I would like to advise you of the facts concerning five obscene and threatening communications mailed by Charles Augustus Livezly to President Johnson, Mrs. Johnson, John Cardinal Krol of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and me. The Newark Office of this Bureau has been in contact with United States Attorney David M. Satz, Jr., and Assistant United States Attorney Donald Horowitz who declined to prosecute Livezly. The facts of this case as well as the prosecutive decision were discussed by Special Agent Rex I. Shroder with Mr. E. Lamar Sledge of the Criminal Division on September 15, 1967, and by Special Agent [redacted] with Mr. Carl W. Belcher on September 19, 1967. However, it was not indicated as to what action, if any, was intended by the Criminal Division. The five letters in question are enclosed.

On September 13, 1967, two obscene and threatening letters were received by me signed [redacted]

Investigation identified the writer of these communications as Livezly. Subsequently, Livezly was identified as the writer of obscene and threatening letters mailed to President and Mrs. Johnson and John Cardinal Krol. Livezly is employed by Radio Corporation of America (RCA), Camden, New Jersey, in a custodial capacity. He has been observed on several occasions committing acts of masturbation at the RCA plant and has also demonstrated other aberrant sexual behavior.

An RCA physician has advised that Livezly's medical file contains no record of mental illness and this physician considers Livezly to be an eccentric individual, but one who is absolutely responsible for his actions.

Livezly admitted to Special Agents of this Bureau in a signed statement that he prepared and mailed the obscene and threatening communications. He denied that he intended to harm the recipients and stated the letters were sent to create trouble for persons whose names he signed on the letters. Livezly had signed names of fellow employees.

Messrs. Satz and Horowitz are of the opinion the subject is not dangerous or a real threat and believe he needs psychiatric care. Local law enforcement officials in New Jersey have advised there is no way within New Jersey State laws whereby Livezly can be committed to an institution by them.

This subject has admitted writing five extremely obscene communications. He is not known to be mentally incapacitated and, as a matter of fact, his employer's physician states he is absolutely responsible for his actions. It would appear Livezly has the definite potential, as evidenced by his past perverted actions, of committing sexual crimes. Accordingly, I would appreciate your comments in connection with this matter in view of the apparent need for affirmative action and the nature of the threats against the President and others.

A copy of this letter is being made available to United States Secret Service for information inasmuch as the President and Mrs. Johnson were recipients of letters from Livezly.

This is the case concerning the extremely obscene letters received 9/13/67 threatening the Director's life unless \$1,000,000,000 was paid. Livezly, employed by Radio Corporation of America (RCA), which has knowledge of his perversions, furnished signed statement admitting writing these letters and threatening letters to President and Mrs. Johnson and Cardinal Krol, Philadelphia. U. S. Attorney, Newark, refuses to prosecute because of questionable mental condition; since there is no indication that any of the victims were in danger or that subject intended to carry out threats. We are checking with military in view of Livezly's secret clearance to determine what steps can be taken, if any, to have mental examination afforded Livezly. We are continuing our discussion with Criminal Division concerning Federal prosecution of subject and we will go on the record protesting the failure of U. S. Attorney, Newark, to vigorously prosecute this matter.



Synopsis: Assistant Prosecutor, Camden County, N.J., advised that a review of the local statute books and the criminal code for Camden County, N.J., does not give his office any jurisdiction to move against LIVEZLY, as the mailing of the extortion letters in this case involve a Federal violation and not a local violation. Information from Security Officer, Radio Corporation of America, Camden, N.J., on 10/25/67, discloses that no action taken against LIVEZLY for a physical examination either by the Company or by the Industrial Security Office, Columbus, Ohio. LIVEZLY still has secret clearance at RCA. On 10/25/67, [REDACTED] RCA, Camden, N.J., indicates that Company will make immediate arrangements for psychiatric examination of LIVEZLY. The FBI Lab concluded that the typewriting on the letter and envelope of the extortion letter to CARDINAL JOHN KROL, at Philadelphia, Pa., was prepared by the same typewriter that prepared the other extortion letters in this matter.

DETAILS

On September 26, 1967, First Assistant Prosecutor ALBERT SCARDUZIO, Camden County, New Jersey Prosecutor's Office, Camden, New Jersey, advised the writer that he does not feel that LIVEZLY has violated any criminal law in Camden County, New Jersey. SCARDUZIO advised that he will review the New Jersey State Statute books and will advise if he can find any violation of local law under which LIVEZLY could be arrested.

NK 9-2084

On September 26, 1967, Assistant Prosecutor SCARDUZIO recontacted SA PHILIP J. CARROLL and advised that he is willing in any manner to offer assistance to the Federal Government in order to have LIVEZLY committed. SCARDUZIO advised that a review of the New Jersey State Statutes and the criminal code for Camden County, New Jersey, does not give his office any jurisdiction to move against LIVEZLY, as the mailing of the extortion letters in this case involve a Federal violation and not a local violation.

SCARDUZIO advised that as there is no local criminal violation, his office is unable to take any action against LIVEZLY. He pointed out none of the Victims reside in Camden County.

Mr. SCARDUZIO advised that the only action available locally would be for one of the individuals whose names were used on the letters sent by LIVEZLY to come in and sign a complaint against LIVEZLY for Defamation of Character. SCARDUZIO advised that this is a civil tort action and under this type of action, it would not be possible for Camden County authorities to order LIVEZLY to be given a mental examination.

The matter would be handled in civil court to determine the amount of damage to the character of the complainant as the result of the letter or letters, and if LIVEZLY were convicted, he would be given a fine by the court.

On September 26, 1967, [redacted] Radio Corporation of America (RCA), Camden, New Jersey, advised that the company doctor has recommended that LIVEZLY be given an examination by a private psychiatrist paid for by the company to determine his sanity.

[redacted] advised that this has been proposed to the company union and they are in agreement that this be done. The union has suggested to LIVEZLY that he consent to the examination by a private physician paid for by RCA, Camden, New Jersey.

[] advised that he believes that LIVEZLY will consent to this examination. He advised that it has been the company's experience in the past that when such an examination is afforded, the private psychiatrist is careful in his evaluation and he will probably not judge the subject as insane as this is regarded as almost impossible to establish with one visit.

[] advised that the examination may cause a transfer of LIVEZLY to another division of the plant, but he does not believe that it will result in the releasing of LIVEZLY from his employment on medical leave and it most certainly will not accomplish the commitment of LIVEZLY to a mental institution.

[] advised that the final arrangements for such a physical cannot be accomplished by the company immediately, and he does not feel that LIVEZLY will be given the examination for at least a month.

On October 2 and 17, 1967, [] advised that no arrangements have been made as yet for LIVEZLY to be given a physical examination by the company. [] stated that he has not received any further communication in regard to LIVEZLY from the Industrial Security Office, Columbus, Ohio, and that LIVEZLY still has a secret clearance with that company.

On October 25, 1967, [] advised that no further action has been taken by RCA to afford LIVEZLY a physical examination and that no action in regard to LIVEZLY has been taken by the Industrial Security Office, Columbus, Ohio.

[] suggested that the matter be discussed with [] RCA, Camden, New Jersey, in an effort to afford LIVEZLY a physical examination.

On October 25, 1967, [] RCA, Camden, New Jersey, advised that since LIVEZLY has been involved in writing letters, he has instructed that the guard force examine on a daily basis, the suitcase carried by LIVEZLY when he reports to work every day. [] advised that this suitcase contains only a change in clothing.

On October 25, 1967 [] advised that he will make immediate arrangements for LIVEZLY to be given a psychiatric examination by RCA, Camden, New Jersey, and he will advise the FBI of the results of the examination given.

RESULTS OF FBI LABORATORY EXAMINATION

In the Extortion Letter Q6 and the Envelope @6, sent to Cardinal JOHN KROL, at Philadelphia, one latent fingerprint of value was developed on Q6. This latent print was not identical to the fingerprints of [] of the Cardinals Office.

It was concluded that the typewriting on Q5 and Q6 was prepared with the typewriter used to prepare specimens Q1 through Q4 which were submitted previously by Newark under "J. EDGAR HOOVER-VICTIM; EXTORTION".

DETAILS:

On November 16, 1967, and November 30, 1967, [redacted] Radio Corporation of America (RCA), Camden, New Jersey, advised that no arrangements have been made by the company to date to give the subject a physical examination.
