The apartment listings at 158 Waverly Place, New York City, as personally observed by SA [redacted] on August 26, 1957, lists PETER GUEST in Apartment number 3.

A review of the United Nations (UN) telephone directory for April, 1957, reflects that the subject is employed in the Documents Control Division at the UN.

T-2 previously advised on June 11, 1957, that he learned from a source, whose identity he did not disclose, that the subject was in Thailand for the UN on a technical mission to set up a document control system for the "UN Economic Committee for Asia and the Far East." According to the informant, the subject was very ill in Thailand and at one time it was thought he would die.

T-2 related on August 23, 1957, that he learned from a source, whose identity he did not disclose, that the subject was now back in this country. According to this informant, the subject, though very ill and still under medical care, is back on duty at the UN. T-2 advised that the subject has reportedly become very friendly with ARTHUR MILLER and his wife, MARILYN MONROE.

An article in the "New York Times," a daily newspaper, edition of June 22, 1956, datelined June 21, 1956, and captioned "Arthur Miller Admits Helping Communist Front Groups in the Forties" reflects that MILLER "discloses today a past filled with Communist front associations." According to the article, MILLER told the House Committee on Un-American Activities that he had signed many appeals and protests issued by "Red front groups in the last decade." The article states that MILLER denied being "under Communist discipline."

Miller Wins Reversal Of Contempt Sentence

Appeals Court Rules Walter Failed To Clarify Command to Playwright

The full nine-man bench of the United States Court of Appeals today reversed the contempt of Congress conviction of Playwright Arthur Miller, husband of Actress Marilyn Monroe.

Mr. Miller was convicted in Federal District Court here last year for refusing to tell the House Committee on Un-American Activities the names of Communist writers with whom he admittedly met in New York in 1947.

The appellate court directed District court to enter a judgment of acquittal.

The appellate court found that Chairman Walter of the House committee failed to make definitely known to Mr. Miller that he was being commanded to answer the question at issue.

The court pointed out that after the question was first asked, Mr. Miller requested that the question be suspended until a later time.

Lack of Clarity Found

The court found that the chairman did not make clear later that the question was being insisted upon.

Attorney Joseph Rauh, jr., representing Mr. Miller, also

had contended that the question was not pertinent to the subject under inquiry by the committee. At the time, the committee was investigating the abuse of passport privileges by Communists.

On the pertinency issue, the court declared that in view of its ruling on the direction to answer, it was unnecessary to go into the pertinency question.

Opinion Unsigned

"The appellant (Mr. Miller) had the right to leave the hearing thinking that the direction to answer was still suspended if not abandoned," the court held. The opinion was unsigned.

District Court Judge Charles F. McLaughlin had given Mr. Miller a suspended 30-day jail sentence and imposed a \$500 fine.

Synopsis:

Subject on 6/11/56, resided at 155 Willow St., Brooklyn, NY, but was at that time at Reno, Nevada, or en route to NY. MILLER attended a closed CP meeting in the Fall of 1946 which was described as a special "seminar" for playwrights and writers in the CP. He spoke or was committed to speak at an affair in behalf of HOWARD FAST after FAST was arrested in 1947 in connection with proceedings regarding the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. In "Daily Worker" article, 11/8/55, HOWARD FAST praised subject as a playwright. A "Daily Worker" article, 12/12/55, reflected MILLER issued an "angry retort" to the NYC Youth Board which had bowed to "red baiting attack" and shelved MILLER's film script on juvenile delinquency. An article in "The New Leader," 2/20/56, reflected MILLER ignored

An article in the "Daily Worker," edition of September 29, 1955, Page 6, Column 1, captioned "Arthur Miller's 'A View from the Bridge' Opens Thursday," reflected that ARTHUR MILLER's play was to open in the Coronet Theater and was his first play since "The Crucible" appeared on Broadway.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

Marital Status

An article in the "New York Journal American," a daily newspaper, edition of June 10, 1956, Page 16L, Columns 3 and 4, reflected that playwright ARTHUR MILLER was at that time at Reno, Nevada, preparing to divorce the former MARY GRACE SLATTERY of New York. According to the article, MILLER's name had recently been linked romantically with actress MARILYN MONROE. The article further reflected that MILLER had established the necessary six-weeks residence for divorce at the Pyramid Lake Guest Ranch near Reno.

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BU 185-S* advised on January 30, 1956, that IRVING GOFF, IS-C (Bureau file 100-99839) mentioned to his wife, SOPHIE GOFF, SM-C (Bureau file 100-99839) on the above date that one ARTY MILLER and "your brother" (NORMAN ROSTEN, aka: Norman Rosenstein; SM-C) (Bureau file 100-372341), were "running around" with actress MARILYN MONROE. SOPHIE GOFF replied that her brother and ARTY MILLER were good friends and that MARILYN MONROE goes to her brother's house. IRVING GOFF then said that a "Life" photographer (not identified by GOFF), who was a "Party member," took MARILYN MONROE on a tour of Brooklyn and escorted her to "Normie's house." (X) u

Mr. ANTHONY DUKE, New York City Youth Board, on November 22, 1955, contacted ASAC DONALD E. MOORE and advised that the Youth Board had planned to do a film in collaboration with Independent Artists and United Artists on youth gangs in New York City. Mr. DUKE stated that the Youth Board had been advised by the corporation counsel that MILLER had been a member of five organizations cited by the Attorney General of the United States. The names of the organizations were not specified. DUKE stated that in view of the controversy regarding MILLER, he had been requested by RALPH WHALEN, Executive Director of the New York City Youth Board, to contact the FBI to see if the FBI could furnish any advice or could possibly have ARTHUR MILLER subpoenaed before some committee. Mr. DUKE was advised of the confidential nature of the files of the FBI and was told that this office could be of no assistance to him in this matter.

AUSTIN VAN STRETT, Michigan State Police, Subversive Squad, Ann Arbor, Michigan, advised the Detroit Office on December 5, 1955, that DONALD T. APPEL of the House Un-American Activities Committee was at that time in Ann Arbor conducting an investigation on ARTHUR MILLER, the author and playwright. MILLER was described as an alumnus of the

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SYNOPSIS:

Subject presently in England, was issued Passport Number 129936 on 7/6/56. MILLER appeared before HCUA on 6/21/56. He admitted signing many appeals and protests issued by "Red front groups in the last decade" but denied he was ever under Communist discipline. MILLER, when asked if he signed an application to join the CP in 1939 or 1940, stated he had signed what he thought to be an application for a "study course" in Marxism. He refused to name persons he had seen at CP Writers meetings. On 7/10/56 and 7/25/56, the HCUA and the U. S. House of Representatives, respectively, voted to cite ARTHUR MILLER for contempt of Congress.

DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUND

A. Residence

An article in the July 10, 1956, edition of the "Daily Worker" captioned "MILLERS Fly to England Friday" reflected that ARTHUR MILLER and actress MARILYN MONROE would fly to England on Friday (July 13, 1956) on a honeymoon and business trip.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper.

Mr. ASHLEY J. NICHOLAS, Chief, Passport Legal Division, Passport Office, Department of State, advised SA [redacted] on July 6, 1956, that ARTHUR MILLER was issued Passport Number 129936 on July 6, 1956, limited to expire in sixth months, not to be extended without the express authorization of the Department of State. In his passport application, dated May 17, 1956, at Reno, Nevada, MILLER stated he intended to proceed by plane to England from New York City for a period of one month to six weeks approximately July 15, 1956, to cast and assist in production of his play, "A View From The Bridge."

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An article in the August 29, 1956, edition of the "New York Daily News" reflected that on that date, ARTHUR MILLER had arrived in New York from England to spend ten days to two weeks with his children. The article reflected that at the end of that time, MILLER would probably return to England to rejoin his bride, actress MARILYN MONROE.

An article in the September 12, 1956, edition of the "New York Daily News" reflected ARTHUR MILLER had returned to England.

B. Marital Status

An article in the July 3, 1956 edition of the "Daily Worker" reflected that ARTHUR MILLER and MARILYN MONROE were married in a civil ceremony at White Plains, New York, on Friday, (June 29, 1956), and were subsequently remarried at Katonah, New York, on July 1, 1956, in the Jewish faith.

II. AFFILIATION WITH THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT

A. Miscellaneous Activities

An article in the June 21, 1956, edition of the "New York Journal American", a daily newspaper, captioned "House To Quiz MILLER On Passport Dispute", reflected that ARTHUR MILLER, Broadway playwright, would interrupt his romance with Hollywood's MARILYN MONROE, "today" to appear before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA). According to the article, MILLER was scheduled to testify on his "passport battle" with the United States State Department and further that the members were certain to quiz MILLER on his alleged links with "some 29 organizations cited as Communist fronts by the House Committee on Un-American Activities or the United States Attorney General."

An article in the "New York Times", a daily newspaper, edition of June 22, 1956, datelined June 21, 1956, and captioned "ARTHUR MILLER Admits Helping Communist Front Groups In 40's", reflected that MILLER "discloses today a past filled with Communist front associations." According to the article, MILLER told the HCUA he had signed many appeals and protests issued by "Red front groups" in the last decade." He denied being "under Communist discipline."

The above article reflected that MILLER was asked about his sponsorship of a World Youth Festival in Prague in 1947; the signature on a 1947 statement against the outlawing of the CP; a signature on a statement defending GERHART EISLER before he fled this country to become a top Communist official in East Germany; a statement attacking the HCUA; and statements opposing the Smith Act. The article reflected that MILLER stated he had no memory of most of these things but that he would not deny them.

MILLER said that he was not directed or misled into attending CP meetings but rather that his growing up in the depression and maturing in the midst of war, and many forces in his personal life led him for a time to seek in Marxism a fount of authority, from which might flow a stream of values, in which "I could wholly have faith." The article further reflected that MILLER said he came away from CP meetings convinced that his temperament and viewpoints were diametrically opposed to those of Marxists.

An article in the July 11, 1956, edition of the "New York Daily News," captioned "Vote Contempt Citation Against ARTHUR MILLER" reflected that on July 10, 1956, that the HCUA voted a contempt citation against ARTHUR MILLER.

An article in the July 26, 1956, edition of the "New York Journal American" captioned "MILLER Prosecution Studied by BROWNELL" reflected that on July 25, 1956, the United States House of Representatives voted to cite MILLER for contempt of Congress and that the Justice Department was deciding whether to prosecute MILLER upon his return from England where he was honeymooning with actress MARILYN MONROE.

B. Communist Party (CP) Fronts

A. National Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions (NCASP)

The Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, Review of the Scientific and Cultural Conference for World Peace, arranged by the National Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions, and held in New York City, on March 25, 26, and 27, 1949, House Report No. 1954, April 26, 1950, (originally released April 19, 1949) page 2, describes the National Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions as "cited as a Communist front."

ADMINISTRATIVE

NORMA ABRAHAMS, Reporter, "New York Daily News," on 7/11/56, furnished information that on 7/3/56, the "New York Daily News" received an anonymous telephone call from an unidentified male during which he stated that ARTHUR MILLER had been and still was a member of the CP and was their cultural front man. The anonymous caller said that MILLER's religious marriage ceremony to actress MARILYN MONROE and MILLER's public statements were so much cover up. ABRAHAMS stated that according to the anonymous caller, MARILYN MONROE had drifted into the Communist orbit and money from MARILYN MONROE Productions was finding its way into the CP. This source stated that MARILYN MONROE Productions was filled with Communists.

RE: ARTHUR ASHER MILLER - summary

Arthur Asher Miller was born on October 17, 1915, in New York, New York. As of June, 1956, he resided at 155 Willow Street, Brooklyn, New York. Miller, a playwright, is the author of the play "Death of a Salesman." On June 29, 1956, he was married to Marilyn Monroe, motion-picture actress.

Miller has been reported to have been a member of the Communist Party (CP) in the 1940's and to have been associated with numerous communist-dominated organizations from 1946 to 1950. He testified before a subcommittee of the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., on June 21, 1956. Miller admitted having attended 5 or 6 meetings of CP writers in 1947 but denied having been under CP discipline. In response to a question concerning whether he had signed an application to join the CP Miller testified that in 1939 or 1940, he had signed what he thought to be an application for a study course in Marxism but that he did not know the exact nature of the application. He refused to discuss activities of any other individuals and was, therefore, on July 25, 1956, cited for contempt of the House of Representatives, United States Congress. Contempt of Congress is an offense subject to criminal prosecution.

ENCLOSURE

On July 6, 1956, Miller was issued Passport Number 129936, good for a period of 6 months, not to be extended without express authorization of the United States Department of State. In his passport application Miller stated he intended to proceed by plane from New York City to England about July 15, 1956, for a period of one month to 6 weeks to cast and assist in production of his play "A View From the Bridge." New York City newspaper articles reflected that on August 29, 1956, Miller had arrived in New York from England to see his children and that as of September 19, 1956, he had returned to England. 100-33379

On 8/22/55, [redacted] advised that SERGEI S. VESHCHUNOV, of the USSR Embassy, had spent two days the previous week at the office of CHARLES RECHT on business matters affecting the Embassy. Informant said he spoke with VESHCHUNOV who told him that a number of persons prominent in the entertainment world were attempting to get visas authorized for travel to Russia. VESHCHUNOV stated that among them were the following: MARILYN MONROE, BING CROSBY, FRANK SINATRA, RHODA FLEMING and CARLTON SMITH. VESHCHUNOV said several of these people talked with him in person but he did not identify which ones to the informant. Enclosed herewith are 4 copies of the report of SA [Redacted] dated and captioned as above, at NY.

Subject was contacted at 9 A.M., on 9/21/56 by SAs [Redacted] in front of Sagamore Cafeteria, 8th St. and 3rd Ave., NYC, 3 blocks from subject's residence. After being advised of the identity of the Agents, a request was made to speak with the subject regarding a confidential matter. Subject readily admitted his identity and agreed to accompany the Agents to a Bureau car parked at a discreet distance from the place of contact. Here the Agents reintroduced themselves and again displayed their credentials. The subject shook hands with both Agents and carefully examined their credentials, while engaging in friendly conversation. In this conversation subject indicated that he was presently attending a NY college in pursuit of his MA degree in [Redacted] and that he was not presently employed.

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It was pointed out to the subject that the Agents might possibly be known in the neighborhood, and he agreed to ride with them to a less conspicuous area. This was done and subject was interviewed on an untraveled portion of E. 10th St., NYC, until approximately 12 noon. Subject, at the outset, was advised of the Bureau's responsibilities and investigative jurisdiction in the internal security field.

Subject was then asked whether he knew of anything which would aid the FBI in fulfilling its responsibilities, it being pointed out that we were in possession of information tending to indicate that subject was, or had been, connected with the CP.

Subject advised that he was acutely aware that this interview would subsequently be reduced to writing and be made a matter of official record; therefore, he desired to be considered "as cooperative as possible," and would conduct himself and answer questions towards that end. He stated that while he

Subject answered "No" to all questions, but subsequently modified his answer to the extent that he admitted having attended meetings at which people, whom he knew to espouse the Communist line, and who had been said by others to be Communists, had attended. He denied that Progressive Party meetings held at Ohio in 1950 fell into this category, and stated that this party, in his opinion, was not Communist controlled. Subject would not further elaborate on this topic.

Subject was asked to state how he came into contact with the Communist movement, how he came to disavow it, if in fact he had, and for any comment he might wish to make on this subject. [redacted] stated that his present position on Communism and his attitude was best stated by ARTHUR MILLER, Playwright and husband of MARILYN MONROE, in several of the released MILLER had made to the press. He stated, that like MILLER, he had "found Communism in the sifting search for a philosophy of life." He stated that he has "rejected" but has not "denounced" Communism, that he likewise holds all other US parties in similar contempt, and at this point strongly criticized the Democratic Party for its Dixiecrat element, and the Republican administration for its failure to make a show of force in the recent racial incidents throughout this country. Asked to explain why he did not "denounce" Communism, but yet "rejects" it, he stated that the word "denounce" is too strong, and that he associated the word "denounce" with certain individuals, usually former Communists, who now loudly attack the Communist philosophy, naming their likewise misguided associates, without the slightest feeling of shame that they themselves had been ardent exponents of Communism.

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He stated that Marxism - Leninism is not for the Negro. That now he considers himself a political nonentity and reiterated substantially the following statement:

I am politically nothing, no political party or form of government has the answer to my (the Negro) problem. I no longer have any interest in political philosophy, [redacted]

FIELD accompanied her on several local trips. MONROE was also in contact with DAVID and BRYNA PRENSKY and GEORGE PEPPER. MONROE departed Mexico March 2, 1963. Later, when FIELD traveled to New York, he reportedly used MONROE's apartment there, and upon her suicide expressed concern over possible difficulties regarding some pre-Columbian artifacts he had given her *(u)*

Prior to her suicide, she commissioned [redacted] an associate of the ACGM during her stay in Mexico, to come to Mexico from Los Angeles to buy decorator's items for her. MONROE's traveling companion had expressed the belief that MONROE's marriage to ARTHUR MILLER had strongly influenced her to the left. Apparently it was through MILLER that she was put in contact with the above persons in Mexico *(u)*

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I. RELATIONS BETWEEN ACGM AND SATELLITE DIPLOMATIC ESTABLISHMENTS *u*

Such relationships are limited mainly to [redacted] who claims to have a close friend in the hierarchy of the Czechoslovakian Embassy. [redacted] friend, [redacted] also reportedly is seen at affairs at the Polish and Soviet Embassies, and ELIZABETH [redacted] MORA occasionally also may visit these embassies *(u)*

In addition, ELIZABETH CATLETT MORA claims to be very close with [redacted] at the Cuban Embassy. Reportedly, MORA is the clearing agent for American subversives desiring to travel to Cuba. [redacted] refers such Americans to MORA, who checks their credentials and background through CP connections in the United States and then notifies [redacted] whether permission should be granted or refused. *(u)*

On May 22, 1957, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Enver N. Mamedov, Chief Editor of the magazine, "USSR," informed Mrs. Santha Rama Rau, who is also known as Mrs. Faubion Bowers, that the visas for her, her husband, Faubion Bowers, her son, and her helper, not further identified, for travel to the Soviet Union were ready and all they have to do to prepare for the trip is obtain their travel vouchers from the American Express Company. \$u

The source advised that Mamedov believed the visas were not for any specified period of time and he was certain that when the Bowers arrived in the Soviet Union they could extend the visas for as long a time as is necessary. Mamedov suggested that the Bowers get in touch with representatives of Voks and the Writers Union in the Soviet Union and these individuals would go out of their way to help the Bowers. The source said that Mrs. Bowers indicated that they would travel by ship and would leave on August 16, 1957. \$u

The source also advised that Mamedov indicated that he and his wife, Tamara Y. Mamedova, had received an invitation from an individual named Lee Strasburg. Mrs. Bowers said Strasburg was an important individual in the New York theatre world and she strongly suggested that Mamedov and his wife attend the affair. Mrs. Bowers said that in any event Mamedov should attempt to attend the affair inasmuch as the famed movie actress Marilyn Monroe would be present. The source advised that Mamedov was uncertain as to whether he could attend this affair since he was planning a trip to the West Coast. The source was unable to learn further particulars concerning the affair described above. \$u

T-3 further advised that MAMEDOV and his wife had received an invitation to a function from LEE STRASBURG. Mrs. BOWERS said that STRASBURG was an important individual in the New York theater world and if at all possible, the MAMEDOVs should attend. In any event, Mrs. BOWERS told MAMEDOV that he should go to the function since the famed movie actress MARILYN MONROE would be present. The informant stated that MAMEDOV indicated he was going to the West Coast, and did not know whether he would be available for this function. (S) u

On May 15, 1957, T-3 advised that JIM JOHNSON, Director of the World Affairs Council, Seattle, Washington, told MAMEDOV that his group would attempt to schedule MAMEDOV for an appearance on their program during the last half of June or early part of July, 1957. MAMEDOV advised JOHNSON that he desired the council have a specific time for him to appear before he could arrange a trip to the West Coast. JOHNSON, according to the informant, agreed to attempt to set up a more specific date for MAMEDOV's appearance. (S) u

On May 17, 1957, T-3 said that JOHNSON told MAMEDOV that the World Affairs Council was intrigued with the idea of MAMEDOV's appearance on a program, but they felt this was "a bit touchy." The Council felt it would be better if they could have MAMEDOV's counterpart from the magazine "Amerika" on the same program. The informant stated that MAMEDOV had no objection to this, and they agreed to keep each other advised on developments regarding MAMEDOV's appearance before this group. (S) u

"Amerika" is the publication of the American Embassy, Moscow, USSR.

On April 26, 1957, T-7, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that BRUCE S. HOPPING of the Ripley-Hopping Lumber and Timber Company, Port of Newark, New Jersey, [informed MAMEDOV] that he was interested in impressing American undergraduates with the finesse demonstrated by gymnasts at the Olympic games. The informant stated that HOPPING described himself as Vice-President of the New Jersey Committee for Health and Physical Education Development, Incorporated, and had also been present at the 1956 Olympic games, serving as a swimming judge. The following information was received from [redacted] and [redacted] who have furnished reliable information in the past, on 2/28/62. Extreme care should be used in reporting any of this information to avoid disclosure of sources who were associating closely with subject during her visit to Mexico. (u)

This source advised that MARILYN MONROE, the movie actress, was recently in Mexico on vacation and while in Mexico associated closely with certain members of the American Communist Group in Mexico (ACGM). Source characterized the ACGM as a loose association of a predominantly social nature of present and/or past members of the Communist Party, USA, and their friends and associates who share a common sympathy for Communism and the Soviet Union. They advised that during the course of this visit a mutual infatuation arose between subject and FREDERICK VANDERBILT FIELD (Bufile 100-2278). This situation caused considerable dismay among Miss MONROE's entourage and also among the ACGM.

On 2/21/62, FIELD visited subject in her suite (#1110) at the Hotel Continental Hilton at 5:00 P.M. The visit was arranged through New York friends and was based on his former friendship with ARTHUR MILLER, her former husband. He stayed about an hour and she agreed to go with FIELD on 2/23/62 to Toluca, Mexico, for the day. (u)

Subject arrived in Mexico on 2/19/62 from Miami. Her entry into Mexico reportedly was arranged by FRANK SINATRA through former President MIGUEL ALEMAN. She was accompanied by an agent, a hair dresser, and an interior decorator. The latter was identified as EUNICE CHURCHILL, a widow about 65 from Los Angeles. CHURCHILL said her husband was a violent trade unionist who was a functionary in the furniture workers section of the AF of L Carpenters Union who died four or five years ago. She identified him as a labor pioneer but did not identify him as a leftist. She is a part time interior decorator and also claims to be an assistant of Dr. WEXLEY, subject's analyst. (u)

According to CHURCHILL, the subject was much disturbed by ARTHUR MILLER's marriage on 2/20/62 and feels like a "negated sex symbol." CHURCHILL said that subject "has a lot of leftist rubbed off from MILLER." Subject reportedly spent some time with ROBERT KENNEDY at the home of the PETER LAWFORDS in Hollywood. Walter Winchell's column in the July 8, 1963, issue of the "New York Mirror" contained the statement, "Photoplay's current article on the man who 'killed' Marilyn practically names him."

In accordance with your request, there follows a brief review of the information concerning Marilyn Monroe in the August, 1963, issue of "Photoplay" magazine. On page 10, a column by Winchell begins which states that Marilyn Monroe's death "and the married man responsible for it" was still getting considerable space in the foreign press. Winchell says the author of the articles, which are syndicated in papers on the Continent, claims he personally interviewed many people in Hollywood and New York who were aware of Miss Monroe's problems and claimed his sensational story was "big news." The "big news," according to Winchell, was the name of the "married man" involved. Winchell says "many of us" on the papers and in the magazines have hinted at the name, and the foreign correspondent has jumped to conclusions. Winchell says there is no proof that the married man was the villain, and many of Miss Monroe's friends now believe the overdose of sleeping pills was an accident. Winchell claims much of the foreign correspondent's story was recognized by him as having appeared in "Photoplay" and in the Hearst newspapers for which Winchell writes.

The article concerning Miss Monroe begins on page 52 under the caption, "One Year Later Marilyn Monroe's Killer Still At Large!" A review of this article reveals Winchell's claim that it practically names the man who "killed" Marilyn is nothing more than a ~~redacted~~ plug for a cheap magazine. Actually, the article comes nowhere near identifying anyone. The only "clues" to the identity of the alleged married man who had an affair with Marilyn and "caused" her suicide when he rejected her could apply to any number of prominent individuals.

These "clues" are: that the man is happily married and has children; that you can see him in a crowd and reach out and touch him; that he is a great man, famous, known the world over; that he can be seen on television and in movie theaters; that people look up to him and consider his wife and children lucky; that he is mentioned almost daily in newspapers and magazines; and that he is considered a "truly honorable man."

The article alleges the affair between this man and Miss Monroe began during the "worst time of her life and the best time of his." The alleged man was celebrating his good fortune in reaching a height in his career "he never before dreamed" would be possible. The remainder of the article allegedly outlines the end of the romance and Miss Monroe's final efforts to renew the relationship. The article states that she telephoned the man on Sunday night, August 5, 1962, and when he said he would not leave his wife and could not see Miss Monroe "any more," she swallowed a "handful" of sleeping pills. The article claims she later called the man again, implying that she told him of having taken the pills, only to have him hang up on her and states that the last sound she heard was the "buzzing of the receiver in her hand." after the man broke the telephone connection.

The article states that Miss Monroe's housekeeper has "vanished" and that her publicity agent, Pat Newcombe, is now working in Washington, D. C. It says her second husband, Joe DiMaggio, is the only one who remains faithful and that the man who killed Miss Monroe is still at large and can never be arrested. But, the article asserts, "Wherever he goes, whatever he touches, whomever he sees; he thinks of Marilyn. His guilt never leaves him, his fear has become his friend."

To advise of speculation concerning FBI complicity in the death of Marilyn Monroe propounded by author Norman Mailer in his soon-to-be-published biography of the deceased actress.

"Marilyn," a 270-page biography (New York; Grosset and Dunlap,) priced at \$19.95, is scheduled for publication on 8/1/73. It reportedly has a first American printing of 285,000 copies and is the August selection of the Book-of-the-Month Club.

Following Miss Monroe's death by drug overdose in 1962, there was a spate of rumors, originating on the West Coast, alleging she was having an affair with the then Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy, and that her death was in some way related to this and/or was the result of a plot revolving around some of her associates who allegedly had past Communist Party affiliations or sympathies. These rumors were embellished upon at that time in various sensational-type gossip magazines and in a short book published in July, 1964, entitled "The Strange Death of Marilyn Monroe" by Frank A. Capell. These allegations were branded false and no factual support existed for them.

Mailer, in his new book, has repeated some of these same rumors and has given them a bizarre twist.

As to whether Miss Monroe took her own life, Mailer answers "possibly" - and then suggests other possibilities. One of these is the suggestion that the FBI, CIA or the Mafia found it of interest that Robert Kennedy, brother of the President John Kennedy, was reputed to be having an affair with the movie star. Mailer suggests that "right-wing" FBI and CIA Agents had a "huge motivation" to murder Marilyn Monroe in order to embarrass the Kennedy family,

claiming the FBI and CIA were furious with the Kennedys because following the Bay of Pigs invasion President Kennedy was moving to limit the power of these agencies.

Mailer has admitted in recent press interviews concerning his book that he has no evidence to support his theory and that it is based on his "writer's instinct" and on speculation.

A second allegation purportedly contained in the book was recently brought to the attention of the Los Angeles Office by Lloyd Shearer, editor of Parade Magazine. This allegation is that in 1962 FBI Agents in Los Angeles went to the telephone company in Santa Monica, California, and removed a "paper tape" of Marilyn Monroe's telephone calls, some of which according to Mailer, were presumably to the White House or White House staff on the night of her death.

This is false and neither the files of the Los Angeles Office nor FBI Headquarters indicate the existence of any such tapes. This again appears to be a variation of a spurious charge contained in Capell's 1964 book in which he alleged that such tapes were in the custody of the Los Angeles Police Department.

Norman Mailer is an eccentric but well-known author, who in the past has won a Pulitzer Prize and a National Book Award. He is the author of "The Naked and the Dead," "The Deer Park," "An American Dream," "Cannibals and Christians," "The Armies of the Night," and "Miami and the Siege of Chicago."

He admits to little or no research concerning his speculation about Marilyn Monroe's death. He states his motive in writing the book is his dire need for money. He admits having no evidence to support his theory of FBI or CIA involvement and uses it to sensationalize his book and to gain publicity. Mailer has even coined a new word which describes some of his speculative writing in "Marilyn." The "factoid" he defines as "an event which has no existence other than it has appeared in print."

A review in Time Magazine on 7/16/73, a Mike Wallace television interview, a 7/22/73 New York Times book review by Pauline Kael, and a Washington Post article dated 7/20/73 by Stephen Isaacs, are all critical of Mailer for his unsubstantiated theorizing and for engaging in "yellow" journalism.

For information only. No action is recommended regarding Mailer's allegations. Any public statements by the FBI would merely serve to feed the fires of publicity which Mailer is attempting to stoke.

ROBERT F. KENNEDY

Robert Kennedy had been having a romance and sex affair over a period of time with Marilyn Monroe. He had met her, the first date being arranged by his sister and brother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Peter Lawford. Robert Kennedy had been spending much time in Hollywood during the last part of 1961 and early 1962, in connection with his trying to have a film made of his book dealing with the crime investigations. He used to meet with producer Jerry Wald. He was reported to be intensely jealous of the fact that they had been making a film of John F. Kennedy's book of the PT boat story.

Robert Kennedy was deeply involved emotionally with Marilyn Monroe, and had repeatedly promised to divorce his wife to marry Marilyn. Eventually Marilyn realized that Bobby had no intention of marrying her and about this time, 20th Century Fox studio had decided to cancel her contract. She had become very unreliable, being late for set, etc. In addition, the studio was in financial difficulty due to the large expenditures caused in the filming of "Cleopatra".

The studio notified Marilyn that they were cancelling her contract. This was right in the middle of a picture she was making. They decided to replace her with actress Lee Remick. Marilyn telephoned Robert Kennedy from her home at Brentwood, California, person-to-person, at the Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. to tell him the bad news. Robert Kennedy told her not to worry about the contract -- he would take care of everything. When nothing was done, she again called him from her home to the Department of Justice, person-to-person, and on this occasion they had unkind words. She was reported to have threatened to make public their affairs. On the day that Marilyn died, Robert Kennedy was in town, and registered at the Beverly Hills Hotel. By coincidence, this is across the street from the house in which a number of years earlier his father, Joseph Kennedy, had lived for a time, person-law, with Gloria Swanson.

Peter Lawford,

[redacted] knew from Marilyn's friends that she often made suicide threats and that she was inclined to make a suicide attempt in order to arouse sympathy. Lawford is reported as having made "special arrangements" with Marilyn's psychiatrist, Dr. Ralph Greenman, of Beverly Hills. The psychiatrist was treating Marilyn for emotional problems and prescribed the use of barbiturates. On her last visit to him, he prescribed several tablets, and gave her a prescription for 10 of them, which was unusual in quantity, especially since she saw him frequently.

On the date of her death, March 4, 1962, her housekeeper put the bottle of pills on the night table. It is reported the housekeeper and Marilyn's personal secretary and press agent, Pat Newcombe, were cooperating in the plan to induce suicide. Pat Newcombe was rewarded for her cooperation by being put on the Federal payroll as the assistant to George Stevens, Jr., head of the Motion Picture Activities Division of the U. S. Information Service. His father, George Stevens, Sr., is a left-wing Hollywood director, who is well known for his involvement in the making of slanted and left-wing pictures. One of his pictures was the "Diary of Anne Frank". Pat Newcombe was flown within 24 hours

Marilyn's death directly to Hyannis... where she... Robert Kennedy... Kennedy checked out of the Beverly Hills Hotel and flew from Los Angeles International Airport via Western Airlines to San Francisco, where he checked into the St. Francis Hotel. The owner of this hotel is a Mr. London, a friend of Robert Kennedy. Robert Kennedy made a telephone call from St. Charles Hotel, San Francisco, to Peter Lawford to find out if Marilyn was dead yet. Peter Lawford had called Marilyn's number and spoken with her, and then checked again later to make sure she did not answer. Marilyn's housekeeper, after she had taken the second tablets, called a psychiatrist for Marilyn and said she had taken the bottle of pills Marilyn expected to have her stomach pumped out and to get away from through her suicide attempt. The psychiatrist left word for Marilyn to take a drive in the fresh air, but did not come to see her until after she was known to be dead. Marilyn received a call from Joe DiMaggio, Jr., who was in the U. S. Marines, stationed at Camp Pendleton, California. They were very friendly. Marilyn told him she was getting very lonely. The last call she attempted to make was to Peter Lawford, but he had made to her. Joe DiMaggio, Sr., known the whole story and is reported to have stated when Robert Kennedy gets out of office, he intends to kill him. Joseph DiMaggio, Jr., know of the affair between Robert Kennedy and Marilyn.

Pat Newcombe, Marilyn's former secretary and press agent, is a friend of Pierre Salinger. He is a beatnik joint in San Francisco where they had a dinner.

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[redacted] arranged for Marilyn to be the singer, to represent the United States in a cultural exchange program in Poland, which was a talent festival. [redacted] as a U. S. representative.

Marilyn also had an intimate relationship with [redacted] wife Robert [redacted] was carrying on his sex affair with Marilyn [redacted] Kennedy came out and had sex parties with [redacted] an actress. Chief of Police Parker, of the Los Angeles Police Dept., has the toll call tickets obtained from the telephone company on the calls made from Marilyn's residence telephone. They are in his safe at Los Angeles headquarters. Fletcher Huis, the columnist, has considerable inside information and knowledge of the Robert F. Kennedy and Marilyn Monroe affair. He personally saw the telephone call records. Marilyn Monroe's psychiatrist, although he knew she had taken the pills, did not come to her home until after she was dead. He made contact with the coroner and an arrangement was made for a psychiatric board of inquiry to be appointed by the coroner, an unheard of procedure in the area. This was so the findings could be recorded that she was emotionally unbalanced. It was reported this arrangement was to discredit any statements she may have made before she died.

what about this?

In Newsweek of August 19, 1963, there appears an article on Pierre Salinger and Laila Porter. Robert Kennedy's friend, Mr. London, the owner of the St. Francis Hotel, has a brother who is a Communist Party member. He is a millionaire, and head of the King Crab Industry in Alaska. He is a member of the International Fisheries Commission made up of representatives of the U. S., USSR and Japan. He owns a fleet of fishing boats, some of which are equipped with special electronic equipment not necessary for fishing. It is suspected that he does work for Soviet Naval Intelligence. Newsweek of December 2, 1963 has an article on the Marilyn Monroe case, indicating a book was being written and mentions a tie-in with a high Washington, D.C. official. George Stevens, Jr., of the U. S. Information Agency, heads a unit that makes films for the U. S. Government. He previously was an assistant for his father. He was a first lieutenant in the U. S. Air Force, 1954 - 1960, and was appointed director of the Motion Picture Service Agency, a division of U. S. Information Agency on January 31, 1963.

During the period of time that Robert F. Kennedy was having his sex affair with Marilyn Monroe, on one occasion a sex party was conducted at which several other persons were present. The recording was secretly made and is in the possession of a Los Angeles private detective agency. The detective was asked for a certified copy of the recording, in which all the voices are identifiable.

Miller, author of "All My Sons" and "Death of a Salesman," was under communist discipline in the 1930's and a member of the Communist Party (CP) in 1943, 1946, and 1947. He has been a member of or connected with a number of CP front organizations. On 5-29-56 Dick Arens, House Committee on Un-American Activities, advised that the Committee would like to have Miller appear before the Committee on 6-12-56, 6-13-56, or 6-14-56. Arens advised the Committee knows Miller was a CP member in 1943 but is unable to locate a live witness that can put him in the Party. Arens inquired as to whether the Bureau could furnish a Photostat of Miller's CP card. We informed Arens the requested data was not available.

WINCHELL SAID:

"Washington, D. C. The Senate investigators will stage a very sensational melodrama on June 18, 1956, in New York City. Six water front leaders will be confronted by newspaperman Victor Riesel, who lost his sight in the fight against labor racketeers."

COMMENT:

Five congressmen have urged a labor rackets inquiry in connection with the attack on Riesel. The 6-18-56 hearing may be a result of the inquiry urged by the congressmen. The Bureau is continuing its intensive investigation of the "Obstruction of Justice" matter in which Riesel was the victim.

Winchell's broadcast was not carried locally on station WWDC due to the broadcast of a baseball game. The following items of interest to the Bureau in Winchell's broadcast above date were obtained from the New York Office.

WINCHELL SAID:

Playwright Arthur Miller, husband of Marilyn Monroe, refused to disclose names of comrades with whom he once attended Red front meetings. Committee will astonish Miller by telling him those nine names.

COMMENT:

Miller was under communist discipline in the 1930s and was a CP member in 1943, 1946, and 1947. He has been a member of or connected with a number of CP front organizations. Miller testified before HCUA on 6/21/56, and admitted having attended meetings in 1939 or 1940 which he understood were meetings of CP writers, however Miller refused to furnish any names. Miller also admitted having contributed to communist fronts.

WINCHELL SAID:

International news, London - "Time and Tide," British publication, had a remarkable scoop. "Now that the cruel ways of Joe Stalin have been abandoned we have hope that Mrs. Khrushchev will be released from Siberia. She was arrested and deported in 1938 by Stalin for whom Mr. Khrushchev was carrying out mass purges.

WINCHELL SAID:

Paris - French Government suffered another badly depleted division of reserves in Algeria. Washington and London now fear a general war in North Africa by autumn.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL SAID:

Washington - Dr. J. B. Matthews, former staff director McCarthy Senate Committee will take the stand July 10. The star government witness for HCUA investigating recent report by Fund for the Republic which alleges many people are blacklisted in radio and TV. Fred Woltmann, a Pulitzer prize-winning newspaperman of the Scripps-Howard paper made the following serious indictment of that fund report. Said Mr. Woltmann "In documenting case histories of alleged blacklisted victims the report repeatedly suppressed their full communist record."

COMMENT:

Winchell is referring to the study of blacklisting in the motion picture, radio and TV industry that began in September, 1954, under \$100,000 grant from Fund for the Republic. Study conducted by John Cogley, former executive secretary of the "Commonweal" a lay-Catholic weekly magazine. The HCUA announced on 6/28/56 it had subpoenaed Cogley to appear on 7/10/56 to discuss his recently completed report on "blacklisting." No investigation has been conducted re Cogley. Files reflect no pertinent information concerning him.

WINCHELL SAID:

W. W. discussed Arthur Miller and the Congressional Investigation Committee. W. W. said some people are confused. They confuse Marx and Lenin with Romeo and Juliet. W. W. states that the Government is not trying to interfere with the romance of Miller and Monroe. Some papers give that impression. Mr. Miller testified that he once supported Red front outfits, but he refused

to name comrades to that committee who attended meetings with him. Mr. Miller said he could not name them on the grounds of conscience. W. W. reviews Communist Party as criminal conspiracy and the effect Smith Act has on Communist Party. Mr. Miller testified that he stopped all Red front activity ten years ago. Before I go into next, I want to add that Mr. Miller's conscience did not stop him from following communists or having Joseph Rauh, Jr., as his lawyer. Mr. Rauh reportedly paid \$8,000 to a fellow named Paul Hughes as an informer whose stuff just did not stand up before a United States Senator. Anyway Miller testified he stopped all Red front activity 10 years ago. I am now in possession of a pamphlet which shows Arthur Miller was either mistaken or perhaps his name was misused or that he lied under oath. This pamphlet names Miller as sponsor of the Citizens Emergency Defense Conference to "Defend the Smith Act Victims." The Smith Act is the only law to jail convicted Reds. Mr. Miller testified he quit all Red fronts 10 years ago. This pamphlet shows that Miller was sponsor of this pro-Red conference in New York City March 16, 1952, or 4 years ago.

COMMENTS:

Information re Miller is set forth above. The Citizens Emergency Defense Conference now defunct has been cited by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450. Our files reflect one Arthur Miller was listed on the executive board of this organization in 1952. Paul Hughes was tried and acquitted of perjury in connection with the Harvey Matusow case. Hughes allegedly furnished fictitious information to Rauh and to representatives of "The Washington Post and Times Herald" concerning Senator Joseph McCarthy.

WINCHELL SAID:

Inside the Communist Party. Seven Communist Party members were recently arrested in Boston for violation of the Smith Act. The 7 Boston Reds approached 22 law firms trying to get permanent counsel. All 22 firms turned them down.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL SAID:

Party chiefs Gene Dennis and Dr. Albert Blumberg held a very secret meeting at Philadelphia.

Movie Stars Named in Magazine Inquiry

Sources of Lurid Tales Revealed

Names of such high-priced Hollywood talent as ~~Ava Gardner, Kirk Douglas, Kim Novak, Desi Arnaz, Sonny Tufts, Elizabeth Scott, Herb Jeffries, Mickey Rooney, Charlie Barnett, Anita Ekberg and Marilyn Monroe~~ sprinkle the county grand jury Confidential magazine inquiry transcript which was filed in Superior Court yesterday.

The 142-page document is a record of testimony by Actress Maureen O'Hara, Liberace, Playgirl Ronnie Quillan and others which on May 15 led to the secret indictment of Magazine Publisher Robert Harrison, ex-Actress Francesca de Scaffa, nine other persons and five corporations.

The indictment was on charges of criminal conspiracy to publish libel and obscene material.

Bears Out Statement

The transcript bore out statements by both Miss O'Hara and Liberace that they had told the jurors Confidential articles about them were "untrue and false."

It was disclosed that Ronnie Quillan, faded veteran of numerous Hollywood escapades, freely admitted that she marketed love and that she took money from Confidential to get affidavits from other prostitutes which involved male film stars in "lewd and colorful situations."

Miss Quillan said she first contacted Confidential to protest about a story concerning her and Singer Billy Daniels "that was completely untrue."

Although Harrison said he wasn't interested in the "true facts" of that episode, Ronnie testified, he put her to work digging up dirt on other Hollywood figures.

Received \$1600

She said she sold the magazine a story about Desi Arnaz "which dealt with my having gone around with him 10 years prior." She said Confidential's published article made the incident appear to be a recent one.

She said she was paid \$1600 by Harrison for stories on Ava Gardner and Singer Herb Jeffries. Harrison, she testified, had Private Detective Jack Holcomb tap her apartment telephone to obtain "verification" of her stories.

But, she said, she never followed through on an assignment to substantiate an article about Actress Elizabeth Scott. She recalled that

she was to try to have lunch with Miss Scott, recording the conversation on a microphone-wrist watch. But she didn't call the actress, she said, and was even told by Private Detective Virginia Lee that there appeared to be no truth in the article Confidential wanted to print.

Harrison ran it anyway and subsequently was slapped with a lawsuit which is still pending in New York courts.

'Episode Smelled'

Virginia Lee, also known as Joan Morgan, testified that she did not know the nature of the work she was doing for her boss, Private Detective H. L. Von Wittenberg, until after she was told to get affidavits from two prostitutes "about Desi Arnaz."

Von Wittenberg, also a witness during the two-day hearing, said he quit working for Harrison after the Arnaz investigation. He said "the episode smelled. I told Harrison this was not for me."

Von Wittenberg, operator of Hollywood Detective Agency, said he also was assigned by Confidential to check out a story about Kirk Douglas that was offered the magazine by "Diana Manners, a former moving-picture personage."

Information on Tufts

It was Frank J. Goldberg, an unemployed Hollywood writer, who testified he sold the smear magazine information about Sonny Tufts. He

was paid \$150 by Hollywood Research, Inc., Confidential's local listening post, he said.

But, he added, the resultant article, "Open Letter to Sonny Tufts," contained "a lot of things I never knew about Sonny."

Jerry McCarthy, Los Angeles newspaperman, said he was contacted by Harrison to check out a story that Joan Crawford "was mean to her children." But, McCarthy said, he found no truth to the allegation and quit cold "because I was getting a little sick of the whole thing."

Former Boy Friends

It was Howard Rushmore, former editor of Confidential, who brought in the names of Kim Novak and Anita Ekberg. In both cases, he said, former boy friends sold stories which alleged indiscretions.

Rushmore said he learned at the Confidential office that it was Private Detective Fred Otash who supplied details of his asserted earlier romance with Miss Ekberg.

And, said Rushmore, a male actor got \$750 from Marjorie Meade of Hollywood Research for the article about Kim Novak. "He wanted to be known as one of Novak's early lovers," said Rushmore, "so part of the understand-

ing with Marjorie . . . was that his picture was to be used in the layout."

That story was titled, "Kiss and Tell," he said.

Wrong-Door Raid

Rushmore said it was Private Detective Barney Ruditsky who supplied missing details of the famous wrong-door raid involving Frank Sinatra, Joe DiMaggio and Marilyn Monroe after one of Ruditsky's operatives apparently sold the original information.

Following that, Rushmore said, Ruditsky returned to Hollywood and subsequently sold Confidential information about Mickey Rooney and Bandleader Charlie Barnet. He said Ruditsky worked through Marjorie Meade, niece of Harrison, and her husband Fred.

Rushmore said Francesca de Scaffa, ex-wife of Actor Bruce Cabot and now in Mexico, ". . . supplied 90% of our Hollywood material over a two-year period."

Resulted in Lawsuits

Three stories she turned in, he told the jury, resulted in lawsuits—Robert Mitchum, Errol Flynn and Doris Duke. When questioned by Confidential's attorneys, said Rushmore, Miss De Scaffa ad-

mitted she wasn't certain of her facts.

Rushmore, according to the transcript, estimated that Francesca—who has twice attempted suicide in Mexico City since her indictment—made "\$30,000 to \$40,000 from Confidential."

Fired Ronnie Quillan

He testified that he fired Ronnie Quillan as a source when she offered him a story that "nauseated" him.

He said he was sent to Los Angeles by Harrison to set up a West Coast bureau and that he hired Columnist Florabelle Muir and her husband, Denny Morrison.

But, he remembered, their articles "were too well documented." Harrison did not like their stuff.

Also Got Fired

"He bawled me out. He said, 'You went out there and spent a lot of money and came up with . . . a couple of people that are writing stories that the Daily News or

even the New York Times would use!'"

Rushmore said Harrison fired Miss Muir and her husband after three months.

Rushmore said that when he told Harrison he didn't trust the sort of informant who would sell information about former girl friends, Harrison retorted, "That is the kind of stuff we need!"

Walter Winchell, Rushmore testified, had no financial interest in Confidential, but gave it several boosts "because Harrison was shrewd enough to defend Winchell against the left-wingers and pro-Communists who attacked him."

Of the 11 persons and five corporations indicted by the grand jury as a result of the testimony, only the Meades have surrendered on bench warrants to date.

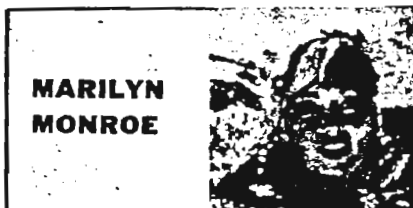

world at that time that he had to have a celebration of his good fortune. He hung up on her and she tried to lose herself in sleep. Beside her bed there was a bottle of fifty sleep capsules. There, there was her friend, the thing that always gave her peace.

She gulped down a handful.

The phone rang. It was a close friend of hers, a friend who knew all about the romance.

"He won't take me back," she cried. "He said he'll never come back."

The friend told her, "I'll come over and talk to you."

But Marilyn didn't want anyone to see her the way she looked. Her eyes were swollen and red. She'd let her blonde hair grow out until the dark roots showed. Her face clearly showed the signs of drinking and pills.

"No," she said, "I've taken a sleeping pill. I'll just go to sleep."

But she couldn't sleep—and next to her was the bottle of pills. If she could

She could forget about her father who never wanted her, her mother who escaped to mental institutions. The bottle. It was empty! There were none left.

The last thing Marilyn heard was the buzzing of the receiver in her hand.

Coroner Theodore J. Curphey, in his official report, noted: "Miss Monroe had often expressed the wish to give up, withdraw, and even to die. On more than one occasion in the past, when disappointed and depressed, she had made suicide attempts by using sedative drugs. On these occasions she had called for help and had been rescued."

This time she had not been rescued. It was her housekeeper, Mrs. Eunice Murray, who first sensed that something was wrong. The light in Marilyn's bedroom was still burning at three that morning. She knocked. There was no answer. She tried the door. It was locked.

She called Marilyn's psychiatrist, Dr. Ralph Greenston. He hurried over and broke in the window. When he found her, she was dead. The telephone was still buzzing in her hand.

Now it is a year later. Mrs. Murray has disappeared, she'd vanished shortly after Marilyn's death. Pat Newcombe, Marilyn's publicity agent, has left the Hollywood scene and is now working in Washington, D.C. Joe DiMaggio, her second husband, has remained faithful to her memory—he has a small bouquet of roses placed on her crypt every week.

But he is not the only one who is faithful to Marilyn today. There is still the man. The man who killed Marilyn. He is the man they can never arrest. He is the man who is still at-large.

He is the man who is living the death she so quickly found.

We have lost her, but so has he.


Wherever he goes, whatever he touches, whomever he sees; he thinks of Marilyn. His guilt never leaves him, his fear has become his friend. For once, long ago, before all this, he was an honorable man. But he had made a fatal mistake. And now he is lost—not to all the world—but to himself.

Some people know who he is. Will they ever reveal it publicly? Does his wife know? Would she tell? And he himself, will his guilt pry his tongue loose?

You can see him in a crowd. You can reach out and touch him. . . . And you will never know that he is the man who killed Marilyn Monroe.

And he is the man who killed himself.

ZINCHUK visited building at 10 East 40th St. where CHARLES RECHT has office and building at 160 Broadway where law firm of Wolf, Popper, Ross, Wolf, and Jones has office. They shopped and attended a movie in afternoon and in evening toured bars and restaurants in New York City along with YURII GOUK. On 7/8/55, GOUK and ZINCHUK visited 114 East 32nd St., New York City, while VESHCHUNOV waited in cab outside that building. They all returned to Washington, D. C., that day. On August 22, 1955, T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the subject had told him he had spent two days during the previous week at the office of CHARLES RECHT, 10 East 40th Street, New York City, on business matters concerning the Soviet Embassy. T-1 stated that VESHCHUNOV had told him that a number of persons prominent in the entertainment world were attempting to get visas to travel in Russia. Among the persons named by VESHCHUNOV were MARILYN MONROE, RING CROSBY, FRANK SINATRA, RHONDA FLEMING, and CARLTON SMITH. According to the informant, VESHCHUNOV stated that some of these persons had talked with him relative to the above, but he did not identify which had done so. VESHCHUNOV then told informant that these contacts were in the nature of a feeler to the Embassy to ascertain whether a visa would be granted if the above persons could produce passports. Q^u
