
On 11/22/82, Chief of Police (COP) Pete Gray,
Bay Village PD, telephonically advised that he believed the
murder weapon in the Sheppard murder case had just been found.
Chief Gray said that the current owner of the house where
Samuel and Marilyn lived had been digging a trench to lay a
new water line. Approximately five inches into the ground he
found a brass fire tong. Chief Gray said the fire tongs had
been buried in sandy soil and appeared to be remarkably preserved. Initial examination indicates that there may be hair
adhering to the surface of the tongs. The tongs are being
taken to the Cuyahoga County coroner for comparison of the
deceased Marilyn Sheppard and to see if a determination can be
made by the coroner as to whether, in fact, this may be the
murder weapon. Chief Gray would like to submit the fire tongs
to the FBI Laboratory for appropriate forensic examination.
He pointed out that this examination could have great historical
significance but reminded me that all of the principals in
this case are now dead.

On 11/22/82, I discussed this matter with Deputy Assistant Director William Doran, FBI Laboratory, who stated that the laboratory would conduct the required examinations. Doran will have Section Chief Bill Cronin contact us to furnish details of procuring and shipping the evidentiary item.

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Tool may be Sheppard we

More than 28 years after Marilyn R. Sheppard was bludg-beened to death in her Bay Village home, law enforcement officials said they might have uncovered the long-missing murder weapon.

Bay Village Police Chief Peter J. Gray yesterday confirmed a tool was found, buried five inches deep in a yard near the Sheppards' former lakefront home, 28924 Lake Rd.

The neighbor who unearthed the find gave it to Gray Friday, setting off new inquiries into Greater Cleveland's most publicized slaying, which led to the conviction and later acquittal of the victim's husband, Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard.

"I don't know if it has anything to do with the Marilyn Sheppard case," Gray said. "Over the years, there have been many, many things turned in that could have been potential weapons.

"This may or may not be the

he said. Gray would not describe the find except to call it a "toll of sorts." He also would not identify who found it. However, a preliminary (xamination by the Cuyahoga bounty coroner's office matched the tool to some of the 35 blows to the head and body which killed Marilyn Sheppard near daybreak July 4, 1954, Gray said.

"Some of the blows would be consistent with the object we found, while some others would not be," Gray said, speculating that two weapons could have been used

He cautioned that officials have not yet determined if the tool had been manufactured at the time Marilyn Sheppard, 31 and four months pregnant, was killed.

"We have to get positive identification on it and go from there, Gray said.

Two FBI agents took the instrument to the FBI laboratory in Quantico, Va., where agents will

It was not known how long the tool had been buried, but Gray paid the coroner's office found root fibers attached to it, indicating it had been underground for at least several years.

"It could have been put there 28 years ago or it might have been there only a few years," he said, adding it could have been planted in the yard by a publicity seeker.

The find came just days after a movie, "Guilty or Innocent: The Sam Sheppard Murder Case," was re-run on television here depicting the life of the man known as Dr. Sam, who was convicted of the murder in a dramatic trial five months after his wife's death.

He was freed 10 years later in a complicated round of appeals. Two years later, in 1966, the U.S. Supreme Court, citing extensive, prejudicial publicity, reversed his conviction. A new trial found him not guilty. Sheppard died in 1970 at age 46.

Gray said the weapon always had been a loose end in the investigation. He said police got phone calls offering tips whenever the movie was shown. None has turned up any new evidence, he said.

Coroner Samuel R. Gerber, who offered key testimony in both of Sheppard's trials, declined to discuss the latest findings. Mary E. Cowan, senior medical technologist, who worked on the original case, examined the tool but would not comment about it.
