

KELSEY MORRISON, State Penitentiary, McAlester, Oklahoma, stated that Guy Wilkerson had told him that Cornett and Male wanted Wilkerson to corroborate story of Roan leaving Cornett's that evening, as stated above, but that Wilkerson said he saw no such thing and would not testify that he did. Morrison also stated that Henry Cornett bragged to him that he, Cornett, was the best evidence framer that ever was, or words to that effect.

O. C. WERB, Fairfax, Oklahoma, government witness who left Pairfax
December 5, 1928 at night and was reported to be intending not to be present to teatify for the Government and who Agents had kept located in the meantime, returned to Pairfax December 17, 1928 and on December 18th was interviewed and stated that on December 5, 1928 he was the complaining witness against one Jess Warren, charged with cursing over the telephone; that on that date, Walter Gray, attorney at Fairfax and Bill Hale partisan, personally advised said O. C. Webb in substance as follows:
"Now, Webb, you know I am your friend and like you and never gave you any bad advice. This case today (Warren case) is going to be a Hale and anti-Hale case entirely. The best thing for you to do is to leave here and not be here to testify in the Hale trial. Stay away till it is over. You know I am your friend and am advising you for your own good."

O. C. WEBB stated further that he left that night intending the star away of ill after the Hale trial; as advised by Gray; that he, webb, went to the California, and finally decided to return but that he is in fear of his life because of being a witness for the Government against Hale and he, Webb, must have protection. WebB and Gray have lived in Fairfax for year and have been friends for several years. WebB requested that he be taken to Tulsa to see T. J. Leahy, attorney in this case, which wab7done.

Emery and Gray Moheer Persons all Y and well; that he knew them both for years when they lived in Emass City and had bullness dealings with both of them. 




