Reference is made to the report of Special Agent New York, New York, dated April 14, 1943, earrying Chicago as origin, and setting out a lead for all offices to check their indices to determine whether or not groups of the MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE Church are active in the respective Field Divisions.

A review of the Birminsham file discloses the report of Detroit, Michigan, dated Special Agent November 12, 1942, entitled COLONEL COKIRKMANDEEY, with aliases, Bt Al; MOORISH SCIENCE TEMPLE OF AMERICA, INTERNAL SECURITY - J, DUSTODIAL DETENTION, SEDITION, in which Detroit is carried as origin and which sets out a lead similar to that mentioned above. By letter dated Movember 21, 1942, this office advised the Detroit Office that there was no evidence of the above organization being active in the Birmingham Field Division.

The file of this office also contains a report of Special Knoxville, Tennessee, dated Jamuary 1, Agent 1943, entitled as last stated, which carries Knoxville as origin.

For the information of the various interested offices, there is no evidence that the subject organisation has been active in the Birmingham Field Division.

that the report was based on an inquiry conducted for anthropological reasons to determine if there was any cultural connection between a various negroes and their cults in the Chicago area. The following information was obtained from the report.

"Two organizations striving to foster racial pride have extracted numbers of Chicago negroes from time to time. These are the Moorish-American Science Temple and the Nation of Islam, ordinarily referred to as 'cults.' Assentially they are religious bodies, opposing the Christian faith. Members of the Moorish-American Science Temple insist that they are not negroes, and avoid the use of the word or of 'black' when referring to themselves, maintaining that they are really Moors and that their skin is 'clive-hued.'

"An 1868 a costl me pro weight a flacing red rez shaler to those worn by traits appeared in edity lots indion street corners of thicago's south side to procleim a startling new doctrine. He was Hoble brew all, born Timothy brew in North Carolina, troppet of Islam, and Tounder of the Hoorish American Science Temple. Little is known of brew Ali's early history. He is reputed to have been an expressmen in Hewark, New Jersey, where he is said to have founded the first hoorish-American Science Temple as early as 1913.

"Drew's main contention was that the people commonly known in America as negroes are of Moorish descent and thus Asiatics. Act six of his 'Divine Constitution and My-Laws' reads:

With us all members must declare their nationality and their Divine Greed that they may know that they are a part and partial (sic) of this said government and that they are not Hegroes, Colored Folks, Flack People or Stiopians, bo-

cause these names were given to slaves, by slave holders in 1779 and lasted until 1865 during the time of slavery, but this is a new era of time now, and all men must proclaim their free national name to be recognized by the government in which they live and the nations of the earth, this is the reason why Allah the Great God of the Universe ordeined Noble Brew Ali, the prophet, to redeem his people from their sinful ways. The Hoorish-Americans are the descendants of the ancient Losbites who inherited the Horthwestern and Southwestern shores of Africa.!

Trophet Noble Drew Ali did not immediately rally many disciples to his banner, the Loorish star and crescent on a field of red. But he persisted, and at length was able to set up permanent headquarters. Though semi-literate, he obsessed an eloquant tongue, a persuasive manner, and a notive alrewomess which chall d him to support the cor and unlettered people who liftened to him. Lost of them revembered the race riots of 1919; all of them had experienced discimination and other wrongs. Drew Ali was offering them pride of race and dignity. In 1927 a successful convention encouraged Trew Ali to expand his proselytising activities to other cities.

eslim mamphlet consisting of a curious mixture of the Mohammedan boly book of the same name, the Christian Eible, and anecdotes of the life of Jesus - the whole bound to ether with the Prophet's own pronouncements and interpretations. The Prophet bigan to do a profitable business in various nostrums and charms he had concocted, among them Old Moorish Healing Oil, Moorish Purifier Bath Compound, and Moorish Herb Tea for Muran Allments.

"More and more 'Asiatics' flocked to the star and crescent standard. They flaunt'd their fezzes on the street and treated the white man with uncistuded contempt. The prophet amounced that each:

devout woorish American must carry a card bearing his credentials and his real (or Asiatic) name, signed by the Prophet with his seal. Often enough 'slave' names were transformed into 'real' ones by the simple addition of 'El' or 'Ley,' these being titles signifying woorish dignity. The membership card and button, when displayed to Europeans, would convince them that the bearer was enlightened and a member of an organization to be feared and respected.

"To the Prophet this theory of new-found independence had been a more or less turnely ethical or theoretical wint, and le had not rechoned on its practical effect among his zealous followers. Alarting reports of atreet brawls, threats, insults, and minor violence centering around Moorish-Americans were brought to his notice. Hembers were accosting the white one you are causets, showing their hembership cames are justices, and proclaiming an use have of wheir hopket, oble frew all, that they had been freed of suropean domination.

"Recalling the downfall of the militant Abyssinians and contemplating the current difficulties of the Carvey movement, . rew Ali issued this order:

'I hereby wern all Moors that they must cesse from all radical or agitating speeches while on their jobs, or in their homes, or on the streets. Stop flashing your cards before Europeans as this only causes confusion. We did not come to cause confusion; our work is to uplift the nation.

" rew Ali's leadership was soon contested. In 1920 he became embroiled in a quarrel with Claude Green, politician and former butler of Julius Rosenwald, who previously had joined the temple. One day Frew arrived at his o Tice to find that Greene had moved all the furniture outside and declared himself areno thath. I givil war ensued, each decision

enlisting support from temples in other cities. Greene was shot and stabbed to death in his offices at the Upity Club on the night of March 1t, 1929.

"Drew Ali, errested as he set with his wife and roup of followers celebrating (suthorities charged) the murder of his rival, was defended by Attorney Aaron Payne and William L. Dawson, temple members who later gained political prominence.

Trew Ali was released on bond and shortly thereefter died under mysterious circumstances a few
weeks later. One theory is that he succumbed to
injories inflicted by the police during his imprisonment, another is that he was set upon by partisans
of Greene after his release and beaten so severly
that he never recovered.

"Ifter Trew Ali's death A-torney Aeron Paymerattech enorg several of the -rochet's disciples anneumond that he alone was the rightful inheritor
of Erew Ali's leadership. Stevengibbons El (formerly the Prophet's chauffeur) and ire Johnson
ley (who had been imported from Pittsburg to
assist in quelling the Greene revolt) each maintained that the dead leader's pairit had entered
his body. Johnson, a man of action, invaded the
office of Mealy El, another aspirant, and demanded
recognition as Grand Sheik. Healy El demurred and
received a terrific mauling. Johnson them dispatched his henchmen to kidnap firkman Eey, who
claimed possession of Drew Ali's last will and
testament.

"Miriman's wife, secretly surmising that her husband was being detained in Johnson's apartment, directed the police thither. A gun battle ensued in which two policement and one Moor were killed. Sixty-three Moors were arrested, and Johnson was committed to the State Hospital for the Timinally Insane, where he subsequently died. Love libbons also was apprehender after he had

forced his way into Attorney Payne's home in search of Drew Ali's papers.

was released several years later. In 1941 he was heading a Chicago temple on East 40th Street and still asserting claim to the title of Grand Sheik of all Moorish-American Science Temples. Gibbons was one of six contestants, each one a temple leader and each one designating his own as Temple No. 1.

"Services in each temple observe with monor deviations, the pattern established by Drew Ali. First, a minor sheik, a sheikess or the chairman reads and explains Drew Ali's verson of the Moran. Then follows a more elaborate discourse by the Grand Sheik (in some temples called the Governor), the whole caremony being numetuated at intervals by a vistian hymne with the word, Aliah, rew Ali, and osles substituted for God, Anrist, and Christian. Friday is observed as a holy day of rest, 'because on a Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and on a Friday the first man departed out of the flesh and escended unto his father God Allah, for that cause Friday is the Holy Day for all Loslems all over the world."

"Since Drew Ali considered Marcus Carvey his forerunner (in a relationship analogous to that of John the Baptist and Jesus) and paid tribute to him in his 'Koran' and in his sermons, Moorish-Americans frequently laud and quote the Jamaican or anizer.

"January E, the Prophet's birthday, is a spicial occasion in all temples. Full woorish regalia is worn by those members who can afford it, and there is likely to be feasting and distribution of gifts in thricumus celebrations in Christian chruches. In number of unconverted juests are invited; the customary apaceies wake on a more even, elication

tone. Expositions of the teachings and principles of the Prophet are offered in a simplified form for the benefit of those still under the influence of the Christianity, called the Folly.

The leader of each of the bickering factions has striven in vain to build up an organization as powerful (and as lucrative) as the perent body disrupted by internal warfare and the death of rew Ali. According to Attorney Aaron Payne, the Prophet in one year amassed a fortune of 36,000.00 and commanded a membership of 12,000. Politicians respected and courted him, and congress men Oscar De Priest was reputed to have joined the temple.

Illinois, it was set forth that had telephonically contacted the Unicago Office to advise that subject who was employed as a hand; man at the Rojers motor Company, 2250 South Lichigan Avenue, had failed to register under the Selective Service Act and had made the statement that he did now intend to register. Subsequently subject was arraigned on complaint charging him with violation of the Selective Service Act.

As a result of disturbances caused by hey were arrested by local officials. Subsequent investigation by Sheriff of Holmes County, Lexington, Lississippi, reveled that these persons had been presching to negroes in the community that they were not members of the negro race, but were in actuality moors and members of the Asiatic race; that the Japanese were fighting a war of liberation for all of the Asiatic people in America and that when the Japanese wen the war and invaded the United States, those individuals who were members of the woorish Temple of Science and who had certification cards is sued by the headquarters of the organization would not be harmed by the invading armies and be treated as prothers by the Japanese while other individuals would be killed. The negroes were being taught that they should be cooperative with the Japanese and should not fight egginst them in the present war.

Subsequently, all four individuals were indicted under a hississippi state statute charging them with having thought and advocated the overthrow by expanse of the present form of government. Subjects returned to Chicago before they were apprenenced.
