

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

The Wednesday, July 21, 1976 issue of the "Daily World", on page 6, contained an article entitled "To the UN: Declare Paul Robeson birth date Day of International Peace and Friendship". The article, datelined "Toronto", reflected, in part, that the Paul Robeson Commemorative Committee (PRCC), recently formed in Toronto, has called upon the Secretary General of the United Nations, Kurt Waldheim, to place before the United Nations the proposal that the birthdate of Paul Robeson (April 9), be officially proclaimed as "the Paul Robeson day of International Peace and Friendship".

The "Daily World" is an east coast communist news-

The late city edition of "The New York Times", dated December 23, 1963, reported that Paul Robeson left the United States on July 10, 1958, after an eight-year legal fight and a Supreme Court ruling to obtain a passport.

According to the article, Paul Robeson once said he loved "the Soviet people more than any other nation because of their suffering and sacrifices for us, the Negro people, the progressive people, the people of the future in this world".

Most of the questions directed at Robeson upon his arrival in New York, New York on December 22, 1963, were answered by his wife who told reporters her husband still thinks Communism is "terrific".

The letter sent by the PRCC to Kurt Waldheim, Secretary General of the United Nations, also appears in the July 21, 1976 "Daily World" article.

At the end of the July 21, 1976 "Daily World" article appears a note entitled "To our readers:", written by "A.B.", not further identified, which note solicits support from "Daily World" readers for the PRCC's proposal to the United Nations. This note indicates the address of the PRCC to be 214 Beverly Street, Toronto, Ontario, Canada M 5T 123.

TORONTO—The Paul Robeson Commemorative Committee, recently formed in Toronto, has called upon the General Secretary of the United Nations, Kurt Waldheim, to place before the United Nations the proposal that the birthdate of Paul Robeson be officially proclaimed as "the Paul Robeson day of International Peace and Friendship."

Robeson's life and work was the subject of a concert tribute recently in Toronto, which drew wide recognition and acclaim. At the concert the packed audience heard messages of tribute. from the four corners of the globe, many of whom subscribed to the idea of setting aside April 9 as an international day.

The Committee, headed by Harvey Murphy, a retired trade unionist who led the fight in Canada to free Robeson from the U.S.-imposed han on his travel during the 1950's, has sent the following letter to Waldheim with copies to the States Members (U.N. delegations) as well as to all Non-Governmental Organizations at the United Nations. A special appeal will, be made to the Canadian Government to support and carry the proposal to the U.N. General Assembly.

Honorable Sir:

We are addressing a request to you for consideration of the proposal that the United Nations Organization preclaim the birthday of Paul Robeson, April 9, deceased in January this year, as the world day of peace and friendship among all accoler.

We respectfully suggest that it should be proclaimed efficially an April 9th, in perpetuity, as the PAUL ROBESON DAY OF INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND FRIENDSHIP

Our purpose in setting forth this suggestion is to provide for the peoples of all lands and countries or day in which all may celebrate their energy and commonality

as a means of strengthening the cause of peace to which the UNO is dedicated and to which Poul Robeson devoted his life.

Such an action would be in harmony with the universal aims and activities of this extraordinary man who was known and leved for his coaseless efforts in the cause of peace and friendship in the world, as well as for his creative genius as a concert singer and

His life and work were perhaps best symbolized when in the frent lines of Spoin in 1938, singing to the Loyalist troops and to the troops of the international Brigades, the guns were stilled an both sides of the fighting front.

His studies of the languages of many nations and people became a life-long effort to seek universal communication of the message of peace and friendship. It is true to say that his songs and his words rang like the boll of freedom around the world, to all continents and peoples.

Ne person can say that his unique abilities and gifts were used other than to heal and overcome obstacles and antogonisms among humankind. And in this noble work of love and brotherhood as he himself declared, "I will never retreat one thousandth part of one inch."

His courage and bravery, and in particular, his unrelenting struggle for the freedom and dignity of the colored and the oppressed peoples of all countries, has left a legacy which must not be fornetten.

He was a Black American, son of a slave who fought for and achieved his freedom. This heritage no doubt led Paul Robeson to the side of the working people, Black, white or brown, to struggle with them for the attainment of human dignity and freedom. Recently in Terente at a concert to honor Paul Robeson, greetings and tribute came from all parts of the world. The audience unanimously responded to the proposal of requesting the United Nations to proclaim his birthday as "THE PAUL ROBESON DAY OF INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND FRIENDSHIP."

In view of the universal acclaim of Paul Robeson, we are also sending copies of this letter to all States Members of the United Nations Organization and to all Non-Government Organizations. We do so in order that Paul Robeson's contribution to understanding and peace be forever kept and acclaimed by the human family.



Dear President Carter:

It was mentioned on a radio interview of Paul Robeson. Jr. that information and tapes of his father singing and speaking are being held by the F.B.I. and C.I.A. Why should this be so and what could be one to secure the release of this information?

He was one great human being, superior in intellect and accomplishment. What a rare instrument was his voice. There are so few like his that it is a shame we squelched it. Truly, he was an early black leader and paid a heavy price for his convictions. Can we not now take off the light and let his greatness rise?

His son says that he never suffered any bitterness or hatred about what happened to him because he was all about LOVE. And the veltet voice. What a shame his career was not allowed to flower so that we would have more of his music recorded.

Last year we entertained a man from Holland who was bent on finding some Robeson records when in New York City. I think he must have been more appreciated outside our country.

When I heard Paul Robeson, Jr. being interviewed on WEXR (the New York Times station in New York) on the eve of his father's birthday, I was pleased to hear of an effort to give Paul Robeson the place he deserves even posthumously.

C. 20535. In the letter you must request documents regarding the specific topic of interest to you.

Other material concerning Mr. Robeson is exempt from disclosure pursuant to provisions of the Freedom of Information and Privacy Acts. Since you also mentioned the Central Intelligence Agency in your inquiry, I am forwarding a copy of your letter and of this reply to that agency for any consideration it may give you.
