

MORANDUM FOR MR. TANM RECORDS

With reference to your memorandum of Bovember 19,
1934, covering your conversation with Mr. Helm, of the
Kansas City Journal-Post, I believe that you should
immediately instruct the Kansas City Office of this
Division to take up with the United States Atterney
this matter, and be guided by his service as to whether
we shall request Gill to furnish as for examination
purposes, the original shells. In other words, I do
not think we should take any action in this matter
except with the knowledge and at the direction of the
United States Attorney, who now has the case in head.

Iour action in refusing to comment upon this matter to Mr. Helm was entirely proper, as I do not believe we should try our sesses in the newspapers.

Specific instructions should be issued to the Kansas City Office that under so circumstances is there to be any further dealing with Mr. Gill, and he is to be furnished with no information at any time in any case.

A Mr Helm, representative of the Kansas City Journal-Post, referred to me from your office. Mr. Helm stated that he received information from his paper at 2:30 A.M. this morning to the effect that on the morning of the Kenses City Massecre, Chief of Police Otto Reed had in his possession a shotgun; that Reed was sitting in the back seat of Caffrey's car and that after the Massacre, two exploded shotgun shells were found by the Police on the running board of the cer or on the ground nearby. Mr. Helm stated that his paper advised him that Agent Caffrey had been killed by a ball-bearing; that Nash's body indicated that he had been shot from behind and that a third person killed had also evidently been killed by a shotgun. Helm stated that he was advised further that the windshield of Caffrey's car had been blown out by bullets from inside the car. The Kansas City Journal-Post now claims that Caffrey, Reed and one other person were killed by the shotgun of Otto Reed. Helm further stated that an unexploded shotgun shell. was found on the person of Reed after the Massacre and that this shell when taken to the Bellistics Expert Gill, was found to be loaded with buckshot and ball-bearing.

Helm further stated that his newspaper had information that sometime after the Massacre Agents Frank Smith and Lackey had returned to the son of Otto Reed in Oklahoma, the shotgun belonging to Reed.

Helm requested that I deny or affirm this story or indicate that the Division had previous knowledge of this angle of the case. I advised Mr. Helm that the Division would make no comment upon this matter; that it was the Division's policy and practice to prepare our cases for trial in Court not in the newspapers. Helm stated that it seemed odd that if we knew of this angle of the case before, we had not given it to the papers. I reiterated that we were not preparing our cases for trial in the newspapers.

It is obvious that the information in the possession of the Kansas City Journal-Post has come from Merle Gill, since it coincides precisely with his present theory of the case. In the event I have occasion to talk to Mr. Nathan at Kansas City today, I will again caution him against having any further dealings with Gill.

The only way we can determine conclusively whether Reed's gun fired the shots from which the exploded shells found at the scene of the Massacre NOV 276 1934

emanaged, is to obtain the original shells which I understand are in the possession of Mr. Gill. Agents of the Oklahoma City Office have recently obtained test shells fired from Reed's gun. In view of the probable publicity which will appear on this angle of the case, do you desire that we approach Gill and attempt to obtain the original shells from him? The possession of these shells and the subsequent examination will of course not prove conclusively the identity of the person responsible for the death of Caffrey at all, but will merely identify the shells as coming from or not coming from Reed's gun.

Referring to your telegram of November 13, 1934, relative to the above entitled matter, in which you request that another effort be made to locate the record of George Ryan, released by authorities at Los Angeles, please be advised that a further search of the records of the Los Angeles Police Department disclosed that Ryan was turned over to the Los Angeles authorities by the sheriff of Santa Ana, California, on September 16, 1917 for suspicion of having stolen a Cadillac from San Diego, California -Sheriff's No. 1058 at Santa Ana on Ryan. Said Ryan, under Los Angeles Police No. 15532 was arrested on September 19, 1917 by police officers at Los Angeles on a burglary charge; said Ryan was held to answer to this charge, and on September 28, 1917 was placed under \$2500.00 bail.

On October 25, 1917, said Ryan pleaded guilty to a charge of burglary in the Superior Court, Los Angeles, California, and applied for probation. On November 26, 1917, said probation was granted by the Superior Court of this city, and Ryan was released for a period of three years.

According to the records of the Police Department, Los Angeles, California, the fingerprint classification of Ryan is 29 0 18.



This will confirm telephonic conversation between Mr. Temm of the Division and myself on November 24, 1934, at which time I was instructed to ascertain if the United States Attorney at Kansas City, Missouri, had any objection to offer to the contemplated action of the Division in sending the Thompson Sub-Mechine gun, recently recovered at the time of Subject Richetti's arrest, to the Colt Factory in order that the secret number could be ascertained therefrom. This gun is mentioned in my letters to the Division dated November 8 and 14, 1934.

Special Agent H. E. Anderson conferred with Mr. Randall Wilson, Assistant United States Attorney at Kansas City, Missouri, who is hendling the instant case at which time Mr. Wilson stated that he had no objection to the Division's contemplated action in this regard. Mr. Wilson indicated to Agent Andersen that he was desirous of having the employee at the Colt Factory, who located the number, to put an identifying mark of some kind on the gun at the time of such examination. I furnished this information to Mr. Temm, by telephone, on November 26, 1934, and pursuant to his additional request contact was again had with Assistant United States Attorney Wilson by Agent Andersen, at which time Mr. Wilson indicated that it was not essential that such an identifying merk be placed on the gun by the Colt employee; that Mr. Wilson had in mind keeping the continuity of the possession of the gun intact. He added that as he had placed an identifying mark of his own on the gun at the time it was in Kansas City, further identifying marks by employees at the Colt Factory will ? RECORDED & INDEXED be unnecessary.

The policy of not revealing the location of the secret number guns was explained to Mr. Wilson and, hence, was made clear to him thy it would not be possible to obtain the name of the employee who made the discovery of the number on the gun.

Reference is made to the letter received from the Kansas City office, dated October 16, 1934, with reference to exploded shotgun cases found at the scene of the Kansas City massacre.

The details of the possession of shotguns at the time of transporting Nash at Kansas City have been discussed with Special Agent Frank Smith. He recalls nothing about the obtaining of such guns, it being his recollection that these guns were obtained by Agent Lackey and by Chief of Police Reed of McAlester.

Special Agent Smith proceeded to McAlester, Oklahoma, on November 8, 1934, and discussed the matter of the possession of such shotguns with Chief of Police Abbott. Chief Abbott had no information relative to the guns taken by Mr. Reed. Mr. George Reed, son of the late Chief of Police at McAlester, stated that his father owned a 10 gauge pump shotgun, and that after his father was killed, that he proceeded to Kansas City where his father's shotgun was exhibited to him and which he promptly identified. This gum was later shipped to George Reed at McAlester and the gun was examined by Agent Smith. It is a Model 12-16 Gauge Winchester Hammerless Pump Gun, originally having a 28 inch barrel. The barrel is presently 18 inches long, and the gun bears factory number 11337 on the gun, and factory number 310580 on the barrel. George Reed fired five shells from this gun in the presence of Agent Smith, which are being transmitted to the Division under separate RECORDED cover with a copy of this letter.

Agent Smith has no other definite knowledge relative to the shotguns carried at Kansas City, but it is his recollection that two such guns were carried in the party. No further information could be 934 obtained at McAlester relative to the second gun.

A review of the autopsy reports node by the coroner at Kanent

City, lissouri, has been sade to determine the probability of the various parties mentioned by Cill having been killed by shut—gun blasts. These satopsy reports are set out in report by Special Agent Trainor dated at general City, kissouri, march 20, 1984. Segarding Agent Caffrey the autopsy showed that there were so missiles apparent in his body at the time the autopsy was performed. There was apparently but one wound which passed completely through his head. The coroner did not show in his report what type of gun may have been used in the killing of Bash. Mr. Gill in his expert epinion during June, 1985, explained that since he found bullet holes through the back of the ear of agent Gaffrey, he believed that the bullet which willed Bash penetrated from that point and that the core of the bullet passed on through Hash's heed from the rear and that the jacket of the bullet stuck to the outside of the scalp after having been loosened from the core by passing through the steel body of the car.

In the absence of any definite and scientific proof it appears that it would be impossible to determine whether Frank Rash and Frank Rermanson were killed by means of a shot-gun or atter firety. Hr. Gill has previously

Mr. Spears telephoned from Kansas City and advised regarding my recent conversation with Mr. Nathan on the Floyd gun sent to the Division, that they had talked with Mr. Wilson, the Assistant United States Attorney there today; that he stated that it was all right to send the gun to the factory to have the secret number revealed; however, that he desired that whoever located the number make some sort of identification marks on the gun and a report made/to same in order that he would be in a position to testify relative to the location of the number. I advised Mr. Spears that under no circumstances should this information be brought out in testimony; that the location of the number on the gun was one of the secrets that we would not reveal. Mr. Spears then stated that if we were ever going to identify the gun we would have to tell how we did it, and I told Mr. Spears that we were not going to identify the gun; that this was purely an Mr. Spears stated that it was his underinvestigative procedure. standing that the Assistant United States Attorney did not necessarily contemplate using the above information in the trial, but he wanted to have it so that in the event he had to state what had been done to the gum he could. I informed Mr. Spears that it was my understanding from the above that all the Assistant United States Attorney was interested in was the continuity of possession of the gun, and he stated he believed this was correct, but would verify same and advise. Mr. Spears that the only reason we were interested in tracing the guns was to see where the people were obtaining them, but this should have no effect in connection with the indictments in this case.





With reference to Division letter dated November 21, 1934, in the above entitled case, requesting advice as to whether or not Jaunaita Buelah Baird and Rose Baird are wanted by the authorities at Mount Zion, Kentucky, your attention is respectfully invited to the report of Special Agent J. F. Sears, Cincinnati, Ohio, dated March 5, 1934, in which it is stated that the Baird girls were returned to Williamstown, Kentucky, for trial for robbery of the Mount Zion Deposit Bank. They were sentenced to a term of three years and were incarcerated in the State Penitentiary at Frankfort, Kentucky. Ohlespeal the Court of Appeals reversed this case for lack of evidence and the case was returned for trial at Williamstown, Kentucky. Later the case was dismissed against the Baird girls by the Circuit Judge evidently for the reason that they had no more sufficient evidence than that for which the Court of Appeals reversed the case.

For this reason it appears that the Baird girls are no longer wanted by the authorities at Williamstown, Kentucky.

The developments in the Kansas City Massacre have been the release of Beulah and Rose Baird by the Oklahome City office after information had been obtained from them respecting their association with Floyd and Richetti. The Buffalo Office reports that Rose Baird using the alias, Byrl West, accompanied byher sister, Beulah OBsird, alias Edith Brennan, purchased a Ford Sedan at Buffalo, N.Y., on October 18, 1934; that the Baird sisters had lived with Floyd and Richetti from September 21, 1933 to October 18, 1934 in apartment #821, 8 Eighteenth Street, Buffalo, N.Y.; that the photograph of Floyd has been identified as resembling the individual who remained in the apartment at all times and was frequently seen pacing the floor of the apartment. A comprehensive report has been received from the Kansas City office covering the recent session of the Federal Grand Jury. The report discusses the indictments returned against Galatas etal, Richetti, Reppert, Higgins and Rayen, and lists the names of all witnesses who appeared before the Grand Jury. A copy of the report and copies of the indictments are being furnished to the Attorney General for his information. The Technical Laboratory is presently engaged in analyzing the ballistics evidence with respect to the current charges appearing in the columns of the Kansas City Journal Post based, apparently, on information furnished by Merle Gill, Kansas City, Missouri, ballistician. The Kansas City office is being instructed to have no further dealings with Gill nor is any information to be furnished him. Respectfully, R.P. MEMORANDUM OF EVENTS LEADING UP TO INFORMATION CONCERNING WHEREABOUTS OF CHARLES ARTHUR FLOYD:

About 10 o'clock on the morning of October 22, 1934, Special Agent M. J. Purvis, advised Special Agents R. G. McCallum, D. Dilillo and C. F. Risler that Floyd had been seen about ten miles north of East Liverpool. We three were directed to go in this locality and patrol this locality to obtain any information possible. We patrolled in this section until about 12:15 P.M. when we pulled in at a gas station to contact Special Agent M. J. Purvis at the Traverse Hotel, East Liverpool, Ohio. I had just finished making this telephone call to SAC Purvis when Clyde Birch, a Constable, rushed into the gas station and said "Are there any D. J. men here. " He was followed by Robert Robinson, a farmer. I made myself known and was then advised by Birch that Robinson had fed "Pretty Boy" Floyd at his farm house about fifteen minutes ago. The farm house was about six miles away from the gas station. I immediately re-called SAC Purvis and informed him of these facts and the five of us, Constable Birch, Mr. Robinson, Agents McCallum, Dilillo and myself, immediately proceeded to a school house about a quarter of a mile from the farmer's home. Constable Birch and Agent McCallum started immediately to patrol the road, in Constable Birch's car. Agent Dilillo accompanied Robert Robinson to his farm in order that the Robinson family could identify the picture of Floyd. Constable Birch told me at about this time that he dropped into Robinson's farm and asked Robinson whether or not he had seen "Pretty Boy" Floyd, and that Robinson replied to the fact that he didn't know that he had fed a stranger a few minutes before. Robinson described this stranger to Birch, who recognized it to be the person of Floyd. He immediately, together with Robinson, hurried to locate some of the Department of Justice Agents.

It was the result of the information given to me by Constable Birch in the presence of Robert Robinson, that eventually lead to the finding of Floyd.

In the evening at the Traverse Hotel, Constable Birch and Robert Robinson were in the hotel room which was occupied by the Agents. To the best of my recollection I introduced Birch and Robinson to SAC Purvis and told Purvis at the time that these were the men from whom I obtained the original information as to the exact whereabouts of Floyd, and to the best of my recollection I told Purvis at the time that, in my opinion, these men should be entitled to any reward which may have have been offered.





It is noted that Mr. Haupt was the officer on duty at the Kansas City Police Department to whom Special Agent in Charge Vetterli talked on the night of June 16, 1933 for the purpose of making arrangements to have officers of that Department at the Union Station on the morning of June 17th. I felt the Division would be interested in this testimony. A copy of the transcript of this individual's testimony is also attached to copy of this letter for Inspector Cowley, at Chicago.

In connection with the testimony given before the Grand Jury, you are advised that it was my understanding that the stenographer employed to take this testimony would make additional copies of the transcript, and that these copies would be furnished to this office. However, only one copy of the transcript was made. The United States Attorney has agreed that the transcript of all the testimony taken may be loaned to this office for its information and for copying such portions of it as appear desirable. This testimony is quite voluminous and would require considerable time to copy in its entirety. Before undertaking this task I would like to have the advice of the Division as to whether it is desirable to make copies of the testimony, either in whole or in part. The testimony is being examined by Agents of this office and any matters of particular interest will, of course, be noted.

In connection with the Kansas City Massacre case, please be informed that I have just been telegraphically advised by the Kansas City, Missouri Division Office that information has been received from Colonel B. M. Casteel of the Missouri State Highway Patrol to the effect that one Francis McMeiley, who was arrested at Corydon, Iosa and is not in the sustody of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, has admitted his participation in the murder of Bergeant Benjamin Moore of the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Sheriff Roger Wilson, at Columbia, Missouri on June 15, 1931. McMeiley names Klrey C. McKeever as an accomplice. The gun found in McMeiley's possession has been positively identified by the local suthorities as the weapon used in the Columbia, Missouri killings.

Adam Richetti, who was recently taken into sustody by the local authorities at Wellsville, Ohio, and who is presently being held by the Missouri State Highway Patrol as one of the murderers, is now considered as innocent of this crime and is to be surrendered to the Kansas City, Missouri authorities.

The Kanses City Office of this Division has been instructed mot to take custody of Richetti, but that he should be delivered to the United States Marshal or the United States Attorney, Kanses City, Missouri.

As the Division has been advised, Agents of this office on the night of November 15, 1934 took into custody Jaunaita Baird with aliases and Rose Baird with aliases, women companions of Floyd and Richetti, at the home of Mrs. W. L. Floyd at Sallisaw.

Agents who took these women into custody were John B./Little, O. G. Hall, George H. Franklin and Frank J. Whelan. The taking of these women into custody was effected without the aid, assistance or knowledge of any local peace officers. It was done speedily and quietly. Agent Franklin was posted in the rear of the house, Agent Whelan was stationed in the front thereof and Agents Little and Hall entered the house. These Agents informed me that there was no disturbance or resistance of any kind, nor did any arguments of any kind take place in connection therewith.

On Sunday, November 18th, I had occasion to interview the informant and his woman companion who have been working with us in connection with this matter. They told me that Mrs. Floyd has stated that she expects to make a complaint against the Agents who took these two women into custody at her residence to the effect that the Agents were profane, abusive and otherwise guilty of misconduct on said occasion. The informant told me that Mrs. Floyd has even gone so far as to ask every person present in the residence that night to make a sworn statement to the effect that the Agents conducted themselves as indicated. The informant and his woman told me, however, that the Agents conducted themselves gentlemanly and there was no profanity nor any abuse or misconduct of any kind. The informant advised me that Mrs. Floyd said that she expects to write me a letter complaining against these agents and that possibly she will seek the assistance of

Fred Green, County Attorney, Sallisaw, in the preparation of said complaint. Fred Green is about the age of Charles Floyd and is alleged to have attended grade school with him and is reputed to have been a friend of Floyd.

Agent Little informed me that persons present in the Floyd home at the time these women were apprehended were Mrs. W. L. Floyd; her son, E. W./Floyd, and wife; the informant and his woman; a young girl who lives in the neighborhood and who works in a restaurant in Sallisaw, but whose name was not obtained; three young children; and Jaunaita and Rose Baird.

As of possible interest to the Division, the informant told me that Bert Cotton, the Chief of Police at Sallisaw, is generally suspected of having informed the Division to the effect that these women were in Mrs. Floyd's residence as it is reported that he was, seen to go into a telephone booth in Sallisaw during the afternoon of the 15th and that he remained there for several minutes, apparently engaged in conversation. The informant further stated that Sheriff Billy Byrd of Sallisaw is alleged to have made the statement in the community to the effect that he felt the Division should have shown him the courtesy of having him go along at the time the girls were picked up; that the Sheriff is reported to have made a statement to the effect that he did not believe the persons who picked up these women were Government Agents and that possibly it was all a frameup and the persons who got them were hi-jackers. Of course it would have been inadvisable to have sought the assistance of Sheriff Byrd for the reason that it is almost a fact of general knowledge that he was friendly to Floyd and never made any effort to effect his apprehension in years past when he visited his home.

The informant stated that Mrs. Floyd has a hatred for all peace officers and practically anyone connected with law-enforcement, which of course is the reason that she has spoken of making the alleged complaint against the Agents in this matter.

I feel that the Division should have this information and if and when such a complaint is received, I do not feel that it merits any investigative attention whatever and unless specifically instructed to conduct such an investigation, if and when such a complaint is received, I do not propose to take any action in connection therewith.

The informant told me that there are people, not naming any individuals, in the vicinity of Sallisaw who are infuriated and incensed at the fact that Charles Floyd was killed and that it is his belief that they would do almost anything in an underhanded way to retaliate against Agents of the Division, possibly to the extent of shooting someone in the back. I, however, do not place much credence in this but I thought the Division should be apprised thereof.





MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TAME

Mr. Vetterli telephoned from St. Louis and stated that they were having a conference in regard to the Henses City Massacre Case there today; that there is some question as to the attitude of the Division toward the advisability of using the statement of Vivien Mathews; that this statement is the basis of the entire case, and the United States Attorney is rather insistent that he be permitted to introduce that statement as a free and voluntary confession regardless of what might have been said to the women; that it would not be given any publicity and would not be used against her. I told Mr. Vetterli that I believe in keeping my word to anybody; that if we give our word to keep faith with someone, we should not violate that trust. Mr. Vetterli stated that it was his epinion that the purpose for which that statement was originally used has now been served, in that Floyd is dead.

I suggested that she ought to be interviewed again, and if she is willing to now let the statement be made public, I would have no ebjection to it; that it would be a good idea for Agents Suran and McKept to interview her again and if she were willing to withdraw the restriction which was originally placed against the statement, I would be willing to let it be made public; that, however, as we had given our word to her to keep the statement in strictest confidence, it was not my desire to break the trust.

Division by Mr. Bruce Mathan of the Kansas City Office in which he stated that now that the disposition of Richetti was up, Sheriff Bash and the Mr. Nathan Prosecuting Attorney of Jackson County, wanted turned over to them all the Mr. Tolson evidence now in our possession; that the United States Attorney also wanted Mr. Clegg. this evidence. I told Er. Vetterli that in view of the above facts, it would be desirable to have a re-interview with Vivien Mathews; further, that I had no objection to the presence of the United States attorney at this interview; that the interviewing Agents should endeavor to get her permission to let the statement be introduced at the trial. I told him that in view of the fact that the statement which she gave us was of minost importance in the case, and further in view of the fact that we had given our word, we should not break this sanfidence.

I instructed him, therefore, to take the above suggestion up with the United States Attorney and get his reaction; that arrangements should be made at the earliest possible moment for Mr. Lackey, Mr. Vetterli and Mr. Smith to view Richetti; that it should also be ascertained immediately whether the Prosecuting Attorney is a men of honor or whether he is a procked politicism,

Er. Vetterli suggested that the conference would be probably held over through tomorrow; that they might want to confer with Agents Suran, McKee and possibly Mr. Brantley. I told him that in the event the conference wanted to see those men, I was perfectly willing that this be done.

I told Mr. Vetterli that I am perfectly willing to do everything we can to assist Sheriff Bash and the United States Attorney in this anter, but that we are going to do it in an honorable way.
