Informant was asked if he is familiar with the name RUDOLPH NUREYEV and whether he could furnish any information concerning this individual. It is noted that NUREYEV is a Soviet who was formerly associated with the Kirov Ballet, Leningrad, prior to his defection to the West, at Paris, France, on 6/6/63.

Informant immediately recognized the name of NUREYEV as that of a Soviet defector. He also remembered that NUREYEV was a ballet dancer. He said that somewhere he heard NUREYEV had written a book but informant said he has never seen this book and has not read it. He said that, to his knowledge, no one in the Soviet colony in NY has ever spoken of NUREYEV in his presence. Informant said he could furnish no information relating to NUREYEV's defection, nor does he have any information reflecting that NUREYEV has, in any way, been connected with espionage activity.

I'd also credit him enthusiastically for using a wide, fresh, musical vocabulary of dance steps and patterns throughout the evening, although one or two ideas (like the crouching men in the formal dance at the beginning of the last scene) didn't come off nearly as well as others (the pas de deux aroung a pyramid of girls in the forest vision scene was great).

Meanwhile, I must lament the quasi pornographic costume of Nureyev's en trancer boots well above the knees, jacker revealing, just a touch of bony, sculptural buttocks under white tights.

Veronica Tennant, a girl short in statur but high in talent, was the evening's Priscess Autora, making special news with he handling of slow, suspended balletic challengés Frank Augustyn's Bluebird was clean, strong, exhilarating, but the next man in line, Winthrop Corey, seriously acked grandeur. Nureyev admits to having less training and to starting later than most dancers. But, without modesty, he will admit that he has something special that "nature gave me."

"I had a talent, a gift. was talented, I knew I would be a dancer from the beginning."

It is terrible to be a success," he acknowledges, "I mean that. Because once you become a success you have to maintain your excellence. You don't compete with anybody else any more. You compete with yourself. It is exhausting. You are tired all the time because the hardest thing is maintenance.

"And there are always reople coming up behind ou. People who are good and who want to be as good as you. So you must be as good as you were."

Nureyev knew, too, that what he wanted would be hard. "Ball are hard life. But od one, too."

Nureyev seems shocked at

a distinction between art and entertainment. He does not consider what he is or his personality or his mass popularity as anything like "show biz."



And he gets up from the table and stalks triumphantly out of the restaurant, as though he is taking bows for a magnificent performance.




