Rocky's Family Flees Camp-or-Die Threat

(Special to THE NEWS)

May 15.—Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano, his wife, Barbara, and their 17-month-old daughter fled into hiding near here after an anonymous letter threatened that they would be killed if Marciano does not throw his June 15 fight against Earl Charles, it was revealed today.

The letter mailed to the family was turned over to police.

The family fled to a hiding camp at Grossinger's. It was opened by the fighter's father, who notified Rocky and then turned the family over to police.

The family fled in May.

On June 7, 1954 AL WEILL, Manager of Heavyweight Champion ROCKY MARCIANO, turned over to the New York office a letter postmarked June 3, 1954 at Bayonne, New Jersey, which was addressed to Mr. ROCCO MARCHEGIANO, Training Camp, Grossinger, New York.

It was noted that the reverse side of the envelop contained the notation "we mail this in Bayonne, New Jersey". The letter, which is hand-printed, is being set out as follows:

"Look Rocky, the threat still goes. If Philadelphia don't do the job, we will and with pleasure. You may think this is a joke but it's not. We want and your daughter. She better not be to the fights and you win. So dump the bout with Ezzard Charles or lose your ugly fat family. Remember we will be at the fight along with Newark boys with our zip guns."

The letter contained in two places a drawing of a skull and crossbones.

Also contained in the envelop was a clipping apparently taken from the New York "Daily News" of May 15, 1954 which pertained to previous threats received by MARCIANO. This clipping contained the hand-printed notation "Big Deal - You Whop!" This letter has been forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory for comparison with other letters forwarded in this case and for examination as to water marks and for processing for latent fingerprints.

By Air-Tel dated May 26, 1954 the Chicago office advised that the Illinois State Athletic Commission had no handprinting specimens of [REDACTED]. Specimens were obtained, however, from the [REDACTED] where [REDACTED] was previously employed. The specimens submitted to the laboratory by the Chicago office included applications for employment, disability benefit membership and group hospitalization form, which were filled out by [REDACTED] partially in handprinting.

Additional investigation conducted by the Chicago office failed to develop any additional pertinent samples.

In connection with the specimens submitted by the Chicago office on [REDACTED] the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory reported by Air-Tel dated May 28, 1954 that no conclusion could be reached as to whether [REDACTED] prepared the questioned documents because of the illustrated nature of the handprinting on the known specimens.

Regarding the specimens submitted by the St. Louis office on [REDACTED] the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory reported by report dated June 4, 1954 that no conclusion was reached as to whether [REDACTED] prepared any of the questioned documents. The laboratory reported, however, that differences in the handprinting characteristics were noted and that additional known specimens of [REDACTED] were not being requested.

In an attempt to obtain handprinting specimens on AL WEILL and [REDACTED] at New York City the following investigation was conducted:

SE [REDACTED] ascertained that the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, New York City, contained no operator's license or vehicle registration made out by either WEILL or [REDACTED].

SE [REDACTED] checked the Selective Service records at New York City and ascertained that these records contained a registration card for WEILL [REDACTED]. Each of these cards contain the written signatures of the two individuals, however, the remainder of the card was filled out by a clerk of the draft board. The following pertinent information appeared on each card.

[REDACTED] of the New York State Athletic Commission, advised that the Commission maintained a file on all boxers and managers who operated in the State of New York. He stated that each file contained a fingerprint card and an application for license. He advised that each application is signed by the person applying, and that usually the application is filled out by the applicant. He advised, however, that the application is sometimes filled out by a manager or an assistant manager acting for the applicant. He advised that sometimes the application may be filled out at the manager's office so that the Commission employees do not know who filled out the application. He made available the files on WEILL, [REDACTED]. Regarding these files, [REDACTED] advised he could not release any particular application or fingerprint card in the file, but he gave permission to the writer to photograph any part desired.

Accordingly, the following handprinting specimens were photographed and were forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory for comparison with the questioned documents:

According to [REDACTED] the letter could have been dropped into one of six letter boxes located on the Chester Pike between 5:00 p.m. May 10th and 6:00 a.m. May 11, 1954, in view of the 9:00 a.m. time shown on the postmark.

It should be noted that Sharon Hill adjoins Folcroft and Glen Olden, who also have letter boxes on the Chester Pike, and the letters addressed to the victim, as previously reported, could have been dropped into the boxes covered by the above post offices while driving between Philadelphia and Chester, Pa.

At Darby, Pa.

[REDACTED] Darby Township Police Department, advised that the majority of negroes living in Delaware County send their mail through the post offices involved in this case. [REDACTED] who is well informed on the activities of the Negro element along the Chester Pike, advised that there has been little betting on the CHARLES-MARCIANO fight and from his experience with the gamblers was of the opinion that the betting would be done in New York just before the fight. [REDACTED] suggested that the writer contact a local [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] along the Chester Pike.

At Fernwood, Pa.

[REDACTED] was interviewed and [REDACTED] advised that he [REDACTED] was questioned as to any logical suspects in the Chester Pike area who might be responsible for the sending of the letters in this case. He advised that he could think of no one who would do anything like that and was of the opinion that the sending of the letters was a publicity stunt to increase the gate on the night of the fight.

Continued contact with [REDACTED] Pennsylvania State Police, and [REDACTED] failed to identify or point out a logical suspect.

At Lansdowne, Pa.

[REDACTED] Clerk, Local Selective Service Board #58, which covers the Chester Pike area, made available all the 4F files of that board. A review of these files failed to reveal any handprinting that was similar to that appearing on the letters in this case.

At Philadelphia, Pa.

[REDACTED] CID, Philadelphia, Police Department, advised that continued contacts with contacts in the gambling circles has failed to develop any information that might be of value to this investigation.

[REDACTED] Criminal Section, Post Office Inspectors, 30th and Market Streets, advised that his files on crank letter writers contain no similar handprinting to that on the letters in instant case.

Inasmuch as all logical leads have been covered by the Philadelphia Office, no further investigation will be conducted.
