June 8th, FRED TILLMAN, attorney Pawhuska, informed Agent Burger that's certain MRS. NECIA KINNEY, wife of JOHN KINNEY, Osage Indian, is probably directly involved in the ANNA BROWN murder, for the following alleged reasons:

MRS. KINNEY is but the common law wife of JOHN KINNEY and now sebarated from him; she and JOHN KINNEY were living on his allotment, one one-half miles northeast of Belfort Bridge in DO NOT WRITE IN THESE SPACES RECE MELAPINE

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May 24 to June 200 924. Deage County (note this location) in 1921, when ANKA BROWN JOHN KINNEY was at that time having undue relations with and spending much of his time in her company, both being Osage Indians, while MRS. KINNEY is a white woman. MRS. KINNEY is of a very violent disposition, having personally assauled different men on a number of occasions for fancied wrongs, and 17 on June 4, 1924 she shot a number of times at FRED TILIMAN at Guthrie kla. shooting him from his rear and hitting him three times, twice in 21 the legs and once in the arm, using a pistol. She is also said to have 23 repeatedly horsewhipped JOHN KINNEY and kept him at work with a rifle. TILIMAN States that MRS. KINNEY was insanely jealous of 27 BROWN and threatened that she was going to kill ANNA BROWN just 20 Short time before was killed. ANNA That this threat was made to a certain woman at Fairfax. Okla. 3 whose name MR. TILIMAN has forgotten, but will procure and furnish to me MR. TILLMAN stated further to Agt. Burger that he was attorney for TMRS. KINNEY and on one occasion asked her what she thought of the Fair-39fax murders, but did not mention wark any particular one; that was. AIKINNEY flew into a rage and asked TILIMAN if he meant to accuse her of 43the murder of ANNA BROWN: that he pacified her and reminded her he name to her. Shad not even mentioned ANNA BROWN'S

Agents will investigate this MRS. KINNEY angle thoroughly for the main reason that she and John Kinney lived near Belfort Bridge at the very location states BRYAN BURKHART told that BRYAN BURKHART and ANNA BROWN met J. L. BRIDGES, GEORGE JAMES and EDITH DAVIS, about 9 P. M. the night of May 21, 1921 (when ANNA BROWN was murdered) and it now appears possible that MRS. KINNEY and BRYAN BURKMART may both have had a hand in ANNA BROWN'S murder. MRS. KINNEY. Seconding to MR. TILIMAN, owned a .32 calibre pistol at that time as her husband, JOHN KINNEY, knows.

June 12th Agents proceeded to Wichita and made appointment with 26

June 13th. These Agents at Wichita, Kens. interviewed HUGH K. REA 32 39attorney, 205 Fourth Matl. Bank Bldg. MR. REA is attorney for JOHN 40 40 41KINNEY, husband of MRS. KINNEY, named above.

MR. REA called JOHN KINNEY to the office and instructed KINNEY to
44
45 talk freely and fully to us and furnished us a room to talk privately in

JOHN KINNEY is a full blood Osage, about forty years of age, hard to be aring, slow of speech but quite intelligent and speaks English very 50 slowell indeed. KINNEY however plainly is of weak will power. He impressed 52 slowery favorably by his desire to be truthful and just in his state-

JOHN KINNEY stated that he and his wife are now separated; that 58
59she is a white woman about forty years old; that they have been married 60

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about fourteen years and have no children; that he owns two and one-fifth headrights in Osage Tribe; that he is not restricted and did own about 1.650 acres of land in Osage County and a large sum in Liberty Bonds.

That during the last few years he has given said wife, at her repeated requests and for the alleged purpose of safety of the property.

in trust for them both, Liberty bonds and money in the aggregate sum of setween \$65,000.00 and \$85,000.00 which she still has; that he has also made a will which she has by which she is kin given his entire estate at his death.

That he and she having not been friendly for several years, though

It will thus be seen that JOHN KINNEY is badly in need of an honest

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42quardian and attorney to look after him and his property rights at once
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44as his wife is of violent, desperate and erratic character.

JOHN KINNEY stated further that some years ago he married ANNA
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48BROWN who was murdered near Fairfax in May, 1921; that however this
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59marriage was annulled because of his then valid existing common-law
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52marriage to his present wife, referred to above.

That his wife appeared jealous of ANNA BROWN and was unfriendly to her; that on one occasion this wife asked him if he thought more of 57
524NNA BROWN than he did of her and he told her "no"; that she replied 59

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that if he did he was liable to be killed some time while out on a drieding purity with ANNA BROWN, but did not say who would kill him!

JOHN KINNEY stated that in May, 1921 he and his wife lived on the place, about one and a half miles northeast of Belford Bridge is Owner. 2 County, but that neither ANNA BROWN nor BRYAN BURKHART was ever at that place, so far as he knew; that he never heard his wife threaten any harm to ANNA BROWN; that his wife did not possess any pistel is 1921 that he knew of.

JOHN KINNEY stated that he had no reason to believe his wife impli-22 cated in ANNA BROWN'S murder and that she told him several times 24 that She believed BILL HALE and the BURKHARTS were responsible for 26ANNA BROWN'S murder as they wanted her death before LIZZIR Q died. so property would go to LIZZIE Q. ANNA'S mother, who ANNA'S 30had a will giving nearly all her property to the RRNEST BURKHART family JOHN KINNEY showed a surprising knowledge of amount and descent of 34the ANNA BROWN. LIZZIE Q and family property, and stated that he also eved the HALE-BURKHARTS were responsible for murder ANNA BROWN'S 38 but that he had no evidence to that effect, as all the Indians were afraid to tell anything.

JOHN KINNEY stated further that his wife is very courageous and has had several fights with white business men such as merchants, guardians and bankers in Osage County; that however he knows that there was justification for her in these affrays as in several of the cases she was trying to prevent Indians being grafted by these men, naming CHAS. ASE, BROOK and others.

JONN KINNEY stated also that during the last year or so his wife has seemed to have a strong belief in spiritualistic mediums and has been 57

Stelling him some strange and weird things; that she has had employed

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KINSON another whom she called WILLIAMS and another whose name he did
not learn; that she told him these men were detectives and that WILKENSON was a Spiritalist, and informed her that FRED TILIMAN and others at
Pawhuska were going to lay a spell on KINNEY and have him kill her;
that WILKINSON also told her that FRED TILIMAN has put a spell on her;
that she told KINNEY that on one occasion she was in TILIMAN'S office
at Pawhuska and FRED TILIMAN "mesmerised" her and had her sign a deed
by which she conveyed to FRED TILIMAN the \$ 1,500 acres of land JOHE
KINNEY had deeded to her, as stated before.

KINNEY stated that MRS. KINNEY related that FRED TILIMAN on that 26 27 occasion told her she could not raise her hands, and when she tried to 28. 29 do so, she could not move: that TILIMAN then commanded her to sign the 30 31 said deed to said land and she obeyed because of the "spell" TILIMAN 32 33 had laid on her.

exerty bonds and money she has gotten from him.

JOHE KINNEY States that his wife seemed to be a good honest woman 22 in the few years ago and made many enemies because she took an interest 24 25 in numerous cases where the whites were grafting the Indians, she taking 26 27 the Indians's side, but that she has changed.

That shortly after GEORGE BIGHEART'S mysterious death in a hospital 30
31 at Okla. City he, KINNEY, heard BLIZE BIGHEART? the widow of GEORGE, 32
32 telling MRS. KINNEY that BILL HALE had taken GEORGE BIGHEART to a hospital at Okla. City and had induced GEORGE BIGHEART to sign a deed 35 pital at Okla. City and had induced GEORGE BIGHEART to sign a deed 37 conveying a lot of land to BILL HALE. KINNEY stated that BLIZE BIGHEART Was appealing to MRS. KINNEY for help in this matter, but MRS. 39 HRART was appealing to MRS. KINNEY for help in this matter, but MRS. 40
41 KINNEY refused and told BLIZE BIGHEART "I won't do it. You Indians are 42
43 all cowards. I have taken your parts in many of these cases, and you 44
45 Indians don't stand by me, and I get myself into trouble".

JOHN KINNEY states that the man at his home when JEFF HUTCHINSON served notice of suit by E. R. SHEPHERD against JOHN KINNEY was F. L.

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ROBERTS: that ROBERTS is still on KINNEY'S farm near Belford Bridge.

JEFF HUTCHINSON is said to claim that MRS. KINNEY had this man one-dered to will HUTCHINSON at that time, but KINNEY says he knows nothing of that and don't believe it.

That the detective WILKINSON told him, KINNEY, that the spirit talk was all bunk; that WILKINSON is said to work out of the detective office of A. V. STEPHENSON OF STEVENS. Fort Worth, Tex.

The rather long account of JOHN KINNEY'S statements are set forth.

21 for two reasons.

The main one is that MR. and MRS. KINNEY did live about a mile and less a half northeast of Belford Bridge in May, 1921 when ANNA BROWN was tilled, which is the location of the place that R. M. PIKE states BRYAN PURKHART told him was where BRYAN BURKHART and ANNA BROWN met J. L. 30 BRIDGES, GEORGE JAMES and EDITH DAVIS the night ANNA BROWN was killed. 32 There is a possible connection here, that will have to be traced out

The other reason is that H. C. HARGIS, FRED TILIMAN, J. S. SIMPSON BD SCHENCK and others keep insisting that MRS. KINNEY is implicated in ANNA BROWN'S murder, though none of them has produced any evidence to that effect, and the only motive assigned is jealousy.

There is no doubt that MRS. KINNEY is a desperate character and 44
45 determined to get a small fortune out of JOHN KINNEY by any means she
46
47 deems necessary.

LES. JOHN KINNEY has made many enemies among the whites in Osage County. She was not to be found when we were at Wichita on the 13th of June. But we will locate and interview her fully as soon as possible. It is possible that she may be of great assistance to us, if so inclined or persuaded.

June 13th, interviewed ED SCHENCK, 1608 S. Waco, Wichita, Kane.

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who was evasive and unsatisfactoryin his talk, possibly due to his age 72 years. He declared the woman WM. SHAW had in mind was LUELLA HALLETY but stated that she was unreliable and no account and had told him told.

BD SCHENCK has also changed his theory of this murder, so he stated, and expressed a belief that MRS. KINNEY was implicated in it, but SCHENCK could not or would not give any reason, motive or information to support his new theory.

Interviewed HUGH K. REA, attorney for JOHN KINNEY, but MR. REA had nothing to add to what KINNEY told us, but promised to assist us all possible.

June 19th, interviewed LAURA CONN, who now lives with her father.

SILAS CONN at Washungs, Okla. LAURA CONN stated in brief that she never
did say that ROSE OSAGE told her that JOE ALLEN, alias JIMMY HICKS

killed ANNA BROWN and that she, LAURA CONN, never did say that JOE
ALLEN told her that ROSE OSAGE killed ANNA BROWN.

ADTAIRS and there another man wrote up a statement in which she puraported to state that ROSE OSAGE told her, in the Foley Hotel at Fair-43 AATAX, that JOE ALLEN killed ANNA BROWN and that JOE ALLEN told her, 45 AGLAURA CONN, that ROSE OSAGE killed ANNA BROWN; LAURA CONN stated to 48 Aggents that she told JEFF HUTCHINS and the other man at the time that 49 Sothis was not true, but they had her sign the statement anyway.

LAURA CONN stated further that JOE ALLEN and ROSE OSAGE both did stell her that they pawned a ring of ANNA BROWN'S at Wynona, Okla. Schor some whiskey but did not say to whom and did not say how or when sathey got this ring. Also that JOE ALLEN did tell her, LAURA CONN.

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stopped sam TULK and another man for assistance; that ANNA BROWN'S shoe was in the FANNIE LASLEY car at the time and TULK asked about it and JOE ALIEN told him it was ROSE OSAGE'S shoe and JIMMIE HICKS said he would not have stopped TULK if he had known who he was.

Also that ROSE OSAGE nor JOE ALLEN nor anyone else has questioned to her. LAURA CONN, since she was at Fairfax as a coroner's witness in 18 1921 and that she has never testified nor told that JOE ALLEN OF ROSE 29 21 OSAGE told her who killed ANNA BROWN.

It appears almost certain that there is nothing to the theory that JOE ALLEN or ROSE OSAGE had any part in ANNA BROWN'S murder.

HENRY ROAN MURDER.

June 3d at Ponca interviewed JAMES, AUTIN 19 years old who had told CHANCE FRAZIER that he, AUTIN, knew all about who killed HENRY ROAM and the SMITHS and why it was done.

JAMES AUTIN is intelligent, but shifty. However, Agent Weiss who interviewed AUTIN believes AUTIN'S story is probably true, so far as 50 Jaurin is concerned, but that AUTIN'S informatis were just telling AUTIN some boastful lies to impress him. AUTIN'S statement, in material substance, is that:
