



Dear Mr. Brown:

I received your letter of the 29th mitime, and were reglad to hear from you. First, I want to extend to you my heartless congratulations upon the successful outcome of the W. K. Hale case. The result should certainly tend to strengthen the confidence in the Federal Law Enforcement Agencies in the State of Cklaho and increate to the lawless element that when the Federal Government takes up a matter it intends to go through with it irrespective of the many harassing obstatles that may be placed in its way.

It is gratifying to note that the agents of the Bureau were so satisfactory in their work upon this case. I realize what a difficult investigation it has been and each and every man who has worked upon it deserves all of the credit that can be accorded to him for his efforts.

In regard to Agent Burger, I well appreciate his indefatigable application to duty throughout the many long months that
this case has been pending. In regard to sending him back to
Kansas City, I shall be very glad indeed to keep this in mind.
Just at the present moment, however, I think it would be very inadvisable to send him back to Kansas City until all angles of
the Hale matter have been concluded. I want to make serte in
that there is no possibility of a recurrence of the situation while
developed previously after the trial of Hale. As soon as
is a certainty of this being passed, I will then endeavor to have



I have on this date conferred with Mr. John M. Goldesberry, United States Attorney for the Morthern District, and Mr. Roy St. Lewis, United ... States Attorney for the Western District of Oklahoma, and Mr. Goldesberry expressed to me that in his judgment the defense would rely solely on desision in the Lewis case which is now before the United States Supreme Court, to argue the motion for new trial in the W.
