

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



Relet requested analysis of subject's files to determine whether possible violation of passport sanction provisions of Internal Security Act of 1950 by either subject.

The Department has advised in previous correspondence relating to passport sanctions, that in order to establish a violation under Section 6(a) (1) or (2) of this act, "it would be essential for the Government to prove Communist Party membership during the approximate period of the particular act involved, that is, the act of making application for a passport or the renewal of a passport or the act of using or attempting to use the passport".
