

During his speech lange stated that the purposes of the communist International were aimed at its inception at the establishment of a world revolution but that this was changed by Stalin for the profession of the Soviet State against foreign aggression by raising Bussia first rank military power and having it collaborate with the Democratic governments or any other governments which were anti-Fascist and have soviet.
