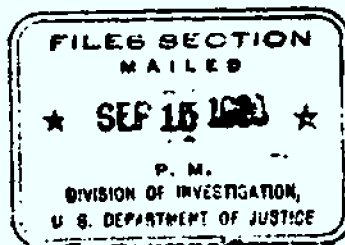
Dear Sir:

photograph of Rose and Pauline Ward, which are appropriately
labeled on the back as to each.

This photograph was secured by Special Agents Andersen
and Traylor from Nell Ward, sister of these women, who stated
that she secured it surreptitiously from her sister, Pauline.
She stated that it is her information this photograph was taken
within the past year and that it is a very good likeness of
both of the girls. She does not know from what source Pauline
received the photograph, but she is aware that it was received
within the past year, and it is evident that during that time
they have been with Charles Arthur Floyd, according to the
information previously furnished by Nell Ward.

It is suggested that this photograph be pieced together
and reproductions made in order that they may be furnished to the
interested offices. It is requested that the original be returned,
since Nell Ward desires to replace it in order that she will not
be suspected by her family. She has promised to secure whatever
information she can for the Agents, and it is believed desirable
that her family not suspect her.

Well Ward also advised that three or four days ago, while at her mother's residence in Kansas City, she was introduced to a man and woman whose names were given her as Flackie and Marie, from Oklahoma, and she understood that they came from the home town of Charles Arthur Floyd or its vicinity. It is evident that these parties are none other than W. A. (Flackie) Malley and his wife, Marie. This is thought to be of significance, since Mrs. Marie Malley is the sister of Adam Richetti, and her contacts with the known friends of Charles Arthur Floyd would indicate undoubtedly that Adam Richetti and Floyd are still connected and probably traveling together.

Well Ward stated that she has heard nothing further regarding her mother's receipt of correspondence from Floyd, or the daughters', but she has had other indications from her mother's conversation that she has been receiving her mail through Attorney Robert M. Coleman at Kansas City.

This office anticipates within the very near future, when the press of other business permits sufficient time, causing a very thorough and vigorous interview to be had with Coleman at the Kansas City Office. The Division will be later notified with reference to the outcome of this matter.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Mr. J. H. Forbes, Special Agent of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, stationed at Sumter, S. C., has a confidential informant at Greenville, S. C., who advises that Subjects have been passing through Greenville, South Carolina, quite frequently since December 1933, and she believes them to be engaged in major criminal activities such as kidnaping. Informant has seen them with machine guns and believes they were connected with Pretty Boy Floyd, the Bremer kidnaping, the Lindbergh kidnaping and the recent Brooklyn mail truck robbery. Subjects have discussed kidnaping Andrew Mellon for ransom. Informant has furnished very little information which can be checked. Numerous photographs of major criminals shown informant, and she identifies Charles Arthur (Pretty Boy) Floyd.

REFERENCE:

Report of Special Agent Duncan K. Brent, Jr., dated at Charlotte, North Carolina, April 9, 1934, entitled **CHARLES ARTHUR FLOYD**, with aliases, FUGITIVE, Miscellaneous. Division letter dated August 30, 1934.

DETAILS:

The reference report carried Kansas City as the office of origin in view of the probable identification of Charles Arthur (Pretty Boy) Floyd. However, until more definite information is received, Charlotte will be carried as the origin, and the title has been changed to reflect names as known, and as will be noted hereinafter.

This investigation was first called to the attention of the Division by Mr. A. Bruce Bielaski, Assistant to the General Manager, National Board of Fire Underwriters, New York City, New York, on March 28, 1934, when he turned over to the New York Division Office a copy of a letter which he had received from his Agent Mr. J. H. Forbes, stationed at Sumter, South Carolina, dated March 24, 1934. Mr. Forbes in his letter advised Mr. Bielaski that some years ago while investigating fires in the state of South Carolina, he had made a contact with an informant who had given him some very valuable information relative to these fires, and had recently passed on to him information relative to a band of suspicious characters who were passing through Greenville, South Carolina, on an average of every ten days or two weeks; that these suspicious parties were travelling in a bullet-proof automobile, changed license plates frequently, used disguises and were equipped with machine guns; that on or about February 10, 1934, the Police of Savannah, Georgia, had received a tip that Charles Arthur (Pretty Boy) Floyd was in that section, and on February 13, 1934, one of the suspicious characters passing through Greenville, South Carolina, and known to Mr. Forbes' informant as "Smittie", stopped at the informant's house with a sick man on the rear seat of an automobile, who although apparently suffering, refused to be taken to a hospital; that shortly thereafter "Smittie" advised the informant that the sick man was none other than "Pretty Boy".

Shortly after Mr. Bielaski turned this information over to the New York Office, Mr. W. Fred Newman, State Detective, attached to the Governor's office, Columbia, South Carolina, informed Mr. Coffey of the Division of the activities of these parties, Mr. Newman having received his information through Mr. Forbes.

On April 1, 1934, Special Agent Duncan K. Brent, Jr., interviewed Mr. Forbes at his home, 405 West Calhoun Street, Sumter, South Carolina, as will be noted in the reference report. However, due to the fact that all offices have not received copies of that report, the information will be repeated herein, and supplemented by that obtained by this Agent from Mr. Forbes and his confidential informant. It may be stated that Agent Brent's report practically records verbatim the information obtained from Mr. Forbes by the writer.

On June 22, 1934, Mr. Forbes appeared at the Charlotte Division Office at the request of the writer, related in detail the information which he obtained from his confidential informant, and was very reluctant to disclose her identity, although he agreed that on his next visit to Greenville, South Carolina, he would advise the writer, and would arrange for his informant to be interviewed there.

- At Greenville, South Carolina -

Pursuant to the telegraphic request of Mr. Forbes on June 26, 1934, the writer proceeded to Greenville, South Carolina, where Mr. Forbes again endeavored to emphasize the fact that he must not disclose the identity of his informant for her own personal safety. Although Mr. Forbes was assured that the information obtained from his informant would be treated strictly confidential, he insisted that it would be better for him to bring the informant to the side of the hotel in his car and permit the interview. Mr. Forbes was of the opinion that if the writer accompanied him to the informant's house, she probably would become afraid to cooperate and assist in determining the identities of the Subjects. Mr. Forbes perfected these arrangements, and brought the informant, a woman, whom he introduced as Mrs. Castle, and who will be referred to as such hereafter, to the side of the hotel, where she was interviewed in Mr. Forbes' car.

Mrs. Castle advised that during the years 1928 and 1929, she was a member of a theatrical chorus in New York City; the name of which she refused to disclose, stating that such was not necessary, and would be of no value, and that while following this employment she became acquainted with one Bert Kelley, who while not connected with the theatrical chorus, did work indirectly for it in the capacity of a financial solicitor; in other words, that Kelley would contact people with money for the purpose of having them back the theatrical show, he thereby obtaining a commission out of whatever money he induced them to put up. Mrs. Castle refused to disclose where she resided in New York City, although she states that she on occasions visited Leon Langford, whose address she does not remember, and who died three or four years ago. Kelley was also acquainted with Langford. According to Mrs. Castle, she returned to her home in Greenville, South Carolina, in the latter part of 1930 to nurse her mother who is a paralytic invalid, and now confined to her bed; that in December 1932 while at the Textile Hall in Greenville, South Carolina, she happened to encounter Bert Kelley, who at that time informed her that he had changed his name to Bert BruLa (Broolay). Mrs. Castle stated that Kelley did not use this name in New York, and she believes his correct name to be Albert Kelley, although everyone called him Bert Kelley; that while at the Textile Hall she asked him what he was doing down in this section, and he informed her that after leaving New York he had gone to Chicago and affiliated with Al Capone's gang; that he was at that time enroute to Atlanta, Georgia, where he was going to try to effect the release of Al Capone through some sort of habeas corpus proceedings, after which he was going to Florida. Mrs. Castle states that the meeting with Kelley at the Textile Hall did not last more than a few minutes, and several weeks later she received a postcard from Kelley signed Bert BruLa, from Miami, Florida. She believes that Kelley was either stopping at the "Biscay", or some similar name, hotel in Miami at that time, or else it was a picture of this hotel that was on the front of the postcard.

It was learned from Mrs. Castle that on or about December 4, 1933, Bert Kelley came by her house, accompanied by two men, driving a Chrysler sedan, and asked her to accompany them to Charleston, South Carolina. Mrs. Castle stated that she got in the car with them and noticed in the back end of it a child's coffin. Up to this point Mrs. Castle had been of the opinion that these persons were probably running liquor from Greenville, South Carolina, but realizing that such a small coffin would hold only a small quantity of liquor, came to the conclusion that they were probably handling dope; that she asked them whether or not it contained drugs, but received no answer, and for this reason she refused to accompany Kelley to Charleston. On a later occasion she asked him what it contained, and he informed her jokingly that "It might have been a couple of grand". The Chrysler sedan they were driving, according to them, was bullet-proof, and had a specially constructed back seat, which opened like the lid of a trunk.

On or about December 13, 1933, Kelley again appeared at Mrs. Castle's house in Greenville wearing a false mustache, appeared to be highly nervous and was perspiring so freely that his mustache would not stay in place. On this occasion Mrs. Castle accompanied him across the river from Greenville on the edge of town where they obtained curb service at a barbecue stand. Mrs. Castle noticed his nervousness, asked him about it, and jokingly asked him if he participated in the Charlotte mail robbery, which mail robbery occurred November 16, 1933. Kelley promptly informed her that he was not in on the mail robbery, and that he could prove that he was standing on the jail house steps in Charlotte when it occurred. Referring to this robbery Kelley stated that the Touhy gang came to Charlotte to "snatch a guy", but had joined in with another gang there who had been planning the mail robbery, and pulled that job; that the two gangs got crossed up while in Charlotte, and that rival gangs would not stand for other gangs joining in on their business. Mrs. Castle could not explain what Kelley meant by this last remark. At this time Kelley asked Mrs. Castle if she remembered "Smittie", who was a friend of Bert Kelley's younger brother, and who lived in New York City while she was there. She informed Kelley that she did, and he stated that "Smittie" had been in Chicago, and was now an expert with a machine gun; that he had been practicing upstairs over a garage located in Chicago, and could write his initials on the wall with a machine gun.

On or about January 5, 1934, Kelley again appeared at Mrs. Castle's home accompanied by "Smittie", and on this occasion Kelley had Mrs. Castle write two letters to Lew Schwartz, General Delivery, Decatur, Illinois, and Joliet, Illinois, containing the same message, namely, "Please return my tailor made suit and other belongings". Kelley explained to Mrs. Castle that the tailor

made suit was his machine gun which had cost him \$97.00, and which he had loaned to Schwartz.

On Saturday, January 13, 1934, just before the Bremer kidnaping occurred, Bert Kelley again appeared at Mrs. Castle's home driving his Chrysler sedan, and accompanied by an individual whom he introduced as Abram Levy. On this occasion Kelley and Levy took Mrs. Castle for a short ride in the car, and she noted that they changed the New York license plates and replaced them with New Jersey license plates. While they were riding around Kelley asked Levy who was in the rear if everything was loaded, and he replied that it was and two extra chambers. Mrs. Castle saw a gun in the car which she described as a gun with a large "belly", and later as a machine gun, after much prompting by Mr. Forbes. Kelley stated that they were leaving Greenville immediately, and going on a dangerous mission. Mrs. Castle asked to accompany them, and they informed her that they would take her to skin a calf some time, and if she did not tear the hide, the next time they would take her to skin a bull. They also stated that they wanted to travel during the weekend when traffic was heavy. Kelley produced a small bottle of dye, and Mrs. Castle darkened his eyebrows. Abram Levy had let his hair grow down about two inches over his ears, needed a shave and while riding around wadded up a good hat so as to make it look like an old one.

Bert Kelley and Abram Levy did not return to Greenville, South Carolina, again until about March 13, 1934. However, on January 28, 1934, "Smittie" came by driving a Buick automobile, and was accompanied by a small man who will be referred to as Nick Number One. "Smittie" stated that he was desirous of getting in touch with Kelley, and thought that he might obtain his address from Mrs. Castle; that Kelley had asked him to locate someone, and that he had done this, and was now attempting to get in touch with Kelley. While talking to Mrs. Castle and taking her address, "Smittie" dropped and left behind him a Chicago streetcar transfer dated January 22, 1934. "Smittie" then left Mrs. Castle and returned on February 13, 1934, about 9:00 P. M., driving an automobile, on the rear seat of which was an individual who appeared to be sick. "Smittie" informed Mrs. Castle that both he and this man had eaten some oysters a few hours before, and they had made his friend sick. Mrs. Castle offered to accompany "Smittie" and his friend to a hospital, but the offer was refused. "Smittie" asked her for medicine, and she gave him a morphine tablet, which the doctor had prescribed for her mother, and this was given to the friend on the rear seat, who was covered up by a lap-robe. Mrs. Castle advised that this friend appeared to be a medium-sized man with a large square face and square jaws. Although she states that she

did not get a good look at him she has picked out the photograph of Charles Arthur (Pretty Boy) Floyd from about two dozen others and identified it as being this individual. On March 3, 1934, "Smittie" came by alone and informed Mrs. Castle that he was still looking for Bert Kelley, and he was going to Knoxville and probably Nashville, Tennessee, if he did not get in touch with him soon; that he had tried to locate Kelley at La Fayette, Indiana, South Bend, Indiana, and La Salle, Illinois. At this time Mrs. Castle asked "Smittie" how his sick friend was getting along, and he stated that he was all right, and asked her if she recognized him. When she replied in the negative he said, "Well, that was Pretty Boy." Mrs. Castle was questioned closely at this point, and she states that he did not mention the name Floyd, but she took it for granted that he was referring to Pretty Boy Floyd. At this point Mr. Forbes stated that he was positive that it had been Pretty Boy Floyd, in view of the fact that the Police Department at Savannah, Georgia, had only a few days prior to that time received a tip that Floyd was in this vicinity, and had requested the Columbia, South Carolina, Police Department to post a lookout for him.

On or about March 13, 1934, Bert Kelley and Abram Levy came by the informant's house, this being the first time since they had left on their dangerous mission, driving Kelley's Chrysler six sedan, which was carrying Indiana license plates, and they stated that they had just come through from Fort Wayne, Indiana. On this occasion Abram Levy was dressed in a woman's sport coat, was wearing a woman's beret, had a large doll which had been dressed up to give the appearance of a child about two years of age, and he advised Mrs. Castle that he would hold the doll in his arms while driving through cities to give the appearance of a baby. He complained that the hat which he was wearing was too tight, and requested Mrs. Castle to lend him one of hers which she did. Mrs. Castle saw one pistol, and what appeared to be a machine gun on the back seat of Kelley's car. She asked Kelley the results of the dangerous mission, and he informed her that they had done pretty well, giving Mrs. Castle at this time \$5.00, and instructing her to buy some flowers for her mother. The serial number of the five dollar bill has been checked against the ransom bills in the Lindbergh and Bremer kidnaping cases with negative results. On this visit of Bert Kelley, Mrs. Castle informed him about "Smittie" telling her of the identity of the sick man, Pretty Boy, whereupon Kelley stated that if "Smittie" "didn't pipe down" he would be a "pale boy".

On March 27, 1934, "Smittie" alone called on the informant, and after some conversation asked her if she knew anyone presently living in Hollywood,

California. Informant replied that she believed she did, whereupon "Smittie" stated that a moving picture company of Hollywood, California, was making a picture, the scene of which was to be made in the Cookson Hills, and implying that the picture was to be a gangster film; that it was desired that some pictures of Pretty Boy Floyd be obtained. From "Smittie's" statements informant inferred that Pretty Boy was to be hired by this moving picture company as an extra, although his identity was not known, and that thereafter as a publicity stunt his true identity would be revealed. "Smittie" stated that negotiations had been undertaken between this company and Pretty Boy's family, and that if Pretty Boy was offered some sort of security he would undertake to go to Hollywood to be photographed in this picture. He was offered a salary of fifteen thousand dollars.

On April 23, 1934, Bert Kelley and Abram Levy again appeared at informant's home and stated that "Smittie" had gone to Oklahoma on a vacation; however, that they had just received word from Indianapolis that he had been shot. Kelley and Levy then took the informant in their automobile and drove out on the main highway toward Asheville, North Carolina, and instructed her that in the event she saw a Buick car approaching them at a fast rate she should jump out of their car and walk back to town. When the informant was asked why she was given these instructions, she stated that she did not know unless they were expecting to meet "Smittie" on the road, and they thought probably the law might be following him, because they had not proceeded far when they met "Smittie" and a man whom they called Nick, and who will be referred to hereinafter as Nick Number Two, driving a Buick car carrying Indiana license plates; that Nick Number Two was driving this car, and Bert Kelley stopped him, and they pulled in a side road, where "Smittie" started to explain to Bert Kelley how he had gotten shot in the leg; that Kelley was very sore at "Smittie", told him to shut his mouth, and threatened to strike him; that "Smittie's" leg was wrapped up with gauze, and appeared to have been treated by a doctor; that they had a pair of surgical scissors with them, which she now has in her home; that Kelley took "Smittie" in his car and informed her that he was going to take him to their layout near Savannah. He did not furnish informant much information concerning the layout, but stated that they would have a pretty good hide-out there if it were not for a beacon light or some kind of light nearby and the C.C.C. boys. From what Kelley stated, the informant believes that there is a C.C.C. Camp located near their hide-out. From all the information that the informant had been able to gather concerning "Smittie's" getting shot it seems that "Smittie" joined up with some other fellows in Oklahoma, and they were planning to rob a bank which was being covered by the law, and that the law had already received a tip that it was to be robbed.

On May 5, 1934, Bert Kelley again came by the informant's house, told her that he was going north, and asked her to go with him. The informant told Kelley that she did not want to leave her mother in the condition that she was in, and furthermore that she would not travel around with anyone without knowing what their racket was; that she explained to Bert Kelley that he would have to give her some information as to what he was doing, as they might be picked up, and if she was left in the dark she would not know what to tell the law; that Kelley then informed her that he was going north to investigate Andrew Mellon, and expected to be gone two or three months. Kelley then exhibited to informant an issue of the Sunday News of New York City, dated April 29, 1934, wherein there appeared on pages 6 and 7 the life history of Andrew Mellon with one or two of his photographs. He led informant to understand that they were planning to kidnap Mellon. At this time Kelley advised the informant that letters would reach him at 19 State Street, Brooklyn, New York. The informant does not recall the first two numbers, stating that she did not write them down at the time, as she thought she would be able to remember them; that she believes that this will be near a wharf in Brooklyn, New York, as Bert Kelley on several occasions has remarked about being a wharf rat. During this contact with Kelley she again brought up the dangerous mission and asked him if it did not relate to the Bremer kidnaping. Kelley in a joking way intimated that this might have been the mission; however, that he was not in on the actual kidnaping. He did state that he had planned the thing, and is what is known in the underworld as an advance man; in other words, he plans the jobs and then sells his plans to the ones who actually carry them out; that in the Bremer case he had discussed his plans with some other gangster who was going to buy them, and this gangster had told him that he could have a young college boy pull the actual kidnaping for a percentage of the ransom, and that after the job was pulled the college boy could be double-crossed and not given any money. Kelley then advised the informant that he would not have anything to do with this, as he did not believe in double-crossing anyone, as this would be a good way to make them squeal.

On May 18, 1934, Bert Kelley again appeared at the informant's home in Greenville, South Carolina, stating that he had just come from New York City, and had left Abram Levy up there, as they had postponed the kidnaping of Andrew Mellon since the Government was going to take another stab at him on his income tax; that they would wait a while until the Government had finished its investigation, and then "everything was going to be cream". Kelley advised the informant that he was going to Savannah, Georgia, to get

"Smittie", who had gotten all right, and from there he was going to Havana, Cuba, to get living quarters. Informant believes that Kelley is going to Havana, Cuba, and establish a hide-out where Andrew Mellon can be held after he is kidnapped.

On June 21, 1934, Abram Levy and Nick Number Two came by informant's home in Greenville, South Carolina, ostensibly looking for Bert Kelley. They advised informant that they were expecting a telegram or mail from Kelley at Havana, Cuba, and requested her to call at the Western Union office and the Post Office in Greenville, South Carolina, to ascertain whether there was a message or mail there for Abram Levy. Abram Levy then gave informant an envelope postmarked June 4, 1934, Detroit, Michigan, addressed to Abram Levy, General Delivery, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in order that the informant could identify herself at the Western Union office and obtain any message there. The informant stated that she proceeded to the Western Union office and the Post Office, where there was no message or mail for Abram Levy; that these parties did not accompany her to these places, but remained about a block or a block and a half behind her, and followed her until she had gotten at least two blocks away before they contacted her. They stated that they wanted to get back as soon as possible, not stating any place in particular, but getting no word from Bert Kelley they would have to go on to Miami, Florida. The informant then asked them more about "Smittie's" getting shot, and they informed her that "Smittie" had gone to Oklahoma on a vacation to join Pretty Boy or the "Kid", and that they had decided to pull one more hold-up before going into the moving pictures, but that the law must have known that they were coming, and were waiting for them, as the result was that "Smittie" got shot. On this occasion informant states that Abram Levy and Nick Number Two were driving a new Buick sedan bearing Georgia license plates.

Informant was unable to furnish any additional information concerning these Subjects, and stated that she had not been able to obtain the numbers of their license plates; that she would not furnish the Police of Greenville, South Carolina, any information, and desired that they not be contacted, as she did not have any confidence in them; that if she received any additional information she would immediately contact Mr. Forbes, who could advise this Agent in Charlotte. It was impressed upon the informant that it was necessary for her to obtain the license numbers of the cars which these Subjects were driving in the event they return to her home, which she stated she would try to do, although she stated that she was afraid to observe them too closely as the Subjects might become suspicious; that these Subjects have always treated her as a lady, have never made any remarks of an immoral nature or used any profanity in her presence; that she has not observed them when she thought they were drinking, and she is unable to figure out what their activity is unless it is kidnaping.

b7D In order to ascertain the identity of the informant, Special Agent W. D. Dickerson on July 4, 1934, contacted Mr. Frank Farmer, Assistant Manager, Western Union Telegraph Company, Greenville, South Carolina, for information as to whether anyone had called for telegrams addressed to Abram Levy on or about June 21, 1934. Miss Ina Elmore, Cashier, Western Union Telegraph Company, recalled that a woman had called for such a telegram. Miss Elmore could not remember the woman other than that she was believed to have been a blonde about twenty-five years of age. Mr. Farmer succeeded in locating a notice of address slip filled out in Miss Elmore's handwriting, dated June 20, 1934, bearing the following notation, "Abram Levy, § [REDACTED] (given for one day only)".

Mr. Farmer stated that he could positively and correctly state that there had been no Western Union messages received for Levy from Havana, Cuba, as he has copies of all cablegrams on file in his office, and that such a message from Havana would be a cablegram. In view of this information it appears that the true identity of the informant, Mrs. Castle, is [REDACTED]. This address is [REDACTED] of Greenville. From Agent's observation of Mrs. Castle, her description is as follows:

b7D [REDACTED]

On August 11, 1934, Agent again proceeded to Greenville, South Carolina, at Mr. Forbes' request, and there interviewed Mrs. Castle, who stated that on July 27, 1934, Nick Number Two and another person whom she had not seen before, came to her home and stated that they were just passing through, and had had car trouble in Spartanburg, South Carolina, the gas line having become stopped up. Nick Number Two did not say who else was with them, but stated that the rest of the gang were out in the woods near Spartanburg repairing the gas line, and that he, Nick Number Two, had driven over to Greenville to get some more of that medicine which she had given to Pretty Boy when he was sick, after allegedly eating some oysters. Informant stated that she did not have any of this medicine at the house, and Nick Number Two gave her a five dollar bill, serial number E-10,206,440-A, series of 1928 B; that she took her mother's prescription to the doctor, had it filled, and gave the morphine tablets to Nick Number Two. Informant stated that she did not know why

these Subjects wanted the morphine unless one of them had been shot, because none of them appears to be addicted to drugs. When asked if she had obtained the license numbers, she stated that it was dark when they came to her house and left, and she did not get an opportunity to observe them. At this interview with Mrs. Castle and Mr. Forbes they were both of the opinion that these Subjects were the ones who kidnapped the Lindbergh baby. However, they have no information on which to base their belief, and it is merely their suspicion. It should also be stated that the informant is very hazy on all of the foregoing information, and had to be prompted on numerous occasions by Mr. Forbes to refresh her memory. It seems that Mr. Forbes is better acquainted with the facts than the informant, although his information came from her. In an effort to determine the identities of these Subjects, the following photographs have been exhibited to Mrs. Castle:

Informant states that none of the above photographs appears to be a likeness of one of the Subjects of this investigation with the exception of Charles Arthur (Pretty Boy) Floyd's photograph, which appears to be similar to Subject Pretty Boy who was brought to her home on February 13, 1934.

On August 27, 1934, the writer received a telegram from Mr. Forbes from Hendersonville, North Carolina, stating that he was at that place on his vacation, and had just received information which convinced him that the Subjects in this investigation had participated in the Brooklyn armored truck robbery. Mr. Forbes was immediately contacted by telephone, and he advised that Nick Number Two came through Greenville and stopped at the informant's house two days following the robbery of the mail truck at Brooklyn, New York, at which time \$427,000.00 was reported to have been stolen; that Nick Number Two appeared to be very tired, and to have just completed a long drive; that he had with him another individual whom the informant had never seen before, and who resembled a doctor; that informant states that from his appearance she believes that he was a doctor, and is being taken around with this gang to administer first aid to them in the event they get shot while pulling some of these jobs. Nick Number Two wanted to sleep at informant's home for a few hours. However, she informed him that she did not have room for him, but would take him to the hotel. He stated that he did not want to go to the hotel, but would go out in the woods and sleep in his car, which he did, remaining in Greenville about three hours. It will be noted that there is nothing in this to indicate that these Subjects were connected with the Brooklyn mail truck robbery, and Mr. Forbes was unable to furnish any additional information that would connect them. In view

of this and the large amount of work at the Charlotte Office needing attention, it was not felt that a trip to Greenville, South Carolina, to contact the informant or a trip to Hendersonville, North Carolina, would be warranted.

Reference is made to Division letter of September 1, 1934, under caption of the case entitled ALVIN KARPIS, with aliases, I.O. #1218, ET AL; EDWARD GEORGE BREMER - Victim; KIDNAPING, relative to the recovery of Thompson Sub-Machine Gun #7267 by the Chicago Office, which firearm it appears has been identified as one of the weapons used in the instant Massacre and in the killing of John Lazia, which occurred at Kansas City on July 10, 1934.

This office has during the time that the State of Nebraska was under Kansas City jurisdiction, secured the shell cases and bullets found after the robbery of the First National Bank at Fairbury, Nebraska, and they were compared by Merle A. Gill, local ballistist, with the evidence exhibits in the instant case. Mr. Gill failed to make any identification. These specimens were returned by registered mail to the State Sheriff at Lincoln, Nebraska, where they should now be secured by the Omaha Office and transmitted to the Division for further analysis.

In this connection, reference is made to page 15, paragraph 2, of the report of Special Agent W. F. Trainor, dated at Kansas City, Missouri, February 20, 1934, in the case entitled

It is suggested that the Division cause a comparison to be made between the latent impression and the fingerprints of the individuals here mentioned.


AT MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

In this connection, reference is made to report of the writer under date of August 21, 1934, at Jacksonville, Florida, covering an investigation to attempt to identify the individual known as "Curley" as requested in the undeveloped lead in the report of Special Agent R. C. Suran, dated at Chicago, August 9, 1934. Photographs of one Henry Beckman, who was the chauffeur of Ed O'Hara and was known as "Curly" were furnished the Chicago Division Office, together with a photograph of one Frank Curly, Sheriff's Office, Miami, Number 14983. In this connection, Division letter dated August 21, 1934, makes reference to the above Frank Curly, including description and furnishing photograph of Mike Curley, stating that it is the photograph of the Curley referred to in the report of Special Agent J. L. McCaffrey, dated at Jacksonville, April 5, 1932. Frank Curley and Mike Curley bear different Miami Sheriff's Office identification numbers and the photographs do not appear to be of the same person.

Captain Frank Mitchell of the Miami Police Department was again interviewed and advised that at the time Lee Turner and Henry Beckman were arrested that he did not hear anyone by the name of "Big Homer" mentioned and that he has never heard of that individual. There is no information in the files of the Miami Police Department concerning "Big Homer".

Captain Mitchell advised that he knew of Seig Sommer, but that at the present time he is in Cicero, Illinois, around the dog tracks with Ed O'Hara and his crowd. There is no identification data concerning Seig Sommer at the Miami Police Department or the Miami Beach Police Department Identification Bureau.

No undeveloped lead is being set out for the New York Division Office to interview Mike Curley at Mineola, Long Island, it being left to the discretion of the office of origin as to the advisability of this. It is believed that Henry Beckman, who can be located at Cicero, Illinois, through Ed O'Hara will prove to be the "Curly" mentioned by Madeline Dorsey as the man she knew at the Miami Beach and Kennel Club.




<p>DETAILS:</p> <p>Mrs. B. A. Stevens, R.F.D. #4, Talbotton, Ga., admitted to agent that she is the daughter of Mrs. C. M. Floyd of Sallisaw, Oklahoma, and the aunt of "Pretty Boy" Floyd. She stated that Floyd was born in North Georgia, in Bartow County, and that when he was four or five years old the family moved to Oklahoma. She has not seen him since that time and does not believe that he has ever returned to the state. He has an uncle, B. R. Floyd, who resides between Woodbury and Raleigh, Ga., but she is certain that he has not seen or communicated with Floyd. Mrs. Stevens advised that last year she visited her mother, who is "Pretty Boy" Floyd's grandmother, and that the family does not know where he is. She said that at one time she read in the paper that he was dead, and another account said he was wounded. She claims that she does not discuss the subject in her letters to her mother, as Mrs. Floyd is very much grieved over her grandson's criminal activities. Mrs. Stevens said that while she realized that "Pretty Boy" was a criminal, she did not think that he was as notorious as reported in the papers. She remarked that he was not implicated in the Kansas City murder, but when pressed for her reason for this statement she became evasive and said that she just knew he wasn't. It is apparent that Mrs. Stevens has dismissed the matter.</p>

with her relatives, but agent was unable to gather anything from her demeanor or conversation that would justify the conclusion that she has been in communication with Floyd.

Mr. Stevens was very frank in his conversation, stating that he realized Floyd is a dangerous criminal and expressing the hope that he would be wounded to such an extent that he would have to give up his criminal life. It is significant, however, that neither Stevens nor his wife expressed a wish that Floyd be apprehended. Mr. Stevens admitted that he had tried to keep his relation to Floyd a secret, as he said anything but word of the connection and that very few people in the county knew of it.

It was ascertained from Mr. Stevens that the other members of the family consist of his daughter and his sons, O. A. and C. M. Stevens, who live with him.

Mr. W. A. Perryman, rural mail carrier, stated that the Stevens family has resided in the community for at least twenty years and that they are highly respected and law abiding citizens. He stated that while he is living well he has noticed no strangers at the house and that he does not remember any letters addressed to anyone except members of the family.

Mr. Stevens' home is located off the main highway in a rather inaccessible spot. It would be possible for a fugitive to secrete himself there with a minimum chance of detection, as there are no other homes close by and the intervening hills obstruct the view from the main highway except at one point. However, Mr. Perryman feels that he would know if someone were in hiding there.

The above description checks fairly well with a criminal by the name of Lewis Austin, with aliases. It has been determined that Lewis Austin has a long criminal record, and that he has recently been arrested by the Police Department at Columbus, Georgia. Criminal record of Lewis Austin, Division #10860, as supplied to the Police Department at Columbus, Georgia, by Division letter dated April 5, 1934, indicates that Austin was arrested April 1, 1934, on a charge of burglary and entering and possession of burglar tools, at which time he was assigned Columbus Police Department fingerprint #8408.

It is requested that an investigation be conducted at Columbus, Georgia, to secure the disposition of the indicated arrest and to determine, if possible, the present whereabouts of Austin. It is also requested that a recent photograph of Austin be secured for identification purposes.

Agent learned that Patrolman Carpenter is now deceased, and Officer Price of the Portland Police Department is on a vacation and will not return until about the middle of September, 1934.

Agent contacted Lieutenant Patrick Moloney, now chief of the Vice Squad and a Detective Sergeant of the Portland Police Department in 1911. Lieut. Moloney distinctly recalls J. J. Miller, with aliases, and M. J. Florence. Lieut. Moloney stated to agent that he knew of no other associates of Miller or Florence who were in Portland, Oregon at that time, or have since operated in Portland. Lieut. Moloney stated that he has seen J. J. Miller, whose photograph he readily identified, on one occasion since 1911, that being on or about the fall of 1925 when Miller was passing through Portland on a train southbound, at which time Lieut. Moloney saw Miller at the railroad station in Portland.











A careful investigation at the Eaton Hotel, Portland, failed to reveal any information of value.

A search of the Portland Police Department criminal records revealed photograph and fingerprints of M. J. Florence, associate of Miller. Photograph of Florence and photographic copy of his fingerprints are herewith submitted to the Division.

Special Agent T. M. Birch of this office informed me today that he learned from William Woods, Burns operative at Tulsa, Oklahoma, that Woods had received a report from the Kansas City office of his organization in which it was stated that Beulah Baird and Subject Floyd are living together at Alton, Illinois with a Mrs. Mary Cleard, but no information was at hand as to how long they have lived there, or where, or under what circumstances.

This report contained information to the effect that one Bill Bellinger, who operates a barber shop at 36th & Indiana Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, made the statement to a Burns operative that he shaved Floyd about three months ago, and stated that if any further information concerning Floyd were obtained, he would turn it over to the Burns people in Kansas City. It appears that R. J. Eckert is the operative at Kansas City who rendered the report in question. This is in confirmation of my telephonic conversation with you of today.

Copies of this letter are being transmitted to the St. Louis office with the request that no investigation be conducted at Alton until the receipt of information from the Kansas City office concerning its contact with the Burns people there.

Since the dictation of the foregoing, you have advised by long distance telephone that your contact with the Burns Agency in Kansas City discloses you are already in possession of the information, which was to the effect that "old lady" Baird is in West Alton, Missouri. It will therefore be unnecessary for the St. Louis office to conduct any investigation at Alton, Illinois.

Referring to my communication dated August 30, 1934, which concerns the detainer lodged against Vivian Mathias at the United States Detention Farm at Milan, Michigan, please be advised that I had a long talk with the Mathias woman yesterday.

She stated that she was considerably perturbed over the fact that she will not be released on the eighteenth of September, adding that she was unable to understand why the charges had been filed against her at Kansas City. I went into the matter very carefully with her, explaining that the evidence which had been discovered clearly involved her in the conspiracy with Miller and others in connection with the Kansas City Massacre. I emphasized the fact that from all indications the case against her was iron clad. She continued to state, however, that she knew nothing about the affair and that she had nothing to say concerning it.

It was very evident during the course of my talk with her that she is greatly disturbed about the detainer which has been filed, as she had been planning considerably on being released on the eighteenth instant. I informed her that undoubtedly she could do herself much good if she would be willing to cooperate with this Division in furnishing information which we desired. She refused, however, to discuss the slightest angle of the crime at Kansas City, although she did not present a hostile attitude.

Mr. Ryan, the superintendent of the institution, furnished a letter which Vivian Mathias had written to Mr. B. Feldman, Attorney, 10 North Clark Street, Chicago, Illinois, which reads as follows:

"Dear Benny:

Just a line to ask you to do me a favor. Mr. Ryan, the warden here, informed me that there was a Government hold came in for me yesterday. My time is up the eighteenth of September. Then I will be taken to Kansas City, Missouri. I wish you would find out what it is all about and let me know at once as I am worried about it. When Bobby comes home from

This letter, the warden informs me, was written immediately after he had notified her about the detainer. The letter, upon our suggestion, however, has been held up in the superintendent's office, it being deemed advisable to do so until my interview with the Mathias woman. I suggested to the superintendent, upon my departure from the institution yesterday, that the letter be mailed at once to the attorney at Chicago, and Mr. Feldman will undoubtedly receive same this afternoon or tomorrow.

It has occurred to me that, in view of the refusal of Vivian Mathias to make a statement about the affair at Kansas City, that it would be desirable for an Agent to contact Attorney Feldman at Chicago, informing him of the seriousness of the offense with which the Mathias woman is charged and emphasizing the fact that, from all indications, she will receive a good, long sentence unless she indicates willingness to cooperate with the Division.

It is noted that Attorney Feldman represented the Mathias woman when she was prosecuted for harboring Verne Miller at Chicago last November and undoubtedly his influence prompted her to a great extent in entering a plea of guilty to that offense. It is believed, therefore, if he is approached in a diplomatic manner and can be made to believe that Vivian Mathias would benefit greatly by furnishing this Division the desired information, that he might possibly take it upon himself to proceed to Milan for the purpose of advising her to talk. It is felt that he might have sufficient control over her as an attorney to persuade her to tell the story about the massacre.

The above information was telephoned to Mr. Cowley at Chicago last evening.

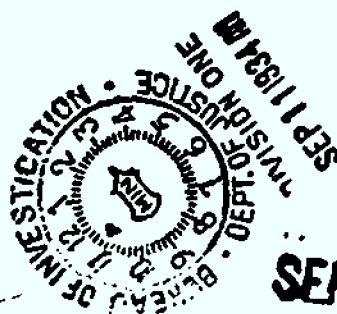

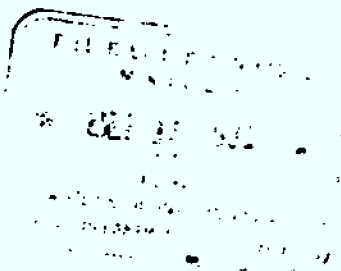

There is being transmitted, herewith, in triplicate copy of memorandum submitted by Special Agent R. E. Lawrance at Ft. Smith, Arkansas, dated September 6, 1934, regarding two photographs of Charles Arthur Floyd, one a group photograph of Charles Arthur Floyd, his wife and child and the other a studio photograph of the child.

In connection with these photographs, I am of the general impression that they were probably taken during the winter of 1931 and 1932 and will have little value from the investigative standpoint even though the building where the photograph was taken may be located.

There are also being transmitted, herewith, three negatives, one being a large and one being a small picture of the group, the other being of the child. It is suggested that an appropriate number of the photographs in question be made and be distributed to interested Field Offices. The photograph of Floyd, apparently, is a good one.

In connection with the above, Agent Lawrance has advised me that Constable Jack Pace of Ft. Smith, Arkansas, expressed the desire to have ten or twelve copies of each of the photographs. Agent Lawrance assured him that he could furnish him at least one of each but the Constable stated that if he could not supply more than that, that he would desire to have the negatives returned in order to have additional prints made. Agent Lawrance attempted to learn the real reason for wanting so many copies of these pictures without result. The question of furnishing Constable Pace with a number of photographs will be left to the discretion of the Division; however, it does appear that it may be necessary to return to him the negatives otherwise.

In connection with the identity of Constable Jack Pace of Ft. Smith, Arkansas, it may be noted that he has a reputation of being one of the very few honest outstanding law enforcement officers in the vicinity of Ft. Smith, Arkansas. He has cooperated with the Division readily and has furnished some very valuable information. He has been elected Sheriff at Ft. Smith, Arkansas, and is to take office at the beginning of the coming year.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILE

As previously arranged by Agent, Night Chief of Police Rufus Matlock, Van Buren, Arkansas, procured two small photographs (approximately 1 1/2 x 2 1/2 inches) from a Van Buren youth by the name of Bill Smith. One of these pictures was a posed studio photo of Floyd's son which was stamped on the rear: "Little Hollywood Studio". The other was a group photograph of Floyd, Mrs. Floyd and their son, a snapshot picture, which had been rubber stamped with the numeral 22.

Immediately upon securing these photographs Matlock turned them over to Constable Jack Pace, Fort Smith, Arkansas, who had enlarged copies made of them by A. R. Hansard, Photographer in the Illinois Bldg., Fort Smith. One copy each of the enlarged prints are enclosed as well as the negatives. The original pictures were immediately returned to Chief Matlock who returned them to the owner without supplying the information that copies had been made.

Constable Pace learned that the "Little Hollywood Studio" has been closed for some time but that it was formerly operated by a man by the name of Renfro. Constable Pace and Agent located the Renfro residence at 1307 N. 33rd Street, Fort Smith.

Agent contacted O. M. Renfro at his home, 1307 N. 33rd Street and learned that the posed photograph of the Floyd boy was taken in the "Little Hollywood Studio", 706 1/2 Garrison Street, Fort Smith, sometime between October of 1931 and February 1932. These are the only months that this studio was operated. Renfro stated that he recognized the picture as being one he had made but could remember no other circumstances in connection therewith. Renfro stated that the group photograph must have been done by some larger studio by reason of the fact that he did not number his work, and that the number 22 could indicate that the studio which made the prints had a large volume of work.

A study of the group photograph reveals that this picture must have been taken at about the same time as the posed photo by reason of the fact that the boy appears to be wearing the same coat and hat in both pictures. The following details are also noted in the group photo:

1. That it was taken in front of what appear to be Garage doors of a two story residence, the lower portion of which is brick while the upper is of frame.
2. That the trees which are showing in the background appear to be elms which are typical of this section of the country.
3. That steps and a railing can be seen on one side of the Garage.
4. That the brickmasonry is unusual as short pieces which appear to be one half of brick ends are inserted to make a pattern, with the exception of the top and the third from the top rows.

Constable Pace states that the clothing worn by Mrs. Floyd and the boy is the same as that which they were wearing in Fort Smith during the winter of 1933. Pace states that the boots worn by the boy particularly drew his attention because he remembered seeing the boy wearing them in Fort Smith, last winter. For this reason it is just possible that the group photo may have been taken later than the winter of 1931-32.

With this in mind it is suggested that copies of these photographs be made and supplied to Agents in this district with a view of locating this building, which place might possibly be used at this time as a hideout.

With the assistance of Constable Pace Agent is making a search of the district in and around Fort Smith to locate the residence or building shown in group photograph.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TALL

During telephonic conversation this evening I told Mr Cowley that a letter is being prepared to him in regard to the future program at the Chicago office. I stated that as soon as the Piquett case is taken care of, I want him, Mr Cowley, to give special attention to the Karpis-Barker, "Baby Face" Nelson and Hamilton, and the Kansas City massacre cases. I told him that he would be authorized to go, whenever he thinks it necessary to St Paul and to Kansas City, or that he might call those people into Chicago for conferences. I told him that I am not sending a copy of this letter to either St Paul or Kansas City for the reason that I feared if I did this, there would be even less work performed in these districts; That I feel both Mr Ladd and Mr. Nathan are inclined to await instructions from someone else. I told Mr Cowley that as soon as he is able to do so, I felt it would be well for him to visit these two districts frequently to supervise the work. Mr. Cowley suggested that Mr. Purvis be furnished with a copy of the letter referred to above, since up to date, he, Mr. Cowley, has had supervision over the Kansas City Massacre case. I told him I would see that Mr. Purvis receives a copy of the letter, and the letter will be phrased to indicate that he, Mr. Cowley, is on special assignment from Washington, operating out of Chicago. I remarked that the Kansas City case is connected with the Karpis-Barker and "Pretty Boy" Floyd cases, and possibly is connected with the Dillinger case since the gun found in the Lake is the gun used in the Kansas City massacre. I told Mr. Cowley that whenever he finds it necessary to shift Agents in connection with these cases, he should advise this office and I will see that it is done. I remarked that of course, I would like to have these three cases concluded within the next thirty or forty-five days if possible. Mr. Cowley felt that we would be able to accomplish more in these three cases now, particularly in the Bremer case.

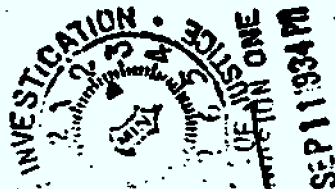

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Larson called from Cleveland, Ohio, about 9:45 P.M. and stated that he had just arrived in Cleveland. I advised Mr. Larson that the Matterson woman has been identified through her fingerprints as Paula Harmon who has been known to travel with Fred Barker and that she can furnish valuable information with respect to the Kanno, Bremer, and Hamm cases if she will. Mr. Larson asked whether the Division was in possession of a photograph of Winona Burdette, paramour of Harry Campbell and stated he believed that Winona Walcott now in custody at Cleveland is the Burdette woman. I told Mr. Larson that I would make a search of the Division file and in the event that a photograph was located it would be forwarded to him together with a photograph of Harry Dutch Sawyer.

Mr. Larson stated that so far photographs of Alvin Karpis, the Barker brothers, and Harry Campbell have been identified as frequenting the apartment on 71st Street in Cleveland; that Harry Sawyer is also believed to be associating with the mob in Cleveland.

Mr. Larson further advised that he was going to try to have the three women now in the custody of the Cleveland police department removed to the Lakewood, Ohio, police department jail where he believes the accommodations are better and that he can prevent further publicity being furnished to the newspapers as is being done by the Cleveland Ohio police department. No attempt has been made by the police department to obtain latent fingerprints in the apartment occupied by these individuals and that it is apparent that they have overlooked the possibility of developing harboring charges against them. I advised Mr. Larson that Alvin Karpis and Arthur R. Barker are under indictment in connection with the Bremer case and are classed as fugitives.

He stated that Helen Hargeson had been left at Toledo, Ohio, but that he did not anticipate any developments at that point in view of the arrests at Cleveland, Ohio, and ventured the opinion that had not these arrests occurred the addresses of the Barker Karpis gang would have been learned through the man Angus with the possibility of picking up the entire gang.

Mr. Larson stated that there is some indication that Kate Barker has also been in Cleveland and that he is going to question the five year daughter of the Sawyer woman with a view to identifying all those who have been in Cleveland and associating with the Barkers. He also stated that an attorney had been making an attempt to get the woman out but had not been successful.

Mr. Larson stated that it looks as though the Barker-Karpis gang has been working out of Cleveland and that they have been disposing of the Bremer ransom money in the vicinity of Buffalo, New York, which is not far distant. Another angle which he will give immediate attention is the resort alleged to be operated on one of the islands in the lake near Sandusky, Ohio, by the man Angus who operates some sort of a dive in Toledo, Ohio; that he is awaiting information from Agent Murphy who is to contact Helen Furgeson after she has contacted Angus. Mr. Larson feels that if Angus has such a place in the Lake near Sandusky, Ohio, that it would be very appropriate for them to go there to hide out; that they had left all their clothes in the apartment; that there is a suite of very fine furniture in the apartment; and that a detailed examination of the apartment will be made immediately. From the information furnished by the Walcott woman (believed to be Campbell's woman) it appears that this group went to Toledo, Ohio, early this year and from there went to Cleveland, where they established residences about one month and a half ago.

I called Mr. Larson's attention to the letter which I exhibited to him last Saturday addressed by the Kansas City Office to the Detroit Office wherein the serial numbers of several bills were listed, bills which were deposited by old man Barker in a bank at Keosau, Missouri, and which bills were issued by a Cleveland Ohio bank. Mr. Larson stated that an examination of the six one hundred dollar bills found in the possession of Mrs. Sawyer showed that they were issued by banks in Kansas City, Missouri, Denver, Colorado; San Francisco, California; that none, however, had been issued by a Cleveland bank. I pointed out to Mr. Larson that every effort should be made to identify the cars or at least obtain the description of the cars now in the possession of the gang. He said that they had been seen in two Ford V8 Sedans and one Chevrolet Sedan and that the Cleveland police department has one of these cars in its possession. He said the apartment did not have a telephone, and therefore it would not be possible to trace any long distance phone calls from that apartment. He said that it was not an apartment that they occupied but a rented house and that the furniture in the house had also been rented by them.

Mr. Larson closed by saying that he would give this matter further attention tonight and would advise the Division of any further developments the first thing in the morning.

California, and was being held in the County Hospital at Oakdale, California,
apparently a victim of amnesia.

Telephonic inquiry of the Chief of Police at Oakdale, California,
developed that this girl was Irene Dorsey Goetz and that he had obtained
the address of her mother in Wilmington, Illinois, and had wired to her, and
had received a wire from her advising that she, Mrs. Dorsey, was enroute to
Oakdale, California, to return her daughter, Irene Dorsey Goetz, to her
parents' home at Wilmington, Illinois.

Later, telephonic contact by Agent Ramsey with John Ryndberg, Super-
intendent of the County Hospital at Modesto, California, developed that
Irene Dorsey Goetz departed at 2:00 P.M. on August 23rd, 1934, via the
Santa Fe and Chicago and Alton Railroad for Wilmington, Illinois. It was



Reference is made to letter addressed to this office by the St. Louis Office under date of August 26, 1934, transmitting a copy of letter signed by R. S. Wilfrey, of the First National Bank, Fairbury, Nebraska, dated August 11, 1934, which you no doubt have in your files.

Miss Blanche Howard, paramour of Jack Griffin, when interviewed at the Kansas City Office on August 31, 1934, by Special Agents Andersen and Trainor, was questioned regarding her connections with T. J. Gerson. She stated that Mr. Gerson resides somewhere in Kansas City and that he has been an old sweetheart of hers for several years. She advised that he is not acquainted with Jack Griffin and that she did not know Griffin for most of the time that she went with Gerson. She stated that he is a jewelry auctioneer, and spent some time at a jewelry store at Fairbury, Nebraska, in connection with his business, during the years 1932 and 1933. She stated, however, that the photograph of Gerson found in her apartment at the time that Griffin was shot was in no way connected with Griffin's activities. She denied that Gerson has ever participated in any illegal affairs. She stated that he is related to Tom Gershon, Assistant City Prosecutor at Kansas City, Missouri. It is noted that Tom Gershon spells his name differently than does T. J. Gerson.

A photograph of T. J. Gerson, which was found among the personal effects of Griffin and his paramour at Kansas City, was identified by Blanche Howard. Same is transmitted herewith, and it

is suggested that it be displayed at Fairbury, Nebraska, especially in connection with the Fairbury bank robbery, since there is a possibility that he, while at Fairbury, might have figured the bank job for the others, who participated in it.

It is noted that Mr. Wilfrey mentioned several photographs, which he stated that Chief of Detectives Thomas J. Higgins was intending to send him, and especially it is noted that he stated that Griffin identified one of the photographs as a likeness of one Doc Miller. The only photographs submitted to the Kansas City Office by Chief of Detectives Higgins were those of Gerson and some other local parties, none of whom are known as Doc Miller. If Mr. Wilfrey has been the recipient of any photographs from Mr. Higgins, it is requested that you secure copies of same, to be transmitted to this office.

Your investigation at Fairbury, Nebraska, should be very discreet, in view of the fact that the Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department is strongly suspected as having further knowledge of the Fairbury bank robbery than they have furnished to this office. It has appeared quite strange that the Kansas City Police caused an immediate identification of Jack Griffin in the Fairbury bank robbery after he was wounded in an apparent spot job by some of the underworld, when as a matter of fact Griffin had been allowed to operate openly under the protection of the Police Department for several months prior to his attack.

The longhand letter transmitted to the Kansas City Office with the letter from the St. Louis Office is being forwarded to the Division, typewritten copies of same being retained in the Kansas City file of this case. Should later developments indicate the probable identity of the writer, the Division will be notified.

Reference is made to Division letter of August 27th, 1934, which apparently crossed in the mails letter from this office of August 31st, 1934, which was in answer to your letter of August 3rd, 1934, regarding action being taken in this district looking to the location of the Barker-Karpis gang.

Supplementing information noted in my letter of the 31st, and in addition to the information developed in connection with the Dillinger and Kansas City Massacre cases, Agent Ramsey advises me that there are leads in this case pending at Sacramento, Smith River, Vallejo and San Francisco, California.

Regarding investigation in other cases which bears on this case, reference is made specifically to the fact that a great deal of investigation in the Dillinger and Frisch cases has directed itself into and around the persons connected with the Bank Buffet, a saloon and gambling resort at 3286 22nd Street, in San Francisco, which investigation has developed that it is operated by one Johnny Coyle and "Soap" Marino, who employ as bartender one Louis Tambini, all of whom are mentioned in connection with previous investigations conducted by Agent Ramsey regarding the address, No. 34 Hyde Street, which, it will be remembered, is the address given by subject Karpis under the alias of William B. Lohman in renting an apartment in Chicago at 7137 Yates Avenue (see report of Agent W. R. Ramsey, Jr., dated San Francisco 6/8/34). Further investigation is continuing regarding these individuals and any possible connection they might have with subjects in this case.

Since rendition of the above noted report of Agent Ramsey, investigation has developed nothing additional regarding this address except that a letter was received in the San Francisco Postoffice directed to William B. Lohman at the 34 Hyde Street address bearing return address of one C. A. Reagan at

7137 Yates Avenue in Chicago, an x-ray of which letter revealed that it was merely a statement to William B. Lohman for apartment rent at the 7137 Yates Avenue address up until August 1st, 1934, and bore the further notation in longhand, "Why don't you pay up and get your furniture? Let me hear from you. (SIGNED) C. A. Reagan." It will be recalled that Reagan is the Manager of the apartment at 7137 Yates Avenue and has been previously interviewed by agents of this Division.

Specifically referring to my report of July 21st, 1934, in the case entitled Vernon C. Miller, with aliases, deceased, Richard Tallman Galatas, with aliases, Fugitive, I. O. No. 1201, Charles Arthur "Pretty Boy" Floyd, with aliases, Fugitive, I.O. No. 1194, et al, CONSPIRACY TO DELIVER A FEDERAL PRISONER, a copy of which was forwarded to the Division for inclusion in the Bremer file, and wherein the explanation of Irene Dorsey Goetz regarding the Auburn automobile of Alvin Karpis left in Chicago with George Grosscurth was noted, it is believed important that the discrepancy in the statements of Irene Goetz and Grosscurth be cleared up.

Report of Agent Ramsey in the Kansas City case, above noted, dated August 8th, 1934, reflects that Irene Goetz escaped from the care of Lee Bevans while enroute to her home in Illinois on August 5th, 1934.

On August 20th, 1934, after location of Irene Goetz at Oakdale, California, her mother came to Oakdale and departed with Irene Goetz on August 23rd for her home in Wilmington, Illinois. A wire was immediately dispatched to the Chicago office advising of this departure and suggesting a prompt interview. It is believed that she should again be interviewed regarding the Auburn automobile in the event investigation does not substantiate her story related in the above noted report.

This office is not relaxing its vigilance in connection with this investigation and developments will be promptly reported.

Reference is made to Division letter dated August 30, 1934, transmitting information received from Mr. A. Bruce Bialacki of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, New York City, to the effect that his Agent J. H. Forbes at Sumter, South Carolina, was in possession of information concerning the identity of one or more of the perpetrators of the recent robbery of an armored truck in Brooklyn, New York.

Please be advised that Mr. Forbes wired me on August 27, 1934, that he had information concerning this robbery, as a result of which I immediately contacted him by telephone. As will be noted in my report dated September 4, 1934, entitled ALBERT KELLEY, alias BERT KELLEY, alias BERT BRU LA; ABRAHAM LEVY; "SMITTEK"; "PRETTY BOY"; NICK NUMBER ONE; NICK NUMBER TWO, Miscellaneous - Information Concerning, it appears that Mr. Forbes has no information that the individuals whom he has in mind have any connection with the above mentioned robbery. Since December 1933 several persons have been passing through Greenville, South Carolina, and have contacted a confidential informant of Mr. Forbes, and have indirectly intimated to this informant that they have been connected with practically every major crime since the kidnaping of the Lindbergh baby. While the informant states that she will be glad to assist in ascertaining the identities of these persons, provided her name will not be disclosed, she has not furnished any information upon which an investigation could be based. One of these persons came to the informant's house two days following the robbery of the armored truck in Brooklyn, New York, appeared to be tired from a long drive, and asked to be allowed to sleep for a few hours in the informant's home, which request was refused. The informant agreed to take him to a hotel. However, he declined, and slept in his car in the woods near Greenville, South Carolina, after which he left there. He did not mention the Brooklyn robbery, and there appears to be nothing to indicate that he was one of the perpetrators.

As will be noted in my report referred to above, Mr. Forbes has arranged for the writer to interview this informant on two occasions at Greenville, South Carolina, and he has insisted that she not be contacted by any other Agent in order to protect her. In view of his attitude, and the fact that he had no definite information that these persons were involved in the Brooklyn robbery, I did not feel that a trip to Greenville, South Carolina, for the purpose of again contacting the informant was warranted.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

While talking with Mr. Stapleton, he referred to the telegram sent by Forbes to Mr. Bielecki regarding the robbery of the armored truck in Brooklyn and advised that Forbes also sent the Charlotte office a telegram and he, Stapleton, contacted him by telephone but the reason a report has not been submitted is that they have absolutely nothing on it. Mr. Stapleton stated that he is going to review the whole matter again today and submit a report so that the other offices will know what it is all about. Mr. Stapleton said that Forbes contacts him about once a week and when he goes down there, he always tells the same story as they never get the numbers of the license plates.

Mr. Stapleton stated that this time when he contacted Forbes telephone, Forbes advised that his informant claimed that one of the parties who was in the Brooklyn job came through about three days after the mail truck robbery and the informant stated she could not take him to Forbes' house but could take him to a hotel but he would not go there; that he then went into the woods and slept in the woods for about three hours. Mr. Stapleton stated there is a thing at all to connect this man with the Brooklyn robbery and that he passed through three days after the robbery and he, Stapleton, got the automobile license number as he had previously cautioned them obtaining license numbers and was advised that the car had no license which is evidently a stall. Mr. Stapleton stated that this informant as she knows who pulled the Lindbergh job as she saw a bunch of characters once; that she also thought this bunch was connected with Guy Floyd, with the Charlotte mail robbery and with the Bremer robbery. Mr. Stapleton stated that she has this gang in on every job that she has given a thing that can be checked. I instructed Mr. Stapleton to tell the facts to the Division and he stated he was going over the whole matter and submit copies to all interested offices. Mr. Stapleton stated that she is about the people coming through but it is evident that she is in a loose chase.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TAMM.

Subject: Examination of the recovered Thompson
sub-machine gun from Chicago, #7387,
received at the Laboratory August 9,
1934, against exhibits in Plaza and Lazia
shooting cases, Kansas City, Missouri.

Shells and bullets from this gun (#7387) were checked
against shells and bullets received from L. A. Gill of Kansas
City, Missouri, stated to be evidence exhibits from the Plaza
shooting, Kansas City, Missouri, and one shell and one bullet,
stated to be evidence exhibits from the Lazia shooting at Kansas
City, Missouri.

From an examination of these exhibits a conclusion was
reached by Special Agent Ward of the Laboratory that the shells
received from Gill stated to be evidence exhibits in the Plaza
and Lazia cases were fired from this arm.

This conclusion was reached after a study of the signifi-
cant characteristics implanted by the bolt head and firing pin of
gun #7387, and after a further confirmatory study of photographs
taken by Mr. Appel of the bolt face and one of the evidence shell
heads in the Plaza exhibits.

After careful study of the bullets stated to have been
recovered in the Plaza and Lazia cases with test bullets fired
through gun #7387, no conclusion could be reached as to their
relationship, if any.

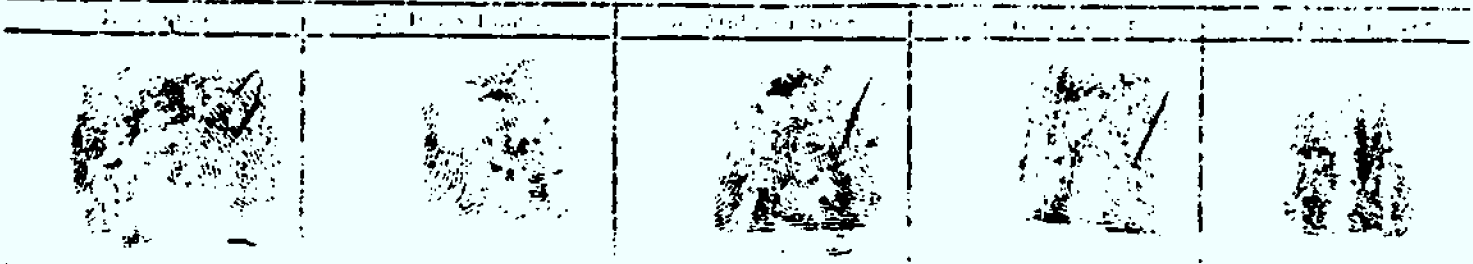

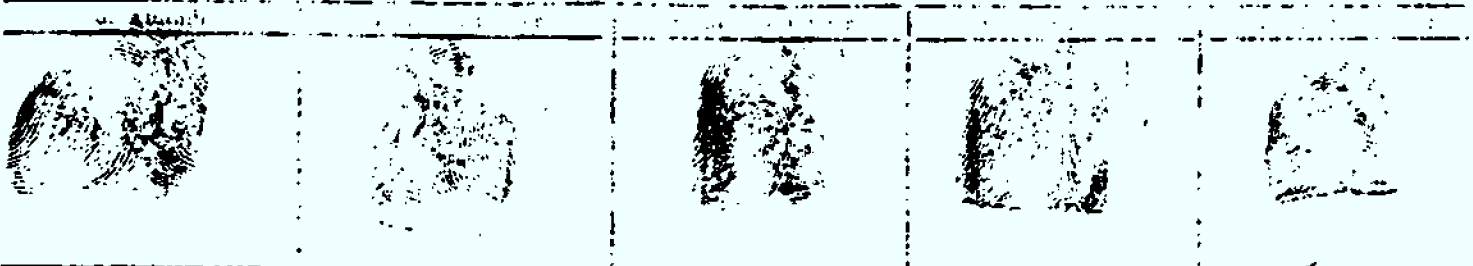

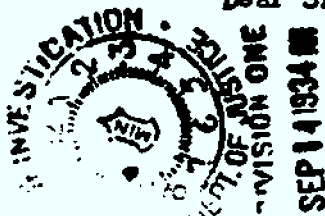

While at Lincoln yesterday, Friday, August 31st, I noticed a well-dressed hard looking devil and a woman companion who appeared to be spotting Woods Brothers' office. Woods Brothers, as you know, are a nationally known bridge construction and river control outfit and are presumed by the general public to be very wealthy. However, if I am not mistaken, they are in the hands of receivers.

After noticing this couple a number of times during an hour and a half and also a second man who seemed to relieve them at times, I stepped into Woods Brothers and told them about my suspicion and suggested that they call the Lincoln Police Department, but their curiosity exceeded their judgment and Mr. Woods and the cashier went out on the sidewalk and looked at these people so long and hard that they got scared out and by the time the Police Department at my request were able to get a crew over to Woods Brothers, the suspects had beat it.

I did not see them with a car and had I known that Woods was going to make such an ass of himself I would have waited and followed the people and checked their car number but they beat it while I was telephoning the police from another locality.

The description of the man you will find tallies with that of "Pretty Boy" Charles Floyd, with the exception of weight and the color of his complexion. In other words, he was about 5'8½", weight about 175 to 180 pounds, chestnut hair, very florid complexion, which might have been induced by previous heavy imbibing of hard liquor, a very square jaw, carried himself very erect and had all of the appearance of a pugilist, which was "Pretty Boy's" previous occupation. He was dressed in a light grey suit and wore a white cap, drawn well down over his eyes.

They stood on the curb watching the Woods Brothers office from a little after 9 A.M. until nearly 11. As stated above, occasionally they would be relieved by a second man, who was probably 135 lbs. in weight, dark brown hair, rather thin face with fairly sharp features, wore a blue shirt and I believe, grey trousers, no coat and, I think, wore a cap. This chap was about 5'8". The woman was, judging by appearance, of the type who would do things. She was about 115#, 5'7" or 7½" tall, long, slender face with rather a square jaw, very swarthy complexion with medium chestnut, rather long bobbed hair, dressed in a white summer suit with three-quarter length coat and a white hat trimmed with black, and, I believe, had black eyes.

Three of the members of the Woods Brothers office closely scrutinized the heavy set man and woman. I suggested to Chief Condit that he take "Pretty Boy" Floyd's pictures and description for them to look over. It is my understanding that "Pretty Boy" Floyd has been known to be a heavy drinker and since his descriptions were broadcast this habit no doubt has grown on him with the result that he has increased in weight and lost his clear complexion. One of his characteristics is the extreme erectness of his carriage. This was one of the prominent traits of the person I saw at Lincoln.

I had to leave Lincoln before Chief Condit returned from his conference with the Woods Brothers people, so do not know whether the witnesses of Woods Brothers confirmed my identification of "Pretty Boy" or not. If the Chief took the magazine he showed me which contained a more complete description of "Pretty Boy", I am quite sure the witnesses of Woods Brothers would concur in my identification. But I think Chief Condit only took the picture and Bertillon description with him.

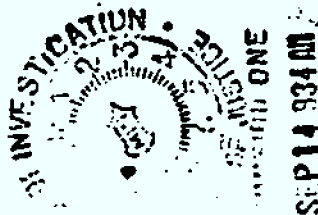

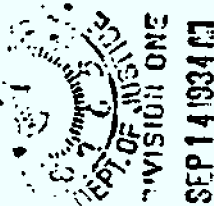

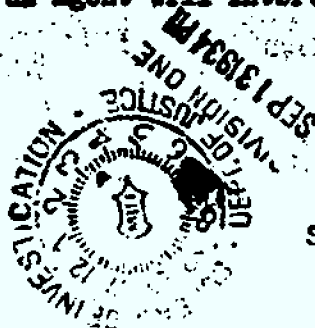

If Mr. Feldman has done so it is believed advisable that the United States Attorney should advise Mr. Feldman to contact the Chicago office. This matter will be closely followed, and in the event Mr. Feldman does not seek information from either the United States Attorney at Kansas City, or the Chicago Division office, an Agent will interview him at Chicago several days prior to September 18th.

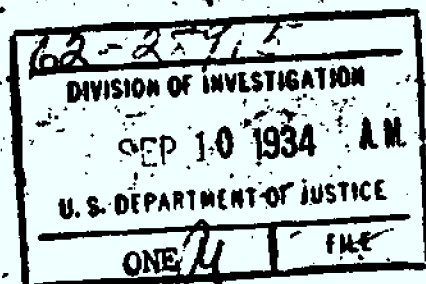

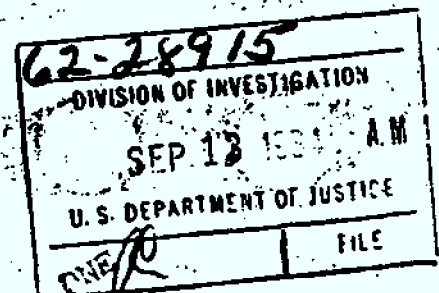
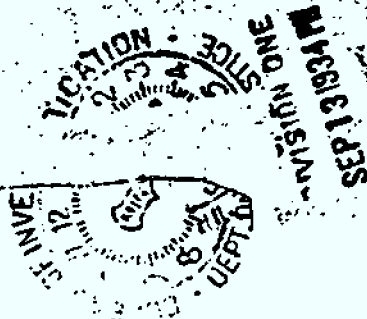

and Tybee Beach have ceased to a great extent their contacts with the big operators from other sections. These men have now gone into the wholesale handling of various brands of beer and tax paid liquors. Not nearly so many Northern liquor runners come into Savannah as formerly. This Agent is informed that very few strangers against whom suspicion might be directed are now visiting Savannah.

As to the hide-out mentioned in the report of reference, there is no CCC Camp within twenty miles of Savannah. The nearest one is located near Bloomingdale and there is no beacon light near it. There is a Veterans' Camp of CCC located between Hardeeville and Ridgeland, South Carolina, about thirty miles north of Savannah, and this is near the route of the Eastern Air and air mail lines. The alleged hide-out may be near this camp. There are no CCC Camps south of Savannah along the route of the airways between Savannah and Jacksonville, Florida.

In an effort to determine the possible identity of the parties described by the informant of Agent Stapleton, this Agent taxed his memory for those outstanding gangsters now wanted by the Division who have known to have been in Savannah in the past. There is only one outstanding one who comes to mind, that is WILLIAM WEISMAN with aliases, who is wanted in connection with the murder of Prohibition Agent Finiello in Elizabeth, New Jersey. It is known that Weisman, under the alias of BILL WEISS or BILL WISE, stayed in Savannah during the winter of 1931 and 1932 and that he arranged for the stay at the DeSoto Hotel in Savannah, for a period of several weeks of Holden and Keating when they were wanted as fugitives. The present whereabouts of Weisman is not known and it is the understanding of this Agent that the Division has information indicating that Weisman may have had some connection with the Kansas City Massacre and particularly with Richard Talman Galtso. It is believed that the photograph of Weisman attached should be exhibited to the informant.

In April, 1933, E. A. Fitzgerald, City Detective, noted that several suspicious acting men were hanging around the DeSoto Hotel, one of Savannah's leading hotels. He caused the arrest of these men and they were fingerprinted and released. They are known as liquor hi-jackers and have been in and out of Savannah many times since their arrest.

This mob is suspected by the Alcohol Tax Unit of having engaged in a gun battle with Agents of that Unit in December, 1933, when an Agent was severely wounded. This battle took place in South Carolina, near Ridgeland. Prohibition Agents at Charleston, South Carolina, are thoroughly familiar with this incident and may have additional information as to these men and their identities.

Agent believes it possible that members of this mob may be the persons who have been visiting informant at Greenville. The following data has been secured from the fingerprint files of the Savannah Police Department:

Reference is made to letter from the Kansas City Office
addressed to the Oklahoma City Office dated September 11, 1934.
It is noted that a letter is quoted as received from W. D. Lyle,
then a captain in the Wichita, Kansas Police Department. In this
letter Mr. Lyle stated that he had an informant who had furnished
him information that Charles Arthur Floyd has a contact man named
Frank Hall living in the Seminole District, near Earjo, Oklahoma,
which is adjacent to Marlboro, Oklahoma. The substance of Mr. Lyle's
information was given the Oklahoma City Office for such action as was
deemed advisable. It will be noted that Mr. Lyle stated in his letter,
quoted at that time, that he had been to the location where the
last of Floyd resides.

Mr. Lyle, now a detective in the Wichita, Kansas Police
Department, informed Special Agent W. F. Trainer on September 8, 1934,
that Frank Hall is said by his informant to be wanted in Canada for
train robbery. He stated that the location of Hall's place would be
impossible to secure unless diligent inquiry is made among the
use of someone who has been to the place previously. The informant
of Mr. Lyle is now in the Kansas State Penitentiary and Lyle advised
that his informant, while a criminal at heart, has furnished him
information that cleared up at least five major crimes in the vicinity
of Wichita. He stated that he, himself, and the informant were going
to pass that part of his time that he is "baiting" and that he
could and could be willing to proceed with the agents of this Division
to the place in question, if notified within a few days time in advance
in order that he might meet the agents at an appropriate designated
spot in Oklahoma.

He stated that the hideout is a cave, the
is situated on top of a knoll; that the knoll is surrounded by woods
and that in order to proceed to the mouth of the cave it
to go through the farmyard of Frank Hall's place.

Frank Hall would, of course, not furnish any information willingly, according to his information, and that any inquiries from the local residents at Earlboro or Harjo would be fatal to the accomplishment of any results.

This information is transmitted to the Oklahoma City Office for consideration by Assistant Director Harold Nathan. It is suggested that there might be a possibility of forcing Frank Hall to talk were it possible to definitely establish that he is wanted for train robbery in Canada.

Mr. Lyle did not furnish the name of his informant but stated that he is in for a long term at the Kansas State Penitentiary at Lansing. The wife of the informant is still residing in Wichita and Mr. Lyle stated he would make contact with her in an effort to determine what, if anything, the informant has recently learned since she makes frequent contacts with him at the Kansas State Penitentiary. If it seems worth while Mr. Lyle would proceed to Lansing and make further efforts through his informant to secure the latest information available.

There is transmitted herewith a copy of a memorandum by
Special Agent M. C. Spear dated at Kansas City, Missouri
with reference to the appearance of the wife of Charles Arthur Floyd
(Ruby) and her son, Jack Dempsey Floyd, at Kansas City in a theatrical
performance.

Please be advised that the act was billed at the Liberty
Theatre, which is owned by the Dubinsky Circuit, and it was also
shown at the Regent Theatre, which is also a Dubinsky Theatre.

Mrs. Floyd registered at the President Hotel in Room 945.
Charles Dennison, of Pawhuska, Oklahoma, registered in Room 947, which
is an adjoining room. A check of the long distance calls reveals
there was only one call made and that was made from the room of
Mr. Dennison, placed by E. E. Beach, on September 4, 1934, the parties
having arrived there on September 1st. The long distance call was to
telephone number 217, Pawhuska, Oklahoma, and the charge was \$1.00.
Dennison left on September 4th for parts unknown.

On September 5, 1934, Special Agents Harold E. Andersen
and W. F. Trainor inquired of Mr. Ed Dubinsky, of the Liberty Theatre,
regarding the duration of the theatrical contract with Floyd's wife
and he stated that they were through there on that date, and accord-
ing to his information E. E. Beach was seeking to bill the act at
some theatre in St. Louis, Missouri. He was unable to determine what
theatre Beach had been in contact with.

On the night of September 5th Agents Andersen and Trainor
learned at the Haffziger Garage, on 14th and Baltimore Avenue that the
automobile of Mrs. Floyd was then out in possession of one of the
attendants of the garage. Information was received that the attendant
had driven the car to the Liberty Theatre. The Agents proceeded there

and found that the attendant had just taken Mr. Beach to the bus station at the corner of 13th and Main Streets, and arriving back at the garage Agents found the attendant in company with Mrs. Floyd driving her car. She inquired for the highway from Kansas City to Pawhuska, Oklahoma, by way of Coffeyville, Kansas, and she was directed on Highway 73-E. It was found that Mrs. Floyd checked out of the President Hotel on the evening of September 5th, a few minutes before she departed from the city. The Agents noted that she was driving a 1934 Model Terraplane Coach, bearing Oklahoma license 331-875. Mrs. Floyd inquired also the street routing from the garage at Kansas City to Highway 73-E proceeding South, and the Agents shadowed her in her car to the Highway in question. It was noted she traveled with her son, Jack Dempsey Floyd, and that she stopped to make inquiry in two other instances before she reached the highway desired.

You were notified by telegram on the evening of September 5th with reference to Mrs. Floyd's return to Oklahoma.

On August 28, 1934, Mr. E. E. Beach, of Pawhuska, Oklahoma, called at the Kansas City Office, and advised that he, together with one O. V. Black, of Ponca City, Oklahoma, were financially interested in a moving picture which was shown of the son of Charles Arthur Floyd, relative to the recent baptism of his son by the Baptist Church in Texas. Mr. Beach advised that Floyd's former wife and the mother of this son, Ruby, was now living with one Charles Dennison, an Osage Indian, and Beach was presently in Kansas City in an endeavor to book the above-mentioned picture in Kansas City, at which time a personal appearance would be made by Mrs. Floyd and her son. It was Mr. Beach's suggestion that Floyd could probably be apprehended if, when Ruby Floyd and the son appeared at Kansas City with Charles Dennison, that Dennison and Ruby be picked up on a White Slave complaint, and that publicity be given to this feature, in order that Charles Arthur Floyd would then make endeavors to contact his son in Kansas City, and take him away from the evil influence of Ruby Floyd. Beach explained that "Pretty Boy's" son was one of his weak spots. At the time of this first call Mr. Beach advised that he had not yet secured a contract for the showing of the above-mentioned picture, and a personal appearance by Ruby Floyd and her son. Subsequently on the same date, he called and advised that he had made arrangements for the showing of this picture at the Liberty Theater in Kansas City, Missouri, at this time not stating the date it was to be shown. He requested at that time to come to this office in order that he might communicate by telephone with Ruby Floyd, supposedly in Muskogee, Oklahoma, or Tulsa, Oklahoma, in order that arrangements could be made for her and the boy to come to Kansas City.

The above information was communicated to Assistant Director Harold Nathan, at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, by telephone, and he advised that he believed Beach was endeavoring to further his own ends, but in the event Mrs. Floyd and the boy were booked at Kansas City and did come to Kansas City, it would be advisable to keep a close surveillance of them while here. Mr. Nathan advised that, concerning the question of a technical White Slave charge against Ruby Floyd and Dennison, he would consider this feature further, but at the present time did not consider this matter of endeavoring to apprehend Floyd to be advisable or practicable. Mr. Nathan at this time indicated that he would be in Kansas City in the next few days possibly.

Subsequently the same evening, Mr. Beach called back and advised he had communicated by telegram with Mr. Black, at Ponca City, Oklahoma, and expected a telegram from him the following morning, August 29, as to whether Ruby and her son would appear in Kansas City, probably this week end, for personal appearance. Mr. Beach said that he would again communicate with this office after he had received a reply from Mr. Black at Ponca City.

Bolivar, Missouri, where his mother at the present time resides. When interviewed he advised that his wife is a good friend of Joe Richetti, brother of Adam Richetti, who now lives at Bolivar, Missouri; that his wife would be in a position, if she were willing, to obtain information regarding the Richetti family. He admonished the writer not to approach his wife, however, saying she would be in sympathy with the Richetti family. Cousin stated that he frequently visits his relatives at Bolivar and promised to endeavor to secure information at that point regarding the present whereabouts of Adam Richetti. In that connection he stated he would discreetly attempt to have his wife "pump" the Richetti family for relevant information.

Cousin asserted that he had no doubt but that Adam Richetti could come and go in Bolivar as he desired, pointing out that the local law, including the Sheriff, would fear to take any action against either Floyd or Richetti.

Owen R. Brown, Police Detective, Springfield, Missouri, advised that something like three or four months ago one Tucker, a salesman for the Liggett & Lyer Tobacco Company, working out of St. Louis, Missouri, came to see him and advised that he had recently seen Floyd eating in a restaurant at Exeter, Missouri. Tucker went on to explain that early the night he furnished the information to Brown he was eating in a restaurant in Exeter when a black car drove up. One man got out of this machine and after looking around ordered sandwiches and drank some beer. This individual then returned to the automobile and another man entered the restaurant and had a meal. After these men left the restaurant and drove off the proprietor turned to Tucker and said, "You know who that was?". Tucker replied that it looked like Floyd. The proprietor, according to Tucker, answered "That's right. He comes and eats here about once a month". Brown was questioned at some length with reference to Floyd and Richetti and advised he had no other information of value, except that one Calvin Henderson, of Purdy, Missouri, had recently told him that a woman residing near Purdy had some valuable information concerning Charles Arthur Floyd. He suggested that Henderson be interviewed.

Investigation revealed that the restaurant at Exeter, Missouri, mentioned in the previous paragraph, is operated by M. J. Brewer and his wife. Mr. Brewer at the time of this inquiry was out of town. Mrs. Brewer, when interviewed, suggested that one of the men who was in the restaurant the night Floyd was supposed to have visited there should be contacted for definite information regarding what transpired, she herself not being in the restaurant during the night in question. In this connection she suggested that the writer interview Ben Venable, of Exeter, Missouri.

Ben Venable, when interviewed, stated that something like four months ago at about 11 P.M. he was in the Brewer's restaurant when a car drove up and parked outside. Two men and a woman got out of the car and entered the restaurant. Venable observed that the car the trio arrived in was a

two door Chevrolet Sedan with a red stripe around it. This automobile had wire wheels and was equipped with a radio and did not have license plates in front. As the party entered the restaurant Venable believes he recognized one of the men as Charles Arthur Floyd. He said the party ordered sandwiches and some beverage and remained in the eating establishment for approximately 20 minutes listening to the radio. He said that his attention was drawn to the automobile when he noted the radio had been left running, as well as the engine of the car. He advised that they drove off in the direction of Eureka Springs and that he had information later to the effect that one Hob Amos, who lives near the Garrett Brothers Garage, at Butterfield, Missouri, was visited by Floyd that evening. He advised that Floyd, whose photograph he identified, was with a small woman who he was unable to more definitely describe. He stated that Floyd's male companion was small in stature and had ears a bit misshapen. All of the individuals, according to the informant, were plainly dressed and Floyd wore khaki trousers and boots. Venable was unable to identify photographs of Beulah and Rose Baird or Adam Richetti. He has promised cooperation and has suggested that he be interviewed or communicated with from time to time. As will be noted later in this report Hob Amos is reputed to be a close friend of Floyd's.

C. W. Kemper, rural carrier Route 2, Exeter, Missouri, advised that he believes one E. U. Fair, who lives 2½ miles south of Wheaton, Missouri, is the contact for Floyd. In that connection he advised that he had noted that Fair communicates with someone in Joplin, Missouri, by the name of Floyd. He has promised to watch outgoing mail in an endeavor to get more definite information. He advised that this information will be relayed to the Kansas City Office.

B. F. Cos, Night Watchman, Exeter, Missouri, stated that he had received numerous rumors to the effect that Floyd passes through Exeter but had never obtained any definite information to that effect outside of the information heretofore set out in this report.

C. E. Henderson, who resides on a farm about 1½ miles north-east of Purdy, Missouri, stated that one Mrs. Vaught, who lives in the vicinity of Purdy, told him that she had observed "Pretty Boy" Floyd, a man companion and a woman drive up to her farmhouse about the first of August 1934, at which time the party obtained drinking water for their thermos jug. He suggested that Mrs. Vaught be interviewed for more definite information.

Mrs. Mamie (L.K.) Vaught resides on a farm one mile south and two miles west of Purdy, Missouri. She was interviewed and stated about August 1, 1934 at approximately 3 P.M. a Pontiac or Dodge Coupe drove up to her home and stopped. A man got out, went to the side of her house where he filled a thermos jug full of water from her pump. Mrs. Vaught observed that a woman remained in the car. This woman appeared to be about 25 years of age, had a novel face and bleached blonde hair. The man, whom she identified as

Floyd from photograph exhibited to her, wore khaki trousers and a blue shirt. Mrs. Vaught stated that she felt positive that the man who called at her home was Charles Arthur Floyd. She was questioned as to any friends Floyd might have in the vicinity and stated that up to about a year ago John Roland and his family lived in back of their farm. Mrs. Roland often advised that she knew Floyd and his family and Mrs. Vaught said that she had not a doubt in the world but that the Rolands would harbor Floyd should he call to see them. She stated, however, that the Rolands were very undesirable residents, in her opinion and would not cooperate in any manner in locating Floyd. When questioned as to the present whereabouts of the Roland family she advised they moved around considerably but that the last time she heard of them they were some place in Arkansas. A letter is being directed to the Postmaster at Purdy, Missouri to secure any forwarding address the Rolands may have left.

Motorcycle Patrolman Frank Pike, Springfield, Missouri, when interviewed, advised that he had formerly been very friendly with one Benita Young, sister of Harry Young, formerly a notorious outlaw of Southern Missouri who is now deceased. He said he felt that Benita Young would be in a position to secure or furnish valuable information relative to Floyd inasmuch as it was generally rumored that Benita Young's brothers had been friendly with Floyd prior to their death. In this connection it should be noted that Harry Young and his brothers engaged in a gun battle with officers at Springfield sometime ago and killed several officers. These men were later killed. Patrolman Pike said that if the writer could gain the consent of the Chief of Police at Springfield he would make a date with Benita Young and attempt to obtain information from her regarding Floyd and his associates. The matter was taken up with the Chief of Police and the same night Patrolman Pike went riding with Benita Young. He reported the following day that he had been unable to obtain any information; that he felt he had been laboring under a misapprehension as he was convinced that Benita Young knew nothing about Floyd or his activities. He has promised, however, to cooperate with the Division in obtaining information regarding Floyd.

B. K. Wommack, Assistant Chief of Police, Springfield, Missouri, stated that one Dr. Pace, a friend of his, of Gainesville, Missouri, recently informed him he had treated a leg wound for Floyd last October. The doctor, according to Wommack, was contacted first by Wilbur Underhill, who made arrangements for Floyd's medical treatment. Because of fear Dr. Pace made no mention of having treated Floyd until recently. It should be noted he is a personal friend of Wommack's and at the present time will probably furnish any information he has regarding the fugitive. The Kansas City Office contemplates interviewing Dr. Pace.

Hugh Brixie, former Sheriff at Cassville, Missouri, is now connected with the State Fish Hatchery at Roaring River, Missouri, which is situated about 15 miles from Cassville. He advised that he had not received any definite information regarding Floyd but did not doubt that Floyd frequently passes through the Camp at Roaring River. He pointed out that the camp would make an ideal hideout

and because of the numerous visitors slight attention would be paid to him. Brixie promised to cooperate and it is believed he should be contacted from time to time as he is in an ideal position to obtain information with reference to Floyd. Brixie stated that one Hob Amos, a close friend of Charles Arthur Floyd, whose last address he knew as a point about three miles northwest of Cassville on Highway Number 37, undoubtedly harbors Floyd from time to time. He said that Amos has a hideout about one mile off the highway just mentioned at which Floyd could stay without fear of detection.

In connection with hideouts and contacts, Brixie suggested that it was quite possible that one Jack Clayton, who lives in back of a hospital in Cassville, might be a good possibility. He stated that Clayton is unscrupulous and is reported to hide those who are evading the law. He further stated that it was generally known that one Cecil Garrett, a garage mechanic at Cassville, Missouri, does work on Floyd's automobiles from time to time. He advised that this individual would be entirely undependable as far as the Division is concerned. These reputed contacts will be given consideration at a later date.

Harold Randall, Attorney-at-Law, Springfield, Missouri, and former Division Agent, was contacted for any information he might have with reference to Floyd. He advised that he would endeavor to secure some information regarding possible contacts of Floyd and would furnish same to the Division Office at Kansas City. He suggested that if the writer proceeded to Joplin, Missouri, it might be advisable to contact one Cecil Brookshire, gambler and bootlegger at that point. He voiced the opinion that if anyone in Southern Missouri could locate Floyd, Brookshire would be the man. He advised, however, that he did not know whether Brookshire would cooperate. Incidentally, it should be noted that Brookshire is an old friend of E. E. Fisher.

Cecil Brookshire now operates a drug store and wholesale liquor establishment at Joplin, Missouri. He was interviewed and denied he had any information pertaining to the present whereabouts of Floyd or Richetti. When shown a photograph of Adam Richetti, however, he identified it as a likeness of an individual he had seen at the Cotton Club, a night club situated near Joplin, the night of August 25, 1934. He explained that he and a woman companion had attended the Club the night mentioned and had observed two men and two women who aroused his suspicion. He noted that both men kept their backs to the wall at all times and from the bulge around their waists he felt certain they both were armed. He said his suspicions were further aroused when he observed that only one man would dance at a time, the other man keeping a watchful eye on what transpired in the club.

At his suggestion Fisher and the writer attended the Cotton Club with Brookshire Sunday night August 26, 1934, but did not see anyone who re-

sembled Richetti or Floyd. It should be noted that Brookshire did not identify the photograph of Floyd as being the companion of Richetti at the Night Club. Brookshire has promised to keep his eyes open and endeavor to secure information regarding Floyd and Richetti and that he would advise the Kansas City Office of any information he obtained. The informant is in an excellent position to obtain information discreetly in view of the fact that he furnishes liquor to many of the bootleggers from various points in Oklahoma.

N. O'Neal, partner of Brookshire in the liquor business, was contacted and expressed his willingness to "set in" the writer with any of the notorious characters from Oklahoma it might be desirable to meet. He said he felt certain that he could arrange so that an Agent would be able to not only meet these connections but to become intimately acquainted with them. This matter should be given consideration at a later date as it would be possible to gain the confidence of the Oklahoma bootleggers through the offices of O'Neal. In addition, O'Neal said that should it be desired at a later date he will arrange to have an Agent or informant meet, through his Indian girl friend, some of the wealthy Indian girls from Miami, Oklahoma, who would be of considerable value in securing information regarding Floyd and his activities. Incidentally it should be noted that O'Neal is keeping company with an Indian girl named Peck, who is the sister of the Chief of Police at Commerce, Oklahoma.

Harry Head, Chief of Police, Joplin, Missouri, was contacted in reference to Floyd, but advised he had no information relative to the fugitive. Later the same day, however, he was observed entering the liquor warehouse of Brookshire and it was noted he was partially intoxicated. When he met Fisher and the writer he invited them to go for a ride with his family and during the ride he became somewhat loquacious. He advised that he had forgotten to mention earlier that day that Floyd had been in Joplin about the middle of August 1934. After riding around for some time he told the writer that he wanted to introduce him to the source of his information, a bootlegger of Joplin.

Accordingly, Tom Lloyd, 516 East 9th Street, Joplin, Missouri, was interviewed in the presence of Fisher and the Police Chief. Upon being advised to tell what he knew by the Chief, Lloyd stated that during the night of August 13, 1934, a black V-8 two door Ford Sedan, bearing custom trunk on back, drove up to the side of his house and stopped. He observed the car had a red stripe around it and bore Oklahoma license tag. Jack Leroy Curry, an old friend of his, the former's girl friend, and Charles Floyd entered the house. Curry and the woman had several drinks but Floyd did not touch any. Lloyd said that he observed Floyd was armed, having one gun in his belt and one under his shoulder, and that the car they had arrived in was not left unoccupied. He said that on looking through the window of his kitchen, the shade being up, he noted that another man had remained in the automobile. Lloyd frankly stated he would like to get any reward that might be out on Floyd and said he would

not be a bit surprised if Floyd returned at any time. He said that when Floyd and the rest of the party arrived it must have been sometime between 10 and 12 and that they could easily have been captured as they did not seem a bit afraid of detection. He has made arrangements with Chief Mead whereby the latter will be notified in the event Floyd again returns to his home. He feels that Jack Curry brought Floyd to his home in order that Floyd might have another contact in Joplin, should he need it.

In connection with the foregoing Lloyd advised that he had formerly served time at the County Jail at Neosho, Missouri with Jack Leroy Curry, whom he styled as an Oklahoma outlaw with a big record. He stated that during the visit the night of August 13th Jack Curry mentioned that they might want to make use of his place at some future date in case "the heat was on them", to which he informed Curry that it would be agreeable to him. Lloyd described the woman companion of Curry as follows: Age about 25; 5'3"; weight about 106 pounds; blonde hair, very good looking. Photographs of Jack Leroy Curry are being obtained from the Joplin Police Department and will be furnished to the Division and interested offices.

Chief Mead was again contacted the following day and expressed his willingness to cooperate with the Division unbeknown to his Chief of Detectives in an effort to cause the apprehension of Floyd and Richetti. He stated that he would much rather that Division Agents were on the scene in the event Floyd is located than to handle the apprehension as a local matter.

Bailey Barber, who runs a gasoline station, eating house and drinking establishment on the outskirts of Joplin, Missouri, is an old acquaintance of Fisher's. He was interviewed for information regarding Floyd and Richetti but stated he knew nothing about these individuals. He promised to be on the watch, however, and said he would gladly cooperate with the Division to the best of his ability. Although Fisher seemed to have faith in Barber he did not impress the writer as one who would furnish any valuable cooperation.

Mrs. Lula Dunaway is aunt of E. E. Fisher and resides at 215 West Lee Street, Sapulpa, Oklahoma. She was interviewed in an effort to establish a reliable contact at Sapulpa. She stated that she had no doubt but that Floyd frequently visits Sapulpa and pointed out that many of the more desperate characters in Oklahoma seek haven there when they are wanted elsewhere. She said she had no faith in the local law enforcement officials and did not believe the Division could secure any cooperation at that point. Mrs. Dunaway, who is employed as a waitress in the Lindberg Cafe at Sapulpa, would be in an excellent position to secure information. When approached in this regard she said she would think the matter over and would then get in touch with her nephew, Fisher.

During the investigation reported above the writer observed that while Fisher is honest and willing to do everything he can he is limited in

intelligence and by education in his efforts to secure information. Fisher appeared indiscreet in that he made it generally known wherever he and the writer happened to be that he was seeking the apprehension of "Pretty Boy" Floyd. In view of this it was not deemed advisable to spend any additional time with him.

Since returning to Kansas City Fisher has approached Sheriff Tom Bash with the proposition that the Sheriff finance him in a trip to Southern Missouri, Oklahoma and Arkansas looking to the location and apprehension of Floyd. Sheriff Bash has advised that he furnished Fisher with \$100.00 to defray the latter's expenses. While it appears doubtful that Fisher will secure any information of value he appears friendly toward this office and has advised that in the event he locates Floyd or Richetti or receives any information pertaining to them he will immediately communicate same to this office. Fisher departed for Southern Missouri Friday, September 7, 1934. Before leaving he advised the writer that he contemplated making contacts in Joplin, Missouri and Sepulpa, Oklahoma, as well as other points where he is acquainted.

With reference to the report of Special Agent R. A. Lawrence, dated at Little Rock, Arkansas, September 3, 1934, in which leads are set out for the Kansas City Office to interview Patrolman Pike, of Springfield, Missouri, it should be noted that while the writer was in Springfield interviewing Pike he made mention of the individuals arrested at Eureka Springs, Arkansas, July 20, 1934, one of whom was believed to have been "Pretty Boy" Floyd. In connection therewith it should be noted that the writer exhibited to Pike the latest photograph of Floyd and that Pike was not certain but said he felt that Floyd may have been one of the individuals he was instrumental in having arrested at Eureka Springs. He was not positive, however. He at that time did not furnish any information in addition to that which has previously been recorded in the report just mentioned.

Ralph Hoffman and Paul Weaver, who were with Pike at the time of the arrest at Eureka Springs, will be interviewed at Springfield as soon as practicable.

UNDEVELOPED LEADS:

THE KANSAS CITY DIVISION OFFICE at Warrensburg, Missouri will keep in touch with Walter Cousin, monument worker, for such information as he may be able to obtain at Bolivar, Missouri, regarding Adam Richetti.

At Springfield, Missouri, contact should be maintained with Frank Pike, Motorcycle Patrolman, for any information he may be able to secure regarding this matter.

At Gainesville, Missouri, an interview should be had with one

Dr. Pace, who is alleged to have treated a leg wound for Floyd in October 1933.

At Roaring River, Missouri, contact should be maintained with Hugh Brixie, former Sheriff at Cassville, who is now endeavoring to obtain information regarding Floyd and Richetti.

At Exeter, Missouri, an interview should be again had with C. W. Kemper, rural carrier, who is endeavoring to secure information with reference to Floyd and his associates.

Consideration should be given to the advisability of establishing contact with Oklahoma liquor runners through Cecil Brookshire and N. O'Neal, of Joplin, Missouri, who, as will be noted, have promised cooperation in this matter.

Reference is made to your letter dated September 8, 1934, in the above entitled case, addressed to the Kansas City office, a copy of which was furnished the Detroit office but not the Chicago and New York offices.

For the information of the Chicago and New York Division offices, the Division is interested in locating Phillip Lascuola, James Bove, alias James DiVella and Meyer Bernan, whose photographs are enclosed herewith and with copies of this letter designated for the Detroit, Chicago and New York offices. These individuals are suspected by the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department of having murdered John Lasic, notorious underworld leader at Kansas City on July 10, 1934. The Technical Laboratory of the Division has identified shells found at the scene of the murder of Lasic as shells fired from one of the guns used in the Kansas City massacre.

The investigation at Cincinnati disclosed that Phillip Lascuola and James Bove have been identified as frequenting the Prospect Club, which is located over a bank at the corner of Rockdale and Reading Road, Cincinnati, and is operated by a man known to E. E. Carmichael as "Murph". Carmichael advised that during the early part of July, 1934, probably between the 10th and 15th, arrangements were made whereby he was to notify Detective Ora Slater when both Lascuola and Bove could be located at the Prospect Club at the same time. Carmichael further advised, however, that there was some method of tipping off patrons of this club whenever detectives entered, and at the time the raid on the club was made, Lascuola and Bove disappeared from Cincinnati.

Carmichael further advised that he has, at times, been employed at the Arrow Head Inn, approximately twenty miles from Cincinnati in Butler County, Ohio, which is a well known gambling resort; that he is acquainted with a number of the men connected with this resort, and is especially well acquainted with Joe Bauer, who he states is the Manager; that he also knows Harold Mason, Sam Mason and Sammy Schrader, who are all connected with the organization, and that the last named individual is well acquainted with Lascuola and Bove and will protect them under any circumstances; that he is of the opinion that Lascuola and Bove have some connection with the Arrow Head Inn although he has been unable to find out what this connection might be. He stated that he had seen Lascuola at the Arrow Head Inn on two occasions, the last time being on the night of August 29, 1934.

Carmichael stated that some of the individuals connected with the Arrow Head Inn are also connected with a gambling resort in Cleveland, Ohio, but does not know the name or address of this latter place and that it is his opinion, although not based on any definite information, that both of the individuals referred to may be frequenting this Cleveland gambling resort.

In view of the tie-up between Lascuola and Bove and the Kansas City underworld, and likewise the association between the late Vernon C. Miller and one Sammy Schrager, alias Samuel Martin, number B-51363, Police Department, New York City, and the similarity between Schrager's name and the Schrader mentioned above, the Division desires that a further intensive investigation be made by the Cincinnati office at Cincinnati, and the Detroit office at Cleveland, Ohio, with respect to the information set forth above. In view of the recent developments at Cleveland, Ohio, in connection with the Bauer case. Copies of a photograph of Sammy Schrager are being furnished to the Cincinnati, Detroit and Chicago Division offices with a copy of this letter. The New York and Kansas City offices are already well acquainted with Schrager.

In connection with the above, it is to be noted that members of the Barker-Karpis gang in the past have had definite connections at Kansas City, Missouri, as have the individuals who are discussed in the foregoing portion of this letter, and the Division desires that every effort be made to ascertain the

Identity of the underworld contacts at Cleveland, Ohio, which have attracted members of the Barker-Karpis gang as well as Lascuol. and Love.

This matter should be given immediate, thorough and vigorous attention by all offices receiving a copy of this letter.
