It is to be noted that MARTHA STONE was arrested in New York City on November 1, 1954, for violation of the Smith Act and is presently awaiting trial at New Haven, Connecticut. \upmathbb{N}

Salient parts of the above referenced report are set forth as follows:

"The convention was undoubtedly one of the most significant in the history of NAACP. This was due to the impact of the May 17 Supreme Court decision upon the Association and upon all sections of Negro life and large sections of the white community, especially in the South. The anti-segregation decisions became the point of departure for every major speaker and for the discussion of the delegates. Thus, an atmosphere of militant optimism pervaded the convention as never before. Further, the difficult problems involved in implementation of the decisions, and the challenge to work out specific programs for carrying the fight against segregation into other fields contributed to a note of seriousness in the deliberations and opened up in the thinking of the delegates many questions which the NAACP has not had to address itself to in the past.

"I also have the impression (though a detailed credential report was not available at convention's end) that the composition of the delegates was an improvement over past conventions. There were 617 voting delegates, 65 alternates and 95 fraternal delegates and observers, making a total of 777. So that numerically the convention was larger than most in the past, which have usually ranged between 400-500.

"Also, a large part, probably a majority, of the fraternal delegates were trade unionists. There was a good-sized representation from auto, 16 packinghouse workers came from Chicago, and there were others. In addition, of course, there were some trade unionists, although I don't know how many, who came directly from branches as voting delegates.

"In addition, there was an important number of delegates from some of the small-community branches especially in the South who were attending their first convention and are not yet committed to the policies of the leadership. This does not mean that all the old NAACP warhorses were not there - they were. But there were many indications that they met a sterner challenge to their leadership than any time since 1950. But more of that later.

"Another major positive feature of the convention was the strong current of anti-McCarthyism. This sentiment was more pronounced than last year and resulted in what in my opinion is the strongest anti-McCarthy resolution adopted by any Negro people's organization to date. And, as we shall see, this resolution was passed in face of the most determined effort on the part of reactionary forces in the convention to defeat it.

"Furthermore, there was the usual healthy antibureaucracy sentiment of the rank and file delegates which found many opportunities to express itself in opposition to the railroading of measures, the handling of the chair, the curtailing of discussion, etc. >>

"Now, with regard to the major negative facto the rash of red-baiting on the part g in the convention: the leadership was unprecedented and more vicious than previously. Not one single major speaker at the mass meetings did not redbait. (No, that's a mistake - the single exception was Dr. Theodore Dawless, the American-Firster from Chicago who did not redbait in his speech accepting the Spingarn Award.) Channing Tobias began with a keynote speech which, for political depth, was on a level lower than juvenile. He began by ranking the Subreme Court decision with 'The Declaration of Independence, the Federal Constitution with its amendments, and the Emancipa-Then he invoked the spirit of Booker T. and the 'Atlanta Compromise' by quoting as follows from his own speech to the NAACP May 22 Atlanta meeting: 'Let it not be said of us that we took advantage of a sweeping victory to drive hard bargains or to impose unnecessary hardships upon those responsible for working out the details of compliance.'

"Then he got down to his real business of the evening. He said: 'As has never been true before in the history of our Organization, we must see the fight for rights of Negro Americans as part of a world struggle for freedom.' There was spontaneous applause at this point, and there is no doubt that the audience had in mind a conscious alliance of the struggle for Negro liberation with the struggles of colonial peoples in Asia and Africa for independence. However, almost before the applause died down Tobias went into a point by point support of U.S. foreign policy and the reaction of the audience was one of silence and bewilderment. He said:

" 'During the past year the situation has worsened considerably. The menacing cloud of communism continues to darken the international sky. The issues involving Korea are still unresolved. The struggle in Indo-China grows more desperate with every passing day. The Geneva Conference has been declared a failure. The government of the Union of South Africa continues its apartheld campaign. The communist

infiltration of Guatemala is about to precipitate a civil war that may have serious consequences for the western hemisphere. In such a world as this we rightly insist that America cannot afford the expensive luxury of racial discrimination. At the same time we must make it emphatically clear that Negro Americans are undivided in their allegiance to the United States of America as it engages in mortal combat with the enemies of the free world.

"This was followed immediately by a discussion of 'The Communist Menance within our Borders.' Tobias said:

"'Let no one deny or take lightly the existence of a communist conspiracy in the United States. Enough has been brought to light in recent years to show that there is a persistent though small group of men and women in this country, who are attempting to blast at the "rock of ages" of our national structure. They do not hesitate to lie, or steal, or even kill, if by so doing they can accomplish the ends dictated by their foreign masters.

"'It is no secret that communists have tried to infiltrate our ranks and get control of some of our branches. It is also true that they have been decisively defeated in their efforts. (Some applause). For this is one protest organization that makes its fight for equal rights on the basis of American principles and ideals, and within the American system. Nevertheless we must be ever vigilant to detect and expose by orderly methods those who parade as sheep but inwardly are ravening wolves, whose only purpose is to destroy.'

"One might think that the progressive potent at of the convention would be completely nullified, especially if one considers these leaders as representatives of a class that has completely 'gone over' to the side of imperialism.

"But this did not happen for two very good and important reasons.

"First, it is important to note that the party forces and the progressive caucus forces at this convention, while still woefully small, were larger and better organized than in St. Louis. With regard to our own people, there were seven delegates

Not until next to the last day did we discover that one of our people from Before the convention I was informed we would have one or two people but the names were never gotten to me and we could not discover them in Dallas.

"In addition, there were a few progressive forces who played a major role in the convention, such as

"1 - This leadership looks upon a more vigorous anti-communist line as a necessary tactic to gain more concessions from the bourgeoisie and to 'placate' the mortal enemies of Negro liberation. They are encouraged in this line by the Supreme Court decision and by the fact that the forces they choose to vilify - the left - was conspicuous by its lack of participation in the fight to realize the decision.

"Nevertheless, this petty-bourgeois leadership of the NAACP does not have the material stake in anticommunism which the imperialist bourgeoisie has.

"2- The leadership can be defeated in one aspect or another - and eventually all aspects - of their anticommunist position, if they are effectively challenged. The experience of the progressive forces in the resolutions committee and in the floor debate on resolutions proves this conclusively - and in this respect the convention represented an important advance over last year.


"Following is a play-by-play description of the debate and vote on important resolutions.


"1. The first resolution was the Preamble, at the end of which there was tacked on, like an appendix, the reiteration of the stand against 'communist infiltration' adopted originally in 1950. It was the decision of the progressive caucus not to oppose this resolution, but to save our attack for the Labor Relations resolution with its attack on the independent progressive unions and the NNLC. Therefore this resolution passed without objection and therefore no vote was taken.

"2. The next resolution was the Labor and T dustry resolution, It contains a prohibition against NAACP conversion with 'Communist dominated' unions and with the NNLC. According to the rules, these who wanted to speak on a resolution had to voice objection and call out their name and branch as soon as the reading is completed."

It is to be noted that after a debate, "the vote was then taken. Failure of the progressives to provide a second for the Ellis motion to strike the 2 paragraphs and insist on a vote on that motion, resulted in the vote being taken on the resolution as read. No count was taken. About half voted for the resolution. A small handful (approximately 20) against. About half the delegates did not vote.

"With regard to other sections of the resolution it should be noted that a number of provisions which were introduced in resolutions by the progressive caucus were incorporated and adopted. They are as follows: (a) Calling upon Congress to defeat all filibustering measures and pass FEPC; (b) Urging President's Contract Compliance Committee to hold public hearings in major industrial areas to facilitate processing of complaints; (c) calling attention to special exploitation of Negro women and calling upon the Program Committee for the 1955 convention to set up a workshop dealing with special problems of Negro working women."

The "Daily Worker" of September 24, 1948, page 1 and 11, columns 1 and 2, contrined an article entitled, "Sixteen Thousand Demand-Get Thompson Assailants." The article referred to the stabbing of BOB THOMPSON, Chairman of the New York State CP and presently incarcarated for violation of the Smith Act. Among those who demanded action be taken to apprehend the "would-be assassins", was GUY BREWER, former Democratic Harlam leader.

The "Daily Worker" issue of October 25, 1949, page 3, columns 4 and 5, contained an article, "Notables Ask Mc Grath OK Bail for Eleven." The article stated that the New York State Civil Rights Congress had announced that a number of prominent people had wired Attorney General MC GRATH to intervene to see that reasonable bail was set for the eleven CP leaders. Among those listed as signing the wire was "GUY BREWER, Legal Redress Committee, NAACP."
