
UNITED STATES GOVE lemorandum Mr. Belmont C. A. Evans TRAVEL OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SUBJECT: ROBERT F. KENNEDY With reference to the Attorney General's trip to Roanoke, Virginia, this afternoon, he has now advised he plans on meeting with the United States Attorney and his assistants and desires I accompany him to assist in these meetings. Travel to and from Roanoke is to be by a private plane which is being made available by the Norfolk and Western Railroad, leaving at 3:30 p.m. With reference to the previous conversations between Ed Guthman of the Attorney General's Office and Ed Kemper of Crime Records, the Attorney General states he would appreciate the Bureau handling his transpostation in Roanoke so this can be carried out in the usual effective manner of the FBI and without the fanfare which the United States Attorney and the Bar Association would like. : This whole fiasco is occasioned by number one, the Attorney General not making up his mind and secondly, by the antics of Negro lawyer who has been trying to get a special seat on the podium when the Attorney General speaks. The meeting of the Bar Association is stand, not segregated. ACTION TO BE TAKEN: If the Director approves, I will accompany the Attorney General to Roanoke and will make the necessary arrangements with the Richmond Office to supply the Attorney General the transportation he desires. The Attorney General understands that our principal office is at Richmond and that we have Resident Agents at Roanoke. EVANS - Evans - Stanley ATTORNEY GENERAL'S VISIT TO ROANOKE, VIRGINIA MAY 1, 1962 This memorandum is submitted to supplement the teletype sent by the Richmond Division concerning the Attorney General's visit to Roanoke yesterday. 'The U. S. Attorney from the Eastern District of Virginia at Richmond, Claude Vern Spratley, came to Roanoke and the Attorney General met with him and U. S. Attorney Ton Mason for the Western District of Virginia. The three Assistant U. S. Attorneys for the Western District were also present. Nothing of special interest occurred during these conferences since both U. S. Attorney's offices are small, their dockets are current and there are no particular problems. レールニ Peter Rackes of NBC news traveled to Roanoke with the Attorney General as did the local reporters who regularly cover the Justice Department. Hackes taped a 30-minute television program made up of an interview with the Attorney General. During this program, Hackes said he had heard recurring rumors that the Director of the FBI was going to resign and asked the Attorney General to comment on this. In response to this question, Kennedy said that he had had great admiration and respect for the Director prior to the time he had become Attorney General and that this admiration and respect had increased during the past year; that he had no intention of leaving his position as Attorney General in the foreseeable future but that he hoped and expected Mr. Hoover to be Director of the FBI long after he left his position as Attorney General. He also was asked whether he had any intention of resigning in order to manage the President's campaign for re-election in 1964 and the Attorney General stated that he did not plan to manage this campaign. = Mohr - DeLoack - Rosen 19 62 MAY 11 1962

As you know, at the last minute this morning the Attorney General's Office called and advised that the Attorney General's son, Joseph P. Kennedy, III, and his class would like a special tour of the FBI when they arrived at 10:30 a.m. this morning. The group arrived at approximately 10:15 a.m. and consisted of two Sisters of Notre Dame, five parents and 52 children. They were taken in two groups by Special Agents and given a special tour with particular emphasis on the firearms demonstration in the indoor range. Pursuant to arrangements made by the Attorney General's Office, the group was then taken to the Attorney General's Office and Mr. Kennedy greeted them briefly and autographed the various pieces of material on crime and communism the students had obtained along the FBI tour route. Agents did not personally meet the Attorney General but assisted in handling the group upon their leaving the Attorney General's Office and obtaining their cars which were located in the courtyard. The nuns, adults and children expressed their appreciation for courtesies extended to them on the tour. William Geoghegan, Assistant Deputy Attorney General, called and advised the Attorney General has now scheduled his second reception for the children of Congressmen for May 26, 1962. Those to be included in this group of children are between the ages of five and nine years. Because of their youth, it is not desired that these children be given a tour of the FBI as was done during the first reception when the children were older. Geoghegan said it would be appreciated, however, if we could arrange for a shooting exhibition in the firearms range in the basement. Geoghegan said this would be the first item on the program and would be about 10:00 or 10:30 in the morning.

The Attorney General is sending out about 100 invitations. Predicated on the previous experience, he expects about 80% to accept.

Following the shooting demonstration, the children will be taken to the Attorney General's office where he is to talk with them. He is then going to have a magician to perform and this will be followed by a puppet show. He intends to serve them ice cream and cake and have the affair end shortly after noon.

### ACTION TO BE TAKEN

Since we cooperated with the Attorney General in connection with his last reception for Congressional children, we will, if the Director approves, have the necessary arrangements made to comply with the request in this instance.

BACKGROUND: Reference is made to Mr. Evans memorandum of May 11, 1962, which indicates that the Attorney General has now scheduled his second reception for the children of Congressmen on the marning of Saturday, May 26, 1962. Since the children included in this group are between the ages of five and nine years, Mr. Geoghegan in the Department pointed out that they/not be given a tour of the FBI as was done during the first reception on January 27, 1962. He said it would be appreciated, however, if we could arrange for a suitable demonstration in the firearms range in the basement. We were advised that the Attorney General is sending out about 100 invitations and is expecting about 80% acceptance. The Director approved the recommendation that we make the necessary arrangements to comply with this request. ARRANGEMENTS: The handling of this group is being coordinated under the supervision of SA Chief of our Tour Unit. BA of the Training and Inspection Division will handle the requested firearms demonstration and our plans call for the assignment of sufficient personnel to provide for the security of the building while these youngsters are in our charge. A nurse will be on duty in the Health Service in case of illness and in view of the fact that the visit will be confined to the range, it will not be necessary for us to make arrangements for additional elevator operators. This matter is being followed very closely and you will be kept promptly advised of any later developments.

UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT *Temorandum* : Mr. DeLoach DATE: May 26, 1962 RECEPTION BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR CHILDREN OF CONGRESSMEN AND KEY ADMINISTRATION OFFICIALS **SATURDAY, MAY 26, 1962, 10 AM** Pursuant to the Director's approval, we met the Attorney General's young guests in the Great Hall, right on schedule, shortly prior to 10 a.m. this morning. Following brief remarks of welcome by Mr. Geoghegan of the Department, we escorted the youngsters directly to our Indoor Range. There, Special Agent of our Quantico staff put on a very special firearms demonstration or half of the entire group at a time, while Special Agents of the Crime Records Division explained the various exhibits located in the lobby of our Indoor Range to the remainder. Upon completion of our program, shortly prior to 11 a.m., we presented each child in the group with a packet of reprint material, which included a used silhouette target and empty shell casings. The group was then escorted to the Attorney General's reception room promptly at 11 a.m., at which time our participation in the program terminated. REACTION: The special firearms demonstration was particularly well received, and all the youngsters in the group expressed their delight, with cries of excitement and spontaneous bursts of applause, in tribute to SA superb marksmanship. Mr. Geoghegan and other Department officials were profuse in their praise for the manner in which the Attorney General's young guests were received and handled. The President's and the Attorney General's sister, Eunice, the wife of Sargent Shriver of the Peace Corps, participated in the tour and exhibited a keen interest in our activities. TRAVEL OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

The Attorney General advised me today he is making preliminary plans at this time to visit with United States Attorneys, Federal Judges, and the federal investigative agencies during the period from June 25 to June 30. He asked that I accompany him on this trip.

As his plans are now drawn, the Attorney General plans to visit Detroit on June 25, Chicago and Denver on June 26, Los Angeles on June 27, Oklahoma City and Dallas on June 28, Nashville on June 29 and Roanoke, Virginia, on June 30.

In addition to visiting with the officials noted above, the Attorney General has speaking commitments before the students of the University of Colorado and with a meeting of wardens of federal penitentiaries, both in Boulder, Colorado, on June 26. He is also to speak before the Fourth Circuit Judicial Conference in Roanoke on Saturday, June 30, 1962.

EXAMINATION OF MEDICINES FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Reference is made to Mr. C. A. Evans' note dated 6/4/62, concerning the above-entitled matter. The following specimens were received from Mr. Evans:

- #1 One 30 ml. vial containing small amount of yellow liquid
- #2 One 10 ml. vial containing 10 ml. of yellow liquid
- #3 One 10 ml. vial containing 10 ml. of yellow liquid
- #4 One 10 ml. vial containing 10 ml. of yellow liquid

It was requested that the Laboratory determine whether the samples were similar and whether narcotics or barbiturates were present.

It is pointed out that it is not possible by analytical means alone to determine the specific detailed composition of these samples from the limited quantities furnished; however, general similarity and tests for certain specific components, such as narcotics and barbiturates were possible. Confirming the oral information furnished to Mr. Evans, the following results were obtained from such examination as could be made of this material:

- (a) Each of the specimens is composed of mixtures of vegetable oil solutions and water solutions;
- (b) Specimen #1 is different from specimens #2, 3 and 4;
- (c) Specimens #2, 3, and 4 are similar to each other;
- (d) None of the specimens contain any barbiturates or narcotics, such as Methadon, Demarol, or opium alkaloids (morphine or codeine);
- (e) Vials, such as we have in this instance, usually contain printed matter on the glass. Specimen #3 contains black particles that suggest at least 6 lines of printing were on the outside and that this printing has been mostly removed before receipt in the Laboratory.

Mr. Malone Andrew Ochmann, Executive Mr. Rosen Assistant to the Attorney General, Mr. Sullivan stopped by the office. He left with me Mr. Tavel a small bottle, about one-quarter full Mr. Trotter of an orange colored liquid. The bottle Tele. Room Miss Holmes is the type ordinarily used to hold Miss Gandy . medicines which are administered by means of an injection. The bottle has a label on it with the printed name

'Dr. Mar Jacobson, 155 East 71 Street, New York - City. RE 7-0977-0978. Shake Well. Keep in Dark - Away From Light." The label also has a place for the date, name and dosage. None of these are filled in. The label has printed in orange colored ink what appears to be 'SOL" or "SDL."

Oehmann said the Attorney General asked if chemists in the FBI Laboratory could tell him what this medicine is. Oehmann said the Attorney General was anxious about this. He added that the Attorney General had someone with him and Oehmann didn't have the opportunity of asking the Attorney General anything about the bottle of medicine. Oehmann speculates this may have been medicine for the Attorney General's father. He said, however, he is only guessing and reached this conclusion because of the AG's obvious intense personal interests.

ACTION BEING TAKEN:

The bottle of medicine is being delivered to the Laboratory and a memorandum will be submitted as to the results of our examination.

The SAC at Oklahoma City was telephonically contacted with reference to his airtel of June 18, 1962. He was informed that Hureau: instructions concerning the visit of the Attorney General were contained in an airtel of June 6, 1962, and the only thing that the SAC was to do was to keep the Bureau advised of any information which he received concerning the proposed visit of the Attorney General.

He was further informed that on the basis of his airtel it appeared that he was personally taking over arrangements and acting as an "errand boy" for the United States Attorney (USA). SAC Teague said that this was certainly not true but he could understand from the language that he used in his airtel where this impression might be created. Teague said that the USA had asked him for some guidance in setting up a dinner for the Attorney General. The USA did not have available any facilities in the downtown area which would be suitable for this. Teague said the only thing he did was to tell the USA that he, Teague, was a member of the Beacon Club (a private dining club) and he told the United States Attorney that he should feel free to use his membership there if the USA wanted to use the facilities of the club. Teague emphasized that arrangements for the hotel room were strictly being handled by the USA and he did not mean to imply that the SAC was involved in any way.

The SAC said he was told by the USA that in a telephone conversation the USA had been informed by the Department that the Attorney General would undoubtedly ask the FBI to meet him at the airport. The SAC said what he told the USA was that if this was so, he certainly wanted to cooperate.

As a matter of fact, while the Attorney General has had tentative travel plans he is constantly changing his mind. This is true here as the Attorney General first said he was going to Detroit, then he said he wasn't going to and he has now reverted back to including Detroit in the trip/ Today. I received the attached schedule from the Attorney General. He has indicated this is final, although it is noted this is only Wednesday and the trip does not begin until Monday morning. 77-51387-

The above program was monitored by SA form of the Crime Records Division from 4:00 to 4:30 p.m. on 6-17-62. This was a local television program and the only person appearing on it as guest was the Attorney General. The moderator of the program asked the Attorney General a series of generally innocuous questions concerning his actions in the present Administration. The following points of interest were brought up.

Mr. Kennedy was questioned as to whether he believed the President had exercised too much power in his dealings with the steel industry, and he replied that the President is certainly not "anti-business," that the vigorous efforts he had taken to stop the raise in steel prices were done in public interest as he believed steel price raise would be inflationary. He pointed out that the Administration had assumed the steel industry would not raise prices after the President had exerted pressure to obtain a noninflationary labor contract. The President's strong action against the steel industry was occasioned by the fact that steel prices were raised, regardless of the fact that a noninflationary contract was obtained. Mr. Kennedy pointed out that a Gran Jury hearing is still in progress to determine if antitrust violations were present in connection with the steel price raise.

In regard to the Billie Sol Estes case, Mr. Kennedy stated that 75 FBI Agents are still working on this case. He pointed out that this case does not compare with the Teapot Dome scandal of the 1920's since it was ascertained that cabinet members and other high officials in that Administration had been corrupt. He said the Kennedy Administration will take responsibility for those Government employees involved in the Billie Sol Estes case, and he noted that a number have been discharged from their Government positions. He stated in his opinion the criterion in this case is not that corruption has occurred in the Kennedy Administration, but that the Administration has taken strong action to uncover all facets of the matter. He said his Department will vigorously prosecute violations of the law discovered in this case and that Congressional committees will have access to FBI reports in order that they may conduct necessary inquiries.

Mr. Kennedy stated he believed the most interportant problems facing his Department deal with civil rights, organized crime and juvenile delinquency. Heli said he has done a good job in these matters, posticularly noting that a number of


positive steps have been taken in the civil rights field. He mentioned that there are many more Negro attorneys employed in the Department of Justice than when he entered office and that the President has placed Negroes in several important Government positions. He said that bus terminals and other facilities have been integrated in the South since he came into office and that whereas in the Eisenhower Administration there were only a few voting cases being prosecuted, he now has over 100 cases in the courts.







It appears that David Schine and his father, J. Meyer Schine, will be staying at the Ambassador Hotel sometime later this summer. Their plans are not definitely known to date.

TRAVEL OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL June 25 - 30, 1962

This memorandum is submitted to supplement the daily teletypes transmitted by the various field offices covering the locations visited by the AG last week.

The trip was primarily concerned with meetings with US Attorneys, Federal Judges, and the heads of Federal investigative agencies. In addition, the AG had speaking commitments in Colorado and at Roanoke, Virginia.

Including the US Attorneys who were attending the Fourth Judicial Conference at Roanoke, I had the opportunity of talking with a total of 27 USAs, scores of Assistant USAs and numerous Federal Judges. Uniformly these officials were all most commendatory of the Bureau's work and were apparently well acquainted with the FBI SAC in their home territory.

Of particular interest was the conference held on the evening of 6/25/62 at Chicago. It seems as though the USA there has learned something from previous conferences with the AG, in that he now has a tendency to talk in a more positive tone and to cry less about his difficulties. It is still obvious, however, that he has no real control over his office and there is dissension between Assistant USAs in Chicago. After leaving this conference the AG said that this one was somewhat better than previous conferences, although the USA's office in Chicago was still his #1 problem in this field.

The AG was extremely present at the results of the conference in Los Angeles. SAC Simon was most forceful in his presentation and he stressed the accomplishments which have been secured; the fact that he noted the effect of the Federal Grand Jury which has been assisting in the problem of organized crime; the pressures effected in this way.

The AG said he was most lapressed with the work done by the FBI in Los Angeles and he characterized the over-all situation with regard to the organized crime program in that city as being the best in the United States.

While in Los Angeles the AG conferred with Jerry Wald about the production of the motion picture predicated on the AG's pook. There seems to be some question in the AG's mind as to whether this picture should be produced until after prosecutions in which James Hoffs is involved are completed.



The meeting held in Oklahoma City was attended by the USA there, as well as USAs from the other two judicial districts in Oklahoma, and the two districts in Arkansas. Actually, the USA in Oklahoma City is not a forceful individual; his presentation of the work in the area was most inadequate when compared with the detailed presentation by SAC Teague. None of the other investigative agencies had anything material to contribute, and the AG's understanding of crime conditions in that area was predicated solely on the FBI presentation.

The meeting in Nashville, Tennessee on Friday, 6/29, was also attended by the USAs from the five surrounding judicial districts (two in Tennessee, two in Kentucky, and one in northern Mississippi) The big problem in this area is, of course, rather extensive gambling activities, and the corruption of several major law enforcement organizations. The AG cut this meeting short in order to spend some time in the late afternoon with the publisher and editor of the Tennesseean (it is noted that John Siegenthaler, formerly the AG's Administrative Assistant, is now the editor of this paper). These discussions related to the whole spectrum of national affairs, with particular comment on the Foreign Trade Bill which had just passed the House of Representatives. They also touched upon the activities of mutual acquaintances. There was nothing that related to the FBI.

#### Mr. Belmont

The AG's speech concluded the Fourth Judicial Conference at Roanoke on Saturday, 6/30. His talk concerned the work of the Department of Justice and the need for a rule of law to uphold the position of the U.S. as a nation where justice is done. In private conversations with many of the judges in attendance at this conference it was obvious that the Jim Bennett philosophy as to handling Federal law violators is continually being pushed. Several judges mentioned the speech given the night before by Senator Roman L. Hruska, who favored the indeterminate sentence procedure.

#### ACTION TO BE TAKEN:

While Assistant Director DeLoach has done some very effective work in countering this soft treatment approach to criminals in his appearances at two or three of the judicial conferences, it would nevertheless seem that we are going to have to continue to get our views across to counter the Bennett philosophy. Accordingly, it is believed we should accept every invitation possible to appear before the judicial conferences for this purpose.





Mr. Belmont 7/14/62 DATE: THUNDERBIRD HOTEL LAS VEGAS, NEVADA The Attorney General advised on Saturday morning that he was going to Las Vegas on Monday with General Maxwell/Taylor to view an atomic detonation. He stated that General Taylor through the Army had made reservations for them to stay at the Thunderbird Hotel in Las Vegas. The Attorney General wanted to know the reputation of this hotel. I told him that from memory this establishment is not one of the more notorious spots, but the gamblers, of course, played a prominent role in practically all of the Las Vegas hotels. I told the Attorney General that a memorandum would be prepared for him concerning this hotel which we would get over to him Monday morning. He said this was fine since he wasn't leaving for Las Vegas until late Monday afternoon. Evans ATTORNEY GENERAL'S VISIT TO NEVADA SUBJECT: With reference to the Attorney General's visit with General Taylor to Nevada, at approximately 8:15 p.m. on 7/16/62 the Andrews Air Force Base telephonically advised our Washington Field Office that the plane on which the Attorney General was traveling was returning to Andrews Air Force Base. According to the Command Post at Andrews, the Attorney General's plane was scheduled to land at Andrews at approximately 9:50 p.m. No reason was known why the plane was returning to Washington. However, at about 9:40 p.m. the Command Post at Andrews advised that Base operations at Andrews had 'goofed" and the Attorney General and General Taylor were scheduled to larrive in Las Vegas around 10:10 p. m., E.S.T. as planned. SAC Elson of the Las Vegas Office subsequently advised that the Attorney General had arrived in Las Vegas at approximately 11:25 p.m., E.S.T. Elson spoke with the Attorney General for a very short time pursuant to his request. The Attorney General is staying at the Thunderbird Hotel and the military authorities appear to be taking care of the accomodations for the Attorney General and General Taylor while in Nevada.
