Agent went to #1027 West 6th Street, San Bernardin, "Calif. but no one was at homes. There were no grocery stores, filling stations, etc. in the vicinit I'm where information could likely be obtained. The houses on both sides were emply 125 and for Tent.

Agent, under cover, and under suitable pretext, engaged a neighboriname unknown) in conversation and learned from him that John T. Ewers is a carpenter; has lived for years in San Bernardino and is now employed at the Santa Fe R. R. Shops. He has a daughter Ida who recently graduated from high school, and is 18 % now employed in a telegraph office in Los Angeles . Informant seemed to know of but two sons: one of them in the Fire Department in Los Angeles, and one driving an ambulance at Los Angeles County General Hospitale.

At Los Angeles, agent examined the Civil Service records of the Los Angeles : County and City, and obtained the following date:



17 Dead in \$2,000,000 Conspiracy, Is Charge After Inquiry.

REAL TERROR REIGN AMONG OSAGES TOLD

Federal Grand Jury Receives
Evidence; Tribe Members
Receiving Whisky.

Guthrie, Okla., Jan. 8 (By A. P.). The battered skull of Anna Brown, first victim c. an alleged ring in the Osage county, was taken today before the United States grand jury. Simultaneously, it was announced by Edwin Brown, Assistant United States Attorney General, who is an charge of the grand jury, that liquor is being given Indians brought from their restricted lands to tell what they know of the death shadow that seemingly has hovered over some of their people.

The grand jury is trying to determine the truth of rumers long forming that a powerful conspiracy to obtain Indian money to the exfent of about \$2,900,000 was responsible for a perios of seventeen deaths.

No arrests have been made on charges of intoxication among with nesses, Mr. Brown said, but several Orages have been under the influence of liquer and it is feared that the liques and it is feared. United States Claims Juris Bothen

Mr. Brown has requested Federal agents to keep a sharp lookout fer liquor and to arrest anyone responsible for distributing it among the Indians.

Mr. Brown said that the government has decided it has jurisdiction is several of the killions, and that its inquiry has been widened to include murder charges as well as those of conspiracy against wards of the United States, which was the original scope of the grand jury action.

The government's investigation has revealed a condition that will astound the nation when the details are known, it was declared by Mr. Brown.

"Before this probe is completed the entire United States will be astounded by the revelations," he said. "Nothing he far-reaching in murders has ever before been revenied."



confession to the marger of an old man for his wares. That the confession of LAWLON disappeared from the records of the Jounty Atton, of Casse County resulting in Lawlon being acquitted of said marger, which he, LAWBON, was unquestionably guilty of committing. That he, BLOYD, after the disappearance of LAWLON'S confession, realized that LAWSON had secured high powered co-operation in defeating his case, but he no time had any reason to connect BILL HALL in the matter. BLOYD now recalls that BILL HALE was a frequent visitor at the Casse County Jail having access thereto at any time and was a very close friend to the then Sheriff, LAR. COOK, and no doubt could have gotten LAWJON out of Jail and had him commit any offense, as LAWSON is an unscrupulous criminal, and that he had no doubt in the least but that HALE did get LAWLON out of Jail and have him marder W. E. (BILL) SMITH and family. That he has no information to prove it and is unable to suggest any leads to assist the investigation.

BLOYD was closely questioned as to his whereavouts covering the period around the time the murder was committed, and he unhesitatingly stated when first questioned that he was at Oklahoma City in rederal Jourt just prior to and ot the time ofthe murder, and covering a period of two or three days therewater, but on being confronted with the facts that records disclosed that he was not in Oklahome City covering such period as a witness in the Federal Court, BLCTD then admitted that he guessed he was mistaken, that he was not at Oklahoma City but was at Ml Doraco, Mansas, at Court as a witness. That he knew that he was at one of the two places. On being confronted that the fecords disclosed that he was not at ml Dorago attending Court as stated, BLOYD then admitted that he did not know where he was, but thought that he was at one of the two places, Onlanoma Jity or all Dorago, but that if not at either of these two places, he was confident that he was absent from Fawhsuka at the time of the SMITH murder. INFORMATION OBTAINED PROM MA-SHURIFF A. C. COOM OF OSAGE. THY, OXIZHOMA:

Mr. GOOK stated to this Agent that he was sheriff of Csage County covering period from January 1, 1923 to January 1, 1925, and while as such had in his employ M. A. BLOYD as Deputy. 

Leavenworth, Dec 16-1925: Statement made by John I. Henderson to F. S. Smith, Special Agent, Department of Justice.

I was a peputy sheriff of Osage County on the date of the explosion that killed Bill smith and family at Pairfax, Oklahoma. C. A. Cook was sheriff,

Fred Whittaker, K. A. Bloyd, Henry Mayes, Ed Cleween, D. K. Smith and myself were active field deputies. Harry Loore was under-sheriff and Dock Trins was Jailor and Col. George Roby 🕏 was assistint Jailor and supposed to work at night. Er. Roby was in very bad health and on that account any of the Deputy Sheriffs who happened to be around the Jail would help him in locking up and releasing prisoners and many times would stay at the Jail while he went to a show. On the day before the Smith blow up, Henry Layes and I was working on a fellow who was in Jail, his name Blogg, called "Squirrel" trying to get him to furnish us information concerning some dope peddlers at Whisbang, who he had been associated with and about 6:30 P.M. Henry Mayes and I went up to the third floor cells to talk to 'Spuirrel'. As we passed a cell at the top of the stairs on the third floor, which was the cell that Burt Lauson was then confined in, we saw Deputy Sheriff Bloyd standing at Lawson's cell door with his head close to the bars talking to Burt Lewson. I gave that fact no thought at that time for the reason that I had seen him there talking to Lawson many times prior to then, and after that on leaving the Jail about 7:30 Bloyd was still talking with Lawson. On the morning of the explosion. which took place around 2 4. H., and around 8 4. H. a funch of the Deputies were in the sheriff's office talking shout the explosion and I noticed that Bloyd was exceptionally nervous and acted different than usual. I said nothing at that time but a few days later. Fred Whittaker in the presence of Dock Lains. myself, Henry Mayes, mentioned how queer, funny and nervous floyd was acting since the blow up and all of us commented on his peculiar actions. whittaker went so far as to go to sheriff Cook and told him that on account of Floyd's actions that he did not want to work with him. Sheriff Jook then came to me and asked me if I was afraid to work with him, and I told him 'no' and we then worked together for probably a month or more. Sometime about two weeks after the Smith murder, Blayd showed up with a new special studebaker car, specially equipped. Prior to the Smith murder Bloyd was broke and slways borrowing from some of us Deputies, so nuturally we could not figure out where he got the new car. Sometime after he got the new car he very suddenly disappeared and none of the Sheriff's force knew where or why he had gone. I recently heard that Squirrel' Blogg is in Port Madison prisone (signed) John I. Henderson

STATELERY MADE BY PRICE BOLES:

Leavenworth, Kans. Dec. 16, 1925.

"I am an inmete of the Federal Prison serving. an eighteen months sentence from Osage County, Oklahome, for possession of liquor. Ly present work is cleaning and attending to Cell House Gallery To. 2 and am an Orderly. Sometime about ten cays or two weeks ago, I came in contact with one Burt Lewson, who is a prisoner here, and he remembered me in Osage County. He seemed to take a liking to me and placed confidence in me and we have had many talks together about Osage County and neople we both knew. A few days ago Lawson told me in confidence that he trusted me and went on to tell me that he was brought here by the Government from McAlester prison and that he had no sentence here. That he blew up the Bill amith home at rairiax; that Bill Hale and another party furnished the money and that Bill Hale and a Deputy Sheriff took him out of Fawhusha Jail where he was in on a marger charge and took him to Fairfax on the night Smith's house was blown up and that he actually did the blowing up. That he w s taken back and put in the Pawhuska Jail after the blow up and that none of the officials knew he was out of Jail except the Deputy Sheriff, and that he was taken out more than once by the Deputy. Lewson told me that he made a statement to some Government man telling him the truth or how he was taken out of Jail and how he blew up smith's house, but since making that statement he told several that the statement was not the truth and had sent a letter to the Department of Justice at Lashington through his sister at Oklahoma City, telling . the Government his statement was not the truth, but that the statement was the truth but that he was going to bake out of it. Ly resson for furnishing this information is that if what Lawson has told me is the truth, that those implicated should be prosecuted es it was a norrible afrair.

He told me that Bill Hale and paputy sheriff Bloyd came to the fail then he was and the Deputy Cheriff taken him out at night and bill Hale taken him to Fairfax and drove him up to the alley. He got out of the car and he goes up the alley back of the Bill Smith home, goes in the back way with a jug of nitroglycerine puts it under the house and exploded it and blowed it up then talked back down to krney Burkharts place where Bill Hale agreed to wait for him. He found Hale waiting there for him and bill Hale got in the car and welt back to Pawhuska and bloyd taken him and put him back in jail. He said Deputy cheriff Bloyd framed this job up had all the arrangements and he blowed it up. He said he thought the we uty got more out of it than he did. He hasnt told me how much he got for the job but he said he got a good price of money out of it. He says he dont know whether Burkhart had anything to do with it or not. but Hale waited at this place for him while he was doing the job. It looks a little bad on his part to me. He says he is going to ask you to not prosecute him in this 380000 case. I told him he had better take care of himself. I didn't think Hale was going to help him out. I told him all people wanted was the truth in this case they wanted the suilty party and to just tell the truth and it wouldn't burt him say. Say he said he would do it. well Mr. I guess I will close as this is all the information I have for you at present. Hoping you success.

However, as he recalls it, no evidence of a complicity of Roan's beneficiary in the murder was developed.

Lake stated further that he personally made no investigation of the case; however, that is restible that Peel, personated him in making his investigation, by using his name. Further, that he signed Peel's report and turned it over to the law firm of Jones, Eocker, Jullivan and Amert, of this City.

Agent interviewed Mr. James C. Jones, of this firm, who stated that Peel's report was sent to the law firm of Embry, Johnson and Tolbert, of Oklahoma City, attorneys for the Capital Life Insurance Company, and that he was informed the Government had had access to this report. Mr. Jones stated further that if any difficulty was experienced in locating and serving Peel, through Lake, that he would need be able to exert influence on Lake to insure Feel's appearance at Guthrie, Oklahoma, when desired.

Lake promised to call this office as soon as Peel returns, and an effort to serve Peel will be made as scon as the subpoena is received here.
