Confidential Informant of known reliability, advised that the subject maintains his residence at 22 East 69 Street, New York City, c/o HAROLD COLL, and also receives his mail at this address. T-12 Carther advised that he believes the subject has a residence in Enfield, Connecticut.

Employment

The "Daily Worker" of July 6, 1952, page one, columns two and three, contained an article captioned "Robeson Tour a Triumph for the Artist and the People," written by JUEN HUDSON JUNES, this article stated that ROBESON gave fifteen concerts in as many cities, before nearly seventy-five thousand people. It further stated that the tour honored the fifty-fourth birthday of the subject. This tour, according to the article, was sponsored by the United Freedom Fund, and exceeded all expectations.

The great crowds and the struggles carried on by the people against official opposition in many cities made him express the feeling that in all his career, he had enjoyed this tour the most, according to the article.

The "Daily Worker" is an East coast Communist newspaper.

Confidential Informant of known reliability, furnished a news release of the Council on African Affairs, dated August 18, 1952 which listed PAUL ROBESON as chairman of this organization.

The Council on African Affairs has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9035.

The September 1952 issue of "Freedom" a monthly publication of Freedom Associates listed the subject as Chairman of the Editorial Board of this newspaper.

Confidential Informant of known reliability, advised that previous to February 1752, "Freedom" published by Freedom Associates had been suspended for approximately three

months and that through the efforts of PAUL RODESON the paper is again being published.

It is noted that Confidential Informant had previously advised that the members of the editorial staff and editorial board of "Freedom" a monthly publication of Freedom Associates, 53 west 135 Street, New York City, are Communists active in radial matters.

<u>Activities</u>

Confidential Informant , of known reliability, advised that a New York State Civil Rights Concress leadership meeting took place on

Covised that "Indian Parkerson at this meeting stated that the Civil Rights Congress must widely use the statements, such as the statement of Judge DELLALY, linking FAUL MUSESON with Communism. PATTERSON stated "DELLALY is helping to merge Communism and the fight of the Negro people by linking RUBESON with the Communist Party and the struggle for peace.

"The trials of the Communists must be brought to the attention of the Negro people, because the Negro people are associating the Communist Party with the struggle for their liberation...the linking of Aubadum with Communism should be utilized by us on a wide scale among the Negro people; ROBESON is fighting for the Negro people and for peace. ROLLDON is a Communist. The Communist Party is fighting for the same principles. So, the Communist Party is our Party!"

It is noted that WILL AF PATTERSON is National Executive Secretary of the Civil Mights Congress, which or anization has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informat of known reliability, of advised that the Citizens Emergency Defense Conference held a rally on March 16, 1952 at City Center, 135 West 55 Street, New York City. This rally was held for the defense of the Smith Act victims.

Confidential Informant advised that rAUL RUBESON sang and spoke at this rally. According to the Informant, RUBESON stated that we must fight for the Communist and for the Communist Party because it is the wanguard of the working class. It is part of a movement which is aweeping all over the world. We are ready for a determined unslaught against the Smith Act.

Confidential Informant reported that ROBESON further stated, "In defending DEANIS and BEN DAVIS and ARROLD JUHNSUN, we are defending the rights of the Negro people."

He further stated, according to ______, "The African people and the Negro people from other parts of the world told him that they would not go to war against the Soviet Union. Let the warmongers remember this, and let them also remember that the people of the world know that civilization was saved at Stalingrad."

The "Daily Worker" of April 8, 1952, page three, columns two to four, carried an article which stated that the Citizens Emergency Defense Conference declared its specific purpose to be the defense of the sixteen New York Smith Act victims facing trial at Foley Square.





Confidential Informant of known reliability, advised that ROB SON addressed a meeting at the Yugoslav-American Home, New York City on April 17, 1752 which meeting was to welcome delegates who attended the Inter-continental Peace. Conference at Montevideo, Uruguay. According to the Informant ROBESON compared the oppression of hinese and Indians in South America to the oppression of Negros in the United States and South Africa, stating that all were slaves.

ROBESON, according to the Informant, claimed that the United States was stealing valuable resources from Latin America. According to ROBESON pointed out that the French Revolution had a world-wide effect and that the Russian Revolution is inevitably having a similar effect. ROBESON further stated according to the Informant that it is the duty of Americans to encourage this Revolution so that it would spread as fast as possible.

Confidential Informants and both of known reliability, advised that the Yugoslav-American Home, 405 west 41 Street, New York City is one of the largest centers of Yugoslav Communist activity in the New York area.

The "Daily Worker" of April 6, 1952, page four, columns two to five carried an article captioned "Washington Expesses its own hand in Robeson Passport Case." This article stated that the Secretary of State lifted ROBESON's passport under the National Emergency and on restrictions imposed on travel in November 1941 to prevent Nazi and Japanese spies from operating.

The article further stated that ROBESON's lawyers argued that he had been deprived of his property rights without due process of the law under the Fifth Amendment, that he has been deprived of freedom of speech, thought, assembly, petition and travel in violation of the First Amendment. They further argued that the Secretary of State acted inlegally and unconstitutionally, according to the article.

advised that the Council on African Affairs held a rally on April 5, 1952 from 6:00 to 9:00 pm at Lenox Avenue and 125 Street, New York City. The Informant further stated that PAUL ROBESON was a speaker at this rally. The Informant quoted ROBESON as follows: "This South African campaign will bring to all the Africans and darker races of the world, the struggle for liberation. This is a direct challenge to all Negros to fight, "How long can we take this treatment?" said ROBESON. He further stated, according to the Informant, that if the South African people win some freedom, we are going to win some in America.

The "Daily Worker" of April 30, 1952, page three, columns one to three carried an article captioned "Paul Robeson to Open National Tour with Concert at Rockland Park." This article stated that ROBESON's birthday concert at Rockland Park on May 8 will be part of a nation-wide series of concerts at which the great-Negro artist will be honored. It further stated that the concerts will protest the "house arrest" of the artist who has been denied a passport by the State Department. It further stated that greetings and invitations to sing have been pouring in from almost every nation in the world to ROBESON.

The New York "Amsterdam News" of May 17, 1752, page forty-one, columns three and four contain an article captioned "Frisco Mayor, Board Ban Robeson Concert." This article stated that San Francisco last week became the latest city to ban PAUL RUBESON, noted baritone, in his current concert tour of American cities. It further stated that when the Board of Trustees spurred, by Mayor ELMER ROBINSON, voted to deny the singer permission to sing in the opera house, San Francisco joined of Oakland, California and Seattle, Washington, as cities which have refused to allow the singer to sing.

The Mayor was quoted as follows: "It's time to quit compromising with the Communists. I don't say RUBESON should be banned from singing in San Francisco - that is up to those who have halls to hire. But I don't believe that RUBLSON should be permitted to sing at the tombstone of those who gave their lives

for this kind of government that they believe in and ROBESON opposes."

that PAUL ROBESON will head a committee to campaign for the release of the imprisoned Communist leaders. This campaign is just being planned and will be nation-wide.

Confidential Informant of known reliability, savised concerning the activities surrounding a concert given by PAUL ROBESON in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on May 29, 1952. The Informant reported ROBLSON stated that one thing he wanted to destroy was lear in the minds of our presses that he was a Communist. The question is not whether PAUL ROBESOn is a Communist or not - if that were true and they could prove it, they would have already hauled me before a Congressional Committee or Court." ROBESON stated, according to the Informant, "many times I have offered to go before any committee and present my feelings and to qualify my stand. I have stated that I liked what I saw in Soviet Russia during my visits there. The great Transfiguration of a people that was shown and that had taken place between my first visit in 1936 and my last visit in 1947, makes me like what I saw. For that reason I educated my son there. But the real core of my fight is not political but is based on the sympathy and the love of my people and all colored people of the world. I am determined to strike down all 'Jim Crowism' and second class citizenship wherever I find it. The only thing we must concern ourselves with is Negro liberation to full citizenship in all the world and would peace."

The New York edition of the "Pittsburgh Courier" of June 14, 1952, page nineteen, column six carried an article captioned "Robeson Will Sing in Street if Necessary." This article stated that the American House in St. Paul concelled a contract for the singer's appearance there after veteran and civic organizations protested on the basis of ROBESON's alleged political activities."

Confidential Informant of known reliability, furnished a throw-away issued by a "Provisional Committee to





Restore Paul Robeson's Passpert," located at 2206 7 Avenue, New York City. This throw-away listed MAGGARET MCCADEM, secretary of the above captioned committee and quoted her as follows: "For more than one year rable Robeson has been imprisoned within the geographical boundries of the United States. In violation of our constitutional guarantees of freedom and speech and the right to secure and own property, the State Department has cancelled PAUL ROBESON's right to travel across to fill the numerous requests to hear him sing and speak.

"Recently, representatives of various peace organizations, cultural, Civil Rights, and labor groups, as well as individuals came to give and form a Provisional Committee to Restore PAUL ROBESON's Passport."

This committee believes that the denial of Mr. ROBESON'S right to travel abroad is a threat to the freedom and security of all Americans in all walks of life. Consequently we are in the process of organizing a national campaign around the case of PAUL ROBESON's passport."

This throw-away was in the form of a letter appealing for financial support of the above captioned committee.

Confidential Informant of anoma reliability, oh as acvised that MARGAREN MCCADEN was a member of the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association sometime in 1745 or 1746.

The "Daily Worker" of August 7, 1752, page one, column one, cerried an article captioned "Paul Robeson Says; Fight Now-Don't Wait For No." This article quoted mobblook as follows: "whoever is elected President, Negroes want an FEFC, voting rights and an end to white supremacist terror NOW. There is no reason, if we have the strength and vision to press now for these (civil rights) goals unitedly, why we should have to wait until after the elections to get them."

It is further quoted as ROBESON saying, "None of the candidates for the highest offices in this land, take a forthright position on civil rights and back it up with action except the nominees of the Progressive Party, VINCENTA CALLINAN, for president,

"and that great and courages woman, Mrs. CHARLOTTA BASS, for Vice-President."

ROBESON further stated according to the article:
"The two old party leaders, the statement charged, have chosen en alliance with the Dixiecrat South and said to begroes and the nation: Your rights be damned. We are interested in war and conquest, not peace and equality."

The "New York Times" of August 8, 1952, carried an article captioned "Curb on Robeson Stands," this article stated that the suit by PAUL ROBESON, singer, to have the State Department revalidate his passport was ordered thrown out of court today, August 7, 1952.

The article further stated that the United States Court of A peals sent the issue back to the District Court with instructions that it be dismissed, since, it held, nothing concrete remained of the case.

The article went on to say that the court had reasonathat, since the passport expired January 5, 1951, and no application for renewal was shown to have been made, there was nothing left at issue. The article further stated that the singer's complaint, filed December 19, 1950, said the invalidation of his passport prevented him from making a concert and speaking tour abroad and thus deprived him of a property right.

The article concluded by stating that when the passport was cancelled in August 1950, a State Department spokesman said that the department felt that Mr. RODASON'S actions were not always in the interest of the United States.

The "Daily Worker" of October 15, 1952, page six, column three carried an article captioned "Robeson". This article stated that PAUL ROBESON, a leader of the Progressive Party and the Councillon African Affairs, had made a statement





in regard to the ROSENDERG case as follows: "The refusal of the Supreme Court to review the case of ETHLL and JULIUS ROSENBERG is the latest evidence of the callous disregard for human life and elementary justice which is the citter fruit of the current war hysteria."

The article further quoted ROBESON as saying, But in the United States, a young couple is condemned to the electric chair on the basis of flimsy evidence, in the atmosphere charged with pro-war and anti-Semitic bias, and the Supreme Court succumos to the mania of the moment and fails to discharge its responsibility to extend due process."

He was further quoted as saying, "The preservation of popular liberties in this country depends upon the insistence of the American people that the court reverse its decision and grent the ROSENDERG's a hearing."

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that a broadcast eminating from Peiping, China, concerning the Asian Peace Conference which adjourned October 12, 1952, stated that one of the major purposes of the conference was the establishment of an organization known as the Asian Peace Liaison Committee, to be headed by SUN YAT*SEN. This broadcast listed various phases of the afore mentioned committee and stated that P.UL ROBESO. would be the United States Representative of the Peace Liaison Committee.

An article from the "Shanghai News" for October 4, 1952 contained a statement of PAUL ROBESON as follows: "With profound shame and indignation, I join with you and with human men and women everywhere in demanding that the government of the United States stop immediately the unspeakable crime of bacteriological warfare and conform without further excuse to the international convention to outlaw such barbaric weapons.

"To overthrow the long-embattled Republic of Viet-Nam, the United States Government, violating the democratic traditions of the American people, is furnishing its French Imperialist lackeys with money and materials of war, not sparing the most recent devices of mass murder."

This article containing the statement of ROBESON was addressed to the Asian Peace Conference and his statement generally

dealt with the efforts of the American Peace Crussue to obtain a cease fire and total truce in Korea.

Confidential Informant of know reliability, advised that PAUL ROBESON was in attendance at the second annual convention of the National Negro Labor Council at Cleveland, Onic.
November 21-23, 1952 and that during that convention ROBESON stated that he got a great kick out of stated that he got a great kick out of watching the police and government "watch dogs" watching the various people who got out of taxis and otherwise going to the concert, and he said it made him feel very good that "we had them on the run."

The Informant stated that in his opinion the entire Council is still run from New York City and the most influential persons in the operation of the National Negro Labor Council were BILL PATTERSON and PAUL ROBESON.

has advised the National Negro Labor Council is a Communist dominated organization which does not deviate from the Communist Party line.

advised FAUL ROMESO, spoke at Otisfield Hall, Otisfield, Street, Rowbury, Massachusetts on the night of April 4, 1952. The Istormant reported HORESON as saying, "There is to be an uprising in South Africa, April 6, 1952 by my people fighting for their rights."

Confidential Informant of known reliability advised that the Council of Greek Americans, 357 West 25 Street. New York City, spondored a rally on April 7, 1952 at the Hotel Capitol, 51 Street and 9 Avenue, New York City, to protest the death sentence of eight Greek Communist spies rendered on March 1, 1952, by an Athens Court-Martial. The Informant advised that PAUL ROBLLOW sans and spoke at this rally and charged that the twelve Communists sentenced last year were framed.

The Informent stated that ROEESON preised United States and Greek Communist Parties and stated that the United States rulers are driving the world into fascism. The further stated that ROEESON praised the North Koreaus, Russians and Chinese.

advised that the Council of Greek Americans is a new Greek Communist Organization.

confidential Informant of known reliability advised that a respicion was attended by the subject at the home of JAMES SATATE, 2006 Main Street, Hartford, Connecticut, after the concert given by the subject at the waver High School on Saturday Evening, November 15, 1952. He further advised that ROBESON spent the night at the TATE home.

stated that

colored woman whose identity is unknown to the Informant, suggested to ROBESON, that there are other ways to help the Negro people besides Communism. ROBESON replied, "My dear girl, my best friends are Communists, I am a Communist and proudto be one, one of my best friends, BEN DAVIS is a Communist and he is in jail right now." According to the Informant, shortly thereafter a male negro, whose identity was also unknown to the Informant stated that he admired ROBESON for his artistic ability, but differed with him in everything he stands for. At this point, according to ROBESON replied, "Here's one Negro boy who if he gets a bullet through his chest tomorrow will die happy because I put this government on the spot when I made that speech in Paris that shook all the world."

helping the negro people rather than through Communism. According to the informant, the subject replied "My dear CONFIDENTIAL girl, my best friends are Communists. Iam a Communist and proud to be one. One of my best friends, BEN DAVIS, is a Communist and he is in jail right now". Shortly thereafter a male negro whose identity was also unknown to the informant stated that he admired the subject for his artistic ability but differed with him in everything he stood for. At this point the subject replied "Here's one negro boy who if he gets a bullet through his chest tomorrow will die happy because I put this Government on the spot when I made that speech in Paris that shook the world". The informant also reported that the subject stated "We Progressives have been too soft, we must toughen up and come out fighting".

Confidential Informant advised that was known to the informant as a paid Communist Party functionary in the State of Connecticut. It may be noted that BENJAMIN DAVIS is publicly known as a Communist Party functionary.

mentioned that 50 men were to come with the subject from New York to Hartford to give him protection. The informant advised that it appeared evident from remarks made by that SIDNEY TAYLOR was directing the setup of security for the subject's concert.

advised that the PAUL ROBESON concert was held on 11-15-52 at Hartford, Connecticut which concert was organized under the direction of SIDNEY TAYLOR. The informant advised that proceeds of the concert were to go to the Communist Party and the Peoples Party of Connecticut which were co-sponsors of the group.



Confidential Informant advised that and stated at a meeting on which was held at that the subject was due in Hartford, Connecticut in the near future. They did not advise the reason for the subject's visit.

The 9-18-49 issue of the "Bridgeport Herald" a daily newspaper in Bridgeport, Connecticut, reflected that the subject formed a National Non-Partisam Committee which was to defend the rights of the twelve Communist leaders. According to the neswpaper article the stated aim of the committee was to stimulate public interest in the proposition that the constitutional rights of the twelve Communist defendants had been and were being violated.

The 11-8-52 issue of the "Hartford Times", a daily newspaper in Hartford, Connecticut, reflected that the subject attended — a party on 11-7-52 which was held at the Russian Embassy in Washington, D.C. According to the newspaper article, the affair was given to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the October 1917 Socialist Revolution in Russia.

The 11-17-52 issue of the "Hartford Times" contained an article which reflected an interview with the subject after his concert which was held on the evening of 11-15-52 at Yeaver High School Hartford, Connecticut. In an emotional outburst following his concert ROBESON told the reporters it was "Nobody's damn business whether or not he was a Communist". The subject also called the newsmen names because they asked "Don't you think you are hurting your cause by allying yourself with Communism?" ROBESCN stamped his foot in anger and stated "You ineffective so-called liberals think you know how to get things done, but you accomplish nothing. Communism is not the reason for the attacks on me. The reason is this: the white ruling class of America doesn't like negroes who stand up and talk back and fight for their rights". The subject asked the reporters if they wanted him to bend and bow and shuffle along and be a nice, kindly colored man and say please when he asked for better treatment for his people. He thundered "Well, it doesn't work", as he drove his fist into his hand, "that's what I do to people who get in my way".

A. Civil Rights Congress

The Civil Rights Congress has been cited by the U.S. Attorney General as an organization coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant furnished a pamphlet entitled "Lynching -- Northern Style", which was distributed by the "Committee to Free the Trenton Six". This pamphlet reflected that the subject was chairman of the Civil Rights Congress as of 4-6-49. It may be noted that the Trenton Six were six colored men who were arrested for murder in Trenton, New Jersey. Their case was vigorously defended by the Civil Rights Congress as a case of violation of Civil Rights.

B. National Negro Labor Council ----

Confidential Informant advised that the National Negro Labor Council is dominated by the Communist Party.

Confidential Informant advised that the Hartford, Connecticut Branch of the National Negro Labor Council held a meeting on at the Hartford, Connecticut. Plans were announced at this meeting to have Paul Roblech for an affair in Hartford which was to be held in either September or October 1952. The stated purpose of this proposed affair was to raise money for the National Negro Labor Council and for ROBLECH himself.

Confidential Informant advised that the subject was the main speaker on the evening of 11-21-52 at a meeting of the national convention of the National Negro Labor Council which was held in Cleveland, Ohio. According to the informant, the subject dwelt on discrimination and stated that the way it looks at present with the terrible discrimination problem in South Africa, his son might be compelled to fight against the negroes in South Africa.

Confidential Informant and advised that a meeting of the Hartford Negro Labor Council was held on at Hartford, Connecticut. Discussions were held concerning

means of stimulating interest in the Hartford National Regretation Council and it was decided to abandon a party scheduled for 3-28-53 which was to be held at the home of JAMES TATE, Hartford, Connecticut and have a discussion period with PAUL ROBESON. Flans were also made to carry out the PAUL ROBESON concert which was planned in the near future for Hartford.

advised that the Hartford Negro Labor Council was a local branch of the National Negro Labor Council.

advised that JAMES TATE had advised that the Hartford negro Labor Council was to have the subject in Hartford, Connecticut for a discussion on 4-26-53 which was to be held at 29 Westland Street, Hartford, Connecticut.

C. Peoples Party of Connecticut

advised the Peoples Party of Connecticut, nationally known as the Frogressive Party, is infiltrated and dominated by the Communist Party in Connecticut.

Confidential Informant , of unknown reliability, advised that a social event was held on 6-12-48 in Manchester, Connecticut, which was scheduled to be a social event. The informant stated that upon arrival at this social, however, it was apparent that the purpose of the affair was to raise money for the Progressive Citizens of America. The informant stated that the subject was a featured guest at this social and addressed the gathering although he seemed to be guarded in his remarks. The informant stated that the subject stressed the need for obtaining signatures to place the Progressive Citizens of America candidates on the ballot.

The Progressive Citizens of America has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities Reports 1947, p. 369, and 1948, p. 354 as a "new and broader Communist front for the entire United States" formed in September 1946 at the direction of "Communist steering Committees" from the "Communist dominated National Citizens Political Action Committee" and the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions.

Confidential Informant of unknown reliability, advised that the subject attended a manchester, Connecticut Rally of the Peoples Party of Connecticut (date not given) which was held in a "well-to-do Jewish" home in Manchester, Connecticut. According to the informant, the subject was a main speaker and he told the rally, composed of negroes and whites, that the Peoples Party of Connecticut was fighting for the case of the negro. The informant stated that a collection was taken up for the Peoples Party of Connecticut after the subject's speech and large bills were received in the collection.

Confidential Informant of unknown reliability, actived that the subject attended a social gathering in Manchester, Connecticut, sometime around 9-26-52 which turned out to be a fund raising rally for Communism.

The 9-10-47 issue of the "Stamford Advocate" a daily newspaper published in Stamford, Connecticut, reflected that the subject would be the featured speaker at a Progressive Citizens of America rally which was to be sponsored in New Haven, Conn. on 10-8-47.

The 1-19-48 issue of the "New Haven Journal-Courier", a Gaily morning newspaper, reflected that the subject was elected Vice Chairman of the Progressive Citizens of America national convention on 1-18-48 which was held in Chicago, Illinois.

The II-16-52 issue of the "Hartford Courant", a daily newspaper published in Hartford, Connecticut, reflected that the subject gave a concert on II-15-52 at Weaver High School, Hartford, Connecticut.

This concert was sponsored by the Feorles Party of Connecticut and all profits went to the Peoples Party of Connecticut, according to JOHN ARGALIA, Executive Vice Chairman of the Peoples Party of Connecticut.

JOHN MARSALLA is publicly known as President of the American-Slav Congress.

The American-Slav Congress has been cited by the U.S. Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

D. Connecticut Feace Council

Confidential Informant advised that the Connecticut Peace Council is infiltrated and dominated by the Communist Party in the State of Connecticut.

Confidential Informant advised that a meeting of the Hartford Feace Council was action of at attended this meeting and related that at the office of the American Peace Crusade they were preparing motion pictures and tape recordings of FAUL RCDESON and other individuals to take to the World Peace Congress which was to be held in Vienna.

advised that the Hartford Peace Council is an affiliate of the Convectiont Peace Council. The informant also advised that was known to the informant as an active Communist Farty member.

The American Peace Crusade has been cited by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities statement issued on the March of Treason, 2-19-51 and House Report Number 378 on the Communist "peace offensive" 4-25-51, original date 4-1-51, page 51, as an organization which "the Communists established as a new instrument for their peace offensive in the United States and which was heralded by the Daily Worker with the usual bold headlines reserved for projects in line with Communist objectives".

Confidential Informant advised that the subject attended a National Committee Meeting of the American Peace Crusade on 3-14-53 which was held at Chicago, Illinois. According to the informant, the main purpose of the meeting was to discuss the future work of the American Peace Crusade. Methods were discussed by which the local and state peace groups could work with the national organization. The main discussion centered on methods whereby the local groups could be of assistance in obtaining funds for the American Peace Crusade.




