



SYNOPSIS:

Robeson is controversial Negro concert singer who has consistently supported communist and related front causes and has been outspoken in praise of Russia. He recently wrote and published book entitled "Here I Stand," which purports to explain his dedication to winning freedom for Negro, the meaning of fight for Negro freedom, and means of obtaining such freedom. In dealing with question he seeks to explain his political stand. He charges controversy concerning him originated with "Big White Folks," his persecutors and real "Un-Americans." He explains sentiment for Soviet Union and Afro-Asian nations stems from their support of colonial liberation movement and their views against racial discrimination. He denies any connection with "international conspiracy" (makes no denial of connection with Communist Party (CP)); admits association with nonconformists and radicals; and criticizes Government for refusing him passport. He denounces segregation and its advocates and proposes coordinated mass Negro action through effective leadership to fight for Negro freedom. He makes no reference to FBI and content of book provides no new intelligence data to Bureau.

BACKGROUND:

Robeson is noted Negro concert singer who has long been controversial figure due to his consistent support of communist and related front causes and his outspoken praise of Soviet Union. He was chairman of Council on African Affairs (cited by Attorney General) until its dissolution in 1955. State Department has refused Robeson passport since 1950 for failure to answer questions concerning CP membership; however, State Department has recently lifted ban on travel by Robeson to countries in Western Hemisphere where passport is not generally required. Robeson, his wife, and his son are current Security Index subjects of New York Office. His son, Paul, Jr., was recently elected to the New York State Communist Party Board. 2304-4466

Robeson authored book "Here I Stand" published February 3, 1958. He states he was assisted by noted Negro writer, Lloyd L. Erown, who is believed identical with Lloyd Louis From, 1250 current member of

Memorandum to Mr. Boardman Re: Paul Leroy. Robeson 100-12304

The book was published by Othello Associates (apparently affiliated with Othello Recording Company, a company controlled by Robeson in handling of his recordings), and available to date only in Jefferson Book Shop, New York City, which deals in communist and front group literature.

REVIEW AND ANALYSIS:

Robeson emphasizes his dedication to winning freedom of Negro and explains purpose of book to discuss meaning of fight for Negro freedom and means of securing such freedom. In so doing, he seeks to explain his current political viewpoint in an effort to set the record straight.

Robeson claims current controversy concerning him originated with "Big White Folks" who he describes as his persecutors and real "Un-Americans." He shows contempt for these people and in turn expresse concern for the Negro as well as the common people, i.e. working class, foreign born, nationality groups, Jewish people, middle class progressives, and people in arts and sciences.

Robeson emphasizes his basic views have not changed for years. He claims he voiced friendly sentiment for Soviet Union and Afro-Asian nations several years ago and has seen no reason to change his views in face of a cold war and "McCarthyism." He alleges his sentiment for Soviet Union and Afro-Asian nations is founded in their support of "colonial liberation movement" as well as their support of the Negro people throughout the world. He claims the Soviet Union in world affair has been an important factor in this regard and cites as an example how the Soviet Union blocked "Western Imperialists" from retaking the Suez Canal from Egypt. Robeson charges that his warm feeling for the Soviet Union has, according to Washington officials, made him a part of an "international conspiracy." He emphatically denies ever having been a part of an "international conspiracy" or knowing anyone who is. (At no time does Robeson deny present or past CP membership). claims his refusal to testify before legislative committees is based upon the unconstitutional nature of committee inquiries. He describes the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) as the "Un-American Committee."

Memorandum to Mr. Boardman Re: Paul Leroy Robeson 100-12304

With reference to his passport case, he charges that State Department's refusal to grant him a passport is arbitrary. He claims there is no evidence to support Government charges and alleges his passport refusal is based upon his concern for Negro rights. In general, he attempts to put across point that his support of Soviet Union and Afro-Asian policy concerning colonial liberation movement and racial equality has been misinterpreted as Un-American activity. He frequently criticizes the State Department and United States Government concerning both domestic and foreign policy in this regard. He continuously emphasizes the alleged lack of racial discrimination in European and Asian countries as contrasted to the United States.

At one point Robeson expresses his conviction in scientific socialism as an advancement to a higher stage of life and as being superior to "capitalistic imperialism." He does not elaborate further on this matter; however, he does comment at one point about the "new China" (Red China) in a favorable light and also emphasizes that the "communists of the world denounce racism."

Robeson admits he has never hesitated to associate with nonconformists and radicals, and in this regard points out his long association with Ben Davis, current national CP functionary. He points the mutual interest of himself and Davis in regard to the fight for Negro freedom. He goes on to describe the Smith Act convictions as unconstitutional and likewise denounces the Walter-McCarran Act.

The majority of Robeson's comments deal with his views concerning Negro inequality in the United States. He denounces segregation and its advocates. He proposes coordinated mass Negro action built around strong Negro leadership to cope with the current crisis. He suggests a central fund, concerted Negro support of already existent organizations such as National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, and the exertion of influence of the Negro in labor unions.

In concluding, Robeson compliments the Soviet Union on the launching of the Sputnik and describes it as a step toward world peace.

Memorandum to Mr. Boardman Re: Paul Leroy Robeson 100-12304

OLSERVATIONS:

Robeson's book appears to be directed to the Negro reader for whom it will undoubtedly have appeal. He attempts to analyze the world racial situation from the standpoint of the Negro and apparently attempts to incite the Negro into a form of concerted action for the purpose of fighting for Negro equality. It would appear, however, that Robeson's attempts to explain and justify his political views, as related to his discussion of the racial question, is obviously an attempt to influence public opinion in the United States and abroad to his favor for the purpose of influencing the State Department to issue him a passport. It is noteworthy that Robeson evades any specific reference to the CP, USA, and fails to provide any argument regarding his alleged support of CP, USA, and front group causes other than his previous association with the Council on African Affairs.





It is noted that the Jefferson Book Shop, mentioned above, deals in Communist and front group literature and is operated by MOSES WECHSLER (Bufile 100-399388). A telephonic survey of representative book stores in Manhattan on 2/4/58 reflected "Here I Stand" was not yet available for purchase with the exception of the Jefferson Book Shop. With regard to the actual printing of "Here 1 Stand, the second page of the book which bears copyright notice and publisher's name, also contains the printer's union symbol and shop number, 412. 100-12304 REC- 80 Popirectory of Union Label Printing Of Pic dated April 1957, issued by the Allied Printing Trades Council, Park Row, NYC, reflects that number 412 is listed to the New jun Press, Inc., 119 Fourth Avenue, NYC. 

It added that ROBESON, "known in the past decade for his sympathetic attitude toward communism," would be presented in Portland by the Focus Club of Reed College," which has no affiliation with the college or any other organization.

The OREGONIAN of 3/6/58, made a similar announcement, describing ROBESON as "one of the most famous Negro singers of this generation and a politically controversial figure in the last decade because of squabbles with the State Department over alleged Communist sympathies." According to the OREGONIAN, ROBESON "will present a vocal program of his own choosing under the sponsorship of the Focus Club,



On October 2, 1957, advised that subject was scheduled to give a concert on October 5, 1957, which would be handled by means of a telephone broadcast originating from Associated Recording, 723 7th Avenue, New York City.

advised this broadcast would be made in connection with the Steadforth Festival in Wales, Great Eritain. was unable to advise if the scheduled concert was being transmitted directly to Wales via telephone or being pre-recorded for later transmission.

In October, 1957, advised that the "Sunday Lispatch" newspaper, London, England, issue of October 6, 1957, contained an article entitled "ROBESON Sings to Miners". The article read in part, "Megro singer PAUL ROBESON talked and sang to 3,000 welch miners last night

over a 3,000 mile Transatlantic cable. Because of his left-wing politics the United States Department of State would not let ROBESON travel to Europe, so the miners, held a rally at Porthcawl, Glamorgan, phoned him at a studio in New York. He told them in a 15-minute broadcast: 'I have just won my right to go anywhere in the Americas so I know I shall soon see you in Wales.'

On November 6, 1957, advised that in November, 1957, PAUL ROBESON in discussing his recent concert tour in California, indicated that various individuals in San Francisco, and Oakland, California, were working to obtain an auditorium for him. He stated that during his recent tour he had sung in an auditorium in Stockton, California, and before a ministers union in Sacramento, California. Subject stated he was extremely well received in California, and he planned to return to the West Coast near the end of November, 1957. He further indicated that possibilities existed on the West Coast for him to engage in radio broadcasts.

On November 13, 1957, advised that during November, 1957, the subject expressed the opinion that he is at his best when singing in California and a possibility existed there that he can get someone in Oakland to make his recordings.

On December 29, 1957, advised that during December 1957, PAUL ROBESON indicated he would soon be making recordings on the West Coast in addition to his concert work in churches and other organizations.

In December 1957, advised that PAUL ROBESON was then in California doing concert work and was expected to return to New York near the middle of January 1958.

On January 22, 1958, advised that during January 1958, PAUL ROBESON indicated that he had finished some recording work for Vanguard Records and that in his opinion his voice was better in 1958, than it was twenty years ago.

On January 24, 1958, advised that during January, 1958, PAUL ROBESON had completed a new musical album for Vanguard Records New York City.

On January 31, 1958, furnished information which indicated that PAUL ROBESON was then in California and would return to New York on February 15, 1958.

The February 12, 1958, issue of "Variety" newspaper, page sixty-nine, contained an article entitled "One-Man Campaigner Cries 'Foul'; Fails to Halt PAUL ROBESON Concert". This article concerned a concert given by PAUL ROBESON at the Cook Auditorium Theater, San Franciso, California, during early February 1958. It noted that ROBESON sang to a near capacity crowd in the 2,000 seat theater resulting in an estimated gross receipts for the concert of \$5,600. The article pointed out that efforts to prevent the concert had failed and this was ROBESON's first concert in a city owned theater in Northern California in about ten years.

In January and February 1958, in addition to that set forth above furnished information which reflected that PAUL ROBESON was a self-employed concert singer currently engaged in giving concerts on the East and West Coasts, making recordings in New York, and planning a widerange of concert activities in the future. Further advised that PAUL ROBESON planned to be in Los Angeles, California, to continue his concert activities on February 28, 1958.

II AFFILIATION WITH THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT

A. Evidence of Membership in or Sympathies with Communist Party Front Organizations

"The Worker" issue of November 7, 1957, page four;, column two contained an article which noted that PAUL ROBESON would speak and sing at a Carnegie Hall meeting, New York City

of the National Council of American - Soviet Friendship (NCASF) to be held Sunday, November 10, 1957. The article pointed out that ROBESON was flying East from the West Coast to share in the traditional observance of the anniversary of the founding of the Soviet Union and the establishment of diplomatic relations between the United States and the USSR.

The NCASF has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

"The Worker" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

The "Daily Worker" issue of November 12, 1957, page one, column one, contained an article concerning a rally of the NCASF held November 10, 1957, at Carnegie Hall, New York City, at which the subject was a speaker. Concerning remarks of the subject, the article stated, "ROBESON recalled that visiting the Soviet Union in 1954 was 'as I often afterwards said, like standing on a new planet' where he felt no discrimination as to color existed. 'Now' he said, 'we begin to see it will be possible to stand on another planet' and survey the earth. Enemies of the Soviet Union, he declared, had better forget about pushing them back they'd better just decide to live in peace and friendship".

It is noted that the date 1954 in the above article is an obvious misprint as informants who attended the rally reported that ROBESON actually said 1934.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist daily newspaper which suspended publication in January, 1958.

On advised that PAUL ROBESON attended the NCASF raily on November 10, 1957, held in Carnegie Hall, New York City.


Records of the Clerk of Court, Criminal Division, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, reflected that on July 31, 1956, ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG was found guilty of violating the Smith Act of 1940. On September 17, 1956, Federal Judge ALEXANDER BICKS imposed a one year sentence on TRACHTENBERG as a result of this conviction.

Records of the United States Court of Appeals, Second Circuit, reflected that on September 17, 1956, a notice of appeal was filed by TRACHTENBERG. Following the entry of the notice of this appeal, Judge BICKS granted a defense motion to continue the defendants in United States vs. TRACHTENBERG, Et Al on their present bail.

The "Daily Worker" issue of February 13, 1957, identified JAMES R. JACKSON as one of the twenty members at large elected to the National Committee of the CP at the 16th National Convention of the CP, USA held in New York City February 9-12, 1957.



3. Other Miscellaneous Activities

In August 1957, advised that during that menth MANJAMIN J. DAVIS, JR., in conversation concerning one PAUL described FAUL as a great champion on the Jewish question. DAVIS stated that FAUL has a brilliant and big harmist mind and he criticized the Jewish leaders of the CP who were saying nothing about the struggle for PAUL's pessport. DAVIS further commented that JOHN GATES had recently stated that FAUL REDSOFhas more effect than the whole American Ch.



The "Daily Worker" of February 13, 1957, page two, column four, reflected that during the 16th National Convention of the CP, USA, held in February 1957, JOHN GATES was one of the twenty individuals elected to the National Committee of the CP.

The "Daily Worker: issue of September 23, 1957, page five, column two, contained an article entitled "ROBESON Urges Gov't Defend Constitution Against Racists" by-lined "PAUL ROBESON". This articles concerned the situation in Little Rock, Arkansas, which was termed as a desperate attack on Constitutional Government. The article calls for immediate action to halt racist attacks on Negros sverywhere including some United Nations action on the race situation in South Africa.

On made available a letter dated September 12, 1957, bearing the title "WILLIAM L, PATTERSON, Public Relations Counsellor, 23 East 26th Street, New York 10, New York. This letter, addressed to "Dear friend" included a statement from PAUL ROBESON on the significance of the events in Arkansas. This statement also dated September 12, 1957, consisted of a copy of ROBESON's article which appeared in the September 23 issue of the "Daily Worker".

On PAUL ROBESON attended a memorial meeting for MARION BACHRACH heldeat the Sheraton - McAlpin Hotel, New York City. Advised that PAUL ROBESON spoke briefly of BACHRACH's life and sang two songs, the latter of which contained the words sleep well beloved comrade, the fight, our fight goes on until we win", and was apparently written for the occasion.

On also furnished substantially the same information regarding the memorial meeting on set forth above.

MARION FACHRACH was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury, Southern Listrict of New York, on June 20, 1951 on charges of conspiring to violate the Smith Act. of 1940. On July 2, 1952, during the trial in the United States Listrict Court, Southern District of New York, of the United States vs. ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, et al, in which EACHRACH was a co-defendant on the above charge, BACHRACH was severed from the trial due to illness. On June 18, 1956, BACHRACH received a directed verdict of acquital. HARION EACHRACH is now deceased.

III MISCELLAMEOUS

Informents cognizant of some CP activity in the New York area were contacted relative to the subject during February 1953, and could furnish no recent or additional information concerning him.

were checked by SA and reflect no information relative to the subject not already known to this Eureau.

The "New York Times" newspaper issue of February 25, 1958, contained an article entitled "Soviet Plans Film on ROERSON". This article stated that the Soviet Union planned to make a movie about PAUL ROEDSON and also Dr.HEVLETT TORNSON, the "Red Dean of Canterbury". The article quoted MOSCOW radio as broadcasting that a central documentary film studio had started productions of rovies concerning "outstanding peace partisans", and the movie of ROELSON would be released later in 1958.

The "Kew York Times" newspaper issue of January 15, 1958, page 59, contained an article entitled "RUELSUE Accepts British Bid". This article reported that RUELSUE had accepted a bid to sing on British T.V. In connection with it he would renew his plea to the United States Department of State for a passport previously denied him.



It was further noted that the bic accepted by R.FESCH was for April 9, 1958, at the London Palladium, London, England. The "Trinidad Chronicle" newspaper published in Trinidad, British West Indies, on September 22, 1957, contained an article entitled "ROFESCH is Coming". This article stated that FAUL ROFESCH will be definitely coming to the West Indies during the Winter of 1957-1958. The article quoted ROFESCH as stating "they won't allow me to travel to Lurope but it will come. I have just been freed to travel in the Western Hemisphere. That means I can go to the West Indies this winter. I have a big following there".

The "New York Times" nowspaper, late city edition, issue of February 4, 1958, page 32 contained an article entitled "ROBESON Appeals Passport Denial". This article stated that PAUL ROBESON had asked the United States Department of State for a "limited passport" to make a summer 1950 appearance at the Shakespeare Hemorial Theater in England. The article continued that in a letter dated Lecember 10, 1957, ROBESON's attorney LECEARD B. BOULTN wrote Mrs. FRAICHS MEIGHT, Director of the Passport Office, United States Lepartment of State, that ROBESON would not travel to any country other tran England if the passport was granted.

Ey letter dated January 17, 1958, Mrs. MIGHT informed FOULIN that the State Department deemed it necessary that RUEESON answer questions with respect to CP membership before consideration could be given to his request.

The article pointed out that subsequently Hr. BOUDIN wrote to LOY W. HENDLESON, Deputy Under Secretary of State asked that the State Department reconsider its position.







"I think it's important for people to know that I'm getting these invitations from abroad, because it shows how necessary a passport is for me', he stated.

"In his Portland visit, he emphasized, "I'm here as an artist. I'm here, I believ e, with a richer collection than ever before. I can say, modestly, that I'm one of the finer artists in America, and the reviews I recently got in California were fabulous."

"For the past year, he said, he had been appearing in concerts, indicating that he intended to resume the major concert role he had established before the storm of controversy which arose over his proclaimed sympathies in many instances with Russia.

"The fact that he now, apparently, has much more to say about music than about politics does not mean that he has changed his opinions. 'My political position is precisely the same now as it has always been,' he declared.

"One story which sparked the Robeson controversy was an alleged statement from him that American negroes would never fight against Russia, but he said Sunday he had been quoted 'out of context.'



Nehr and Indian government support of Robeson, has indicated in above article, is the subject of much concern by the State Department. According to State Department cables, All India Paul Robeson Birthday Committee has been formed. This Committee is publicizing Robeson as a great singer; actor and humanist, who has identified himself completely with the poor, the humble and the downtrodden to the point where he is looked upon as the symbol of human aspiration and of the dignity of man. Apparently Prime Minister Nehru has stated that Robeson was a great friend of India during intellationce. Although Nehru is reportedly pushing the gelebration, it was indicated that the original inspiration came from England where it may be noted that numerous Paul Robeson Committees have been established for some State Department is currently attempting to impress Indian officials with the factual background of Robeson and his anti-American and pro-Soviet sympathies. State is attempting to impress upon Indian officials that the celebration in question would undoubtedly be interpreted as communist inspired, anti-American and as evidence that India was going communist. This letter classified "Confidential" inasmuch as the information contained herein concerning the comments of Benjamin Davis was obtained through a confidential source close to Davis. The disclosure of the source could seriously hamper Bureau coverage of Communist Party activities at the national level which would in turn be prejudicial to the national defense.

She has continued to associate with known CP members and has continued to support numerous ecomunist front organizations in the United States. In 1954, she was chairman of the Executive Board of the Council on African Affairs and a n member of the Board of Directors of the Metional Council of American-Soviet Priendship. She reportedly continued her activities in the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship in a leadership especity through at least late 1957. It may be noted that the Council, on African Affairs and the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship have been designated by the Attorney Coneral pursuant to Executive Order 10450. 

In addition, Eslanda Robeson has frequently lectured before sommunist front organizations and has written numerous articles for sommunist publications. These lectures and erticles tend to evidence her procommunist and pro-Soviet sympathies. She has also been reported to have been in contact with Soviet and satellite establishments and efficials in the United States on frequent occasions up to the present time.

It would be appreciated if you would make available any pertinent information ecaing to your attention concerning the activities of Eslands Robeson in the event she visits British possessions in the West Indies.

NOTE ON YELLOW:

Subject in Security Index. Her activities are set out above. Extensive information concerning Paul Robeson. subject's husband, has previously been furnished to State, Central Intelligence Agency, San Juan, and Legal Attache, havena, advised of subject's proposed travel by separate communication. New York Office has likewise been advised to remain alert for information which might indicate that subject may violate her United Nations credentials through possible conduct of CP affairs and contacts in the West Indies, it being noted that State Department would be interested in such information as a means of denying subject further accreditation to the United Nations. This memorandum classified "Confidential" inasmuch as it contains information concerning the CP and communist front organizations furnished in many instances by currently active Bureau informants. The disclosure of this information could possibly jeopardize these informants and seriously hamper future coverage of CP and related activities. This could be injurious to national defense

On April 1, 1958, an informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that on approximately April 15, 1958, the United Nations is sponsoring reduced rate fares for travel to Trinidad in the British West Indies, in connection with a celebration to be held there commerating the freedom of the British West Indies. This informant expressed the belief that subject is traveling to Trinidad in her capacity as a correspondent for the publication "New World Review" for which she is editorial consultant on Negro and colonial questions and correspondent to the United Nations.

The New World Review has been cited as an organization specializing in pro Soviet propagands. It was formerly known as Soviet Russia Today (Internal Security Sub Committee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans S. DOC 117, April 23, 1956, page 76.)





With respect to the individuals and organizations mentioned in this memorandum, the following characterizations are listed. The characterization for the Chicago Council of American Soviet Friendship is attached.

PAUL ROBESON

The July 15, 1949 edition of the "Washington Times Herald", Washington, D. C. newspaper, carried an article entitled, "Probers Told Robeson is Veteran Red". This article reflects that MANNING JOHNSON, an ex-CP leader, told a Committee of Congress on July 14, 1949 that PAUL ROBESON has been a member of the CP for many years. JOHNSON said he has met ROBESON frequently at CP headquarters in New York where ROBESON held secret meetings with EARL BROWDER, WILLIAM Z. FOSTER, JACK STACHEL, and J. PETERS, all leading Communists.

CHICAGO COUNCIL OF AMERICAN-SOVIET FRIENDSHIP (CCASF)

A source advised on May 7, 1957, that the CCASF since its inception in Chicago in the 1940's has never failed to propagandize for Russia and the Russian way of life. This source further advised that the CCASF has been using speakers who were known to the source as members of the Communist Party since the first meetings in the 1940's. The source advised that the program of the CCASF has always included speakers, movies, and pamphlets praising every aspect of Russia including its foreign policy and has been extremely critical of the United States domestic and foreign policies.
