Police Department, who resides at Ravenna, Ohio, advised that on May 2, 1970, during the tarry nours of nightfall he joined a group of Kent State University policemen lead by who were confronting a large group of Ethaents in the Commons area of Kent State University campus. The Kent State University police department was endeavor to separate the students from the Eat Hall, an ROTC building which was slowly burning.

Immediately, and the rest of the men were hit by a barrage of rocks thrown from the area of the Commons. The barrage consisted of rocks, half bricks, and one projectile was one-third of a concrete block. Also thrown were railroad spikes.

Canisters of tear gas were thrown into the crowd of students and they retreated for a while. The students then moved forward up Terrace Drive and threw another barrage of rocks. Again they were hit with tear gas by the Kent State University Police Department.

The building gradually was almost totally consumed by flames and the students gradually dispersed, but threw sporadic rocks at the Kent State University policemen. Later the Chio National Guardsmen and Ohio State Patrolmen arrived and brought t situation under complete control.

advised that during the rock throwing barrages he was hit three times, twice in his right leg and one time in his groin. He advised that when he was hit in the groin, he was knocked to the ground and that the blow caused one of his testicles to swell considerably.

advised he refused to undergo treatment that night because he falt he was needed to control the rioting students. Two days later he received treatment that University Medical Center by swelling and contusion of his groin.

advised that he was unable to make any identification of students involved in the burning of the ROTC building due to the darkness of the night.

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II. BURNING OF THE ROTC BUILDING P. INTERVIEWS WITH OTHERS

Date___M=19__1970____

Arson Bureau, was interviewed at kent State University (KSU) where his department is conducting an investigation concerning fires at that campus from Hay 2-5, 1970.

explained that his department is investigating this matter as the arson is a violation of Section 2907.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. Anyone convicted of violation of this statute is suject to imprisonment from I to 10 years.

explained that on May 2, 1970, the ROTC Administration Building at KSU was set on fire and was totally destroyed by that fire. The fire is classified as an incendiary one or one which was intentionally set as opposed to an accidental type fire.

No investigation was conducted to specifically determine the cause of the fire as numerous interviews with witnesses and observers reveal that the fire was intentionally set by persons on campus. Several witnesses have described seeing persons throw railroad fuses or flares into the broken windows of the above-mentioned ROTC building and other persons were seen throwing lighted objects through the windows. He explained that some unknown individuals were seen taking rags dipped in gasoline tanks on parked motorcycles and these rags were lit and used to start the fire in the building.

The fire was started in the east corner of the building and spread to all parts of the building which considered completely destroyed.

An examination of the rubbish from the fire failed to disclose any remnants of the railroad fuses or rags which were used in starting the fire.

advised that there was another fire that same evening, May 2, 1970, in a storage bin by Bowman Hall and this bin contained grounds equipment.

5/18/70 at Kent, Ohio

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Mgain, this fire was incendiary and examination of the ruins disclosed no evidence of flares or objects which were used to start the fire.

On May 4, 1970, at approximately 3:30 p.m., ther maintenance men inside the maintenance storage bin on Portage Drive when a firebomb similar to a molotov cocktail was thrown into the building. The maintenance men were successful in putting out the fire with no loss or damage as a result.

had developed no witnesses or suspects in that matter.

Another fire was set on KSU campus on May 5, 1970, and this fire was in a frame barn located on Allerton Road and Summit Road on campus and was set at approximately 4:00 a.m. At this time, Guardsmen were on compus and one Guard saw an individual exiting from the barn and this individual ran in a southwest direction on foot. The Guardsman chased him, ordered him to stop, and then fired after the individual kept running.

The Guardsman noted the fire was burning in the center of the floor when he ran by and the barn was thereafter completely destroyed by the fire. Inside the barn were two tractors and miscellaneous equipment, the tractors being valued at approximately \$12,000 and the equipment at \$16,000. No suspects have been developed in that matter.

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

. When the torches were placed against the building. it appeared that some of the crowd was throwing rocks or some objects at the building, and she heard glass breaking. this, it appeared that most of the crowd dispersed.

Approximately an hour and a half later, she heard; that the ROTC Building was on fire and she went outside and observed this to be the situation.

She did not know any of the people in the crowd and could not identify any of them. She knows only about three persons at KSU.

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

He recalled that he, his wife, and in company with some other students left the dormitory. He thought there were several hundred students in the group. He indicated that he and were among the first in the group; however, after a short period, the students moving more rapidly soon passed them and they were at the rear of the crowd. He remembered that the police, possibly the Campu Police, were on hand and that the students were taunting them with obscenities and other comments; however, there was no confrontation that he could see.

He recalled that he and his wife stopped at the top of the hill and did not follow the group as they continued toward where the ROTC Building was located. He remembered that it was dusk and approaching night when he observed several individuals with lighted railroad flares set fire to the ROTC Building. He indicated that due to the fact he was some 500 yards away, he could not distinguish who they were; however, by their movements and the manner in which they conducted themselves, he believes they were all males. He said he saw them break the windows in the ROTC Building and throw the flares inside. This continued for several minutes and it all occurred in the immediate vicinity where some policemen were standing. Mr. was of the opinion that the policemen saw the individuals break the windows and throw the flares inside the building.

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indicated that apparently the fire did not take very rapidly because some of those involved broke out more windows apparently so the air could get inside the building to fan the flame. He said after the fire began, the building was consumed immediately.

said he could not identify any of those involved in the burning of the building because it was too dark for him to see and also the fact he was too far away to actually see who was involved in setting fire to the building he recalled that the people involved were more or less silhouettes.

said he left the campus about 11:00 PM and that after the burning of the building, the National Guard came on the campus. He remembered that the National Guard had been in the Town of Kent but had not been on the campus prior to the burning of the ROTC Building.

said he and his wife returned to Norfolk Virginia, on Sunday, May 3, 1970, and at the time the Nationa Guard was on and off the campus at Kent State University when they left Kent, Ohio.

man student, had gone back to Cleveland on Saturday, May 9, 1970, where she was staying with friends in the home of (phonetic), an attorney in Cleveland, Ohio. said he did not know the exact address of however, it was located in the Beechwood Section near Shaker Heights in Cleveland. said that his daught reportedly was present on Monday, May 4, 1970, during the tim that students were shot on the Kent State University campus. She remembered that some of her daughter's friends (students at the University), her daughter her husband and she left the dormitory and started toward the area where the rally was to take place. She said that they were at the front of the group, but soon the students passed them and her daughter commented she was going on down and would see them back at the dormitory after the rally.

remembered that the group was singing and shouting and taunting the police. She recalled they left the campus at about 11:00 PM and returned to Norfolk, Virginia, Sunday, Hay 3, 1970. She said that National Guardsmen were observed on Sunday when they left Kent, Ohio.
