SUBJECT: PRAYER PILORIMAGE FOR FREEDOM, also known as March on Washington MAY 17, 1957

Information has been received that Mrs. Paul Robeson Hollowen has made reservations for a room at the Charles Hotel, 1338 R Street, Worthwest, Washington, D. C., which caters to both whites and Megroes, for May 15, to May 18, 1957. She probably will be accompanied by her husband, Paul Robeson, a loyal Communist Party (CP) sympathizer who is playing a prominent role in the CP's actions in connection with the march on Washington.

In connection with Robeson's attendance and the possible attendance of other CP leaders at this demonstration, consideration has been given to the use of technical equipment to provide coverage of their activities in Washington. However, inasmuch as we have received no definite information concerning who the other CP leaders are who may attend, have no information showing they will hold meetings after arrival or that there are any plans for violent activities, we do not plan to put on any technical coverage. If information is received that the CP has designated a hotel room or meeting place for the purpose of holding caucuses we will consider technical coverage on that location.

ACTION:

We will continue to follow this matter closely and if there are indications that the Bureau can benefit by instituting technical coverage on CP members in connection with the march on Washington we will recommend same.

Throughout the hearing, Robeson refused to answer all questions regarding communism and his activities on constitutional grounds.

Robeson reportedly attempted to justify his past conduct and explained that he merely wanted to go to England to fulfill some concert engagements. The State Department representative confidentially advised further that Robeson's conduct at the hearing would not improve his chances for obtaining a passport.

A transcript of the proceedings of the above-noted hearing will be furnished to you upon receipt by the Bureau.



CITIZENS COMMITTEE TO PRESERVE AMERICAN FREEDOMS

An informant advised on May 7, 1957 that the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms was organized in Los Angeles, California, in January, 1952, for the announced purpose of supporting a number of individuals from the medical and legal professions who had been subpoensed to appear before the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Since its establishment, the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms, in extending its scope, has worked for the abolition of all Congressional, State and local committees investigating subversive activities and in the latter part of 1954 became very active in opposition to State and Federal legislation directed at the Communist movement.

FRANK WILKINSON, The Executive Secretary of the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms, is described by the informant as the "brains and energy" behind the organization.

The Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms is not a membership organization. It is an Executive Board with a large mailing list which builds up support behind particular issues rather than behind an organizational program.

Another informant advised on September 17, 1952, that FRANK WILKINSON was a Communist Party member as of September, 1952.

An informant advised on May 22, 1956, that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, which was formerly known as the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and also referred to as the Los Angeles Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, adopted its present name (Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell) about August, 1954. The avowed purpose of this Committee is to have MCRTON SOBELL transferred from the Federal Prison on Alcatraz Island and to secure for him a new trial and eventually his complete release.

Both the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell Were, from their inception, dominated and controlled by the Los Angeles County Communist Party through the assignment of Communist Party (CP) members to work on the Committees and to direct the activities of the Committees.

In March, 1956, critical discussion by CP members was that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell should be reactivated and revitalized in a more aggressive way than it had been in the past and that its activities should be expanded in terms of according maximum mobilization of forces to insure attainment of its objectives.







Robeson currently resides at 16 Junel Terrace, New York City, and is self-employed as a concert singer. His public appearances in the last several years have been confined primarily to the United States in view of the denial of the United States Department of State to grant him a passport for travel abroad. It may be noted, however, that the United States Department of State recently removed the restrictions on any travel Robeson may contemplate to countries in the Western Hemisphere for which a passport is not generally required.

Robeson acted as chairman of the Council on African Affairs, an organization cited by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450, until tte dissolution in June, 1955. As of June, 1955, he was acting as chairman of the editorial board of "Freedom." It is noted that a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in 1950 that the editorial board of "Freedom" was composed of Communitat Party members and sympathizers. The source also advised that "Freedom" was intensed as a replacement for the Harlen edition of "The Norker," the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker," an east coast communist newspaper. (w)

The July 14, 1949, issue of the "New York Fost and Home News," a New York newspaper, contained an article entitled "Robeson Kante To Be a Stalin, Party Backs Him, Bouse Told." This article stated that a self-admitted former member of the Communist Forty National Committee had described Faul Roleson as a *member of the CF for many years who was desirous of becoming the black Stalin." The source states further that Robeson, whose Communist Party membership was kept secret from the rank-ant-file communists, had the encouragement of the Communist Party in this regard. It may be noted that another source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in 1950 that Robeson was a concealed member of the Communist Party from the 1930's to 1945.

In November, 1952, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that earlier in November, 1952, Robeson had stated, "My best friends are communists. I am a communist and proud to be one." (u)

Various cources, who have furnished reliable information in the past, advised during the period 1950 to 1957 that numerous public appearances of Paul Robeson during the same period were either spansored, guided ar influenced by the Communist Party. The motives of the Communist Party in this regard were to use Robeson's public appearances as a medium to promote progressive causes and to raise funds for the Communist Party. (u)

Various publications in the United States and other countries have, through the period 1949 to 1955, published numerous statements reportedly made by Robeson while in the United States and also while on tour in Europe in 1949. Robeson reportedly expressed openly his sympathies or admiration for the Soviet Union as well as the Communist Party, United States of America.

Robeson has also been reported by several sources, who have furnished reliable information in the past, and by various publications to have been active through the years as an officer, sponsor or member of numerous organizations which have been cited by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. Some of these organizations include the (American Peace Crusade, American Youth for Democracy, China Welfare Appeal, Incorporatel, Civil Rights Congress, National Negro Labor Council and mond National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims. In addition, Robeson has been reported to have been active as an officer, sponsor or member of numerous other Communist Party frost organizations including such organizations as the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee, Second World Peace Congress and National Council of American-Soviet Friendship. The December 19, 1952, issue of the "Paily Norker," contained an article entitled "Robeson hins Stalin Peace. Prize, Hailed as Leader of Negro Feople." The article stated in part that Robeson was one of seven individuals who had been awarded a Stalin Feace Prize on the occasion of Premier Joseph Stalin's seventy-third birthday.

NOTE: This memorandum is classified "Confidential" inasmuch as it contains information furnished by active informants, the disclosure of which, would seriously weaken coverage of Communist Party activities. In addition, the disclosure of the information furnished by these informants would be prejudicial to the defense interests of the United States.

Passport file contained a letter dated 8/19/53 from the Passport Office to PAUL ROBESON, 155 West 136th Street, New York City, advising ROBESON that in reference to his application for a passport made on 7/29/53 the letter was being written and that in view of information received by the Department of State the issuance of a passport to the subject was precluded by the provisions of Section 51.135 of the Passport Regulations because it had been alleged that he was a communist and had manifested a continued and prolonged adherence to the Communist Party line on a variety of issues. He was told that he could appeal his case and submit as part of the appeal an oath or affirmation, of the nature outlined in Section 51.142 of the Passport Regulations.

On July 23, 1954, the subject advised the Passport Office by letter that he had applied for a passport on July 2, no year given. On 7/27/54 the Passport Office advised subject that his application for a passport executed on 7/2/54 had been received and the letter again advised him along the same line as the letter dated 8/19/53 from the Passport Office to the subject.

On 11/11/54 subject advised the Passport Office that he was going to seek judicial relief unless a passport was given to him.

On 12/14/54 the Passport Office advised subject that since he had not furnished an affidavit as outlined in the Passport Regulations under Section 51.142, he could still ask for a hearing in regards to his request for a passport.

The file reflected that on 1/13/55 the subject instituted a Civil Action #169-55 in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against the Secretary of State JOHN FOSTER DULLES in an attempt to obtain permission for the subject to travel in countries of the Western Hemisphere for which no passport was required for American citizens. His attorneys were JAMES T. WRIGHT, 2003 12th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., and LEONARD BY BOUDIN, 25 Broad Street, New York City.

The file reflected that the case in the U.S. District Court was dismissed at a later date and that a summary judgment for the Secretary of State was granted. The file indicated that on 6/7/56 the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia affirmed the judgment of the District Court. On 11/5/56 the Supreme Court of the United States denied the subject a certiorari.

The passport file reflected a letter dated 5/10/55 from LEONARD B. BOUDIN to the Department of State advising that subject had received numerous requests from all parts of the world to appear in concerts, in films, and in plays and had recently received an invitation to appear in a film version of "Othello" to be produced in the Soviet Union. He asked the Passport Office to advise whether a passport could be issued to the subject in order that be could appear in the film.

By letter dated 5/25/55 the Passport Office advised BOUDIN that if the subject desired the Passport Office to consider the matter of issuing an American passport to the subject, the subject should withdraw the court action and submit an affidavit of the nature outlined in Section 51.142 of the Passport Regulations. He was furthermore advised that subject could request a hearing as provided in the Passport Regulations.

On 10/3/55 BOUDIN by letter requested the Passport Office to issue a passport to the subject in order that the subject could accept an invitation to attend in China, "The Commemoration of Our One Hundredth Anniversary"of the publication of WALT WHITMAN's "Leaves of Grass."

By letter dated 10/11/55 the Passport Office advised BOUDIN that no American citizens were being granted passport facilities to travel to communist China.

On 1/22/57 BOUDIN requested the Passport Office to give a hearing to the subject regarding the subject's application for a passport.

On 2/14/57 the Passport Office requested BOUDIN to advise the subject to submit a new passport application on the application forms in use at that time.

The passport files reflected that a hearing was held for the subject on 5/29/57 at the Passport Office and that a copy of the transcript of the hearing was referred to the Bureau through liaison on 8/16/57.

The passport file reflected that on 8/9/57 a letter was sent to the subject advising him that he could travel in the Western Hemisphere countries for which a passport was not generally required and that any travel to Canada was a matter solely within the province of that country.

In June, 1957, furnished information which reflected PAUL ROBESON had departed for Los Angeles, California on June 18, 1957 and would return to New York near the end of July, 1957.

On July 28, 1957, furnished information which reflected PAUL ROBESON had been in excellent voice during a series of concerts in San Francisco, California during that month.

II. AFFILIATIONS WITH THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT

A. Evidence of Membership in, or Sympathy with, CP
Front Organizations





 Subjects Activities in, and Subversive Ramifications of, his Passport Case

The "New York World Telegram and Sun" newspaper, issue of April 5, 1957, contained an article entitled, "ROBESON'S Passport Czechmated Again?". This article stated that PAUL ROBESON, holder of a \$25,000.00 Stalin Peace Prize, had made another attempt at obtaining a passport and apparently would be turned down by the United States Department of State. It was pointed out that subject's application for passport had been refused on four previous occasions. This article further stated that subject had a case pending before the United States Tax Court, New York City, concerning the sum of \$9,500.00 in income tax the subject had not paid when he received the \$25,000.00 Stalin Peace Prize in 1953.

The "Daily Worker" issue of May 3, 1957, page 7, column 1, contained an article entitled, "British Actors Union Votes Support For PAUL ROBESON." This article noted that a demand to allow PAUL ROBESON to sing in Britain was passed at the annual meeting of Equity-Organization of British Actors in London on May 2, 1957.

FRANCES G. KNIGHT, Director, Passport Office, United States Department of State, by letter dated August 9, 1957, directed to the subject at 16 Jumel Terrace, New York City, advised him that at an informal hearing on May 29, 1957, the subject had refused to submit an affidavit under current passport regulations, refused to answer questions relating to Communist Party membership, refused to answer questions or to offer an explanation concerning participation in the affairs of Communist Party front organizations in the United States, refused to answer questions concerning close association with Communist functionaries in the United States and abroad and refused to answer questions or offer an explanation of his activities abroad in support of the Communist movement. Subject was notified by this letter that in view of his railure to comply with passport regulations, further consideration of his passport was being withheld until such time as he would be willing to comply with these regulations. The subject was further notified that the restraint on his travel in the western hemisphere in countries for which a passport is not generally required was lifted.







This advertisement noted that chairman for the evening would be ESLANDA ROBESON and the affair would be sponsored by the Committee of Women of the NCASF.

"The Worker" is the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker", an Eastcoast Communist newspaper.

on September 23, 1957, a Forum of the NCASF was held at Adelphi Hall, 74 Fifth Avenue, New York City, at which a report on a recent visit to the Soviet Union was presented. Advised that ESLANDA ROBESON acted as Chairwoman of the Forum and at the end of the meeting commented on her own travels in the Soviet Union in 1950.





. Teachers Union of Philadelphia (TUP)

January 4, 1957, the subject delivered a lecture before a meeting of the TUP held at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. According to the subject spoke of her work as a correspondent to the United Nations, then continued with the main topic of her lecture, namely, the role of Africa in current world affairs. The subject pointed out that Africa constitutes the last great land mass under the domination of the colonial powers and its struggling millions would, by sheer weight of numbers, inevitably disintegrate this domination. According to the subject compared the Soviet actions in Hungary to the British action in Kenya, and asked how could the Soviets be censored for their actions and not the British?

Reference is made to NY Airtel dated 11/5/57.

On 11/6/57. advised that on that date captioned subject was in contact with his son, PAUL ROBESON, Subject discussed his recent tour of California and commented on various plans for the future.

advised subject stated that the one important thing to him is that the ministers in the Bay area -San Francisco and Oakland - have a pattern of banding together and this includes minister's councils, Baptist Alliance and interdenominational groups. These people, ROBESON stated, are working to obtain an auditorium for him. He pointed out that during his recent tour he obtained an auditorium in Stockton, California. He also sang in a school and in Sacramento, California, he sang for a minister's union in a Baptist Church.

Subject stated everybody attended his Sacramento concert including the critics from the city's two newspapers. Following the program, these critics came to the stage, greeted ROBESON, and led him to believe they are now behind him in his efforts to obtain an auditorium in Sacramento.

Subject commented he was extremely well received in California and expected to return there near the end of November, 1957. ROBESON stated that GOODRICH (ph) had set things up in Omaha, Nebraska and he, the subject, will stop in Omaha on his way to California later this month. ROBESON stated he expects to keep busy in California where in Los Angeles he has been so well received by SWITCHMAN's (ph) Church and the American Committee For Protection of Foreign Born. His new burst of activity has given him a chance to "shift around both on the East and West Coast.
