Hembers of the organisation have expressed the belief that they are in possession of signs and signals and passwords which will proclude harm from Japanese or German troops when they invade the United States. It is observed that the members of the Pacific Movement of the Eastern World were similarly taught signs purportedly for their protection in the event of invasion. It also appears that there is a military unit within the organisation termed the "Brothers of the Military Department", emother indication of similarity between this organisation and the Pacific Movement of the Eastern World. It is noted in the "Moorish Voice" that this group provides entertainment at their meetings. (62-25889-66 & 61)

It was learned that the bead of the organisation is known as "Colonel" C. Kirkman Bey, Supreme Grand Advisor and Moderator, who maintains the national headquarters at 1104 Sedgmick Avenue, Chicago, Illimeis. The headquarters of the organisation publishes a missographed pamphlat known as the "Moorish Voice" which appears to be issued monthly and is sold for 104. It seems to be concerned with the social activities of the various branches and the sale of devices and trappings of the organisation.

Investigation has disclosed that the Moorish Temple of Science of America was incorporated under the "Not For Profit Act" of the state of Illinois on November 29, 1926. A certificate was filed with the state of Illinois on May 21, 1928, changing the name to the Moorish Science Temple of America. The organisation was incorporated in the state of Indiana on March 17, 1930, for the expressed purpose of teaching the Moran, to establish the Mohammedan faith in America and to conform to that faith by annexing the names of Ali, El and Bey. It was also incorporated in the state of New York with the principal office at 44 Jefferson Avenue, Brooklyn and attempted to domesticate in the state of Virginia but was there refused permission on the ground that the state constitution prohibits the incorporation of a religious denomination previously incorporated under the laws of another state. (62-25889-26 & 41)

The Moorish Science Temple of America also maintains a colony near Prince George, Virginia, known as the National Home of the Moorish Science Temple of America. The local leader, the Bey, elains over one million members in the organisation and has immission that these members support the colony which in turn prints the "Moorish Voice" and manufactures various devices for the use of the organisation. It appears that the inhabitants of the home come from various branches of the Moorish Science Temple, millising it as a refuge.

The letterhead of the New Haven Division of the Moorish Science Temple reflects that F. Turner Kl is "Executive Councilor and Moderator of the Eastern District", 340 Hancock Street, Brooklyn, New York, and that R. Scott Bey is the Mational Chairsan. Harold Peters Bey, 707 Grand Avenue, New Haven, Connecticut, is named Trand Deputy Councilor of the Eastern District."

The organization has recently been quite estive in Detroit, Michigan, where it has been reported the organization has taught that Japan will overthrow the United States; that after the United States and Japan go to war, the colored people will not be attacked providing they surrender to Japan; that America should arm the negro and then the negro should surrender to the Japanese and that it is necessary for the Negroes to establish a front in the United States. It has been reported that who will be recalled as the promoter of the Development of our own in petroit, was at one time active in the Mooriah Science Temple of America under the name of Satakata Takahashi, a major in the Japanese army, and a

representative of the so-called Japanese Black Dragon Society.

520 A magro known as Boy founded a unit of this organization at Kensas City, Kensas, which was said to have broken away from the national association in about 1935. The organisation was at one time very active and in 1936 or 1937 had approximately 500 members. membership subsequently deindled, possibly because of the death of Mohamued Bay. This organisation differed from the Mational Moorish Science Temple chiefly in that it prohibited male members from chaving and required them to wear red fesses at all times. There were also other requirements as to dress, particularly of the women. Fifteen members of this cult were arrested on July 24, 1942, for violations of the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940. Two were released immediately as they were not within the age limits prescribed by the Act. Seven of them, Wimifred Boyd Bey, Jr., Winifred Boyd Bey, Sr., Roy Lee Boyd Bey, Otha Modes Bey, Paul Jackson Il, Lensie David Bey and John Hunter Il, were convicted in the United States District Court at Kansas City and were each sentenced on January 19, 1943, to terms of four years and to pay a fine of \$1,000. The reasining persons arrested were released on October 24, 1942, by order of the Attorney General.



The latter said that the dues for the organization are 50¢ per month but he added that no one pay dues anymore. The minutes of the meeting reflected that at each meeting a collection is taken and the proceeds run from 2 cents to 15 cents. BEY was questioned regarding his attitude toward the present war. he said that all persons are divided into two groups. All colored persons are Noores and all white persons are Europeans.

He was asked by the writer into what classification the Japanese would fall and he stated that he did not know. He said that he had never heard the question brought up before and that for an intelligence answer to this question he would have to consult Colonel C. KIRDMAN BET. He said that he was a 100 percent American and would gadly fight in the armed forces if such was necessary. He stated that he had registered under the Selective Service Act and exhibited his Registration Card which was dated October 16, 1940. He registered at Local Board No. 6, Milwaukee, and was classified 4-H on Jamuary 29, 1943.

Science Temple of America were purely religious and that political affairs were never mentioned in any of their meetings.

Man don't talk about that the government requires 10% of every dollar and a 5% victory tax which makes 15% of your dollar gone which leaves you only 85% and the actual value of the whole dollar is 40 cents discount 15° which leaves you 25¢ of every dollar so you know what you get now. Now the price of everything is going up but wages haven't budged everything you have to buy is out of sight. Now I understand what they ment by the term Celing Price. You saw the picture Celing Zero didn't you, well as high as can go if could any higher it would but the law of gravity won't permit ha, ha.

"Did you know what was in the Army well he . said when he was on his 12 day fourlough he would be glade to leave here but you should hear that poor sucker crying now and you should hear the poor guys in the streets crying about hard times and don't know what to do well Hegroes are going to catch plenty of h__ now they are crying about being called Negroes well when the white man ask the poor suckers what and who they are all they can say is I don't know. Then the white man says you are a Negro a man must be what he knows and what does he know? Ans. Negro well I am going to tell you what a Negro is listen good now ... (obscene) ... I wish I could tell you some of the things I know now and you would realy be surprised I can get books you never dresmed of to back up what I say. well said Hello you slave ok he said some times get a dictionary and look up the word submit and see what you done. I always thought your judgment was pretty fair but when submit to any one you cast aside your own thoughts about things and therefore have signed an agreement or contract to do the bidding of some other therefore making yourself a slave a contract slave think it over Pal. and maybe I will be able to help you brake that contract well I guess that is enough of that stuff you never could stand much of it the Truth. 



New In Newark, New Jersey, at 230 Court Street (see above) these five temples believe in the reincarnation of NOBLE DREW ALL, founder of the faith, and also believe in the following strict distary laws, involving obstinence from meat, alcohol and

tobacco. They do not shave and they wear the Moorish fez at all times. EL explained that the reincarnation of NOBLE DREW ALL was a spiritual rebirth occurring on August 7, 1929. Some time after that he did die and his successor is believed to be one JOE GIVENS-EL, with headquarters at 447 E. 40th Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Medallions have been prepared for these five temples at the EL's order. The manufacturers, WHITEHEAD & HOAG, Newark, New Jersey, made available information recently, indicating that twelve hundred medallions had been prepared, for which the EL paid \$130 in cash in two installments in March and April, 1942. These medallions show a large figure "7" on one side, a symbolic drawing on the other side of a scimitar and the initial letters of the words love, truth, peace, freedom, and justice. Every Moorish American belonging to any of these five temples wears these silver-dollar sized medallions of blue celluloid on all occasions.

The membership fee in these temples appears to be a standard fee. According to EL, the initial cost is \$1.00 of which 50¢ covers dues, 25¢ covers cost of membership and, and 25¢ pays for the medallion. Thereafter dues are 50¢ a month. He stated that the fez costs \$3.00 and ceremonial costumes cost from \$18 to \$20 and are usually made by the members themselves.

EL has stated that what he considers his branch of the Moorish Science Temple faith was incorporated under the laws of Cook County, Illinois July 20, 1928. (Book 521, page 579). EL said that he first met NOBLE DREW ALI in Chicago in 1927 and that subsequent to that time he had come to Newark, where he has been located for fifteen years, most of that time as temple leader. His Temple, and those affiliated with it in New Jersey hold meetings in Sundays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 8:00 p. m. to 10:00 p.m.

His Temple, the largest of the five, rents space at 230 Court Street, Newark, New Jersey, large enough to provide for a church-like meeting room with a senting capacity of about 150, and also a separate room equipped as a restaurant where fish dinners are prepared for the members every day, and where many of them evidently cat, althouthey live in their respective apartments in the neighborhood.

There has been no information received or developed by the Newark Field Division up to this time indicating that this branch of the faith is pro-Japanese. About a half dozen of the younger male members have been drafted and no serious difficulty has been reported in their cases. At the beginning of the drafting, there was one member who sought to obtain deferment on religious or personal grounds, but that was temporary and he finally was inducted EL has been known to say that he believes in serving his country at all times, particularly in time of war, and that he firmly believes in the purchase of war bonds. He has said that his members are cooperating in such purchases to the best of their ability, but specific purchases are not known.

checked ten of the members of Special Agent EL' Temple in December, 1942, including EL and the other officers for Selective Service registration. All were found to be duly registered and not delinquent. In addition to this, at that time EL was outspoken in his statement to Special Agent that he did not believe in Conscientious Objectors and that there had been only one such in the temple, as related above. He said he had refused to support his member in his stand at that time. Regarding the Selective Service subject as a whole, it can be stated that the majority of the Temple members are elderly and above draft age.

EL said when he was he had been a Temple member since 1929 formally ordained by Col. C. KIRKMAN BEY.

EL was at one time a member of the other branch of the faith in Newerk. At that time his Temple teacher was EL has stated to the writer that to the best of EL's branch of the faith began wearing beards in 1933, not having followed their strict dietary laws and rules of personal conduct prior to that time.

EL has also told the writer that NOBLE DREW ALI founded the Moorish Science Temple in Newark in 1913 at which time it, or a previous group, had been called the "Cancanite Temple". After three or four years in Newark, ALI moved to Chicago, and the name of the group became the "Moorish Holy Science Temple of the World", - this in about 1925. Then in 1928 ALI is said to have dropped the word "Holy" in a new incorporation of the group



"For the past three years we had heard of the Mohammedan group among Negroes in Augusta, and had seen, from time to time, grotesque dark figures with matted beards and long hair sametimes twisted into a knot. These, we knew, were the worshippers of Allah, who deny their Negro descent and divide themselves into two "families", the "Boys" and the "Els". Wishing to know more about them, we called on their teacher and leader, who ence called herself bey, but who has lately transposed the two latter names.

Her bedroom, typical of those usually found in the average Negro home, was clean and neat. A small flag, red with a green, five-pointed star, was hung on the wall, and Mary showed us a much larger one similar to this, which she said she always carried in her pocket.

WQuickly changing the subject from religion to the white puppy, we were convinced that here at least was one subject upon which she was not at all reticent. In 1619 we were brought over here and sold by the hundreds like so many cattle and even our names were taken from us, and if a nan named Jones bought a hundred of us, we was all named Jones'. The Japanese, Chinese, Turks, Hindoos, and Spaniards all belong to us, our Asiatic race. There are only two races of people on the earth, the Asiatics and the Europeans. There should be only two flags, the Moorish flag, and the Stars and Stripes, which is only a navel flag. Our Brother Noble Drew Ali tied then together in 1913.

It was concluded that the typewriting appearing on this -specimen was prepared with a machine equipped with Underwood Pica type with a Gothic style "E". It appears that in the case entitled was, et al, Internal Security, J', specimens were submitted by the New Maven Field Division under date of January 31, 1942, prepared with a machine equipped with Remington Pica type and also with a Sothic style "E".

In view of the fact that the two typewritten letters were prepared on machines equipped with stendard type and a Gothic style "E", there exists the possibility that there may be some connection between these two cases which would warrant investigation.

SUMMARY REPORT

The following summary is not prepared for prosecution purposes in this case, but at the request of the United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky for a thorough review of evidence obtained to date in this case and his suggestions for possible leads leading to prosecutive action.

SECTION A. GENERAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS OF MODILISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA, AND LOUISVILLE CHAPTER 45.

I. Founding of Loorish Science Temple of America Nationally.

From the information available to the Louisville Field Division, which information is incomplete to date, the Moorish Science Temple of America was known as the Moorish Holy Temple of Science and was founded by its prophet, NOBLE DEEN ALI in 1915. According to the teachings of the Moorish Science Temple of America, NOBLE DEEN ALI based his new religion upon the teachings of MARCUS GARVEY, a notorious negro agitator. NOBLE DEEN ALI headed the Moorish Science Temple of America until his death in 1929 in a street fight before the temple doors until his death in 1929 in a street fight before the temple doors in Chicago. He was succeeded in his work by the present leader of the MSTA, Colonel C. KIRKMAN HEY, with aliases William Kirkland Bey and "Frog Eyes", who is known to his followers at present as the Extreme Moderator and Advisor. Although by constitution, the offices of the MSTA are declared vacant once a year, KIRKMAN BEY has been unanimously reelected to office each successive year. He presently resides in Chicago, Illinois, which is the headquarters of this organization,

An indication of the pro-Japanese nature of the MSTA has been found in the verification of the report of the Detroit Field Division that the MSTA there was founded by Japanese. The report of Special Agent dated 2-27-43 at St. Paul in the case entitled.

Japanese organizer among the negroes, worked with a Japanese organizer by the name of TAKAHASHI, and the former's statement with regard to the founding of the Detroit organization of the MSTA is as follows:

"TAKAHASHI had helped with the organization in Chicago and had then gone to Detroit. Michigan, to aid in the organization there.

The Detroit unit was financed by TAKEHASHI, who in turn received his money from a Japanese by the name of Another Japanese by the name of was also connected with the organization and helped to finance it. The T.K.H.SHI who organized in Detroit, Michigan, is a Japanese about 65 years of age.

I. Stated Purposes of the Organization

From 1933 through 1936 it was known that Japanese organizers came to the United States to develop racial sympathy for the Japanese Imongs

the Negroes. They found a furtile field for their activities which resulted in the formation of several national organizations among the Negroes which are listed as follows:

The Peace Movement of Ethiopia, also known as the Pacific Movement of the Eastern World.

The Allah Temple of Islam.

The Triumph Church of God.

The Development of our Own.

These and similar organizations flourished in the cities of Chicago, Detroit, and St. Louis and one by one they were broken up or handi-caped in their movements by the United States Government until only the MSTA remains as the largest national organization of this group.



III. Organization of Louisville Chapter Number 45.

The Louisville Chapter of the MSTA was founded in august, 1938 by Sister BEY or Indianapolis, and Sister MARY CLIFF BEY, who are recognized as "Divine Ministers" in the MSTA. They correspond to traveling labor organizations of the larger labor unions. Louisville Temple 45 was first opened at 628 South Ninth Street, which is the present Hod Carriers Union Building. During the years 1939 and 1940, meetings were held in the Brock Building at 630 South Ninth Street. In the early part of 1941 until the present time, the meetings are held at 437 South Ninth Street, which residence is a long frame dwelling, two stories high, approximately twenty-five feet wide and one hundred feet long, standing forty feet back from the street. Photographs of this residence may be found in the bulky exhibit file of the Louisville Field Division.

OFFICERS

When MARY CLIFT REY was appointed Grand Governess in the State of Kentucky in 1941 by Colonel C. KIRKMAN REY, she more or less chose her successors, and Grand Sheik and Assistant Grand Sheikess of the Louisville Temple. as ARTHUR SLATON REY and EL respectively. These two people still hold office.

HEMBERSHIP

Heotings of this organization are held twice weekly, the main one being held Sunday evening, and an auxiliary meeting is held occasionally on the Holy Day of the week, which is Friday.

From an inspection of the books and records of the Louisville MSTA, it which records were dated up to September, 1942, it was determined that the membership of this organization totalled 110 local numbers, both active and inactive. Out of this total, the estimated active membership

tuns from twenty to forty members. The complete membership list of this organization has previously been provided to the United States to this organization reside in the sector from 6th Street West to 18th Street, bounded on the North and South by Broadway and Jefferson Street.

Each member has been furnished with a membership card, a dues card, a membership button, and auxiliary literature for his use in this organization. Photographic copies of this material have been retained in the files of the Louisville Field Division.

IV. General Teachings of the Moorish Science Temple of imerica.

The god of this organization is the Mohammed Diety, ALLAH. As previously noted, the appeal to the strongly religious instincts of Negroes is made on the reincurnation of all religious leaders, and somewhere it develops that NOBLE DREW ALI is the Divine Leader of the Moorish nation. The basic religious book is an adopted short form of the Koran, although the MSTA Koran has no direct tie-up with the Mohammed Koran. Photographic copies of this Koran have been retained in the files of the Louisville Field Division. From the Koran, these colored folks are taught that they are not Negroes, but are descendants of the original Moors who inhabited - the shores of Northwest Africa and Scuthwest Spain. They explain further that three main tribes ruled these lands; the tribes of HEY, ALI, and EL. When the white man, referred to as Europeans, subjected moors to slavery, they fell from their ruling status. They were then given the name "Negro" by the white man to conceal from them their true identity as Moors. It follows that they were then ship ad to imerica as slaves and remained so until MiRGUS. GLEVEY began hisorganizational work in the United States. The work of GARVEY was then carried on by NOBLE DREW ALI, who founded the MSTA.

For this reason, the members of the MSTA adopt the surname HEY or EL, which is added to their given name. For example, ARTHUR SLATON is now ARTHUR SLATON BEY. The surname LI is evidently reserved for the Prophet, NOBLE DREW ALI. Together with highsounding names, a religious dress is adopted which is described as follows: A fancy turban is placed over the head of the leader, and attached to the front of the turban is a jeweled pin. The clothing is usually made of satin and is green in color with red accessories. A large cilver cloth belt is adorned with the seeing eye, mystic symbol of the East, and turned up shoes complete the dress. This dress is only worn on ceremonial occasions.

for purposes of the regular business meetings, the women usually timply wear their turban, while the men wear red fezzes. Added to this a regular ritual is practiced at the meetings, and the combination of the name, dress, and ritual immediately captures the fancy of many Negroes and they join the organization.

POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY

The approach to the political philosophy is usually made by leaders of the group and prominent members in speeches after the reading of the Koran, based on some part of the Koran. The discussion is interesting when Chapter 45 of the Koran is duscussed, which chapter is entitled, "The Divine Origin of the Asiatic Nations." In this the race relationship of the Japanese and China to all dark nations is clearly set forth. ... summary will be made of this in latter portions of this report.

This political philosophy is embodied in the expressed statements of MSTA leaders that the Moors are a separate nation of North America and should strive toward the day when they too will be recognized as all other nations in America. No reference is made as to what other nations are concerned. The Moors are urged to "tell other Negroes who they really are" and not to recognize the name Negro is applied to MSTA members. Accordingly, all public records in which may be found the given name of an MSTA member are to be changed to add the surname MEY or EL. For this purpose MSTA members regularly visit Social Security, Agencies, Selective Service Boards, Election Registration Agencies, etc.

. Approximate Strength of the Moorish Science Temple of America.

The following information on the strength of the national organization may not be considered as strictly accurate, but at best is a careful approximation, inasmuch as this information has been gleaned from many courses, after of which are not yet known to be reliable. However, it is known that the national headquarters of the ESTA and the Noerish Hely Temple of Science are located at 1104 North Sedawick Street, Chicago. Colonel C. KIRMAN BEY operates from there and from those headquarters atem much of the activities of the MSTA members. The second headquarters is located at the Koorish Heme in Prince George, Virginia, which was founded approximately in 1940. Approximately 200 members live there and their purpose seems to be mainly agricultural and social, and they cultivate a large area of farm land. One of the main activities is the editing and publishing of the Moorish Voice.

The chapters of the MST., as previously stated, extend generally from Chicago and St. Louis, Eastword to New York and Richmond. To the best knowledge of the Louisville Field Division, they are located as follows by States.

Prosecutive Statutes

From a review of the file, it is indicated that prosecution has been considered in cases similar to this particular under Sections 33 and 34 of Title 50, USCA, which is the Wartime Sedition Statute. It deals generally with seditions or distoyal acts or words in time of war, while Section 34 covers a conspiracy to violate Section 33

" related statute which has been considered in connection with similar matters is Section 6, Title 18, USCA, Act of March 4, 1909, which covers seditions conspiracies; also Section 10, Title 18, of USCA, which covers the advocation of the overthrow of the government by force, may be considered. Pertinent parts would be Section A, Sub-section 3, covering the organization of, or membership in any group teaching or advocating the overthrow or destruction of the Government.

Names of Possible Defendants to Date

The following people have been selected under this heading to date for the part they have played in teaching or advocating pro-Japanese sympathy and/or un-wherican activities:

- (1) EY (Colored) founder: Age 45 plus; Residence until 1942, Presently resides Prince George, Virginia.
- (2) EL (Colored) Assistant Grand Shcikess;
- (3) ARTHUR SLATON BEY (Colored), Grand Sheik; age 51; 437 South 9th Street, Louisville.
- (4) BIRDIE IEE NEAL BEY (Colored), Chairman; Ago 52; 437 South 9th Street, Louisville, Kentucky.

Other possibilities exist among the charter members of the organization and their names and evidence obtained against them will be set forth in the future in regular investigative reports.

IV. Surmary of Preliminary Prosecutive action taken Versus Moorish Science
Temple of America in Kansas City.

Twelve members of the MSTA, Kansas City, Kansas were arrested for violation of the Selective Service Act on July 24,1942 for failure to register. Authorized complaints against six members over 45 years of age were dismissed by the United States Attorney at the direction of the Attorney General. The other six individuals were indicted by the Federal Grand Jury at Kansas City, Kansas, November 1942.

BEY, was thoroughly interviewed, together with other members, by the prosecuting United States Attorney in connection with the current investigation of Japanese infiltration among the colored people. No evidence was developed that HEY consulted members of her organization to evade provisions of the Selective Service act. The case was dismissed when the United States attorney at Kansas City declined procedution upon the failure to prove HEY's implication in the alleged violation of the Selective Service act.
