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Good morning to you:

While I am aware that you and those associated with you in the Bureau of Investigations do not seek publicity, rather the opposite - yet we noted what to us appeared to be honest praise of Senator McCarthy in your interview while on the West Coast. It is evident that your conclusion is correct and that McCarthy "is not going to be pushed around."

It is alright for Mrs. Roosevelt to say that investigations should be carried on by the F.B.I. - and we in a sense agree with her but when the reports are given no attention or small attention by the "higher ups", there is nothing for the representatives of the people to do but to bring the question out into the open.

Along this line former President Truman writes me today that "some very much garbled information has been broadcast." It is not in mind, to attempt to stir up the animals too much, but I think the American people have been fed up on too much "cover up."


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

#### WEIGHT SAVING TRUCK

A new cab-over-engine heavy-duty truck known as the "Spacemaker" is being manufactured by Freightliner Corporation.

A pancake engine installed under the frame and behind the cab makes it

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possible to use a 24-foot body instead of the 22-foot bodies used on most cab-over-engine models.

The new truck tows a 28-foot trailer, thus providing a total of 52 feet of loading space clthough the combination is only 60 feet overall.

Space saving equipment which permits the transportation of larger pay loads is of increasing importance to Ohio motor carriers because of the enactment of the axle-weight law.

# INTERSTATE COMMERCE COMMISSION NEW ORDER

### EX PARTE NO. MC - 40

# "QUALIFICATIONS AND MAXIMUM HOURS OF SERVICE OF EMPLOYEES OF HOTOR CARRIERS AND SAFETY OF OPERATION AND EQUIPMENT"

The Interstate Commerce Commission on August 5, 1953, anended certain provisions upon petitions of certain trucking associations, as follows:

"It is ordered, That sections 193.25, 193.42, and 193.77 be, and they are hereby, amended as follows:

1. \$193.25 (e) (4) - Delete subparagraph (4) and substitute the following:

(4) The stop lamp or lamps and directional signals on the rear of any motor vehicle shall be red or amber;

2. \$193.42 (c) - Delete paragraph (c) and substitute the following:

(c) Trucks and truck tractors having three or more axles need not have brakes on the front wheels, except when such vehicles are equipped with at least two steerable axles the wheels of one such axle need not be equipped with brakes.

3. \$193.77 - Following the word "Requirements" in the opening statement, change the colon to a comma and add:

except that with respect to wood charcoal heaters these requirements shall be effective on September 1, 1953:

4. \$193.77 (b) (5) - Delete subparagraph (5) and substitute the following:

(5) <u>Solid fuel heaters except wood charcoal</u>. Any stove or other heater employing solid fuel except wood charcoal. 5. \$193.77 (c) (1) - Add the following sentence to the end of subparagraph (1):

Wood charcoal heaters shall be enclosed within a metal barrell, drum, or similar protective enclosure which enclosure shall be provided with a securely fastened cover.

6. \$193.77 (c) (3) - Add the following sentence to the end of subparagraph (3):

Wood charcoal heaters shall be secured within the enclosure required by subparagraph (c) (1) of this section and the enclosure shall be securely fastened to the motor vehicle.

7. \$193.77 (c) (9) - Delete the <u>provise</u> which ends the first sentence after the heading of subparagraph (9) and substitute the following in lieu thereof:

<u>Provided, however</u>, That this requirement shall not apply to heaters used solely to heat the cargo space of motor vehicles where such motor vehicles or heaters are equipped with means specifically designed and maintained so that the carbon monoxide concentration will never exceed 0.2 percent in the cargo space.

8. 5193.77 (c) (13) - Delete subparagraph (13) and substitute the following:

> (13) "<u>Tell-Tale" indicators</u>. Heaters subject to subparagraph (c) (14) of this section and not provided with automatic controls shall be provided with "tell-tale" means to indicate to the driver that the heater is properly functioning. This requirement shall not apply to heaters used solely for the cargo space in semi-trailers or full trailers.

9. 5193.77 (c) (14) - Delete the last sentence of subparagraph (14) and substitute the following:

> This requirement shall not apply to wood charcoal heaters or to heaters used solely to heat the contents of cargo tank motor vehicles, but wood charcoal heaters must be provided with a controlled method of regulating the flow of combustion air.

10. \$193.77 (c) (15) - In the first sentence, delete "Every combustion-type heater the date of manufacture of which is subsequent to December 31, 1952," and in

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lieu thereof substitute the following:

Every combustion-type heater, except wood charcoal heaters, the date of manufacture of which is subsequent to December 31, 1952 and every wood charcoal heater, the date of manufacture of which is subsequent to September 1, 1953,

It is further ordered, That except to the extent relief is being granted by the amendments set forth above, that the above-described petitions be, and they are hereby, denied;

And it is further ordered, That this order shall be effective on the date hereof, and shall continue in effect until further order of the Commission.

Ray Tucker hits the nail right on the head in his column today when he says that J. Edgar Hoover's praise of Sen. Joe McCarthy as "earnest, honest, sincere" is helping the American people to readjust their sights about what some have pleased to call McCarthyism.

The director of the FBI is a national hero. More than that, he is one of the smartest political psychologists at the Capital. He would not have survived for so long in such a sensitive post if it were not for his uncanny talent for scenting favorable and unfavorable winds of official and public opinion, and behaving accordingly.

He always has approved McCarthy's activities, as so much of his magazine writing indicates, Mr. Tucker has told us that several years before the Bentley and Chambers revelations about Communists in government, Hoover's agents told Tucker that they had "the goods" on the principal figures of the various conspiracies for many years. But every report forwarded to the several attorney generals by the FBI director was pigeonholed. Naturally, he must have resented this as an individual and as a good detective. It has been boiling within him and now he can come out in the open with his feelings.

When J. Edgar Hoover issues a good opinion of McCarthy, the people may take notice. How many there are who would give much for a report of "earnest, honest, sincere," from the FBI chief!


Correspondent, in his communication, accuses Senator Joseph R. McCarthy of being a dangerous subversive. He quotes editorials, columnists and Government officials to guigeort this charge. His reply has been deliberately phrased to be noncommittal in view of the controversial issue involved.

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I hereby report, as in my opinion one of the most dangerous subversives in this country, Senator Joseph R. McCarthy.

It is well known that the Communist technique is to create in non-Communist countries fear, suspicion and national hatreds. Moderator Dan Smoot two years ago broadcast over "Facts Forum", as a warning to America, the following words he identified as having been uttered by Lenin, "We will win the Western World for Communism without shedding a drop of a single Russian soldier's blood. How? ... We will create fear, suspicion. We will work inside by creating national hatreds, religious antagonisms. We will pit father against son, wife against husband. We will inaugurate campaigns to hate Jews and hate Catholics and hate Negroes ... We will frighten them. We will create political chicanery. We will confuse international diplomacy. We will do these things."

Joseph C. Harsch in the March 6, 1954 edition of The Christian Science Monitor pointed out that the "Kremlin Reaps Spoils of McCarthy-Army Tiff." He added that "The Kremlin this week was getting all the benefits ... An incidental bonus was the erosion of American public confidence in the loyalty of its armed forces."

The Christian Science Monitor, in its March 2 edition, pointed out that our unchecked senator is a matter of grave concern to the foreign diplomats interested in NATO. They remind us that the Atlantic Alliance is founded on a central core of defense of common principles, of personal freedom and justice, and that the Allies of the United States are gravely concerned if those principles are challenged with apparent impunity in our country. One diplomat is quoted as stating that this procedure "undermines the foundations of American leadership in the free world."

Melvin E. Whiteleather, headed his column of March 7 "Can the U. S. be Trusted? That is What Our Friends Are Asking." He also states NATO was based on an assumption that the same basic democratic ideals operated on both sides of the Atlantic and that now foreign countries are concluding that their assumption was wrong. Elmer Davis in his book "But We Were Born Free" shows Mow Geven our freedom to think has been and is being assailed. He reports also the deliberate efforts made to intimidate his sponsors and keep him off the air. The same kind of story has been revealed repeatedly by Drew Pearson.

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Elmer Davis points out, regarding McCarthy, "One of his great assets is that his supporters have the true making of the fanatic - they are not interested in facts. The endless exposures of McCarthy's endless untruths do not affect them."

The Philadelphia Evening Bulletin in an editorial on March 2 referred to "Senator McCarthy's charges and methods, which are disrupting national unity and making effective administration of Federal affairs almost impossible. The Wisconsin Senator is more responsible than any other man in public life for spreading fear and suspicion among people who are as sincerely opposed to Communism as he himself professes to be."

Senator Flanders on March 9 on the Senate floor stated that McCarthy "is doing his best to shatter the Republican party" and that his search for internal subversion is diverting the nation's attention from external troubles to an "extent dangerous to our future as a nation." This statement was later approved by President Eisenhower.

Vice-President Nixon on March 13 spoke of the harm being done by McCarthy and declared that unfair inquisition methods help to destroy "our freedoms".

Jack Anderson and Ronald W. May, in chapter 26 of their book, "McCarthy", state that McCarthy in 1949 demanded the right to "sit in" when a 3-man Senate Committee investigated the "Malmedy Massacre" trials, and virtually took charge of the investigation and denounced his fellow Benators as attempting "to whitewash the American military"; that, for weeks, he kept up a continuous stream of denunciations on and off the floor of the Senate, which were echoed by the Communist press in Germany and caused such a bitter reaction in that country against America that the sentences of the Nazi murderers had to be commuted; that the socalled evidence which McCarthy produced was received by him from Rudolf Aschenauer. of Frankfurt, Germany, a member of the Communist spy ring; that the fictitious evidence produced by this Communist was given the ring of truth by McCarthy and then handed to the German press as authenticated by an American senator, thus inflaming the German people and damaging the American position in that country; that, in the opinion of Anderson and May, McCarthy thus damaged his country and its reputation abroad to win the pro-German Wisconsin votes; that Walter Harnischfeger, a pro-german Milwaukee pre-fab manufacturer, who made numerous trips to Germany and criticized the war-crime trials, was frequently quoted by McCarthy in the Congressional Record; and that the young lawyer, who assisted McCarthy in the Malmedy investigation, was in fact an employee of the Harnischfeger Corporation.

Jack Anderson and Ronald W. May, in their book, "McCarthy", further point out how McCarthy organizes boycotts and issues threats against publications that publish facts about him; that there are 11 parallels on foreign policy between McCarthy's voting record and the Red party line; that in the opinion of FBI counterspy Philbrick, "The hardr. J. Edgar Hoover

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bitten Communist elite 'just love' Senator McCarthy's name calling." I am confident his view of the matter is correct.

The Alsop brothers, in their column of March 5, and Jack Anderson and Ronald W. May, in their book, "McCarthy", both state that McCarthy owed his election to the United States Senate to Communist support. Furthermore, they point out that, instead of repudiating such support, McCarthy replied airily, "Well, Communists vote, don't they?" It is therefore at least conceivable that the Senator, in supporting Communist objectives while publicly berating them, is paying off his election obligation. However, it seems more probable that we are dealing with a man who craves publicity and power and doesn't care what happens to his country in his drive to obtain them. In any event the Senator, in my opinion, has done and is doing more harm to America than all the Communists so far brought to light. That is why I have reported him.

On Thursday, December 2, 1954, the Acting Director of the Investigations Division of my office. Mr. Robert L. Shortley, received an official request from Senator Ferguson's office to appear before a special Senate subcommittee to provide testimony in connection with a mail cover which had been placed several years ago on Senator before K. McCarthy and his immediate staff. During 1952, Mr. Shortlef had served in the capacity of a staff member of the United States Senate Bubcommittee on Privileges and Elections, which subcommittee had been charged to make an investigation and issue a report on the background of Senator McCarthy.

During the course of his testimony on the afternoon of December 2, 1954, Senator Ferguson had asked Mr. Shortley to provide the subconnittee with his investigative background. The Senator was advised that the witness had served as a Special Agent of the Federal Fureau of Investigation, with the United States Senate and with the Toreign Operations Advinistration. The Senator thereupon requested the witness to provide information as to whether he had ever placed a mail cover prior to the time He was employed in the Senate. Since his only investigative background prior to his Senate employment was with the Sell, Mr. Shortle, advised that he did not feel free to give testimony succerning his activities while employed as a Special Agent with the

The Sengtor pursued the point one step further, stating that he was not interested in what Fureau policy was, but only wanted to know what the witness had done in regard to the placing of mail covers. The Senator was again advised that the witness, before he gave any further itestinony along these lines, respectfully requested permission to discuss the matter with pertinent FEI officials. #### HONORABLE HAROLD E. TALBUTT SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE

A source of unknown reliability has stated that if the Senate Permanent Committee on Investigations ever learned that Secretary Talbott was formerly Chairman of the Board of the Durbin-Bond Company, Little Rock, Arkansus, a real scandal would result; that since Secretary Talbott has been Secretary of the Air Force this company has received numerous contracts, particularly concerning the purchase of oil and Secretary Talbott is alleged to have steered the Air Force arrangements of such contracts. It was further stated that Senator McCiellan, the Chairman of the Senate Permanent Committee on Investigations, was a member of the law firm in Little Rock, Arkansas, which handles business dealings for the Durbin-Bond Company for which reason it was asserted by our source of information that Senator McClellan had not vigorously pursued the Talbott matter in the hopes that the connections with the Durbin-Bond Company would escape public attention.

The Sureau, of course, has not investigated this matter and has no way of knowing whether there is any basis in fact for this assertion. However, it is felt that this is a matter that should be called to your attention.

Please take the trouble to read the account of death through toxic hepatitis in the February 1956 issue of the A. M. A. Archives of Industrial Health published by the American Medical Association - page 212 and page 213 -titled A Carbon Tetrachloride Fatality.

The account relates death following the use of one pint of tetrachloride to clean a hotel room rug. The same effect could have been obtained by use in a room occupied by McCarthy of sany other of the many chlorinated hydrocarbons now in commercial use as insecticides etc . such as chlordene or lindenc. If the occupant of the room is even a moderate user of alochol the toxicity is increased. An hour by hour cheek of where the Senstor





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Having reason to suspect that you had a very high personal regard for the late Freedom Fighter and great patriot, Senator Joseph & Carthy, and knowing that your Bureau has the responsibility of protecting the lives of our Congressmen and other public officials, I am taking the liberty of forwarding to you, without his knowledge, a cony of a letter written on May 12, 1957 by my brother,

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Could Senator McCarthy have been murdered? As you know, McCarthy died of Acute Hepatitis. But you may not know that acute hepatitis occurs when one of the most diabolical types of murder possible is committed. This means of murder has supposedly been used in some "international intrigue" murders. Such murders are almost impossible to detect. It could be suspected in the case of a controversial figure like McCarthy who dies of acute hepatitis, especially if the "disease" is not due to a virus or bacteria. News reports quote doctors as saving that McCarthy's acute hepatitis was not due to virus or bacteria.

It is not commonly known that acute hepstitis of the liver results from poison. The most frequent poisons causing it are arsenic and the common carbon tetrachloride. Arsenic can be detected easily in the body and is not nearly as suitable for murder or crippling as carbon tet. Net carbon tet is not sven considered to be a poison and is present in many homes with its dangers virtually unknown. It has been estimated by experts that a single gallon of carbon tet would kill everyone on the Queen Marv if its fumes were dispersed throughout the ship. Its effect on the liver is immediate and crippling. If death does not result, the liver heals in a year or two but the general health is damaged for years.

The supposed manner of committing the murder would be to nour a small vial of carbon tet under the hotel room door or through the crack in the window, after the victim has retired. Carbon tet vacorizes rabidly. The victim sleeps with the fumes. Should he awake (or be awake) he would probably not suspect anything since the small is similar to common kerosene, cleaning fluids, and to many factory smells. One suffering from sinus trouble or loss of smell would, of course, notice nothing unusual. Within a short while the victim's liver has received either a crippling or killing dose. The victim would usually live for days or even weeks. In cases of lesser damage, the victim may not die, but his health would'be ruined for vears. Brain damage and depression, as well as general debility result. Damage short of death is supposedly preferred by the victim's enemies in many cases. The victim is no longer a threat.

Carbon tet is available in most hardware stores and in numerous other stores. It is common in cleaning fluids and is used in some dry cleaning establishments, etc.

A murder by carbon tet is virtually undetectable and crippling is even less detectable. There is no evidence. The murderer need not even enter the room. The victim dies of what is a common ailment which may be brought on by a host of causes and there is no defference in the symptoms. The carbon tet is virtually undetectable in the body after a few days.

I have heard reports that doctors and governments are afraid that this diabolical and virtually undetectable method of murder will become known to the general public. This is a factor for you to seriously consider before you broadcast any information regarding it. The public has never been made fully aware of the terrible dangers of this common household substance. If you are not now aware, I am sure you will be amazed at what a study of the subject will reveal. I am sure you will double check my statements before taking any action. I em not saying McCarthy was murdered. It is an interesting possibility however. Did he not return from a trip shortly before his death? A man in a hotel is a ready victim but one alone in his own home is not safe from the possibility. It could happen to you or me, or to anyone. McCarthy may have received an earlier



I want you and your associates to know how much I appreciate your h Tele Reem in sending flowers in memory of Joe. Please accept my deep apprect. Mr. h if for your thoughtfulness.

Joe gave his life, as Father Grill said at St. Mary's, "principally \_\_\_\_\_ cause he exhausted himself physically for love of his fellow beings." This is so very true that I, as his wife -- having known this for a long, long time -- never thought before that anyone else would understand.

When Joe came home to Appleton, the heart and soul of this country was  $\frac{1}{1-1}$  standing along the roadside on the 30 mile drive from Green Bay. It was  $\frac{1}{1-1}$  all of that that made Joe and all of that to which he dedicated has life. It was the reason for his sacrifice of personal comfort, the reason for his courage to withstand being alone at times.

I cannot help but feel, however, that his sacrifice of personal comfort, his aloneness at times -- along with that of many unknown and unheralded men -- will have been for nought unless we see the purpose of the immense drive that was his. Knowing Joe as I do, I know he would be impatient with the thought that we simply mourn his passing or praise his life. God had purpose in both of these. The battle Joe fought so fearlessly and with such insight is not over. It will only end, as Joe so often said, with victory or death for our civilization.

Joe once said in answer to the question: "What can I do to help?" --Look to your schools, search behind the printed word, give purpose to and demand a contract from the men you send to man the watchtowers in Washington. If everyone of Joe's friends took that suggestion to heart, I would then know God's purpose had been done.

May I add an afterthought I know Joe would share. That is, never underestimate your power as a citizen. When Joe walked into his first open clash with the wrecking crew of our nation, he had in his mind -- and this he has written -- the "thought of those real people who are the heart and soul and soil of America; thoughts of the young people in my office, toiling night and day ... thoughts of the many young men, friends of mine, who went to their death in the Pacific for what they thought was a better world -- those thoughts convinced me that this fight I had to win."

Perhaps now a few more will stop to think that a man with the intellect and the courage, the drive and the honesty, a man such as Joe -- with his love for life -- could not have spent all that without reason. Perhaps a few more will search their minds and step with decision to the side of right.
