
Upon my return to the office this morning after an absence of about ten days. I received your telegram and was very glad to learn the exact status of the murder cases. When I left washington I had intended to proceed to Oklahoma City before I returned to the effice but certain matters arose in a number of the northern effices which required my attention and I, consequently, proceeded by way of Detroit, Buffalo, New York and Philadelphia, and have just returned.
