


### GENERAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

ON FEB. ONE SIXTYFOUR, SHERIFF DANIEL JONES, AMITE COUNTY, LIBERTY, MISS., ADVISED THAT IN REPLY TO AN INQUIRY FORM HENRY ALLEN, SON OF LOUIS ALLEN AND A NEPHEW OF ALLEN, JOHN WESLEY HORTON, SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT THAT DATE THAT THEY HAD DISCOVERED THE VICTIM/S BODY BY HIS LOGGING TRUCK, HE IMMEDIATELY INSTITUTED AN INVESTIGATION. ON ARRIVAL AT THE SCENE IN COMPANY WITH DR. BRIDGES, HENRY ALLEN AND HORTON, THEY FOUND THE BODY OF LOUIS ALLEN UNDER THE FRONT PART OF ALLEN/S TRUCK. IT WAS IMMEDIATELY OBVIOUS THAT ALLEN HAD MET DEATH AS RESULT OF POSSIBLY ONE OR TWO LOADS OF BUCKSHOT, ONE OF WHICH APPEARED TO HAVE TORN AWAY MOST OF THE LEFT SIDE OF ALLEN/S FACE. THE LIGHTS ON THE TRUCK WERE STILL ON AT THE TIME OF THE ARRIVAL AT THE SCENE AROUND TWELVE THIRTY AM, HOWEVER THE BATTERY IN THE TRUCK WAS VERY WEAK.

SPATTERED AGAINST THE LEFT FRONT WHEEL OF
THE TRUCK. THE TIRE ON THIS LEFT FRONT WHEEL WAS FLAT AND POSSIBLY

FURTHER INQUIRY BY SHERIFF JONES THORUGH THE VICTIM/S WIFE,

JAN. THIRTYONE, SIXTYFOUR. THIS TIME ESTABLISHED THROUGH A TV PROGRAM

SHERIFF JONES STATED HE REMAINED AT THE SCENE ALL NIGHT, PROTECTING THE AREA AND CONDUCTING THOROUGH CRIME SCENE SEARCH AFTER DAYLIGHT. NO LATENT PRINTS WERE LIFTED OF PERTINENCE FROM THE TRUCK, NO TIRE MARKS, FOOTPRINTS, SHOTGUN SHELLS OR OTHER PHYSICAL EVIDENCE WAS FOUND.

SHERIFF JONES INDICATED THAT HE WAS CONTINUING HIS INVESTIGATION AND HAS NOT AS YET DETERMINED THE IDENTITY OF THE ASSAILANT OR ASSAILANTS. SHERIFF JONES STATED THAT CORONER/S INQUEST WAS HELD ON FEB. ONE SIXTYFOUR AT AMITE COUNTY, AND THE FINDINGS WERE THAT LOUIS ALLEN HAD MET DEATH FROM THE BLAST OF A SHOTGUN AT THE HANDS OF PERSON OR PERSONS UNKNOWN.

SHERIFF JONES STATED THAT HE HAD NO INDICATION THAT THE VICTIM END PAGE FIVE

HAS EVER BEEN ENGAGED IN ANY VOTER REGISTRATION MATTER IN AMITE COUNTY OR ANY OTHER CIVIL RIGHTS TYPE ACTIVITY. HE STATED IN FACT, THAT ALLEN HAS ONLY THIRD GRADE EDUCATION, WAS NOT HIMSELF A REGISTERED VOTER AND HAS NEVER ATTEMPTED TO REGISTER.

E.W. STEPTOE, PRESIDENT, AMITE COUNTY CHAPTER NAACP, LIBERTY, MISS., M ADVISED FEB. TWO SIXTYFOUR, THAT LOUIS ALLEN WAS NOT ACTIVE IN ANY VOTER REGISTRATION MATTERS AMITE COUNTY, STEPTOE STATES LAST VOTER REGISTRATION ACTIVITY IN AMITE COUNTY APPROXIMATELY TWO TOSTHREE YEARS AGO.

STEPTOE ADVISED THAT HE WAS CONTACTED ABOUT SIX PM FEB. ONE SIXTYFOUR BY AOWEVER DID NOT TELL HIM THE PURPOSE OF HIS
BEING IN LIBERTY AND STEPTOE HAS NO INFORMATION AS TO CURRENT
WHEREABOUTS. ACCORDING TO STEPTOE, INDICATED HE WOULD STAY WITH
STEPTOE ON THE EVENING OF FEB. ONESIXTYFOUR, BUT NEVER RETURNED TO



NOTE: Victim, a Negro, was killed by a shotgun in Amite County, Mississippi, night of 1/31/64. Department requested inquiry because he allegedly had been engaged in voter registration work. It has been established he was not engaged in voter registration work but was a witness before Federal Grand Jury in September, 1963, concerning an allegation that local officers had hit him in the jaw with a flashlight. Grand Jury returned a No Bill. Department is considering possibility that his death may be commected with his testimony before the Grand Jury but is limiting investigation at this time to the above. St. John Barrett, Civil Rights Division, is sending confirming memorandum.

Room Holmes UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; SUBJECT: LOUIS ALLEN - VICTIM CIVIL RIGHTS St. John Barrett, Civil Rights Division, advised on 2-2-64 that the Department had received information that Louis Allen, Amite County, Mississippi, a Negro who had been active in voter registration matters, had been killed. He requested we determine the nature and extent of Allen's voter registration activities, whether an autopsy was performed and whether local investigation is being conducted. Daniel Jones, Sheriff, Amite County, Mississippi, advised that the victim's body was found on the night of 1-31-64, Her immediately instituted investigation and proceeded to the victim's home with Dr. William D. Bridges. The victim's truck was at the gate to his home and the victim was lying under the truck. No autopsy was performed as it was obvious that the victim had met death as the result of being shot once of twice with buckshot. Most of the left side of the victim's face was torn away. The victim's wife told the Sheriff she had heard three shots short! after 8:30 p.m. 1-31-64. Sheriff Jones said that he arrived at the scene at 12:30 a.m., 21-64, and remained until after daylight to protect the crime scene. He found no tire marks, footprints, or other physical evidence and no latent prints of value were lifted the truck. He is continuing his investigation. The victim planned to move to Milwaykee where he hoped to obtain work as a bulldozer operator; and on the evening of his death, he visited Loyde Cain, a former employer, for the purpose of obtaining a letter of recommendation.

In September, 1961, one Herbert Lee, a Negro who had allegedly been active in voter registration matters, was killed, in Liberty, Amite County, Mississippi, by Eugene Hunter Hurst, Jr. a Mississippi State representative. Investigation conducted at the request of the Department indicated that Hurst and Lee quarreled over a debt and Lee advanced toward Hurst with a tire iron just before the shooting. In August, 1962, the Department requested investigation of an allegation that Louis Allen had been beaten by a Deputy Sheriff for having previously stated that Lee was shot without provocation.

Allen advised in August, 1962, that he had not received any threat or intimidation as with the land witnessed the killing of Herbert Lee but the distold him the Sheriff and several other men had alked about getting him because he had discussed the Lee shooting with her Bli 112 has enied having made such a statemen had called that some hing might happen to had allen and allege that on 6-30-62 Danier Jones, who was Deputy Sheriff, and Layton Bates Town Marshall, Liberty, Mississippi, came to his home, and arrested him because he had talked to a Negro prisoner through the jail window and agreed to make a telephone call for her. ### ACTION

case involving him as a victim was presented to the Federal Grand Jury in September, 1963, and if his death resulted from this fact, it would be a violation of the Obstruction of Justice Statute.

2. After conferring with Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall, St. John Barrett requested that we ascertain details of the victim's arrest in November, 1963, and interview the victim's former employer whom he visited on the evening of his death. It is also requested we interview the victim's wife to determine whether the victim's plans to move to Milwaukee were generally known. Mr. Barrett is sending a confirming memorandum and does not desire any further investigation at this time.

3. Mr. Barrett also said the Department has received a report that a shot was fired at the Department has received are on 1-25-64 and requested that the be interviewed in this regard.

4. New Orleans has been instructed to comply with Mr. Barrett's request and to advise all persons interviewed that this investigation is at the specific request of Mr. Burke Marshall, Assistant Attorney General, Civil Rights Division.

### IFBT ProbeA-2 Into Negro's Slaying Set

The FBI last night launched an investigation into the shotgun slaying of a Negro in Liberty, Miss., who reportedly had been active in the civil rights movement and had once testified against a white man in a murder case.

The investigation was begun at the request of the Department of Justice to determine if there was any civil rights aspect to the murder the FBI said.

The dead man was identified as Louis Allen, a logger in his 50's. He was killed yesterday by a load of buckshot fired into his head at the entrance to his home, Coroner E. E. Bellue said an inquest jury ruled the victim died at the hands of an unknown assailant or assailants.

In Milwaukee, the dead man's brother, Morris Allen told the Associated Fress that Louis had participated in civil rights activities and also had testified against a white man charged with the murder of a Negro. Morris Allen said his brother had been subjected to harassment by Mississippi authorities since testifying.

Sheriff Daniel Jone was quoted as saying he was not aware that Louis Allen had participated in civil rights activities nd denied harassment of the victim.




