at his home, 4 Yorkshire rd., Elm-hurst, in illegal possession of 476 doves shot on a week-end trip to Kansas with other Chicago syndicate hoodlums.

"The car in which he brought the doves back from Kansas also is being checked by officials of Secretary of State Charles F. Carpentier's office. It is a 1959 Cadillac with a dice shooter's dream number, 711-711, on its license plates.

"Officials in Springfield said that this license was issued to Angela Aiuppa, 1641 N. 17th st., Melrose Park.

"The notice to Aiuppa mailed to the Cermak road address, was sent special delivery and registered with a return receipt requested on Monday, and the secretary's office is waiting to see if it is returned by postal authorities. If so, the office will instruct agents to pick up the plates and also amest Aiuppa for investigation."

ACTIVITIES OF AIUPPA

subject attended a meeting at the Town Hotel in Cicero, Illinois. Also in attendance at this meeting were the subject's close associates ROBERT TAYLOR (true name ANSANI), and Chicago hoodlums SAM GIANCANA and GUS ALEX. was unable to determine the exact purpose of this meeting or the nature of the discussion between these

On October 1, 1962, Federal Game Agents, of the Fish and Wildlife Service, United States Department of Interior, Springfield, Illinois, advised that they had received information from one of their agents in Kansas that AIUPPA and his wife, ANGELA, had departed the Pittsburg, Kansas, area at approximately 9:00 AM on that date en route to Chicago in a 1959 tan Cadillac automobile, bearing 1962 Illinois license 711-711. They further advised that the Fish and Wildlife Service Agent in Kansas had developed information that AIUPPA had in his possession approximately 500 illegal doves in vioadvised lation of the Migratory Bird Act. that he had been instructed by their Agent in Kansas to attempt to intercept the subject on his arrival in the Chicago area and place him under arrest for violation of the Migratory Bird Act. On October 2, 1962, Federal Game Agent advised that he and his associate, had arrested the subject on the previous evening as he approached his residence, 4 Yorkshire Woods, Elmhurst, Illinois. He advised that the subject had in his possession at the time of arrest approximately 500 illegal doves.
