BEY advised that he along with the other members of the 1.S.T.A. considered MY to be an ignorant type of individual and that very few of the members paid any attention to his teachings. MY advised that he considers C.KIRK AV TEY to be a person who is conscientious in his religious beliefs and that the only statement he has ever heard him make concerning the Japanese was about Thanksgiving of 1942 when KIRK'AN 'DY made a statement to the effect that the Jameneso are brothers of all the colored races and some day the white races will be ruled by Germany and the colored races by Japan.

It should be noted that GDY appears to be a werson of average intelligence and also appears to be trustful and conscientious in the statements which he hade concerning the teachings of the BEY. He apecifically advised that no other person except the BEY had ever taught the members of the Touble that they should support the Jepanese in case of en invasion of this country. He stated that in his opinion EX is the only member of the organization who might be called pro-Japanese.

The purtinent parts of the interview with were incorporated into a signed statement. This statement sets out the statements and by SEY which have previously been set out in this report. In view of this foct, the statement is not being sot out herein but is being retained in the Detroit file of this case.

#### SUMMARY REPORT

The following summary is not prepared for prosecution purposes in this case, but at the request of the United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky for a thorough review of evidence obtained to date in this case and his suggestions for possible leads leading to prosecutive action.

SECTION A. GENERAL MACKGROUND INFORMATION ON NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS OF MODILISM SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA, AND LOUISVILLE CHAPTER 45.

#### I. Founding of Moorish Science Temple of America Nationally.

From the information available to the Louisville Field Division, which information is incomplete to date, the Moorish Science Temple of America was known as the Moorish Holy Temple of Science and was founded by its prophet, NOBLE DEEN ALI in 1913. According to the teachings of the Moorish Science Temple of America, NOBLE DEEN ALI based his new religion upon the teachings of MARCUS GARVEY, a notorious negro agitator. NOBLE DEEN ALI headed the Moorish Science Temple of America until his death in 1929 in a street fight before the temple doors in Chicago. He was succeeded in his work by the present leader of the MSTA, Colonel C. KIRKMAN HEY, with aliases William Kirkland Beymand "Frog Eyes", who is known to his followers at present as the Extreme Moderator and Advisor. Although by constitution, the offices of the MSTA are declared vacant once a year, KIRKMAN HEY has been unanimously reelected to office each successive year. He presently resides in Chicago, Illinois, which is the headquarters of this organization.

The Headquarters of the MOORISH SCIENCE THIPLE OF AMERICA, INC. is situated at Chicago, Illinois, under the leadership of C.VKIRKKAN SEY - Supreme Grand Adviser and Moderator", who also edits or causes to be published a pamphlet entitled MOORISH VOICE".

The MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE was organized in 1913 by HOELE DREWALLI who headed the Group until his death in 1929, being succeeded by C. KIRKMAN SET. This organization proposed to recover the birthright of the Moors which they alleged was taken from them to enable them to govern their own country - Morocco.

The organization identifies the negroes as Asiatics and a strong pro-Japanese sympathy has been found in several of the branches.

It appears that WAKAYNAKANE an alien Japanese under the alias of WAI CKATA TAKAHASHI, and claiming that he was a Major in the Japanese Army, was instrumental in the promotion of a branch of this group in Detroit, Michigan.

At that time, he stated there was in Cleveland an organization known as the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE Church whose purpose was identical with that of the PACIFIC MOVEMENT. He further stated that there was a group of this nature also in Brooklyn, New York, and that he had attended one of their open meetings, but that as a rule these groups did not admit outsiders and that their membership was almost entirely made up of people of african and Asiatic descent.

In order that the pro-Japanese sympathy among the followers of the subject organization might be more clearly understood the following information is set forth as furnished by at the time of his arrest:

He said that the Japanese will help all the dark people organize and build a government; that he had been sent to the United States to fulfill the mission of organization of the colored races of the United States; and further that the Japanese are scattered in every city in America working for the same purpose and he feels they should be organized now because the time is not so very far off when the Japanese will strike.

Be said the BLACK DRAGON SOCIETY adopted this plan and sponsored a IINGUIST SOCIETY with headquarters at the University of Tokyo. In this society the men and women from all islatic countries are already being trained to be lecturers and organizers and and in other fields as propagandists to indoctrinate in the minds of the dark people the spirit of Asia for the Asiatics. In this connection he stated that now was the time to actively carry on their propaganda inasmuch as all the countries were presently on friendly relations and their efforts in this respect would probably be overlooked.

The case, entitled "MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA - SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITIES", reflects that information was received that the Japarese Chamber of Commerce officials have on several occasions, spoken for the Hartford Connecticut chapter of the MOORISH SCIENCE THEFTE OF AMERICA, INC, a negro organization in the United States, claiming over 8,000,000 members, who described themselves as Moors and not negroes.

At that time, a series of six articles prepared for a Haroford news-paper about this gro p was obtained and forwarded to the Bureau.

This report further reflects that a negro individual known as Grand

Sheik two who resides in Brooklyn, New York, came to Hartford, Connecticut in the Sure r-of 1936 and established Local Chapter Number 35 of "THE MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA, INC." which organization was believed originally founded by KIRKMAN BEY of Chicago, Illinois.

Moorish representative of the MST, 340 Hancock street, Brocklyn, New York, addressed two letters to the Japan Institute, 630 Fifth Avenue, New York City, December 23, and December 27, respectively. In the letter dated December 23, Grand Sheik EL makes reference to a telephone conversation of recent date and states he wished to request a speaker from the Institute for a Moorish Holiday Banquet on January 8, 1941 to be held at the Moorish Temple, 854 Gates Wenue Brockly, New York. In this instance, he requested a Jamese speaker to speak on the culture and history of Japan and the future outlook of the Asiatic race. Also, he at ted that an previous Moorish Holidays, they had been fortunate enough to have who had made very interesting speaches on Japan; further, that the Moorish American people are very much interested in the successe of Japan in her program for the establishment of a new order in Asia, which will eventually terminate emancipation of all Asiatic people of the world.

In answer to this letter, of the Japan Institute advised that he would be happy to furnish the speaker, but that a speaker would not be able to touch on current political situations in the Far East.

Grand Sheik EL in his letter dated December 27, 1940, acknowledged the letter from the Japan Institute and advised the audiance would be made up of 300 or 400 people of Moorish descent, all of the dark race, who are speathetic and interested inthe freedom of the whole Asiatic race and all of the darker race throughout the world.

He stated that he did not know where they held their meetings, nor what days or nights they meet. He further advised that there were not very many of those people in Pine Bluff, but he was unable to give any estimate of approximately how many there were.

Jefferson County, was interviewed at her office in the Armory Building. She advised that there were approximately 20 persons listed in their files under the name BEY and EL. She advised also that the board had not experienced any difficulty with any of the persons listed under those names with regard to their draft status or induction into the army. The only difficulty the board experienced was in listing the parties under the names BEY and EL. All the persons using those names insisted that they be listed as Orientals rather than negroes and that BEY and EL were their correct last names.

Clark of Lecal Board B, Jefferson County, was contacted at his effice in the Armory. He advised that two persons registered in his board attempted to register—under the names BET and EL, one under the name BET and one under the name EL, but that he refused to register either of them under those names. He stated that he advised both parties that the name they were born under was the name he was going to register them under.

BEY. was contacted at his home in connection with the difficulty the Draft Boards had experienced in obtaining the correct names of parties who insisted on registering under the names BEY and EL. He stated that the names BEY and EL were Moorish mames and were part of their birth right, once they became members of the Moorish Science Temple. He stated that the Moorish Science Temple of Ameriga, Ipd , was established in Pine Bluff in the year 1928 when the Prophet NOBLE DREWALL and ARTHUR BROWN EL came to Pine Bluff and established the HEY advised that he became a member of the Temple #8 in 1928. Temple late in the year own and has been a member ever since

EL is the Grand Sheik of the Temple He Stated that Temple #8 is the only Temple in the State of Arkanses and that BEY was the only other officer of the Temple, and that Bky is also an Assistant Grand Sheik, but holds a rank inferior to HEY. He also advised that the total membership of the Temple was between 60 and 70 members but that only about 30 were active.

He exhibited a copy of the Koran and a copy of the Questionnaire bulletin which all new members must familiarize themselves with. In addition, he showed the writer two medallions; one about the size of a silver dollar constructed of dark blue celluloid and embossed with gilt figures and lettering; on one side the large figure 7 and on the other side, a crescent and star with a Turkish Sword resting across the top of the crescent. The word "Austice" was printed on the Turkish Sword. Around the border of each side of the medallion there were four curved solid links. BEY explained that each of the four segments represented a corner of the earth. The other medallion was in the form of a pin similar to the Campaign Buttons worn during a presidential election, of black tin construction and about the size of a dime. A gilt crescent and star with the letters M. A. above the crescent were the only symbols and letters on this small pin.

BEY explained that the small pin ses for every day wear, whereas the large medallion was to be worn at the meetings. The large ) modellion was hung on a red string and apparently was worn with the string hung around the neck.

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

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



The following members of Temple 4, 632 Livingston, were vigorously interviewed on more than one occasion with negative results. All of them insisted that there are no teachings of the Moorish Science Temple of America, no lectures given by anyone in the Temple that might indicate pro-Japanese sympathies. Likewise there have never been any lectures advocating sympathies of the Japanese cause or sympathies with the Japanese in the present war.

"The head of all temples is to refrain from all wrathful words, profamity in the mildest form, all members of his or her temple.

"They must live the life of love, peace, freedom and justice and refrain from all alcoholic liquors or any other harmful liquors. Possibility that will emanate to destroy peace or any other of the divine principles.

\*They are not to contribute to anything that will cause the to disagree with he or she.

"And for one to head a group of Moors—you must keep this house clean, clean with good deeds, kind words, brother must bear good words, kind words, and not only of his good deed.

"If there are children you must see to their support. Follow this divine principle, for if you don't restrict to this divine principle, then you are not a true Moor.

"And heads are not to charge for membership. They are to charge for cards, button and anything issued by the prophet. Those who contribute to either of the preceding are not Moors but robbers. Membership fee for sisters and brothers is not only here but all over the world.

\*The button is twenty-five cents, card twenty-five cents and one month dues is paid. Every member pays fifty cents monthly for dues. This money goes to the support of the temple.

"This if not paid does not entitle you to the protection that is provided for you, and especially if you are working or in a position to work. If you neglect to fulfill this small duty assigned you, how can you rightfully expect money or any other help when you are sick or otherwise disabled?

"The head of my temple can maintain an emergency fund, which cannot exceed the amount of from twenty-five cents to fifty cents a week per member.

#### PART II

"All possible collection and dues also goes to the supporting of each said temple and domestic work.

"The head of every temple must by law obey the word of the prophet and if any head leader or head of any temple fails to obey these laws, embezzlement is his charge and is subject to enforcement of the law by the grand body.

"And the penalty may be a fine or removal from office; or placed under a very heavy restriction of the law.

#### "SUPREME WORDS OF THE PROPHET NOBLE DREW ALI

"I here-by inform all members that they must end all radical agitating speeches while at work, in their homes, or on the streets. We are for Peace and not destruction.

"Stop flashing your cards at Europeans. It causes confusion. Remember your card is your salvation. Failure to obey these orders will be of severe consequence. We are for love at home, peace, freedom and when these principles are violated, justice must then take its course.

"Any member of group of members who hold malicious feeling toward the Temple or the Prophet or violate the divine Covenant will receive their reward from ALIAH for their unjust deeds.





Depot (described to me as niggers who wear beards and let their hair grow long) Remember my pet peeves in the K.C.Ks.)? they called for trash and the other necroes (employees) told their fellows to "lay off those guys, they're mean and will cut you to pieces".




