# President Delighted by Mexico Trip

Plans New Talks; Tuthill Is Named Envoy to Brazil

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., April 16—President Johnson, buoyed by his Mexican visit, announced plans today for two more meetings with President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz and a possible Central-American tour by Mrs. Johnson.

He also named John W. Tuthill as Ambassador to Brazil, a post vacant, since January, when Lincoln Gordon became Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs

Reports from the LBJ ranch today portrayed the President as still ebullient over his Mexico City welcome. Greatly Pleased

"To say that he was pleased is an understatement," said his Press Secretary, Bill D. Moyers.

For three ecstatic hours on Thursday night the cares of the home front and of Viet nam were washed away in the roar of crowds estimated at 2 million.

The crowds' stimulant had him up at 7 a.m. Friday morning putting more "life" into a prepared speech, adding passages filled with reflections on what he had seen in the faces lining the motorcade froute.

And it had him bubbling with plans for the United States and Mexico. In a long talk with Diez Ordaz, these new projects were discussed:

Moyers said the prospect of a trip by Mrs. Johnson to "several Central and possibly South American countries" came up when Diaz Ordaz described his tour of Central America this year. No dates were discussed for either the President's or Mrs. Johnson's travel plans.

Meanwhile, in New York, Arthur, J. Goldberg, U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations, amnounced that he will make an extensive trip in several Latin-American countries this summer. Goldberg said the debails of his tour were still being arranged.

Mr. Johnson apparently was deeply impressed with his host. "The more I see of Diaz Ordaz, the more I like him," Moyers quoted him as saying Moyers said the President regarded the trip as a significant step forward in U.S. relations

with Mozico and the other nations of Latin America.

Specifically, Mr. Johnson be lieves his visit accelerated movement toward a summit meeting of the Alliance for Progress nations, Moyers said.

That conference which Mr. Johnson Thid or sed in his speech Friday, appears to be at least a year away. The President is insistent on the need for careful preparation before the chiefs of state get together.

The preparations, Moyers said, would begin with study of the program agreed on by economic ministers at Buenos Aires last month. That program runs the gamut of economic problems—stimulating private savings, tax reform measures, expanding trade, pressing for economic integration of Alliance nations, agricultural development.

The President feels that preparation for the meeting is a serious undertaking in it self movers said.

President Ambassador to Brazil, Tuthill, was cosen because he is both a diplomat and an economist, Moyers said, and was at the top of selection lists submitted by Secretary of State Dean Rusk and the chief White House talent scout. John W. Macy

Tuthill, a career Foreign
Service officer, has been U.S.
representative to the European Economic Community in
Brussels since 1962. An AllAmerica football player at
William and Mary College in
1937.32, he holds a master's
degree in economics from
Harvard. He has been both

U.S. Embassy in Paris and director of the Office of European Regional Affairs in the
State Department.

For a year before his present assignment in Brussels, Tuthill was U.S. representative to the Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development with the personal rank of Ambassador.

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

Organizations mentioned below are characterized in the Appendix.

T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 15, 1966, that "Trotskyites" from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM) planned to place a United States flag impregnated with inflammable material in a tree near the site of the unveiling of the Lincoln statue. Later, one of the "Trotskyites" planned to set fire to that flag.

Women of the Union Nacional de Mujeres Mexicanas (UNMM - National Union of Mexican Women) planned to carry out their previous program of appearing at the site of the unveiling of the Lincoln statue dressed in black and attempt to hold up signs to protest United States involvement in Vietnam. T-L stated that the Mexican police were familiar with the foregoing data.

VISIT OF PRESIDENT AND MRS. JOHNSON

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The "Trotskyites" probably refers to members of the Partido Obrero Revolucionario (POR - Revolutionary Workers Party) which is active at UNAM.

T-2 and T-3, who have furnished reliable information in the past, on April 16, 1966, made the following resume of incidents during the travel of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON from the Mexico City International Airport to Los Pinos, home of President GUSTAVO DIAZ ORDAZ of Mexico:

In front of the Benito Juarez hemicycle, Mexico, DF, about 200 students from UNAM shouted, "Johnson out of Mexico," "Johnson - Murderer," and "Yankees out of Vietnam." These students were dispersed by agents of the Judicial Police in Mexico, DF, and by agents of Special Services, Metropolitan Police Department.

When the Presidential retinue passed the corner of Insurgentes and Paseo de la Reforma, another group of students from the National Polytechnic Institute (IPN) shouted similar phrases. These students were quickly dispersed by grenadiers and by agents of Special Services of the Metropolitan Police Department.

Just before the Presidential retinue passed in front of the United States Embassy, a group of students from UNAM, headed by MANUEL AGUILAR MORA, leader of Trotskyite groups at UNAM, attempted to distribute propaganda protesting the visit of President JOHNSON to Mexico. MANUEL AGUILAR MORA was detained momentarily but released by agents of Special Services of the Metropolitan Police Department, and his followers were quickly dispersed, but not before a number of the agitators were struck by police officers.

T-I advised that the propaganda which MANUEL AGUILAR MORA attempted to distribute consisted of "flyers" containing the letterhead of POR.

Many Cuban exiles lined the streets carrying signs and flags of their country. The signs protested the "communist meddling" in their country. These signs were confiscated by police officials.

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At about 0:30 p.m. on April 14, 1966, a group of students tried to stage a meeting in front of the Banjamin Franklin Library but were unsuccessful because of the great number of police who were present.

T-4, T-5, T-3, T-7, and T-3, who have furnished reliable information in the past, provided the following summary relative to the visit of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON to Mexico:

Students of UNAM and IPN, mentioned above, were identified by these sources as students who were organized by the Juventud Comunista de Mexico (JCM - Communist Youth of Mexico) and the Student Committee Pro-Vietnam at UNAM. These sources provided substantially the same data as T-2 and T-3 concerning the incidents which occurred along the route traveled by President JOHNSON and his party.

On April 15, 1963, a group of communist students attempted to approach the park where the statue of Lincoln was being unveiled but were intercepted and dispersed by police officials.

A group of JCM members met at about 5 p.m. on April 14, 1966, to form brigades of young women to distribute about 2,000 "flyers" prepared by the Federal District Committee of the Partido Comunista Mexicano (PCM - Communist Party of Mexico) and which contained pictures of "Lincoln" and "Juarez." They then joined other students of the Student Committee Pro-Vietnam to shout insults at President LYNDON B. JOHNSON and his party as described above.

On the evening of April 14, 1966, a group of communist students from the School of Economics and the School of Political Science, UNAM, appeared at the UNAM radio station. They requested time to announce the end of a student strike and the resumption of classes at UNAM. Instead of following their announced plan, however, they launched attacks against President LYNDON B. JOHNSON concerning the invasion of the Dominican Republic and Vietnam. The office of the rector of UNAM has ordered an investigation of this incident.

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

The UNAM was unable to stage any activity as scheduled because of the close surveillance of police of ficials.

Offices of the PCM, Frente Electoral del Pueblo (FEP - People's Electoral Front), Central Cempesina Independiente (CCI - Independent Peasants Central), Movimiento Revolucionario de Magisterio (MRM - Revolutionary Teachers Movement), Movimiento de Liberacion Nacional (MLN - National Liberation Movement), and other communist-oriented groups were under close surveillance during the visit of President JOHNSON in Mexico.

Wide newspaper coverage was afforded all activities during the visit of President LYNDON B. JOHNSON to Mexico. An enthusiastic crowd of between one million and two million people turned out along the streets to give President JOHNSON, his wife, and other members of the party a friendly welcome. The Mexican police afforded excellent security.

#### APPENDIX

Union Nacional de Mujeres Mexicanas (UNMM - National Union of Mexican Women)

According to T-1, the UNMM is an organization of women's groups controlled by the PCM.

Partido Obrero Revolucionario (POR - Revolutionary Workers Party)

T-9, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available a publication of the Regional Committee of the POR, which publication described the POR as the Mexican section of the Fourth International, a Trotskyite organization.

Juventud Comunista de Mexico (JCM - Communist Youth of Mexico)

The JCM has been publicly identified as the youth group of the PCM.

Partido Comunista Mexicano (PCM - Communist Party of Mexico)

The published statutes of the PCM state, "The Communist Party of Mexico has as its final objectives to construct Socialism and to build the Communist society in Mexico."

Frente Electoral del Pueblo (FEP - People's Electoral Front)

T-1 has described the FEP, which was formally organized at Mexico, DF, June 26-27, 1963, as a PCM-dominated Mexican political organization.

## APPENDIK

Central Campesina Independiente (CCI - Independent Peasants Central)

T-10, who has furnished reliable information in the past, has advised that the CCI was formally organized in Mexico, DF, January 6-8, 1933, and prior to Deptember 1964 was reported as a Mexican farm organization under the domination of the PCM. In Deptember 1964, a split occurred in the CCI organization, and since then there have been two groups, one under the domination of the PCM and the other which professes to be opposed to PCM influence.

Movimiento Revolucionario de Magisterio (MRM - R. volutionary Teachers Movement)

T-I has advised that the MRM is the PCM-dominated faction of the Sindical Macional de Trabajadores de Educacion (Mational Union of Education Workers).

Movimiento de Liberacion Nacional (MLN - National Liberation Movement)

According to T-3, the MLN, which was formally organized at Merico, DF, in August 1961, is an anti-United States, procommunist organization under partial control by the PCM.





While Mrs. Johnson and Mrs. Diaz Ordaz spent most of the evening inside the residence except for the time when the diving and swimming exhibitions were put on at the outdoor swimming pool, Secretary of State Rusk spent the entire evening "holding court" in one side of the garden.

Former Senator Barry Goldwater, who was in Mexico for a vacation and who had made a well-publicized speech before the American Chamber of Commerce three days before, was also invited to the reception and attended there approximately one hour. His presence created somewhat of a surprise among many of the Mexican guests and he was very warmly greeted by most of the American guests.

Just prior to the departure of Mrs. Johnson and Secretary Rusk from Mexico on Saturday afternoon, April 16, the Secretary held an especially called press conference at the airport given for "foreign correspondents," which meant the American newspaper correspondents in Mexico.

Point 1

The Mexico City Office has continued to furnish the Bureau with monthly intelligence summaries containing pertinent information concerning the political scene in Mexico since the submission of referenced letter.

The Mexican Government continues to show a friendly but undemonstrative attitude toward the United States. the visit to Mexico of President and Mrs. LYNDON B. JOHNSON in April 1966, an enthusiastic crowd of over one million people turned out to greet them.

President GUSTAVO DIAZ ORDAZ of Mexico, in his speech of welcome, eulogized ABRAHAM LINCOLN (Mrs. LYNDON B. JOHNSON unveiled a statue of ABRAHAM LINCOLN which was donated by the United States to Mexico in April 1966), coupling his name with his Mexican contemporary, BENITO JUAREZ, former President of Mexico, and stressed the excellent nature of the ties which bind the two nations. To mester Call

President DIAZ ORDAZ recognized the existence of problems, great and small, past and present, between the United States and Mexico, but he called upon his people to look to the future and to forget the rancors of the past, pointing to the day when the relationships of all nations might be comparable to the fine relationship which exists between the United States and Mexico.

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#### Point 2

The PCM and the PPS, working in concert, called a meeting of communist-oriented groups on February 6, 1966, at Mexico, DF. The PCM and the PPS used this meeting to outline the resolutions and the programs formulated during the course

of the First Tri-Continental Conference, held at Havana, Cuba, January 3-15, 1966. Among those resolutions were resolutions to hold weeks of solidarity with Vietnam and the Dominican Republic.

The PCM-PPS-sponsored Week of Solidarity with Vietnam was held in Mexico March 12-20, 1966. About 4,000 to 5,000 individuals representing communist-oriented groups in Mexico participated in a demonstration on March 17, 1966, in support of the Week of Solidarity with Vietnam. They marched along a predesignated route shouting anti-United States statements and carrying signs critical of the United States policies in Vietnam. Demonstrators also burned two simulated flags of the United States. Police officers, however, maintained order, and the demonstrators were not permitted near the United States Embassy in Mexico City.

The Week of Solidarity with the Dominican Republic was scheduled for April 24-30, 1966. Because of a conflict between the PCM and the National Liberation Movement (MLN) over the Mexican delegates to the First Tri-Continental Conference, neither the PCM nor the PPS supported the Week of Solidarity with the Dominican Republic. Activities during that week were directed by the MLN, and little enthusiastic public response was elicited by the MLN.

The PCM leadership planned in November 1965 to reorganize the National Central of Democratic Students (CNED). A constituent congress of the CNED was held in April 1966, and leaders of the PCM youth organization, the Communist Youth of Mexico (JCM), were elected to offices of leadership in the CNED, including that of president. The CNED claims to have 75,000 student supporters throughout Mexico. It quickly tested its strength by calling an anti-United States, pro-Cuban demonstration on June 10, 1966, at Mexico, DF. About 2,000 students, including four busloads from UNAM and one busload from the National Polytechnic Institute, responded to the call. Police, however, dispersed all attempts to organize this demonstration.

Because of the recent reorganization of the CNED, it is too early to predict the degree of control the PCM will maintain over its activities. It is expected, however,

that the CNED will be used for anti-United States demonstrations and for support of international communist front activities.
