advised that he had limited association with CARNAP during the latter's affiliation with this institution, but stated that the subject was an introvert who was not well known by any persons in the university circles.

who is well acquainted with the professors and personnel of the University of Chicago could advise of no other persons who could be contacted productively in regard to the loyalty and sympathies of CARNAP.

Assistant to advised that he had only cursory contact with the subject, describing him as a reticent individual who had little association with any persons whom he knew. He advised that the subject appeared to be completely wrapped up in his capacity as professor at the University and very rarely deviated from his study habits.

The article reflected that two hundred Americans from all parts of the United States filed a Brief Amicus Curia with the New York Supreme Court asking dismissal of the New York Insurance Superintendents Petition to liquidate the International Workers Order. Among those who signed the Brief was Professor RUDOLPH CARNAP, according to the informant.

The letter stated that none of these persons were members of the Progressive Party. One of the enclosed statements reflected that RUDOLPH CARNAP, 5642 Drexel Avenue, Chicago 37, Illinois, was one of the signers. The letter went on to state that Dr. RUDOLPH CARNAP was a distinguished American philospher and Professor of Philosophy at the University of Chicago.

who attended the Mid-Century Conference that some of the speeches made and most of all the items considered at the various conference seminars definitely followed the CP line. The informant also stated that at least 90 per cent of those in attendance enthusiastically supported the policies described at the various seminars.

"The Worker" on February 19, 1950, page 9, column 3, published an article entitled "Illinois Leaders Tell Truman Ban Bomb!". The article stated that "one hundred prominent Americans from 24 states sent an open letter to President TRUMAN urging him to immediately take steps to institute direct negotations between our country and the Soviet Union on the highest level the peoples of the world." The article stated that Professor RUDOLPH CARNAP was one of the signers.

The "Daily Worker" on August 29, 1950, page 3, columns 1 to 3 published an article entitled "Chicago University Professors Ask Peaceful Korean Settlement". The article reflected that 39

members of the University of Chicago faculty urged President TRUMAN to leave no avenue of possible peaceful settlement of the Korean conflict unexplored and that they supported the recommended peace proposals of Prime minister NEHRU of India. The article stated that Professor PUDOLPH CARNAP of the Department of Philosophy, of the University of Chicago, was among the signers.

"The Worker" on September 3, 1950, page 8, columns 1 to 4, published an article entitled "Call for Big Last Push in Peace Petition Drive". The article reflected that "rofessor RIDCLPH CAHNAP of the "niversity of Chicago was one of many signers of a letter which expressed alarm that "in a number of cities, citizens who assert their inalienable right to speak for peace are being assaulted, arrested and even impugned as disloyal to the American people and our form of Government".

On January 7, 1954, the Philadelphia Office furnished information concerning possible Communist infiltration at the University of Chicago which was received from Plant Protection, Department, Sun Oil Company, Philadelphia. Among a list of persons furnished by the above who were possibly engaged in such activity was listed the name RUDCLPH CARNAP, a faculty member at the University.

Hearings were held on June 12, 16, 18, and 23, 1953. Part Twelve, on page 837 among the names listed as sponsors of the "Cultural and Scientific Conference For World Peace" New York City, March 25-27, 1949, was, Rudolph Carnap.

Bureau file number 100-0-26639 disclosed that an open letter dated February 28, 1951, addressed to the then President Harry S. Truman calling for the recognitation for the "Peoples Republic of China." This letter was sent to the White House by the "University of Chicago, Graduate Committee for Peace," and furnished to the Bureau by the State Department via Bureau Liaison on May 9, 1951. Rudolph Carnap was listed as one of the signatories of this letter.

Bureau file number 100-7046-572 disclosed an open letter dated November 15, 1950, released by the "American Committee for the Protection of the Foreign Born," 23 West 26th Street, New York 10, New York. This letter protested the denial, by the Department of Justice, of bails to non-citizens who were pending deportation. This letter was obtained by the December 11, 1950, and furnished to the New York Office by that informant.
