**T**he people's movement has much at stake in defeating Reaganite reaction in November. In many ways the elections will be a referendum on Reaganism — its military buildup, anti-democratic conspiracies and contra wars. The most consistent democratic forces have concluded that unity is the only way to defeat the Reaganites.

At the fringes of the preparations for the coming battles of November is the New Alliance Party. Under a slogan "Two Roads are Better than One," NAP, which claims to be "Black-led," is fielding a presidential candidate and is projecting that it will place that candidate on the ballot in all 50 states.

But NAP's strategy is not based on unity. Rather it is based on an attempt to create disunity. In an interview with New York's *Newday*, Lenora Fulani, NAP's candidate for president, made their strategy clear. She stated they were attempting to emulate George Wallace's 1968 presidential run, that is, siphon off enough votes to cost the Democrats the election. Put very simply, their plan is to win the election for Bush, thereby teaching the Democrats a lesson. Of course they never state that it won't be the Democratic Party which pays for this lesson, it will be the American people.

The New Alliance Party has a murky past. A predecessor organization formed on Manhattan's Upper West Side in the early '70s under the guidance of Dr. Fred Newman, a philosophy PhD who earned his degree at Stanford University. According to Newman's own account, during the early '70s he was associated closely with "Lyn Marcus," who then paraded as a leftist and now is the neo-fascist Lyndon LaRouche.

Newman founded his own brand of therapy, in which individuals who suffer from depression are invited to take part in politics as therapy, always under the guidance of "professional care." During the mid '70s Newman's formation approached political groups on the Upper West Side, where they presented themselves as "the vanguard of the left."

One member of a neighborhood group which published a community newspaper recalls the approach which Newman's "collective" made to them around 1975.

"At that time they were calling themselves the International Workers Party. IWP's literature was a strange mix of Freudian psychological phrenology and references to themselves as the 'vanguard' of the political left. Other left groups were described as 'liberal fascists,'" said the West Sider, who prefers to remain anonymous.

Organizations and individuals who have dealt with the New Alliance Party, including former members, paint a picture of a cult-like organization concentrating foremost in the Black community. Its ultimate aim is hard to decipher, but its immediate result is to confuse, divide and discourage the progressive and people's movement, especially that emerging in the nationally oppressed communities.

A series of stories have appeared in major and alternate newspapers in the past few years raising serious concerns about the NAP. One Afro-American newspaper, the *Jackson Advocate* of Jackson, Mississippi, was the target of an NAP lawsuit because it ran a series of articles linking Newman, NAP and LaRouche. (The suit was thrown out of court in April.)

In those stories, written by Ken Lawrence and the paper's editor, Charles Tisdale, Newman's assertions that his group's associations with Lyndon LaRouche during the early '70s were inconsequential are debunked. In fact, the *Jackson Advocate* points out, Newman was associated with LaRouche during the infamous "Operation Mop Up," the organized series of physical attacks against the Communist Party and other left organizations in the early '70s.

"During those years," wrote Lawrence in 1985, "both Newman and LaRouche linked up with an even more mysterious and secretive cult leader who calls himself Eugenio Parente. Because of the secrecy, Parente's group doesn't even have a name, but it is generally known by the name of its most effective umbrella front organization, the National Labor Federation (NalFed)."

Internal NAP documents obtained by *Manhattan's Upper West Side weekly Heights and Valley News* in 1977 detail the International Workers Party's strategy of setting up a front group with two kinds of members: "cadres" (mainly whites belonging to the IWP) and "organic members," meaning Black and Latino belonging only to a formation such as NAP. Such a policy remains in effect today, a prominent former member and former NAP presidential candidate charges, and betrays the group's claim that it is "Black-led."

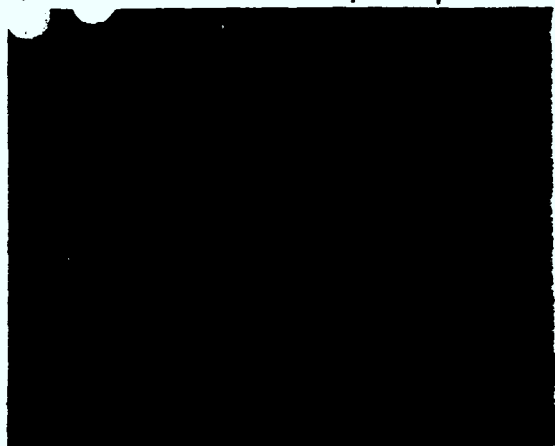
That candidate was Dennis Serrette. Serrette had been a prominent Black trade unionist in New York who was attracted to the NAP by their claim to representing Black and Latino voters in New York City. Serrette, who has since left the organization, now recalls that he was pressured into running as their presidential candidate.

In a statement circulated nationwide, Serrette denounces Newman and NAP as at best opportunists and at worst a cult with dangerous potential.

"Newman uses left rhetoric well, and organizes with a left front. He appeals to what is good and progressive in people, and uses that to build his base. He will as

quickly embrace as he will attack a movement, a progressive, an organization, a principle — based on how he can best opportunize from it. He unflinchingly lies to his membership, almost all of whom have absolutely no history in the movement, and understand it exactly as Newman teaches."

In New York, NAP has consistently attacked Black leaders such as Congressman Major Owens and state Assemblyman Roger Green.

Serrette likens the NAP to LaRouche's methods.

"Like LaRouche's National Caucus of Labor Committees, Newman runs a very tightly controlled organization. Like LaRouche, Newman has created numerous organizations (most on paper) with divergent names; some to attract particular individuals, some solely to make money, many with names so similar to true left organizations that unknowing individuals are often fooled (i.e. Rainbow Alliance and Rainbow Lobby, which have no connection to Jesse Jackson's Rainbow Coalition)."

NAP, which claims chapters in 22 cities and a membership of 30,000, has entered the 1988 presidential campaign in force. Its candidate, Lenora Fulani, who is also a therapist, jets back and forth from one end of the country to the other. Most recently, Fulani's campaign received federal matching funds to the tune of \$239,000 (as of the first filing with the Federal Elections Commission).

When NAP ran Serrette in 1984, under the strategy now referred to as "Two

Roads are Better than One," they professed to support Jackson's primary bid but counted on him never getting the Democratic nomination. In that case, they argued, independents and dissatisfied Democrats would have only one choice their candidate.

Sensing the impact of the Rev. Jesse Jackson's bid for the Democratic Party nomination in 1984 in the South, they decided to deploy operatives from New York to that region. They chose Mississippi as a target.

Entrusted with the task was Emily Carter, a Newman ally for many years who ran for local office in New York under the NAP banner.

"They asked me to let them set up headquarters at my office and I refused," says *Jackson Advocate's* Tisdale. "Basically I felt the New Alliance Party was divisive and that they were seeking to run an independent presidential candidate, which means to me they decided to split the Black vote and make it less effective in uniting toward a candidate that would serve the purpose of the Black community. So I wouldn't let them set up shop here and they took great umbrage at that and got people from all over the country to call saying that I was some kind of fascist."

NAP projected that at the end of that campaign they would have a membership

# Independent Candidate Plays a Spoiler's Role

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20 — Lenora B. Fulani, independent candidate for President, says she will be happy on Nov. 8 if her campaign helped Gov. Michael S. Dukakis lose by taking away enough black votes from him.

"I see myself running against Bush and Dukakis both," Dr. Fulani, a 38-year-old psychologist from New York City who is running in most states as the New Alliance Party candidate, said in a recent interview.

"But I also see myself running against the two-party system that is tremendously unresponsive to most American people, and definitely to blacks," she added. "The particular strategy is to use my candidacy to defeat Michael Dukakis."

Dr. Fulani, who ran for Mayor of New York City in 1988 and Governor of the state in 1992, is the first woman, and the first black, to stand for President in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. She cites that distinction, which required more than 1.5 million signatures, as an important achievement and likes to refer to herself as a "major minor candidate."

### A Candidate With Limits

Many political strategists believe the number of votes she can win will be small, given her limited constituency, her scant national news coverage, her lack of television advertising and her war chest of about \$2.5 million, smaller than those of most Senate campaigns.

Dr. Fulani has also drawn negative publicity from her ties to Louis Farrakhan, leader of the Nation of Islam, whose Friendship University in New York has honored the Nation's prophet, Muhammad, in 1984, and to the Rev. Jesse Jackson, an adviser to the Rev. Jesse Jackson, who was accused by a jury of 1992 when she said she had been raped by a group of white men in Wappingers Falls, N.Y., last November.

The Dukakis campaign does not take her as a serious threat. But Dr. Fulani hopes she can exploit what some polls have indicated is a wavering allegiance to Mr. Dukakis among black voters.

In the interview Dr. Fulani said that as President she would raise taxes on large corporations and cut the military budget in half. She also said she would establish a system to provide free or low-cost health care to all citizens and work for a constitutional guarantee of housing for everybody.

### Two-Party Dominance

But her primary focus is on political participation (she advocates automatic and lifelong voter registration when a person turns 18) and on ending the dominance of the Republican and Democratic parties.

Dr. Fulani filed suit twice in Federal District Court here seeking to stop the two Presidential debates. Judge George H. Revercomb refused both times, saying public interest would be best served if the debates proceeded.

Dr. Fulani then asked CBS, NBC, ABC, the Cable News Network and Fox Television for 45 minutes of free prime time to compensate, contending that the

debates were not "bona fide news events" and therefore subject to equal time requirements.

Spokesmen for CBS, ABC and CNN said the debates were real news events. CBS and CNN declined the request for equal time, while ABC said it had not received it. Requests for comment from NBC and Fox were not answered.

### Reaching Out for Votes

Although Dr. Fulani contends that "the black agenda is totally missing from any discussion of the two major party candidates," she says she is trying not to restrict her campaign to blacks. "I have gotten a strong response from the Native American community, from the gay and lesbian community and from the progressive community," she said.

With evident irritation, Dr. Fulani defended her ties to Mr. Farrakhan and Mr. Sharpton.

She said that Mr. Sharpton was more popular with blacks than "the white press" is willing to acknowledge, and that Mr. Farrakhan, who has been criticized for calling Judaism a "mother religion," was quoted out of context.

Asked if Mr. Farrakhan's philosophy is racist or anti-Semitic, Dr. Fulani replied: "I think everybody is racist and anti-Semitic. People in this country are constantly being taught fifth about each other and saying it all the time. You have to ask what is going on when black leaders are identified as hater of Jews."

Dr. Fulani's electoral strategy is to win over only Mr. Bush's 10 percent of the black vote, she can cost him the election.

Phil Friedman, a New York political consultant, said that in a recent discussion with a group of voters, including 20 blacks, he was surprised to learn that many of the blacks knew of Dr. Fulani and three or four said they would vote for her.

"It's not statistically valid, but it shows awareness," Mr. Friedman said. But he added: "The big question is how many blacks will just stay at home on Election Day. The stay-at-homes may be a bigger threat to Dukakis than Fulani, and maybe even bigger than George Bush."

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1 /PRN/ -- Dr. Lenora Fulani, the African American independent running for president of the United States, has become the 14th candidate certified to receive federal primary matching funds by the Federal Election Commission. Dr. Fred Newman, Fulani's campaign manager, and the New Alliance Party Chairperson Emily Carter will hold a press conference in the West Room of the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., on Tuesday, Feb. 2, at 10 a.m., when Dr. Fulani will also be available, by telephone for interview.

In addition to announcing the certification of the initial matchable amount of \$205,565.18 which was decided by a 5-0 vote, they will comment on the call made by FEC Commissioner Joan Aikens, the only abstention, to restrict independent candidates' eligibility for matching funds. Newman has noted Aikens' remarks about the process of determining matching funds eligibility are pervaded with major party bias, and, as such, are another example of the unfairness of the presidential election process and the erosion of democracy that the Fulani campaign is designed to address.

"I am very proud to be the first Black woman ever to qualify for federal matching funds. Congratulations to the thousands who have already given. We intend to raise millions of matchable dollars before the campaign is through," said Fulani.

"It's now the case that 14 presidential candidates have been certified for matching funds by the FEC -- six Republicans, seven Democrats, and myself, the one-independent," Fulani noted.

"Everywhere I've been told that what makes you a serious candidate is qualifying for federal matching funds. Now that I have, I want to be included in each and every aspect of the process -- every debate and every forum in which presidential candidates express their views. And in the interest of fairness and democracy -- all the other candidates' voices must be heard.

"We've got to build independent politics in this country because the Democrats and Republicans no longer express the viewpoint of the majority of Americans who want such things as decent housing and jobs, a national health service and peace," Fulani said. "The two party political monopoly is unhealthy for the American people.

Lenora Fulani, defeated last year after becoming the first black woman to run for governor in New York State, announced she is running for president as a candidate of the New Alliance Party.

Fulani, who launched her campaign at a news conference outside the United Nations Wednesday, said she hopes to get her New Alliance Party on the ballots of 21 states by the end of the year.

Her supporters hope to garner enough signatures to get on the ballots in all 50 states by early 1988, she said.

"I am announcing my candidacy for the presidency of the United States," Fulani told a handful of supporters, promising her campaign would "address the billions of Americans who seek a profound change in the destructive policies of this country."

Fulani, 37, said her campaign would seek support from both black and white Americans who have seen little difference between both major parties.

"When it comes time to cast their choices for a president there are only two choices," she said, "a Democrat or a Republican whose parties have endorsed and initiated racial violence from the shores of Tripoli to the streets of Howard Beach."

Fulani, a psychologist, said she had no illusions she would win the election but hoped nonetheless to have an influence on the political process.

"My campaign presents a serious challenge. Not because I think I will win. I will not. But it is a challenge nonetheless," she said.

One of those who may find her campaign challenging, she said, is the Rev. Jesse Jackson, who has received strong support in the polls and is expected to announce his plans to seek the Democratic presidential election.

But she said her campaign will emphasize a "Two Roads Are Better Than One Approach" and that Jackson will have her full support when he announces.

"We must support Rev. Jackson's primary run with all our might. But we must be prepared to go beyond the Democratic Party," she said.

She said while she will be "among the first to publicly stand up with" Jackson, she feels the Democrats will deny him their nomination and instead turn to "a white moderate, conservative or pseudo-liberal."

Fulani received 25,000 votes when she ran for governor.

She was defeated by Gov. Mario Cuomo, a Democrat who received 65 percent of the vote. Andrew O'Rourke was the Republican candidate and Denis Dillon ran on the Right-to-Life ticket.

~~The New Alliance Party was thrust into the spotlight during the campaign by Fulani's refusal to repudiate anti-Semitic statements made by black Muslim leader LEWIS FARRAKHAN.~~

What was to have been the only televised debate of the campaign was canceled when O'Rourke and Dillon refused to meet face-to-face with Fulani because of her stand on Farrakhan.

Lenora Fulani of the New Alliance Party announced Wednesday that she is a presidential candidate.

Fulani, running as an independent, said she also would support the candidacy of the Rev. Jesse Jackson, who has not announced he would seek the Democratic nomination for the 1988 election.

"An independent candidacy by a pro-peace, progressive black leader is crucial to halting the bi-partisan support for militarism and intervention in Central America and southern Africa," Fulani said.

"A major reduction in military spending is key to guaranteeing that people have what's needed to live decently - jobs, housing, education and health care," she said.

"My name will appear on the ballot on an independent ticket in all 50 states and I will call for a boycott against the parties of war - the Democrats and Republicans," she added.

New Alliance Party organizers said they have initiated ballot access procedures in 11 states.

~~Fulani, a psychologist and director of a community-based network of medical and mental health clinics, has been billed as the "Independent" since she ran for mayor of New York City in 1985. She also ran for governor in 1986.~~

## BODY:

Col. Muammar el-Qaddafi made a fleeting appearance early today at an outdoor rally marking the first anniversary of the American bombing of his barracks, but he left the talking to his 16-year-old son.

The colonel suddenly materialized at 1:45 A.M. in a white suit through a gate beside a speaker's platform set up next to his damaged house. He reached out to shake hands, raised his arms in the air and then abruptly disappeared.

The commemoration of what the Libyan leader calls his victory against the "barbaric, aborted American aggressions" was more haphazard and subdued than was expected here.

There was no show of military power, as some diplomats had heard, and no fireworks. Instead, about 1,000 people gathered in a courtyard at the back of the colonel's bombed house from 11:30 P.M. to 2:30 A.M.

In an atmosphere of a country fair, a Libyan master of ceremonies introduced a parade of speakers ranging from an American Indian, Vernon Bellacourt, to an American Black Muslim, Mohammed Akhbar, to a British Labor member of Parliament, Ron Brown.

The crowd included 200 Americans visiting at the invitation and expense of the Libyan Government as guests to a "peace conference." The Americans said they were proudly defying a travel ban to Libya imposed last year by the Reagan Administration. Many foreign journalists were also present.

The colonel's low profile during the day was interpreted by some foreigners here as reflecting a realization that the turnout of foreign dignitaries was not as impressive as expected.

The "peace conference," the centerpiece of the anniversary activities, was addressed Tuesday by Aleksandr Shakirov, described in the Libyan press as a Soviet official. But there was no delegation from the Soviet Union.

An Eastern bloc official said there appeared to be no delegations from the Warsaw Pact. A member of the London-based Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament opened her remarks by saying she was not representing the anti-nuclear group but a women's alliance.

At 2 A.M., the hour last year that American jets hit targets in Tripoli and Benghazi, the colonel's eldest son, Saif el-Eslam, took the microphone dressed in a red sweater, a white jacket and blue pants. It was not clear whether the colors were intended as a parody.

Already an assured public speaker, the teen-ager promised that if the American planes came again, "we will destroy them."

"We welcome American blacks and Indians in order that they will attack the American imperialism inside America," he said in Arabic, which a Libyan translated into English.

#### Tour of Unrepaired House

Before gathering to hear the speeches, the conference delegates and foreign reporters were ushered through the colonel's unrepaired house.

The house, still strewn with damaged furniture, showed touches of organized disarray. Yellow ropes cordoned off the rooms giving visitors the impression of touring a museum.

The courtyard rally was beamed live by satellite to the United States in what Libyan officials described as a two-way television hookup. Live pictures of a pro-Qaddafi crowd in Lafayette Park in front of the White House could be seen on a television screen at the back of the speaker's platform but were largely ignored. [In Washington, images of the Tripoli rally could be seen for about 20 minutes and the crowd chanted "Long live Qaddafi!"]

At an afternoon session of the "peace conference," David Dellinger, the antiwar campaigner, thanked the Libyans for the "warmth of their welcome." Also in the American delegation was Dr. Lenora S. Fulani, the New Alliance Party's candidate for Governor of New York last year and an ally of the Rev. Louis A. Farrakhan, the Black Muslim. A Canadian journalist attending the conference was found dead Tuesday morning at his hotel. He was identified as Cristoph Lehmann-Halens, a 31-year-old reporter for Southam News.

The diplomat who takes care of Canadian affairs here said the body had been found on the sidewalk, apparently after a fall from the 30-foot roof of the hotel. He said he had been told by Canadian delegates that the Libyan police termed the death an accident.

The Tripoli press today said the Canadian had committed suicide after seeing the damage done by the American bombing. A senior diplomat from the Canadian Embassy in Rome arrived here today to look into the death.

## BODY:

Lenora Fulani, one of the national leaders of the New Alliance Party, began on Monday the Southern leg of a national tour to promote independent black candidate for president of the U.S. in 1988.

"When the Democratic Party talks about choosing a Southerner as its presidential candidate, you know they're not talking about Rev. Jesse Jackson," she said. "They're talking about a white Democrat, a moderate Democrat, perhaps, a neo-reactionary Democrat."

Fulani said the New Alliance will back Jackson as a Democratic candidate, but if he fails to get the nomination would like him to run as an independent.

"If we can end with a million votes or two million votes for a black candidate, then we can sit down with the Democratic Party and ask for the kinds of concessions that we did not get in 1984," she said.

But Fulani insisted that the Alliance campaign, and the Rainbow Coalition that it belongs to, are not merely bargaining positions from which to re-enter the Democratic Party, but valid campaigns in themselves.

Fulani, a developmental psychologist, is a member of the national board of New Alliance and chairs the party's Women of Color Caucus. She is leading a national petition drive to collect a million signatures to convince Jackson to run as an independent if his Democratic bid fails.

"Given that the obvious intent of the Democratic Party is to select not only a white candidate, but a moderate white candidate, Jesse's chances of getting the nomination are very slim," she said. "I have suggested that Jesse instruct the voters of the Rainbow movement to vote their conscience and not the party line in the general election in 1988, and give their vote to the black independent."

~~The New Alliance Party~~ began in 1979 with a handful of community activists and today has 15,000 members. New Alliance is seeking to run an independent black candidate for president in all 50 states in 1988. Members describe the party as "the only black-led, multi-racial independent political party in the

country.''

Fulani said she has approached other potential black candidates about the possibility of running as an independent, in case Jackson refuses to abandon the Democrats.

'We are going to have a black independent candidate in 1988,' she said, 'even if I have to run myself.'

She said she wished to avoid a repeat of the 1984 election in which 90 percent of the black vote went to Walter Mondale without any apparent benefits to the black community.

Two gubernatorial candidates agreed Monday to sit for separate 15-minute televised interviews instead of a four-way debate because they refuse to join a minor-party candidate in a discussion of campaign issues.

Republican Andrew O'Rourke and Dennis Dillon of the Right-to-Life Party both agreed to the taped interviews as an acceptable way of exchanging their views without sharing a debate platform with Lenora Fulani, the New Alliance Party candidate whom they have called 'racist.'

'This is the next best thing to a debate,' Dillon said.

O'Rourke and Dillon said Public Broadcasting System station WMHT-TV in Schenectady offered to tape the interviews as a way of breaking a debate deadlock that left the incumbent, Gov. Mario Cuomo, in the awkward position of debating only Fulani.

'We were told today by PBS that they wanted us to do a 15-minute tape as backup in case the debate fell through,' said O'Rourke spokeswoman Aloise Buckley. 'We agreed to do the tape.'

A New Alliance Party spokeswoman said late Monday that Fulani had not been asked to sit for an interview.

Dillon and O'Rourke, who for weeks had unsuccessfully needed Cuomo to debate, refused Cuomo's conditions that the debate include Fulani, whose party has been charged with being anti-Semitic and affiliated with Black Muslim minister Louis Farrakhan.

The Cuomo campaign sent a letter to Fulani Monday requesting that she clarify her views on Farrakhan, a New Alliance party spokesman said.

Cuomo campaign officials did not return telephone calls regarding the interview proposal. On Sunday, a spokesman said Cuomo was checking with Jewish organizations to determine if he should debate Fulani.

At a Manhattan news conference earlier Monday, Fulani said, 'If they still have a debate I will go alone. I will be in Schenectady and I will debate whoever shows up.'

She said, however, she hoped Cuomo would not "cave in to right wing reactionaries" and withdraw from the debate, scheduled for Saturday. It would be aired statewide and be the only televised debate in the campaign.

Several Jewish organizations issued statements opposing Fulani's participation in any of the gubernatorial debates.

"Extremist groups that spout bigotry and anti-democratic views have entered the political arena to gain publicity for views that most Americans reject," the American Jewish Committee said of the New Alliance Party.

"It would be wise for major party leaders to refrain from structuring their debates so that greater notoriety or attention comes to groups like the New Alliance Party," the group said.

If the WMHT-TV debate is changed to the taped interview format, there will be only one debate in the campaign, sponsored by The New York Times. Because of that newspaper's policy of not including unrecognized party candidates, Fulani was not invited.

Andrew P. O'Rourke, the Republican candidate for governor, said yesterday that he would withdraw from a televised debate with Governor Cuomo if the candidate of the New Alliance Party, which he accused of extremist views, participates.

Mr. O'Rourke, who for weeks had pressed the Governor to debate him, was joined in his threatened withdrawal by the Right to Life candidate, Denis E. Dillon. The New Alliance candidate was included in the debate at Mr. Cuomo's behest.

## Charges of Racism

The threatened withdrawals raised the prospect that Governor Cuomo, the Democratic candidate, and Dr. Lenora B. Fulani of the small New Alliance Party would be alone on stage for one of the two major debates of the campaign, a 90-minute confrontation to be televised from Albany over nine public broadcasting stations at 7 P.M. next Saturday. Mr. Cuomo, Mr. O'Rourke and Mr. Dillon are also scheduled to debate at The New York Times Thursday.

Debate over holding debates has been the most prominent feature of a campaign notably devoid of issues. Mr. O'Rourke has sometimes appeared with a cardboard cutout of Mr. Cuomo to stress the absence of debate. Mr. Cuomo, who has campaigned little, agreed Wednesday to the two debates after dropping his insistence that Mr. O'Rourke disclose clients he represented while he was a Westchester legislator.

Yesterday, however, the campaign abruptly came to life. In a series of statements and telegrams that were the sharpest exchanges to date, the four candidates lobbed charges and countercharges, issued objections and denials and referred repeatedly to racism, anti-Semitism and other extremist views.

Asked if the Governor might withdraw his request for Dr. Fulani's participation, a Cuomo spokesman, Gary Fryer, said, "We really couldn't withdraw it if we wanted to," and added that Mr. O'Rourke "isn't interested in debating - he's interested in talking about debating."

At the center of the fracas was the ~~New Alliance Party~~, ~~described by the~~ Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith ~~as a leftist group that blends~~ psychotherapy and politics. Dr. Fulani, a 36-year-old developmental psychologist, acknowledged yesterday that she supported Mr. Farrakhan and the Nation of Islam, but she denied that she or the party ever had ties to Mr. LaRouche or had advocated racist or anti-Semitic positions.

"White America must learn once and for all that it cannot tell black Americans who our leaders are and whom we are to respect," she declared. She commended Governor Cuomo's decision "to call for my inclusion in the public television debate."

**O'Rourke Sends Message**

Mr. O'Rourke said he would not debate a candidate of a party associated with anti-Semitic and racist views and ties to Mr. Farrakhan and Mr. LaRouche, and he urged the Governor to "stand up with me against prejudice and anti-Semitism before it's too late."

"I have decided that to appear on the same program with a representative of that party would provide a forum for prejudices and tactics which have no place in politics and no place in government," Mr. O'Rourke, the Westchester County Executive, said in a telegram to the Governor.

"I have decided that unless you agree to withdraw your demand that the New Alliance Party candidate be included in the 'Inside Albany' debate, I will decline to appear," Mr. O'Rourke said. "I am appalled by the way in which you and your campaign have brushed off the N.A.P.'s ties to both Louis Farrakhan and Lyndon LaRouche."

Mr. O'Rourke, campaigning upstate, said Governor Cuomo was trying to turn the debate into a "circus" by including minor-party candidates. "He's achieved his goal," Mr. O'Rourke said.

Mr. Dillon said he too would pull out if Dr. Fulani were allowed to join the debate "because of the anti-Semitic and anti-Democratic views" of the New Alliance Party. "No true Democrat," he said, describing himself as such despite his Right to Life candidacy, "would appear on the platform with such a candidate."

The Governor, in a telegram to Mr. O'Rourke, declared: "Obviously no one wants to provide a forum for racism or anti-Semitism. However, such serious charges should not be made recklessly. Any evidence you have that supports your allegations against Dr. Fulani should be made public immediately."

**'Inside Albany' Program**

Mr. Fryer denied that Mr. Cuomo had "demanded" that Dr. Fulani be allowed to participate on "Inside Albany," a program on politics carried on WMHT, the public broadcasting station in the Albany area.

He said that, after accepting an invitation to participate, Mr. Cuomo had "requested" that she and Mr. Dillon be allowed to join in because "it has been his position throughout his career in public service that, absent any reason to the contrary, all legally certified candidates should have the right

to be heard.''

Moreover, Mr. Fryer said, Mr. O'Rourke agreed on Friday to participate in the debate knowing that Dr. Fulani was to be included. And he said Mr. O'Rourke had also agreed to participate in debates this week on WNBC-TV in New York and at the City Club, both forums in which Dr. Fulani also had been invited to appear.

#### Role for Fulani Denied

Mr. Cuomo asked Friday that Dr. Fulani be included in the debates at The Times and in Albany. David Hepp, producer of the Albany program, agreed, but The Times declined. Mr. Fryer said the Governor would nonetheless attend both debates.

Traditionally, The Times invites candidates of major parties that have permanent ballot spots by having got at least 50,000 votes in the last election. Besides the Democratic and Republican Parties, the Conservative, Liberal and Right to Life Parties all have such ballot positions, but the New Alliance Party, which had only a small fraction of the necessary votes, does not have a permanent ballot designation.

New Alliance literature calls the party a 'black-led, multiracial party' that is part of the Rainbow Coalition, an affiliation of minority groups that supported the 1984 Presidential candidacy of Jesse Jackson. Among the New Alliance's goals are 'full civil rights for lesbians and gays, the scapegoats of the rapidly growing right wing,' and 'jobs at livable wages for all.'

Irwin Suall, fact-finding director of the Anti-Defamation League, said the New Alliance was a 'far-left organization with a streak of anti-Semitism' and 'a cult-like quality built around a quasi-cult leader called Fred Newman, the party's founder and leader.'

Plans for the only televised debate in the gubernatorial race collapsed Saturday when Republican Andrew O'Rourke, who spent months demanding a meeting with Gov. Mario Cuomo, withdrew to protest the inclusion of a minor party candidate.

O'Rourke said he would not appear Nov. 1 on statewide public television unless Cuomo drops a demand that Lenora Fulani, candidate of the tiny New Alliance Party, is included.

'No debate is worth dignifying the anti-Semitic positions taken by this party's candidates,' O'Rourke said in a telegram to Cuomo.

Right-to-Life candidate Denis Dillon also withdrew from the debate to protest Fulani's participation, saying her positions were anti-Semitic and anti-democratic.

The New Alliance Party is a group of New York City community activists that describes itself as progressive and independent and works for racial equality and gay rights. Party candidate Nancy Ross received 5,277 votes for governor in 1982 -- 0.1 percent of the vote.

Both candidates withdrew after the New York Post Saturday linked the party with Black Muslim leader Louis Farrakhan and political extremist Lyndon LaRouche.

'I urge him (Cuomo) strongly not back down whatever the pressure from right wingers O'Rourke and Dillon,' Fulani said. 'White America must learn ... that it cannot tell black Americans who our leaders are and who we are to respect.'

O'Rourke, whose bid for a debate was thwarted by Cuomo's unprecedented demands for disclosure of tax and law-client information O'Rourke partially satisfied, and Dillon issued separate statements on their withdrawals.

"I'm a true Democrat even though running on the Right-to-Life line," Dillon said. "No true Democrat would appear on the platform with such a candidate."

Cuomo spokesman Gary Fryer said the campaign asked O'Rourke by telegram Saturday to produce evidence supporting allegations of anti-Semitism, saying such charges "should not be made recklessly."

Aloise Buckley, an O'Rourke spokeswoman, said three New Alliance Party campaign leaflets show the party supports Farrahkan, the controversial Chicago minister, although none of the material contained anti-Semitic remarks.

"It's a matter of public record that Mr. Farrahkan has made strong statements that are anti-Semitic," Buckley said.

Kate Gardner, a Fulani spokeswoman, denied Farrahkan is anti-Semitic.

Debate producer David Hepp, host of the statewide "Inside Albany" program, said he had no plans to change the line-up for the debate, despite the withdrawals.

"We reluctantly agreed to the governor's demand to expand the debate to include all four candidates," Hepp said. "We don't feel it's our place to disinvite anyone."

Hepp said the broadcast will be cut to 60 minutes from 90 minutes if O'Rourke and Dillon boycott.

The developments come one day after Hepp expanded the broadcast to include all four candidates after protests were lodged that Dillon and Fulani were excluded.

Hepp, who regularly reports on state government, said Cuomo's campaign was playing a "game" and trying to weaken the debate by adding the other candidates.

"There's no question that if you have four voices instead of three, it makes the debate more diffused," Hepp said.

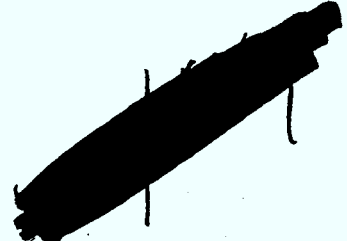

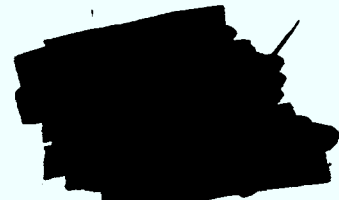

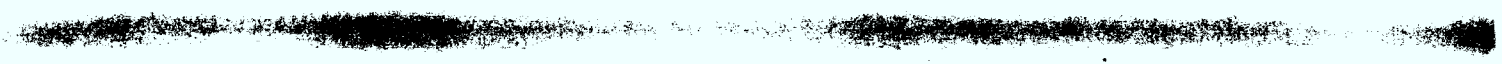

Dear Colonel Linnen:

This is in response to your letter of February 23, 1988, in which concerns were raised regarding the New Alliance Party (NAP), a black militant group, and the Red Command, a recently emerged terrorist group in Puerto Rico.

The FBI initiated a preliminary inquiry on the NAP in January, 1988, [redacted]

This inquiry was promptly closed on April 7, 1988, due to the fact that no and/or insufficient information was developed pertaining to the NAP or its members [redacted] which would have justified continuing the investigation under the Attorney General Guidelines.

The Red Command first came to the attention of the FBI when it claimed credit for three bombings and one attempted bombing on January 6, 1986, on the island of Puerto Rico.

The three explosive devices detonated at three U.S. Post Office facilities in Cidra, Guanica, and Santurce, Puerto Rico, causing minor damages. Later that morning, an undetonated device was found in front of a U.S. Army Recruiting Center in Toa Baja, Puerto Rico. This device was constructed of a metal pipe bomb filled with black powder and connected to a timing mechanism which failed to function. The detonated devices were of similar construction.

The Red Command claimed responsibility for the bombings in pursuit of liberty for Puerto Rican political prisoners and for the island of Puerto Rico.

On March 17, 1986, an explosive device consisting of batteries, wires, a clock and a flash bulb was found under the filling pipe cap of a 5,000 gallon gasoline holding tank at a gasoline station in Ponce, Puerto Rico. It failed to detonate due to a malfunction of the time delay mechanism. The Red Command claimed credit for the placement of the device in order to further the revolution and achieve liberty.

No subsequent actions have been claimed by the Red Command.

Dear Mr. Pomerantz:

At a recent meeting of law enforcement and intelligence officials held in the Washington, DC area, it was mentioned that the FBI may be investigating a black militant group known as the "NEW ALLIANCE". This group allegedly advocates the violent overthrow of the U.S. Government and is comprised of members of the Black Panther Party and the Weather Underground. It was also stated that although the main office is in New York, there are a number of regional offices. Our review of the groups you have informed us about does not conclude that there is such a group under a full Domestic Security/Terrorism investigation but this could have possibly changed. In light of the discussions that took place concerning this organization, request that a characterization be provided this office.

Additionally, this office has been advised by our Army Counterintelligence element in Puerto Rico about the emergence of what appears to be a new and separate terrorist group known as the "RED COMMAND". As you know, all the Puerto Rican terrorist groups have historically targeted Department of Defense elements and for these acts, they have been declared as threats to DOD. We are concerned that a new group, about which we know very little, would add to the threat facing our elements on that island. Request you provide this office with your assessment of this group and any data on its composition and ideology. Upon receipt, we intend to nominate this group for inclusion on the list of groups posing a threat to DOD.

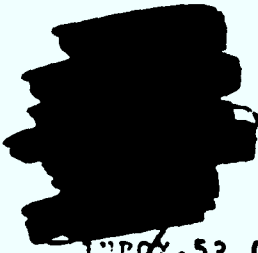

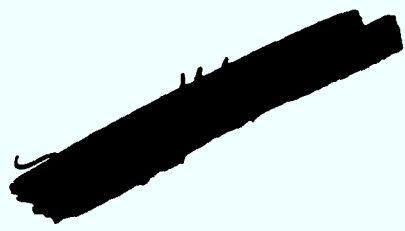
