After studying the resychological make-up of the Mexican Mafia it was agreed that this group and the other related groups should be attacked from both their weak and strong points. The weakness in the organization was that some of its members were drug abusers on parole, and vulnerable. Their strongest attribute was the discipline that its members had built over the years through enforcement of their internal laws, and other officers directed the first assault on the Magua through the enforcement of state laws pertaining to escapes, marole violations, robberies and homicides. A large number of Mexican Mafia members were returned to prison for the aforementioned violations.

prior to the involvement of the Task Force, an incarcerated member of the Mexican Mafia who wanted to leave the Mafia had no alternative other than to fight the Mexican Mafia and eventually be killed, or go to the prison authorities and be locked in protective custody for the rest of his term. This was an awkward position for any prisoner, and especially for an inmate the caliber of a Mafia member:

The main reason for the Mafia's failure in their attempts to control major criminal activities has been the organized and concerted effort of Task Force, through arrests of Mafia members and a certinued monitoring of their activities, both inside and outside of prison.






