

As you will recall, Mrs. Mabel Walker Willebrandt, 433 South Spring Street, Los Angeles, California, called at your office on May 13, 1942, stating that she strongly suspected that Marlene Dietrich, the movie actress, is acting as an agent of the French Government in this country. In view of this allegation, an inquiry was made concerning Miss Dietrich to determine whether she is engaged in un-American activities.

An interview with Mrs. Willebrandt reflected that she was hared by 20th Century Fox Studies and Colonel Darryl Zamuck to atraighten out Jean Gabin's status in this country inasmuch as he is an alian. She said that he was in the country on a visitor's visa and was having trouble getting extensions of time. She continued that she came to Washington to obtain an extension of time for Gabin. While she was here, Gabin came to Washington from New York, but was preceded by District who obtained hotel accommodations for both of them in the Carlton Hotel, At this time, Mrs. Willebrandt continued, Dietrich informed Gabin that she would make the necessary arrangements for him with authorities in Washington whereby he would not have to return to France. These developments, it was apparent, incensed Mrs. Willebrandt and it is suggested that she made the complaint concerning Dietrich through spite.

Background

Districh was born in Berlin, Germany, December 27, 1904. On May 17. 1923, she married one Rudolph Sieber in Berlin and to this union one child, Maria, Districh entered this country September 26, 1933, at the Port of New York. Her husband and child accompanied her. Dietrich was admitted to citizenship in Los Angeles, California, on June 9, 1939,

Prior to for arrival in this country, Dietrich had been associated with Joseph Von Sternberg, who presently resides at 10000 Tampa Avenue, Receda, Cali-Upon her arrival in this country she became associated with the Paramount REPERSESTUDIOS, where she again was directed by Yon Sternberg. It is noted that he had been instrumental in getting her to come to this country. After BUY being associated with the Paramount Studios for approximately three years, UNITED STATES She went to Universal Studies, making the picture "Destry Rides Again".

TOTAL STATE

During her work at the Paramount Studies, Dietrich always worked under Von Sternberg, who apparently was the only one who was capable of presenting her to the public in a laudable fashion. The files of the Los Angeles Field Division reflect information to the effect that during her entire association with Von Sternberg she was his mistress, in spite of the fact that she was married to Sieber.

In an interview with Dietrich in the early part of 1941 in connection with another matter, she stated that in 1936 she was in Paris, at which time Von Ribbentrop attempted to get her to return to Germany to make a picture there. However, she refused to do this even though Von Ribbentrop's request was made on behalf of Adolf Hitler. Dietrich said that after Von Ribbentrop's messenger had left her she debated with herself for two hours whether she should call Hitler directly telling him that she would go to Germany to visit him and then when she arrived there make some plan to kill him. She described Hitler as being "not a normal human being mentally," and described his evident feeling for her as "he has a tick for me."

Districh's Love Affair with Jean Gabin, Actor

At the present time, it is reported, Dietrich is carrying on what is locally described as a "terrific love affair" with Jean Gabin, the new Franch film star who recently completed the picture "Moontide" at 20th Century Fox Studies. Gabin has been reported as being pro-Vichy because he refused to align himself with other French stars who publicly have been going "all out" for Free France. Hewever, an investigation of him which was conducted by the Los Angeles Office failed to reflect that he is engaged in any un-American activities or is actively aiding the Vichy Government.

She constantly changed the interpretation intended by the director of the picture until both the director and producer wished that they had never seen or heard of her.

Gossip Concerning Districh

He continued that she also reportedly had veered from the norm and had had affairs with well-known women in Hollywood, one of these being Kay Francis.

continued that Dietrich has been the butt of much gossip concerning her affairs with Erich Remarque, the author of "All's Quiet on the Western Front", and John Mayne.

Conclusion

Although a rather extensive inquiry was made concerning Dietrich, no information was received which indicates that she is angaged in espionage activities.

No further inquiry is being made of her at this time.

Additional information received in Los Angeles Office concerning DIETRICE set forth. She is still keeping company with JEAN WARIN, the French movie actor, is currently making a picture at Universal Studios and still active in war works Source who has intimate knowledge of MIETRICH'S affaire, interviewed. However, this informent does not think DIETRICH nor GARIN nor DIETRICH'S husband, RUDOLFH MILLIAM/SIKHER, engaged in espionage or subservive activities. Information developed reflecting that SIRHER in 1937 wrote a letter to the German Consul in los Angeles "to register for military service." For this reason stated a transmous amount of pressure has been placed on the Inwigration and Maturalization Service to see that SIEHER becomes a citisen as quickly as possible.

SIERER desired to be technically correct, in notifying the F.S.I. and other agencies of any changes of address, et seters, which are required of alien enemies. Was advised to have SIERER notify the F.B.I. in the district where he registered as an alien enemy, of his change of address. It was suggested to that he discuss any further matters regarding the enemy alien status of SIERER with Assistant United States Attorney ATTILIO DI GEROLANO.

The alien enemy registration folder on SIEBER is not in the possession of this office and it is probably in New York City.

With reference to RUDOLPH SIERER'S application for citizenship a newspaper elipping from the August 21, 1942 issue of the Los Angeles Times is being made a part of instant file. Some stated that SIERER, Austrian born husband of MARLENE DIETRICH, "yesterday obtained his final naturalisation papers at the Federal Bailding." It continued that SIERER, now a Hollywood motion picture director, will be sligible be take the citizenship outh within minety days; that because of his marriage to MARLENE, a naturalised citizen, it is not necessary for him to file the usual first papers; that he has been in the United States since 1936 with frequent trips to Europe before the present war.

Special Agent on August 21, 1942 was advised, when at the Immigration and Naturalization Service on official business, that SIEHER had filed his papers the previous day; that his file is number 2h69P/100061. In the August 21st issue of the Daily Variety, a movie trade sheet, appeared the item "SIEHER now a citizen" and continued "JOSEPH-YON" STERMERG and TEDGY-NAUMFRID were character witnesses yesteriay for RUBOLFE SIEHER, husband of MARLENE DIETRICH, when he was awarded citizenship papers. Because hiss DIETRICH also is a citizen SIEHER was able to finish his naturalization two years in advance of schedule."

On August 12, 19h2 Source A telephonically sivised that DIKTRICE had received a message from one form from Switzerland which was af a perely personal nature, in which the requested DIKTRICE to communicate with him in the near future before he returned to France.

Instant file includes a photograph, a newspaper article of DIETRICH, being presented with a special Treasury Department citation as a reward for her bond selling tours. Instant award was made by IVAN STAUFFER and NELVIN POMPHRET of the Federal Agencies, Notion Picture Division, and Governor RICHARD E. OLSON. DIETRICH had made three nation wide bond selling tours and a fourth is scheduled as soon as she completes her current motion picture. This article appeared in the Los Angeles Times on August 11, 1942.

Source A, under date of August 19, 1942, furnished the Los Angeles Office with a summary of a telephone conversation made August 14, 1942 between DIETRICH, over telephone Crestview 1-7056, and JEAN GARIE who is in Mexicali, Mexico. DIETRICH stated that she had been waiting all day for his telephone call. She mentioned having finally reached (presumably) her present business manager) at Balboa Island, California. GARIE was gaite concerned over DIETRICH'S failure to call him earlier. He made the statement "I was busy all day but I think all the troubles will be fixed by tomorrow morning." It was agreed that GARIE would call DIETRICH in the morning.

The Durenz under date of August 6, 19h2 (160-0) directed a letter to the New York Office, copies of which were furnished this office. This letter was entitled SHEHEAM FOOD STORES MARIENE HIETRICH; JEAN GARIN; SIKHERT - INTERNAL SECURITY. It transmitted an anonymous letter posteried July 13, 19h2 New York City which reads

"I suggest checking seriously MARIKHE DISTRICE, the movie actrees, JRAN GABIN, the French actor now frequently with her, and with her ex-husband Mr. SIEBERT, who also has been seen with both of them.

On September 15, 19h2 Source was interviewed with reference to the information he had received from Source. At that this he stated that that CARIN had made the Statement that II the United States Government didn't want to give him his citisenship he would go beek to Europe; also, that SIESER was not particularly concerned whether he became a citisen or not. Source however, had no information from Source Chat HINTRICE was pro-German.

On September 17, 1942 Source was interviewed





developed that RUDOLPH EFILIAN SIEBER, husband of MARLENE DIETRICH, who for the past years has been residing at the Croydon Hotel, 12 East 66th Street, New York City, was pro-German and possibly a Nazi; further, that in 1937 SIEBER registered for military service with the German Consul in Los angeles. Inasmuch as on august 20, 19h2 SIEBER, in Los angeles, filed his final papers petitioning for American citizenship a summary of the information available to this office is being made herein so that appropriate investigation may be conducted in the New York Division and in Los angeles with reference to SIEBER. Referenced letter to the New York Office set forth the information available at that time.

On April 10, 19h2 reporting agent had occasion to interview Searce at that time Source advised that STERER was a German alien who had been sending his money back to Germany and that his general attitude was such that he, informant, thought SIERER might not be a good american. Continuing, informant stated that although he had no specific information to back up that conclusion he felt that his eastern representative might be able to furnish some information of value to this Bureau. At that time it was expected that this easterner would be in Los angeles in the near future.

On pril 28, June 1 and finally on July 3, 19h2 contact was had with Source

gested that Source be interviewed in hew lork try, rerenced letter to the new York Office was sent on August 26, 1942 to interview Source it also being pointed out at that time that in view of SIEBER'S application for citizenslip the information might be particularly pertinent to the government at this time.

On August 11, 19h? Acting Naturalization Examiner, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Los Angeles, California, was contacted by Special Agent, and he advised that subject was the husband of LAMLEME DIETRICH and was an enemy alien, technically being a citizen of Germany. Subject has lived in New York City for the past several years but for legal reasons has maintained his residence in California.

Within the next few days he is coming to Los angeles to complete his citizenship. Stated that LIRLEME DIETRICH has been doing a tremendous amount of work for the war effort and that subject is going to get a job in the 'var Information Bureau as soon as he becomes a citizen. For this reason stated a tremendous amount of pressure has been placed on the Immigration and Naturalization Service to see that subject becomes a citizen as quickly as possible.

Subject desired to be technically correct, in notifying the F.B.I. and other agencies of any changes of address, et cetera, which are required of alien enemies. was advised to have subject notify the F.B.I. in the district where he registered as an alien enemy, of his changee of address.

It was suggested to that he discuss any further matters regarding the enemy alien status of subject with Assistant UnitedStates Attorney & ATTILIC DI GIROLALO.

The alien enemy registration folder on subject is not in the possession of this office and it is probably in New York City.

Under date of August 16, 1962 there was received at this office copy of a letter issued by the Southern California Sector, Western Defense Command, Office of the Provost Larshal, Pasadena, California, entitled "TEM PORARY EXEMPTION FROM CURFERY" and addressed "TO THOM IT MAY CONCERN." It read as follows:

- *1. Temporary exemption _____om curfew is granted to RUDOLPH E. SIEBER of 868 Birchwood Drive, Los Angeles. He is here for the purpose of receiving a hearing on his naturalization.
- "2. Permit is valid from august 17th to September 5, 19h2 inclusive.
 - "3. Exemption from curfew regulations is authorized.

As a matter of information herein, 668 Birchwood Drive, Los Angeles, is the home occupied by KARLENE DISTRICH.

On August 18, 1912 reporting agent contacted

Examiner, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Los angeles, at which time he advised that SIEBER was petitioning for citizenship on august 20, 1912; however, that it would likely be a period of six months before he actually came up for admission as a citizen of the United States. He stated that SIEBER had been in his office the day before; that he was going to be in Los angeles until about the 3rd or 5th of September, when he would return to New York; further, that because of the bond-selling efforts of LARLENE DISTRICH, considerable pressure was being put on the Naturalization Service to hasten SIEBER'S citizenship.

Stated he had requested SIEBER to keep the New York and Los Angeles Offices of the F.B.I. advised of his whereabouts.

was furnished with the information that the F.B.I. office had just received, from a confidential source, information reflecting that SIEBER had offered his services to the German Government. Any investigation made by the Naturalization Service, which reflects information of value to this office, will be immediately furnished. With reference to RUDOLPH SIEBER'S application for citizenship newspaper clipping from the August 21, 1942 issue of the Los Angeles Times is being made a part of instant file. This newspaper clipping stated that SIEBER, Austrian born husband of LARLENE DIETRICH, "yesterday obtained his final naturalization papers at the Federal Building." It continued that SIEBER, now a Hollywood motion picture director, will be eligible to take the citizenship oath within ninety days; that because of his marriage to DIETRICH, a naturalized citizen, it is not necessary for him to file the usual first papers; that he has been in the United States since 1934 with frequent trips to Europe before the present war.

Special Agent on August 21, 1942 was advised, when at the Immigration and Naturalization Service on official business, that SIEBER had filed his papers the previous day; that his file is number 246/P/100081. In the August 21st issue of the Daily Variety, a movie trade sheet, appeared the item "SIEBER now a citizen" and continued "JOSEF VON STERNBERG and TEDDY BAUNFELD were character witnesses yesterday for RUDOLPH SIEBER, husband of MARLENE DIETRICH, when he was awarded citizenship papers. Because Miss DIETRICH also is a citizen SIEBER was able to finish his naturalization two years in advance of schedule."

On September 18, 1942 this office received a letter from the Immigration and Naturalization Service, this city, dated august 29, 1942, their file number 246/P/100081 which read as follows:

"Special Agent in Charge Federal Bureau of Investigation 510 South Spring Street Los Angeles, California

"Dear Sir:

"The person named below, who has filed a petition for naturalization, is an enemy alien under the terms of Section 326 of the Nationality Act of 1940. It is requested that you furnish this office, for use in consideration of the case, any information contained in your files which might reflect upon the subject's loyalty to the United States and fitness for United States citizenship. Please use the space at the bottom of this letter for your reply, using additional pages if necessary.



Services for the German army; that same had been done either to the German Consul, GEORGE GYSSLING, or to H. A. GEBHARDT, attorney for the Consul. This source also recalled that on one occasion some years ago GEBHARDT had acted as attorney for SIEBER.

Continuing, this source stated that neither SIEBER nor DIETRICH had ever made any statements in the presence of this informant indicating that they were Nazis or even pro-German. However, informant stated that both SIEBER and DIETRICH continually were "digging" by making sarcastic remarks against the English. DIETRICH would say that no Englishman could go on bond tours throughout the country because Americans hate them. SIEBER was of a like mind. In fact, of late, informant said SIEBER insisted in waving the American flag. SIEBER was 1 described as the Prussian type of German as is also DIETRICH. As such they think that their people are right. However, informant made it clear that it was not believed that either SIEBER or DIETRICH were engaged in any active promotion of the welfare of Germany. DIETRICH was described as being too stupid to be a spy and SIEBER as being afraid. Both SIEBER and DIETRICH 🔏 were believed by informant deep down to like the European ways of doing things. At the same time agent was advised that DIETRICH, after making her three-bond tours, has been greatly impressed by the adulation shown her and has taken a particular liking for this country which she did not have heretofore. During the time that SIERER was in Los angeles he lived at DIETRICH'S home and informant stated JEAN GABIN, the French movie actor who is DIETRIGH'S present consort, also was there most of the time. GABIN is subject of Los i Angeles file 100-6792 entitled "JEAN GABIN, with alias. Internal Security-F." This is in a closed status in the Los Angeles Office.



"The SIEBERS have lived at various places in California. One home was at the corner of Roxbury and Sunset Boulevard, in Beverly Hills; that was taken prior to 1934 and they lived there for some six years. Then they took the MARION DAVIES house at the Beach at Santa Lonica and lived there approximately a year. Then they moved to the COLLEEN MOORE house in Bel-Air, where they lived for approximately a year and a half, and when Lr. SIEBER had to go back to Europe for business reasons, hiss DIETRICH and their daughter moved to a smaller house. The only place they have lived on a permanent basis in America, since their first entry, has been in California, and the daughter has been here, except when the mother and father were on trips to Europe, almost continuously since 1931.

"Miss DIETRICH first came to america and to California in April of 1930 and stayed from April to December; then she went back to Berlin on a vacation. In 1931 she came back to California, in April, with her daughter, MARIA, and lived here until 1933. She then went to France with her daughter for a visit, in July 1933, returning to California in September, 1933, where the family resided until July, 1936. Miss DIETRICH states that Lr. SIEBER first came to California the first part of 1932, to the best of her knowledge and belief. He went back to Europe and returned to America in 1933 on a quota number. At no time between 193h and 1939 was he out of the country long enough to have kept him from becoming a citizen except that he lost his citizenship time credit because in November, 1937, when the family was preparing to return from a visit to France, England, and Switzerland, and had sailings* booked, LARIA, the daughter, became ill and the shipping companies would not permit her to have passage on any boat. Ir. and Irs. SIEBER canceled their sailing date twice, waiting and hoping that the daughter would be able to travel, but this was not the case and as Paramount was demanding her immediate return to meet a picture engagement, and as there was no one to leave the child with in France, the only thing to do was for the father to remain with her. The SIEBERS considered having hrs. SIEBER'S mother come from Berlin, but since she could not leave Germany without giving up all rights to her property that was deemed inadvisable, and Lrs. SIEBER did not want her daughter to go to Germany as neither she nor lr. SIEBER had gone back to their native land since they had taken out quota numbers in America, so there was no choice but to have ir. SIEBER stay in France to take care of their daughter. Both Lr. and Lrs. SIEBER received extensions on their re-entry permits, under their quota numbers.

"After finishing her Paramount picture, kiss DIETRICH returned to France in 1938 for a vacation, and found her daughter ill again. After a short stay in the South of France, where her daughter was under constant observation to try to ascertain the cause of her constant illnesses, they went to Paris, and the finest doctors there

and they started these treatments, which caused MARIA to show decided improvement immediately. The doctors implored the mother and father not to take the child away from the treatments given under their supervision. Once more extensions were given on the re-entry permits for LARIA and Mr. SIEBER, and Miss DIETRICH came back to America in November of 1938, with the doctors' promise that if Mr. SIEBER and MARIA would stay until January of 1939, that the child could then be brought with safety to America, which he did merely and entirely because of the child's illness. As a matter of fact, when Mr. SIEBER'S absence from the country was explained to the proper authorities in Mashington, although it is customary for a daughter not to be made a citizen until her father is made a citizen, this case was so thoroughly understood by the Mashington authorities that the daughter was permitted to become a citizen; and remember, the only home that daughter has had in America has been in California.

"As stated above, Mr. SIEBER first came to California in 1932 and then went back to continue his work for Paramount in France, as he spoke very poor English and was much more valuable to the organization in Europe than he was in this country. In 1933 or 1934 when he came over under the quota, he came directly to California and again did not stay very long because he felt so out of place on account of his English, and because he had not risen high enough in his position with Paramount in France to obtain a good position here with the language handicap, and he went back to France meraly with the purpose of making himself more valuable to the Paramount organization, hoping to become important enough to make a place for himself in California. The latter part of 1934 he again returned to California to his wife and family, and stayed for a whole year, which entended into the year of 1935, during which time he made a picture with liss DIETRICH, as assistant director, but this did not turn out so well because he was sensitive and feit that the supposed success he was having was because by that time kiss DIETRICH was a great star and he did not want to have his success attributed to 'pull', so again he went back to Paris to work for Paramount, returning to California in December, 1935 to be with his family in their home, and also to straighten out the great trouble hiss DIETRICH had when it was found had forged some \$75,000.00 worth of checks, as when he was here working at Paramount he had always been in very close touch with her business affairs, and money matters and he was the only one who could go over the checks and know which ones were forged, which shows conclusively that he was always in very close touch with her business affairs, as a husband should be. He did not receive any salary during the year he was here and made a picture as assistant director because he did not wish to arouse antagonism and also he did not think it was fair to take money away from an American on the set, so

"Mr. SIEBER left again for Europe in January, 1936 with kiss DIET-RICH because she had contracted to make the picture 'KNIGHT LITHOUT ARLOUR' and he remained there then to get the company started for her own productions, because she wanted to give him a chance to make his own pictures and get credit for his own undeniable ability. Later, as you recall, ir. VON STERN-BERG had a nervous breakdown and since he was the center of the company from the directorial standpoint, they planned for ar. SIEBER to return to his home in California; this was in the fall of 1937. Then he was held up on account of the illness of the daughter, as given above.

SIEMER did not get back to the United States until June, 1939 and by that time Liss DIETRICH was ready to go back to Europe, so she met them in New York on their arrival in June of 1939, but by that time she was 'finished' in pictures in Hollywood, so they said, and finding she could not get a commitment for a picture here, they went back to France to hasotiate for a picture there, as she thought that if she made a smash hit in France she would then be in demand again in Hollywood. Please understand that on this information she left her furniture, bank account, everything they had, in California, proving conclusively that California was still their heme. By the time they arrived in France the war clouds were becoming very ominous and Irs. SIEBER returned to the United States the first part of August and Ir. SIEBER returned on August 27, bringing LARIA with him, and they all came out to the Coast.

there is, according g no income for r. SIEBER from Europe, during the times he was working for Paramount there and she advises that he got very little money for his work - possibly less than \$50.00 a week, American money - on which he had to pay French taxes and also from which he had to pay his living expenses, and the reason that there was no income was probably that since his home is in California and he, therefore, would be permitted to charge his living expenses in France as a business expense, after making that and other deductions, there would be no tax to pay. He was in France on a visitor's visa and had to live in hotels because, under French law, he could not own or lease even a simple apartment without being a resident of France and he always gave there his home as California. Also, since he was in France on a visitor's visa, and the red tape there is even more strict. than it is here, had it not been that Paramount was a very powerful foreign corporation he would not have been permitted to work. Even his car, which was given to him as a birthlay present, was in France on a 'trip ticket', which means just for temporary purposes, and it was later brought back to California.

Reference is made to the report of Special Agent dated March 25, 1943, at Los Angeles, California, in the above-captioned matter, copies of which are enclosed.

In response to a telephone call from MARIENE DIETRICH, filmactress wife of Subject, RUDOLPH EMILIANLETERER, Special Agent called at her home, 868 Birchwood Drive, Los Angeles, California. Miss DIETRICH stated that she had just recently returned from a bond selling tour of the United States and that on several occasions her husband, RUDOLPH SIEBER, had attempted to accompany her but had been barred from admittance to various locations because of the fact that he was an alien enemy. This condition has caused Miss DIETRICH a great deal of worry. she says, so immediately upon her return to Los Angeles, she telephonically contacted Inspector Immigration and Naturalization Service. Federal Building, Los Angeles, California. Wiss DIETRICH'S statement to Special Agent was that Inspector told her "the case has been suspended by the F.B.I." and that that agency was awaiting a report from our New York Office before proceeding with the case.

Miss DIETRICH was informed by Special Agent could not be the case, inasmuch as the Federal Bureau of Investigation did not grant or withhold citizenship and that this function was the sole responsibility of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Miss DIETRICH expressed disappointment, stating that she did not know where to turn for help or advice; that her husband's status was causing both him and her a great deal of concern and that she was of the frame of mind to call on President ROOSEVELT in an effort to obtain the true facts regarding the delay. surrounding RUDOLPH SIEBER'S citizenship petition.

At the time of this conversation, Inspector stated that he had written a letter to the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation requesting information regarding the Subject. (The report of Special Agent dated Catober 9, 1942, at Los Angeles, California, set out leads for the New York Field Division and the local office of Immigration and Naturalization Service was advised of this fact in a letter dated January 14, 1943.)

Inspector volunteered the information to Special Agent as follows: "Our report is almost finished, we are waiting for your report, that is all that is holding it up".

In response to her request, Special Agent telephonically contacted MARIENE DIETRICH on March 25, 1943, at which time she was told again that granting of citizenship or withholding of same came under the jurisdiction of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. Miss DIETRICH expressed disappointment and stated "I thought it was being suspended awaiting a report from yter office", to which she was told that any delay which had occurred was at the discretion of the Immigration and Naturalization Service and that any detailed information regarding this matter should be obtained from that governmental agency. Miss DIETRICH replied that she was of the opinion that there was nothing to do but wait.

This matter is being called to the attention of the Bureau, inasmuch as the possibility exists that Miss DIETRICH will take this matter directly to the President of the United States, FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT. She mentioned that at the time of her departure for Europe several years ago, Treasury agents had impounded her baggage and jewels for federal taxes, at which time she personally called Secretary of the Treasury MORGENTHAU and had the matter adjusted to her entire satisfaction in an expeditious manner.

In view of the above, it is requested that the New York Office give expeditious attention to the leads set out in the report mentioned in the body of this letter.



Inho, after an examination of Contact was had with Informat DETAILS: his records, advised that the subject took up residence at the Croydon Hotel, 12 E. Soth Street, New York City on May 25, 1940. Since that time he has occupied Apartment 1125 consisting of a chamber, dining alcove Documples the other chamber adjoining and living room. The first lease signed by the subject started on June 1, this apartment. 1940 and extended to the month of October, the following years at a remtal of \$5300. He now leases this apartment on a yearly basis at an annual rental of \$2940. The apartment was first secured for the subject through the services a real estate diency. The records of the hotel reflect that subject previously resided at the Gladstone Hotel, located at 114 E. 82d Street, New York City

Through the courteey of Information reporting Agent was permitted to emmine the hotel records relating to the subject. These reflected that he furnished as a reference the Corn Exchange Bank & Trust Company of Park Avenue, who advised the hetel management by letter dated May 24, 1940 that subject carried a satisfactory, well-conducted routing account at the Park Avenue Branch since February 10, 1940 and that the bank had no reason to believe he is other than responsible. Another reference fundahed by the subject was Lleyd's and Bational Provincial Poreign Bank of Paris. Informant provised that he, too, had had no personal compact with the subject and therefore was likewise mable to furnish information. The informer ant is inclined to discount these statements, but they have been repeated to him on various occasions by the subject. The informat also advised that Sieber has never eaused any trouble whatever during his tenancy at the hotel and has always paid his obligations promptly. He occasionally refers to as his ward and according to the informant there has never been any display of affection between these two individuals. The informant also indicated that Miss Dietrich is aware of the arrangement and he has observed that when she makes trips to New York and is greated by the press upon her arrival, that the subject, as well as cocasionally appears in newspaper photographs as greeting Miss Dietrich upon her arrivale

It should also be noted that Informant explained that the connecting door between the room accupied by the and the spartment occupied by 570
subject, had been out through the dining alcove of the subject's apartment
prior to his occupancy, apparently for the benefit of former guests of the
hotel and that at the time subject rented the apartment, he found this arrangement desirable.

It was also ascertained that subject appears to be friendly with one who occupies apartment that at the Croydon Hotel and who formerly resided at the hotel since September 12, 1941 and at the time he took up residence there gave as references the Hational City Bank of Rew York and the subject. The members of the hotel management who were interviewed were

also of the opinion that had some connection with the moving picture industry and had recently appeared in one small role; however at the time of the interview and for several months prior thereto, he appeared to have no employment whatever.

The recerds of the hotel also reflected that from March 1/te
March 17, 1942, JOSEF VON STERMBERG, who usually directs Miss District string films, was registered at the hotel and in his party were included a

It was the recollection of the hotel management that Sieber had made arrangements for this party to reside at the hotel and it was also noted that on the registration card of Von Stermberg there appeared a notation "no publicity".

In July, 1942, Siebers file reflects that a cancelation clause was added to his lease since he claimed to be subject to the draft; however, the file also contains a statement to the effect that the probability of his being called was very remote.

There were no records available of telegrams or long distance telephone calls received or sent by the subject or The hotel management explained that when Sieber took up residence at the hotel, he immediately had installed a private telephone and therefore his calls do not clear through the hotel switchboard.

Informant was contacted at the suggestion of Informant who stated that this individual could be relied upon. Informant advised that the subject has continued to maintain a private telephone in his apartment and therefore he makes very few outgoing calls through the hotel switchboard. She stated such outgoing calls were restricted largely to the various forms of service available at the hotel. The only incoming long distance calls received through the hotel switchboard are those from Miss Dietrich in Hollywood, which occurred approximately once each week. This individual emplained that Districh's secretary always places Miss Districh's calls and Districh herself never comes to the telephone until the connection has been completed. Her conversations are invariably in a foreign tongue which the informant believes to be German. Occasionally these calls from Districh are answered by who also converses with Miss Dietrich in German. This informant also indicated she was aware of the fact that subject was friendly with The informant advised that it was her opinion that this individual had recently appeared in a small movie role and is not now engaged in any position since he can usually be located in his apartments 10

Informant palso stated that same sometimes holds herself forth as the secretary of the subject. Informant also indicated that she remains in the apartment practically the entire day since it is common knowledge at the

hotel that she will not accept any telephone calls for a period of several hours each afternoom while she is having her map. It was also indicated that she may call the switchboard from the extension located in her room or from the extension located in the room of the subjects


of Local Board 44, lecated at 1109 Lexington Avenue, New York City permitted the reporting Agent to examine the file relating to the subject. This file reflects that Sieber's order number is 1149, serial T-1005. According to information contained in this file, subject was born February 20, 1897 at Aussig, Austria. He listed as the person who would always know his address MARLENE DIETRICH, Beverly Hills Hotels Bewerly Hills, California. He registered in accordance with the requirements of the Selective Service Act on February 16, 1942. High securational questions maire indicates he is an alien who has not filed papers for citizenship, explaining that such action was not necessary since he was married to a citisen; that he does not have a job and is looking for work; that he is married, has no dependents and is possessed of a high school education. In this questionmaire he indicated that the job for which he is best fitted was producing and directing motion pictures since he had had 20 years' experience in this line of work from 1919-39. The type of a job for which he was mext best fitted was listed as a motion picture scenarist having had la years' experience in this type of work from January, 1940 to June, 1941. The duties of the job for which he is next best fitted he listed as titling American-made films for foreign countries. The file contained a letter from

dated May 15, 1942 confirming telephone conversation requesting an additional 10-day period in which to file the questionnaire of subject, in order that his nationality status could be cleared up.


It was also indicated in his original draft questionnaire that subject has physical defects in that he is suffering from kidney stonese In this questionnaire he also states he is residing with his wife. Information contained therein also reflects that during the last 12 months, the subject stated he sarned approximately \$500 whereas during the same period of time his wife earned \$100,000 and during this period of time he contributed nothing to the support of his wife or child. He also indicated in the questionnaire he paid a monthly rental of \$170. The subject claims permanent residence in the United States since February 28, 1954. His questionnaire was signed on May 25, 1942 and on June 25, 1942 he was classified 1-A; however on July 7, 1942 he was reclassified in 3-4. This reclassification was discussed with officials of the Draft Board who stated that this action was prompted because of the fact that his daughter was not yet 18 years of age at that time and the subject therefore could have appealed the classification on that basis in spite of the fact that he admitted in his questionmairs he had not contributed to the support of his daughter. However, as indicated above, he also stated that he was residing with his wife and daughter. Since he is now over 46 years of age, there is no possibility of his being drafted at present, under existing regulations.

It is noted that the possibility exists that Sieber made a strip to California to visit his wife and daughter at approximately the time hereent in his draft questionnaire and therefore was in a position to state that he was residing with his wife and daughter. by Special Agent Contact was had with Informant This individual permitted an examination of the bank account of subject maintained at the Corn Exchange Bank and Trust Company, 86th and Lexington Avenue, New York Citye The records reflected this bank account was opened at the Park Avenue Branch on February 10, 1940. The account was introof the Hotel Gladstons, 114 E. 52d Street, Now 570 duced by York City, which was then the residence of the subject. The account was transferred to the 86th Street Branch on May 28, 1960 when subject moved to the Hotel Croydone An examination of the bank ledgers for this account shows that the subject makes a bi-monthly deposit of \$200 cm or about the first and fifteenth of each mouth. Informant sadvised that these deposits were checks of MARLENE DIETRICH, the wabject's wife, drawn on the Bank of America, Beverly Hills, California. The subject maintains an average balance of \$500 to \$1,000 in this account. In addition to the \$200 deposited, Sieber deposited a \$5,000 check drawn on the account of MARLENE DIETRICH on December 22, 1942 and on January 11, 1945 he made a cash withdrawal of \$4,000. The canceled vouchers on file were also examined and indicated Sieber cashed a number of checks at the Hotel Croydon. One such check, in the amount of \$170. was apparently for rent paid to the hotel. Several small checks were drawn to the firm named Martell's and on March 15, 1943 he drew a check for \$18,75 for a war bonda

Informant advised that at one time the studie of Universal Pictures on the West Coast obtained a commitment from MARIENE DISTRICE to appear in two motion pictures and as part of the agreement entered into between these parties, it was arranged for the Universal Company to place her husband on the payroli of the firm in New York City. This action was demanded by Miss Districh because, according to the informant, her husband was regarded as more or less of an irritant by her and she wanted him removed to some distant point where it would be impossible for him to interfere with her private life. It is believed that this arrangement was included as a stipulation in the contract. Therefore, Enstructions were issued

to the effect that Sieber should be placed on

the payroll in some capacity.

hired the subject as a translator popular popular for the foreign Publicity Department of Universal Pictures at New York City at a salary of \$100 per week. Informant explained that the subject is listed in the records of the company as a scenarist, although he was actually employed doing only translation work. According to the informant, the subject was definitely not worth the figure he was being paid by Universal, but the studio had no alternative if they wished to secure the services of Miss Dietrich, which were desired at that time.

While employed in New York City, the subject was a very quiet individual and caused no trouble, attended to his own business, and never associated with fellow employees.

He was advised that the studio was experiencing a delay in completing the second picture commitment by Niss Dietrich

retain the services of the subject until such time as this sommitment was fully completed. At the completion of the picture

This informent also advised that on one occasion when in the office of subject, he noticed many German magazines and periodicals in the subject's desk but he is unable to attach any particular significance to this fact since the company subscribed to practically every foreign publication availables

For the purpose of definitely verifying the period of employment of the subject, the informant checked the personnel records and advised he was employed from February 5, 1940 to June 28, 1941 at a salary of \$100 per week and when given otics in June, 1941, he was provided an additional two weeks salary.

It is noted that the remark attributed to the subject by the mas made at the time of his discharge in June, 1941 or before the entrance of this country into the ware.

The informant advised that he was positive me further information could be obtained from the co-workers of subject still employed at Universal Pictures in New York City since the subject always remained aloof to them;

That the writer could

be assured that he would maintain the interview in a confidential status.

He stated that in order to fully realise the position of Earlense Dietrich and her husband, one must be aware of the fact that as a person concupying a prominent position in the motion picture industry, Marlens Dietrich is forced to live up to certain of her movie roles in private life, in order to maintain her popularity and also to please her public. He pointed out that her recent roles have largely centered about the "rough and tumble Barbary Coast gal" and it is necessary for her private life to follow somewhat this pattern. He also advised that through his friendship with Miss Dietrich she has discussed with him matters regarding her own personal life, which he considers to be of a confidential nature but which he also stated indicate that she is well aware of the public's opinion of her. For example, she has recently told him that she is well aware of the fact that she has been accused by practically every columnist and commentator, and particularly those on the

West Coast, of living with JEAN GABIN. She stated that if people would just take time to think such matters out, they would realize that such a situation is impossible. She stated she has never visited Gabin at his apartment, and that whenever they meet, he visits at her apartment and present are her daughter, her secretary and her maid.

According to Deforment, MISS DIETRICH is also well aware of the fact that she has been accused of having affairs with other members of the movie industry and has occasionally been accused of having such affairs with the directors of her metion pictures on down to the most menial jeb holder. Since the popular conception seems to be that an actress who eards the sum of money she draws is presumed of necessity to engage in such activities in order to retain her position, he states that Miss Districh realizes that it is impossible to refute such constantly recurring rumors and therefore she makes no attempt whatever to do so since any attempts in this direction would be futile. He stated that he has been present at times when Miss District has jokingly been accused of being a favorite of Hitler and she has resented such statements and en one occasion remarked to him privately that she would mean absolutely nothing to Hitler and he in turn meant absolutely nothing to her. The informant stated as a matter of fact during the period of her residence in Germany, she never became asquainted with Hitler and according to his information there was absolutely no pro-German tendency on the part of either Miss Dietrich or her husband.

He also stated that Miss Dietrich is somewhat sensitive of the fact that certain restrictions have been placed on her husband because of his alien enemy status and he explained that she frequently, and very successfully, has entertained service men in various camps, but is not permitted to have her husband visit the camps with her because of his status.

Sleber's story was entirely truthful and he was eventually convinced that it was

Sieber left Germany in September,

become a German citizen in order to obtain suitable living runters for his family while they resided in Berlin. He also pointed out that since that time it was impractical for Sieber to renounce his German citizenship because had he done so, he would have reverted to his native nationality as a Caschoslovakian and this would have upset the plans of his wife to become an American citizen.

Miss Dietrich has been making frequent appearances at bond rallies and before servicemen in various camps

The informant explained that he believes he is fairly well accordanted with Sieber and he characterised Sieber as an "inoffensive little man". He also stated that because of her position in the movie industry, Miss Dietrich could not afford to have him accept any position which would not be considered one of importance and affluence and therefore she prefers to have him remain inconspicuously in the background with no employment whatever rather than to have him accept some job which might result in embarrassment to here

Informant stated that Sieber is a quiet, timid type of man who will undoubtedly always remain that way and who is much better known as "Miss Districh's husband". He stated that Sieber once had excellent possibilities of developing into one of the more important writers in the motion picture industry in Europe and it was because of these possibilities that Districh married him; however it has since turned out that he has not attained the degree of success anticipated.

Informant also referred to the fact that there had recently been many references made by columnists to the effect that a divorce would soon occur between Sieber and Districh.

He stated that he is certain no divorce is imminent since neither could accomplish anything by divorce proceedings.

According to the informant, Sieber is unemployed at the present time, and there is no doubt but what he is being entirely supported by Miss. Districts

Croydon Hotel, the informant also advised that he was aware of this and explained that the was a Russian girl



The informant stated that he is aware that the average individual, upon learning that and Sieber are living together would immediately assume that acts of misconduct do exist; however, he stated he is aware of the fact that at the time the Immigration and Naturalization Sérvice was making inquiry into Sieber's background, was personally interviewed and asked if such acts did exist between her and Sieber. He stated that both and Sieber were very much perplexed at this course of action.

He also stated Sieber was at a loss to understand why such emphasis should be placed on such a matter and how it could affect his citizenship status; however informant reiterated he is of the impression, and has gained such impression from conversations with Dietrich, that no such relationship exists between and Sieber. 1/1/

During the course of the interview, the inferment advised that in the event any infermation of a derogatory character had been furnished to this organization concerning either DIETRICH or SIEBER, it had undoubtedly been furnished by the individual referred to in reference report as Source



This informant also stated that not only is he not aware of any pro-Masi tendencies on the part of subject, through his sequaintance with him, but he has learned that he purchases war bonds regularly. He also is aware of the fact that subject made an attempt to domate blood to the Red Gross Blood Bank but was refused because of his physical condition. He also stated that he made application for some type of executive position, probably as an officer, in the Marine Corps, but was refused because of his aliem status. The informant also indicated that subject has advised him he does not knew if his parents are still alive in Europee

For the information of the Los Angeles Field Office, the application for Certificate of Identification of the subject is on file with the New York Office. His AER number is 2849180 and the application reflects that he registered as an enemy alien in February, 1942, at which time he furnished his residence address as 12 E. 86th Street, the address of the Croydon Hotele He indicated that he was born on February 20, 1897 and was a citizen of Germany. He reported that he was unemployed at present and listed as his relatives residing in this country his wife and his daughter MARIA HIZABETH SIEBER, both of Beverly Hills, California. His relatives residing outside of the United States he listed as the followings

The application also reflects that he became a citizen of Germany at Berlin in 1927 and took the cath of allegiance in 1915 upon becoming a soldier in the Austrian-Hungarian Army. He listed as the only club of which he was a member the Touring Club DeFrance (automobile club) at Faris, in which

his membership ceased in 1959. The file also contains a letter from the subject dated August 18, 1942, reflecting that as of that date he was changing his address to 868 Birchwood Drive, Los Angeles, California, where he expected to reside until about September 8, 1942.

By letter dated September 8, 1942, he again advised that he had returned from Los Angeles and was now residing at 12 E. 86th Street, New York City. In both letters he indicates that his occupation status has not changed.
