In regard to the attached letter dated Bovember 28, 1934, from Special Agent in Charge Wathen of the Kansas City Office concerning the disposition of Richetti and the desire of the authorities in Jackson County to receive any information which might be in our possession which would prove Richetties connection with the Kenses City messacre, I believe that, first, of course, such Agents of our service as were at the Kansas City massacre should wise Richetti and determine whether they can recognise him as being one of those present at the massagre. Then I think we should determine whether the information in our possession of a confidential character should be made evailable to Sheriff Bash. Of course, if there is in our possession definite information, either through identification of our own Agents or through other sources which are not strictly confidential which would establish the guilt of Richetti in the Kansas City massacre, of sourse the same should be made available to the proper authorities so that proper prosecution sould be initiated. I of course would like to have the views of Special Agent in Charge Bathan as to whether the Prosecuting Attorney, Mr. Juraves, is a men who can be relied upon to vigorously prosecute this case. In connection with the Kansas City/Massacre case, the Kansas City, Missouri Division Office, on November 25, 1984 received from Colonel B. M. Casteel of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, information to the effect that one Francis McNeiley, who was arrested at Corydon, Iowa and is now in the custody of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, has admitted his participation in the murder of Sergeant Benjamin Moore of the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Sheriff Roger Wilson, at Columbia, Missouri on June 15, 1953. McNeiley names Elroy C. McKeever as an accomplice. The gun found in McNeiley's possession has been positively identified by the local authorities as the weapon used in the Columbia, Missouri killings.

Adam Richetti, who was recently taken into custody by the local authorities at Wellsville, Ohio, and who is presently being held by the Missouri State Highway Patrol as one of the murderers, is now considered as innocent of this crime and is to be surrendered to the Kansas City, Missouri authorities.

The Kansas City Office of this Division was instructed not to take custody of Richetti, but that he should be delivered to the United States Marshal or the United States Attorney, Kansas City, Missouri.

On November 3, 1934, the Federal Grand Jury at Kansas City, Missouri, returned an indictment against the above named charging that they committed perjury while testifying before the Grand Jury which was investigating the case commonly known as the Kansas City massacre. These defendants were taken into custody by the United States Marshal at Kansas City, November 4, 1934, at which time descriptions were taken of them and their fingerprints recorded. The Marshal's office advises that the fingerprints were forwarded to the Division the same day.

This office has endeavored to secure the criminal records of the defendants from the United States Marshal, but he advised that the records were turned over to the United States Attorney, the latter, however, is unable to find them. It is requested therefore that this office be furnished with the criminal records of the above named defendants and any personal history which may appear on their fingerprint cerds. In harmony with the request made by Mr. Milligan, United States Attorney at Kansas City, I am submitting herewith remarks which were made to the writer immediately after the Kansas City Massacre, I understand Special Agents in Charge Enrysy and Jones are also to submit memorandums in connection with this matter.

The day of the Kensas City Massacre, while I was at the pelice station, a remark was made by Kr. Reppert, although I cm not absolutely positive that it was he who made the remark, to the effect that he was confident that no Kansas City gungsters had been mixed up in the Kansas City Massacre ewing to the fact that John Laxia had made a curvey and found there was no connection of any of the Kansas City element with the Union Station shooting.

The following day, which was a Sunday, in harmony with Agents in Charge Hervey and Jones, I went to police headquarters and there had a conversation with Mr. Reppert, Director of Police, and Chief of Detectives Higgins and in the presence of all three Mr. Reppert stated that the McElroy case was a Kansas City case and the Union Station killing was not their baby, or words to that effect, but was a Federal case and made some remark to the effect that we had esused the decease of two of their police officers.

Please be advised that a conference was held at the St. Louis TOW Division office Saturday, December 1, 1934, on the above captioned matter in which there were present United States Attorney Milliam of 34 A.K. Kansas City and two of his assistants, Special Agents Gus Jones, George: STACE Harvey, R. E. Vetterli and W. F. Trainor, and Sheriff Bash of Kansas City.

The United States Attorney went over the evidence with respect to a number of subjects in this case, dealing first with the conspiracy charge. There was some question as to whether statements had been taken freely and voluntarily and, therefore, would be admissible in court. In one or two instances it appears that statements were secured from some of the defendants with the promise that their statements would not be used against them and would be treated confidentially. The statement of Vivian Matthews, which statement is perhaps the best secured to date and which is the crux of the entire case, apparently fell within this category.

Accordingly, the writer telephoned to the Director, personally, at Washington to secure his opinion with respect to the use of these statements and was advised that he, the Director, felt that if these statements were made under certain conditions and promises made by Division agents that we should adhere to these statements, providing the defendants made good their promises, owing to the fact that if such were not the case word would no doubt be scattered from coast to coast to the effect that Division agents had secured statements from underworld characters and then had not proven true to their promises, and thus it would make it exceedingly difficult for the Division to work with the

COPIES DESTROYED in the future in connection with other cases which might arise.

The Director's instructions were given to the group. We later telephoned to Special Agent McKee at Chicago, who stated that the statement secured from Vivian Matthews was made voluntarily and she understood specifically that this statement would not be used against her if she pleaded guilty, but if she did not plead guilty to the charges preferred, then the statement sould be used.

Accordingly, I again discussed this matter with the Director, telephonically, and he advised that if, of course, any of the defendants retracted any part of the bargain which they had made with the Division then that nullified the entire matter. In other words, the Director stated that if the defendants remained true to their bargain we would remain true to our bargain, otherwise the entire matter was nullified. The Director advised I could tell the group that if Vivian Matthews did not plead guilty that then, under the conditions under which the statement was secured, the statement which she made could be used against her. I advised the group of the Director's decision and the United States Attorney and all parties were satisfied.

This letter is to inform the Director, who requested I advise him of the following, to the effect that the United States Attorney at Kansas City has agreed that if Vivian Matthews does enter a plea of guilty then her statement will not be used. Of course, it would not be admissible under those circumstances anyway, but that if she does not enter a plea of guilty then the statement will be used. We went over this case very carefully with Special Agent McKee, telephonically, at Chicago so that there is no misunderstanding as to what promises were made to Vivian Matthews.

As a result of the conference the United States Attorney stated that the conspiracy case would go to trial at Kansas City on December 25th or 27th, 1934. During the latter part of this conference we also went over certain remarks which had been made to respective Division agents by police authorities at Kansas City, covering possible perjury charges on the part of certain law enforcement officials at Kansas City.

I furnished the office addresses of the various Agents, feeling that in the event he did desire to subpoena them, they could undoubtedly be reached by addressing a subpoena to this office, and that there could be no good reason for refusing the information. I also furnished the address of Special Agent in Charge Harvey, on the assumption that Higgins referred to Harvey rather than Hardy.



I called Mr. R. B. Nathan regarding the letter from the Kansaa Gity of November 28, concerning the possible prosecution of Richetti in the State. I inquired as to whether the Prosecuting Attorney Greves is a man who can be relied upon to vigorously prosecute the case. Mr. Nathan stated that Agraves is connected with the Pendergast faction there. I advised that your reaction to the letter from Kanses City was that if the prosecuting attorney was a reliable and vigorous prosecuting attorney that we probably should turn over to Sheriff Bash information in our possession which was not of a confidential character. Mr. Nethan stated Besh is of the opinion that if Graves is given the information - that he will vigorously prosecute. I advised that we could not use the information furnished by VivianOMathis. Mr. Nathan stated that the information he had received was that the statement given by Vivien Mathis was made volunterily but on the promise that it would not be used in the event she entered a plea of guilty. He stated that the other evidence concerning Richetti is fingerprint identification; that there has been an identification by Mrs. Swift of the Travel Bureau at the Union Station. The Agents will view Richetti on the 7th of December.

Mr. Nathan stated Graves had called him this morning and stated that a question had arisen as to whether to file a murder charge as to Richetti; that a warrant has already been issued for him. Graves stated that several attorneys had been endeavoring to get in touch with Richetti, but he did not want to file and have a habeas corpus brought which would require that he produce all the State's evidence within twenty-four hours; that he would not take any further action in this matter until we had given him whatever information it was our intention to convey to him. Richetti is now in State custody with Federal warrants filed against him. He stated that the Sheriff at Boliver also has a detainer filed against Richetti on a kidnaping charge. I asked that a letter be written to the Division concerning the connection of Graves with the Pendergast machine.



Reference is made to Division letter dated November 7, 1934, furnishing information regarding an additional criminal record of subject Volney Davis, showing his arrest as Roy Green by the Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, on January 21, 1925, charged with investigation, and his return to the State Penitentiary at McAlester. Oklahoma, on January 23, 1925, as an escape. The Division submitted a photograph of subject Davis taken at that time and requested that this photograph be exhibited to persons acquainted with Davis in order to establish whether or not this photograph was a better likeness of Davis than the one already in possession of the various field offices.

The above mentioned photograph of Davis was exhibited by Special . Agent R. D. Brown to Helen Tyrnes, 1046 Waller Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. who recently received a visit from Volney Davis, and who has seen him frequently during the past year and a half. It will be noted from the photograph that Davis appears to have a sore on his upper lip.

Miss Byrnes advised that this photograph is not as good a likeness of Davis as one shown her on previous occasions, which is the photograph already in possession of the Chicago Division of fice, and which has been furnished to all field offices. She further stated that Davis has no sore or mark of any kind on his upper lip. She stated the photograph which has previously been shown her, in her opinion, is a fairly good likeness of Davis. She stated he is now apparently several pounds heavier and more mature appearing than when the photograph in question was taken and that he now has a very ruddy complexion, indicating he has spent a great deal of time out of doors.



Russell Foley stated that his father, L. E. Foley, is an Agent for the Fort Dodge and Des Moines Railroad, at Webster City, Icwa, and it was from his father that he had secured the information. Accordingly, Agent located Mr. L. E. Foley, who stated that Bill Dillon, an alderly man living above the Greeley Furniture Store, in Webster City, had mentioned something to the effect that Phaby Face Helson had been seen in town, but that he thought it was one of the Barrow Gang.

In company with L. E. Foley, Agent interviewed Bill Dillen, who stated that he was in "Dutch's Restaurant" one night during the first three months of 1934, at which time Mrs. Woody, Dutch Fontana's mother-in-law, made the remark that "PRETTY BOY" FLOYD had been in the restaurant a few weeks prior to that time and that he had been there in answer to a letter she had written to Mrs. Floyd, asking for financial assistance. Mrs. Woody stated that Mrs. Floyd had replied that "Charles" would drop in to see her. Dillon stated that Mrs. Woody had been drinking and was rather talkative on that occasion and he was unable to recall any further details of what she said. Dillon said there were several other people in the restaurant at that time, but he could not recall at this time, who these individuals were.

Agent interviewed Chief of Police J. R. Silver and Captain
Dick Carpenter of the Webster City, Iowa, Police Department, from whom
it was learned that "Dutch" Fontana had operated a soft drink parlor, known
as "Dutch's Restaurant" on Second Street, between Seneca and Willson Avenue,
in Webster City, but that it had been raided about one year ago, at which
time some liquor was found on the premises and Fontana was arrested and
turned over to the County Sheriff; that Fontana was convicted and sentenced
to three months in prison and fined \$300.00, but that he had obtained a
pardon from the Covernor, because of ill health, after serving about two
months of his sentence.

The officers stated that Fontana had since gone out of business and was now living at 309 E. First Avenue, in Webster City, Iowa and it was their opinion he was selling liquor on these premises but they had been unable to secure positive proof. They stated that Fontana's wife and her mother had some from Oklahoma, but that they had not been aware that these women had been visited by anyone from Oklahoma, since coming to Webster City.

Agent interviewed Rugene Miller, Deputy Sheriff, who stated that Fontana had been in the County Jail from Jamuary 13, 1934 to March 7, 1934 on a charge of illegal possession of intoxicating liquor; that he plead guilty and was sentenced to the county jail and fined \$300.00 but that he had later been pardoned by the Covernor, because of his ill health.

Deputy Sheriff Miller further stated they had been keeping Fontana's place under observation for some time, as they had received information he was again selling liquor and if during this surveillance, they noted envone enswering the description of the Subjects wanted by this Division, they would notify the Omaha Division Office.





Reference is made to my telegram of November 27, concerning recent developments in connection with charges of the Missouri State Nichmay Patrol against Richetti, growing out of the killing of two men at Columbia, Lissouri, in June, 1933. In accordance with the telement at Columbia of Mr. Term of the Division on November 28, no phonic instructions of Mr. Term of the Division on November 28, no sectivity is being taken by this office with reference to possibly obtaining custody of Richetti.

It is noted from press reports at Kansas City today that authorities at Columbia, Missouri, are contemplating the possibility of delivering Richetti for prosecution in Polk County, growing out of the hidnaring of Sheriff Killingsworth. The press also reports that the question of turning Richetti over to Sheriff Bash, of Jackson County, is receiving consideration.

Mr. Bash called me by telephone today and advised that he talked briefly with County Prosecutor Graves concerning his desire to bring Richetti to Ransas City for trial on charges of murder growing out of the Union Station killings. At that time Graves advised him out of the Union Station killings. At that time Graves advised him that he would vigorously prosecute Richetti if evidence of his participation in the massacre were furnished. Graves counselled against beach endeavoring to obtain custody of the prisoner unless it were possible to convict him after his return here. Mr. Bash stated that he is very anxious that the Division cooperate with his in furnishing any available evidence which could be used in a prosecution of Richetti. He stated that the prosecuting attorney at Columbia will not decide for approximately five days what disposition will be made of Richetti, and

expressed the wish that I confer with him concerning the eveileble evidence, within that period of time.

Mr. Bush is extremely anxious to have Richetti prosecuted and convicted in Jackson County. In addition to his natural wish in this regard, he is considerably exercised because of recent adverse newspaper content appearing in the Kansas City Journal-Post, which is to the effect that the massacre has not been solved, and that the Government is without evidence connecting Floyd and Richetti with it. We feels that because of his close association with this office he is "on trial" before the public, and if he cannot produce, will be subject to considerable embarrassment. I might state that Mr. Milligan, United States Attorney at Kansas City, has also expressed the view that the same situation applies to his office and to the Division. Of course, these gentlemen are interested in political angles with which the Division is not concerned.

In this situation, I would appreciate the advice of the Division as to the action desired by this office. It is realized that some of the information which we have is confidential in its nature, and not available for use at any trial of Richetti. In the event it is desired that Mr. Bash and the prosecuting attorney here be furniched with such information as can be given, the question of a possible personal identification by the Agents present at the massacre will undoubtedly arise. I will accordingly expreciate advice as to any steps which the Division might be willing to take to have those agents view Richetti in person for purposes of possible identification. Your early consideration of this matter will be appreciated.

present his evidence to the court within twenty-four hours. In this connection, it is noted that a warrant charging Richetti with nurder in Jackson County has previously been issued, and it was upon this warrant that he was brought to Jackson County by deruty sheriffs. Graves suggested that the Marshal file the warrants issued in Federal court for Richetti, in order to avoid the possibility of his release by habeas corpus. I am informed that this has been done. I am further informed that a warrant issued in Polk County, charging the kidnaping of Sheriff Killingsworth, has been filed as a detainer against Richetti. When talking to mr. Graves, I informed him that I would communicate with him at such time as we might be in a position to furnish any evidence Richetti. He had been previously advised by Mr. Bash that it was contemplated that the Division Agents present at the massacre would be given an opportunity to see Richetti in person within a short time.

Special Agent H. E. Andersen has advised me that in a conversation with United States Attorney Milligen today, Hr. Milligen suggested that it would not be harmful to the Government's case if the county authorities were furnished evidence showing the presence of Richetti in Kansas City on the day of the massacre; the evidence showing the finding of Richetti's latent fingerprint at the home occupied by Miller; and any evidence of personal identification.

I will not confer with Mr. Graves with the view of giving him any information concerning this case until advised by the Division.





Tith reference to the possibility of the defense in the perjury trials growing out of this case desiring to call certain Division Agents as witnesses, you are advised that attorneys for Reppert and Hissins have filed a motion in Federal court at Kansas City to permit the taking of depositions of the Agents named in my previous communication. The United States Attorney will resist this motion, and it will be heard at Kansas City on December 10, 1934. The United States Attorney does not desire that depositions of these Agents be taken and, in the event it appears necessary, will advise the court that subpoenss will be issued for any Agents having any material evidence, in order that they might be present and examined in open court at the time of the perjury trials. I will advise you of the outcome of the defense motion.
