PURPOSE:

To have Mr. Drew Pearson interviewed by Assistant Director Nichols concerning instant case, in accordance with Mr. Peyton Ford's instructions.

BACKGROUND:

Reference is made to my memorandum deced October 12, 1950, which is attached, recommending that Mr. Drew Pearson be interviewed, since Mr. Seth Richardson had previously indicated that Pearson may be able to furnish pertinent information concerning this matter. You will recall that the Director instructed that this question be referred to Mr. Peyton Ford. By memorandum dated October 20, 1950, Mr. Ford requested that Pearson be interviewed.

States never in any knowledge of vicinity of Senator McCARTHY's office prior to accusation. Denies other than casual acquaintance with Senator McCARTHY and denies any acquaintance with former and present members of McCARTHY's staff. Denies knowing Disclaims any recent association with persons previously reported as present at so-called "Red Baiters Club" meeting, although questioned as to "Red Baiters Club." Congressional liaison man of Loyalty Review Board denies ever contacting Senator McCARTHY or any of his staff or ever being in office of Senator McCAMTHY.

Investigator for Senator information. McCARTHY, gratuitously stated to a Special Agent of this office that information appearing in FBI reports in the case was obtained and inserted in the form of a Civil Service Commission summary of information, thus making it appear that Senator McCARTHY's office had secured access to Civil Service Commission investigative files rather than FBI files. went on to explain that by handling the information in that fashion, no violation of the law could be proved, since the so-called Civil Service Commission summary report would not be a bona fide report of a Government agency. indicate actual source of the information in

DETAILS:

At Washington, D. C.

Colonel JAMES E. HATCHER, Chief, Investigations Division, Civil Service Commission, furnished essentially the same information as to his knowledge of this case as has been attributed to Mr. KIMBELL JOHN-SON, Colonel HATCHER's assistant, in a previous report in this case. Specifically Colonel HATCHER stated that the "so-called report of investigation" was an evident forgery inasmuch as no such document exists in the files of the Civil Service Commission Investigations Division, and further that the document has numerous discrepancies Colonel HATCHEA pointed out of form from that of a genuine report. that while the Fol reports referred to in the McCARTHY "exhibit" did actually pass through the offices of the Investigations Division, Civil Service Commission, at no time was the statement ever contained in the files of the Investigations Division. He felt that, therefore, it was very unlikely that the leak of this particular information could have occurred from within the Investigations Division of the Civil Service Commission.

Colonel HATCHER stated his belief that the likely source of the leak of information in the case was either within the State Department or within the Loyalty Review Board, since these are the only two places where the information reposed. He said that he was acquainted with most of the personnel of the Loyalty Review Board and did not feel that any individual at the Loyalty Review Board would furnish such information irregularly.

Mr. DONALD L. NICHOLSON, Chief, Security Division, Department of State, advised that he did not know the source of Senator McCARTHY's information in the Case. He said the file was maintained at both the State Department Security Division and the Loyalty Review Board at one time or another and that the information could have leaked

from either of these places. He said that naturally he considered the possibility of the information leaking from the Security Division of the State Department but was unable to discover any possible way in which such a thing might have occurred. He said that he had no suspects in the Security Division, and in fact had no reasonable suspects as to the source of this information. He said he was familiar with the make-up of the so-called "Red Baiters Club." and realizes that it allegedly includes all of whom work for the State Department. He said that he could see no way in which any of these men would have had access to the file, and further that his knowledge of these men was such that he had confidence in them that they would not furnish information of this nature to unauthorized persons.

Mr. NICHOLSON later furnished additional information which is set out later in this report.

Mr. SETH W. RICHARDSON, Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, advised that he was familiar with the situation involving the possession by Senator McCARTHY of information relating to the case, and while he did not feel that this information emanated from the Loyalty Review Board, he agreed that it was possible that the information was furnished by someone in the Loyalty Review Board, inasmuch as the material had at one time or another been contained in the files of the Loyalty Review Board. Mr. RICHARDSON said that he did not have any suspects as to the identity of the source of Senator McCARTHY's information, but mentioned that the names of both employees of the Loyalty Review Board, had come to his attention in this connection.

Mr. RICHARDSON stated that about the time the McCARTHY statement in instant matter broke, he received a telephone call from DREW FEARSON, newspaper columnist, who is an acquaintance of his, and that PEARSON said in effect - I have been told by a member of Senator McCARTHY's staff that he has been obtaining information from an individual employed at the Loyalty Review Board. Also an individual employed by the Loyalty Review Board has been seen at Senator McCARTHY's office and what about this fellow who works for you? In other words, Mr. RICHARDSON said, while he cannot say that PEARSON definitely said had been furnishing information to McCARTHY, or had been seen at McCARTHY's office, the implication was obvious that he had. Mr. RICHARDSON said that at the time of PEARSON's call, HICHARDSON was not aware of identity as an employee of the Loyalty Review Board, and so informed PEARSON.

Mr. Richardson said that he had questioned in that connection and denied ever having been at or hear Senator McCARTHY's office.

Mr. MICHANDSON stated that he had been informed by Mr. LAWRENCE V. MELOY, Executive Secretary of the Loyalty Review Board, of information which had come to the latter's attention suggesting the possibility that an employee of the Loyalty Review Board may have been in wuch with Senator McCARTHY's office. Mr. RICHARDSON said that upon speaking to regarding this the latter denied ever having been in touch with Senator McCARTHY's office at any time in any connection.

Mr. LAWRENCE V. MELOY, Executive Secretary, Loyalty Review Board, advised that he had no specific information indicative of the source of Senator McCARTHY's information. He said that he had been informed by Mr. L. A. MOYER, Executive Director and Chief Examiner of the Civil Service Commission, of the information suggesting that might have been in contact with Senator McCARTHY's office. He said he informed Mr. RICHARDSON of this, and that upon being questioned regarding the matter, denied any connection with Senator McCARTHY or his office.

Mr. MELOY stated that he did not feel that anyone in the Loyalty Review Board would have furnished such information to Senator McCARTHY, and in particular stated that it was his personal feeling, based on many years acquaintance, that and all of whom have been employed many years by the Civil Service Commission, were the type of men who would not do any such thing. He stated that he said this regarding notwithstanding the fact that was under suspicion for similar activity several years ago. He said he felt in this connection that having once been involved in such a matter, would have learned his lesson and not place himself in such a position again.

Mr. ROBERT FENN, Chief, Examining Section, Loyalty Review Board, stated that he had no specific information as to the identity of the source of Senator McCARTHY's information and stated that in particular he felt from his close personal acquaintance with and that none of these men was the type who would do such a thing.

Mr. L. A. MOYER, Executive Director and Chief Examiner, Civil Service Commission, advised that the information which had been furnished MELOY regarding came to him from

Mr. HARRY B. MITCHELL, Chairman, Civil Service Commission, advised that he received the information regarding which he furnished to MOYER from Mr. DONALD RAWSON, Administrative Assistant to the President, who informed him that he had in turn received it from the then Deputy Under-Secretary of State JOHN E. PEURIFOY. He said that the original form of the information as Kurnished to him by Mr. DAWSON was to the effect that the matter with Mr. DAWSON, Board was seen in the vicinity of Senator McCARTHY's office. He said that upon checking back on the matter with Mr. DAWSON, DAWSON was in turn informed by Mr. PEURIFOY that one of his men had seen an employee of the Loyalty Review Board, believed to be in the vicinity of Senator McCARTHY's office, although the identification of was not definite.

Mr. SAMUEL D. BOYKIN, Director, Office of Consular Affairs, Department of State, was interviewed regarding the information allegedly furnished in the first instance by Mr. PEURIFOY, who is at present Ambassador to Greece and not in this country. Mr. BOYKIN made inquiry and determined that Mr. DONALD L. NICHOLSON, Chief, Security Division, Department of State was familiar with the matter.

Mr. NICHCLSON stated that during the time when Senator McCAntHY was making statements in the Senate regarding the State Department, the then Deputy Under-Secretary of State, Mr. PEURIFOY, was on Capitol Hill, on occasion. He said that Mr. PEURIFOY told him that on one occasion, while in the Senate Office Building he was approached in the corridor by an individual whose identity he did not know, who said to him in effect - Mr. PEURIFOY you don't know me, but I have great admiration for the State Department, and in fact my wife once worked there. I think the State Department is getting a raw deal, and I just want to tell you that Senator McCARTHY may be getting some of his information from a man named in the Loyalty Review Board.— Mr. PEURIFOY informed Mr. NICHOLSON that he took no further note of the matter at the time, and was completely unaware of the identity of the individual who approached him. Mr. NICHOLSON said that he presumed that Mr. PEURIFOY informed Mr. DAWSON of this matter so that appropriate action might be taken were the allegations found to be valid.

his duties involved for the Loyalty Review Board and that he spent a great deal of his time on Capitol Hill. He said he did not know Senator McCARTHY nor had he ever been in Senator McCARTHY's office. He said further that he knew no members past or present of Senator McCARTHY's staff.

said that he was also questioned by Mr. RICHARDSON regarding some allegation that he may have been seen at or near Senator McCARTHY's office, and stated that he attributes any such allegation to the fact that he knows that there are several individuals who frequent Capitol Hill who have displayed enmity to him in the past, and who he feels would be not beyond making unfounded accusations against him.

pointed out that any allegation that he might have furnished information in the case is ridiculous in that if he were inclined to perpetrate any such deeds, he has access to and knowledge of information which would be much better used than the information in the case by any persons wishing to have access to information within the Loyalty Review Board. He said that he stated this to emphasize the fact that he would certainly not furnish any information to unauthorized individuals, pointing out that he was an employee of many years standing with the Civil Service Commission, and considers it beyond belief that he would at this late date be thought to do anything disloyal to the Civil Service Commission.

stated that he had no specific information as to the identity of any persons furnishing information to Senator McCARTHY, and in particular thought that no employees of the Loyalty Review Board would be guilty of such activity.

Colonel GROVER C. DAVIS, Chief, Inspection Section, Loyalty Review Board, advised that he was not specifically familiar with the case, and knew of no one in particular who would have had access to that case, if at any time it was maintained in his office. He said that in April of 1950 the sensitive State Department cases were placed in the exclusive custody of Dr. COOMBS of the Loyalty Review Board. Colonel DAVIS was unable to furnish any information as to the identify of the source of Senator McCARTHY's information.

was interviewed at his office and inquiry was made as to whether he was familiar with the statement of Senator McCaRlHY regarding the case. He immediately stated that he had never heard of the case, was not familiar with the name and was not aware that any such case was handled by the Loyalty Review Board. He stated specifically in response to questioning, that he was not familiar with any details of the case nor did he ever officially handle the case in the Loyalty Review Board, reiterating that he had never heard of the case.

Asked if he were acquainted with Senator McCARTHY, he replied that he was introduced to him at a gathering about three or four years ago but has never seen him since. He said specifically that he knew no members of Senator McCARTHY's staff past or present. He stated

specifically that he did not know staff.

stated that he was never in Senator McCARTHY's office or in the vicinity thereof, nor did he know where it was located until such time as he was questioned by Mr. RICHARDSON regarding an allegation that he was seen at or near Senator McCARTHY's office, after which questioning he proceeded immediately to Senator McCARTHY's office with the intention of seeing the Senator in an effort to refute any such allegation. He said that he was unable to gain an interview with the Senator and left the Senator's office without identifying himself. He said that this was the only occasion when he was ever at or near Senator McCARTHY's office, mentioning that the only time he ever was in the Senate Office Building was in connection with his official attendance at certain hearings conducted in that building.

Early in the interview pointed out that he

was also questioned concerning his knowledge of the individuals previously reported as present at the so-called "Red Baiters Club" meeting; however, no specific mention was made of the "Red Baiters Club," its membership, or its meetings. It was not deemed advisable to mention this to the in view of the necessity for maintaining the confidence of Washington Confidential Informant

was asked if he knew and replied that he had made his acquaintance when was formerly a Civil Service investigator, and that the last time he had seen him was two and one-half years ago. He said that he believed he may have talked to him by telephone well over one year ago.

When asked if he knew he said that he does not know him. When asked if he knew he said that he knew him as a former Civil Service investigator and had seen him, he believes, in the company of also about two and one-half years ago, and that he may have talked to him on the phone well over a year ago. When asked if he knew him slightly, and had last seen him well over a year ago when

stopped by his house briefly. When asked if he knew he said that he knew him as a former Civil Service investigator who was presently on the House Civil Service Committee. He said he has seen him from time to time but that the last time he has seen him was well over a year ago. He said that he knew whom he sees regularly, and whom he lest see within a few days. Said that he also knew but that it has been many years since he has seen him.

Although no specific mention was made of the alleged meeting of the "Red Baiters Club" held early this year, just prior to Senator McCARTHY's first speech, was repeatedly questioned along such lines so as to establish whether he had met with this group of individuals, and with the exception of his statement that he saw frequently steadfastly denied having seen, talked, or met with the other individuals as a club, or individually for at least about one year.

denied ever having made available to any member of Congress any information which may have come to his knowledge in connection with his Government employment. He mentioned that he had been suspected of furnishing information to Congressman FRED E BUSBEY, but denied ever doing so. He said in fact that he never even knew BUSBEY until such time as he had been suspected of furnishing information to BUSBEY, at which time he immediately sought an interview with BUSBEY to solicit the latter's assistance in proving he had not furnished material to him.

denied ever removing, extracting or copying any information in any files or correspondence coming to his attention in connection with his Government employment, and stated that while prior to his employment in the Loyalty Review Board, he was accustomed to taking material home with him to work on, that he had never removed any material from his office even for the purpose of doing "home work" since he has been employed in the Loyalty Review Board.

stated that he had no knowledge whatever as to the source of Senator McCARTHY's information and stated that it definitely did not emanate from him.

Senator JOSEPH R. MetalTHY, made the following gratuitous statement to Special Agent of this office, on September 15, 1950, when Special Agent was in contact with in connection with official business not related to this inquiry.

said "I would like to get a copy of the Bureau's summary report on LATTIMORE." (This reference is to an investigation which was aware was being conducted by the FBI regarding Owen LATTIMORE). Stated that he presumed that approximately twelve FBI offices had these reports, and that copies had also been distributed to the Office of Naval Intelligence and to G-2, Department of the Army. Indicated that in the past he had been able to secure some information from the New York office of ONI. He stated that he needed such a report inasmuch as Senator McCARTHY, in the future would not make any further allegations without being able to support such allegations by an investigative report. He said that if he could get the report, he could attribute the information contained therein to another Government investigative agency, explaining that "this is what happened in the case."

advised that he was aware that the FBI had initiated an investigation to determine how Senator McCARTHY could have obtained the information appearing in the Civil Service Commission Investigative files concerning

He also stated that the Senator had been questioned in this regard by a representative of the FBI.

would be handled in the same fashion as was done in the case, explaining that he had inserted the information appearing in the FBI report in the form of a summary of information appearing in the Civil Service Commission Investigative Files, thus making it appear that his office had secured a Civil Service Commission file rather than an FBI file. In this way, said, he modificated be violating any laws inasmuch as the Civil Service Commission summary report would not be a bona fide report of a Government agency, and thus, a theft of Government property case as such, could not be proved. He said that he also believed that a theft of Government property case with respect to the information contained in the report could not be proved inasmuch as the information would be completely paraphrased, making it impossible for any observer to determine that the information was actually taken from an FBI report.

The foregoing information was volunteered in its entirety by the who made these statements without solicitation of Special Agent whose only comment at the conclusion of remarks was that no report on LATTIMORE would be made available to him.

PURPOSE:

To advise, pursuant to your instructions, Supervisor and SA control of the Washington Field Office were instructed to make necessary arrangements to interview Mr. Drew Pearson concerning instant matter today.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to your instructions, Supervisor of the Loyalty Section met with Supervisor and SA of the Washington Field Office, and instructed them to make the necessary arrangements to have Mr. Drew Pearson interviewed today concerning instant case. They were advised to bear in mind the following:

- 1. Advise Pearson that Bureau contact with him is pursuant to Deputy Attorney General Peyton Ford's request.
- 2. That Richardson suggested we talk with Pearson; that Richardson has no objection to Pearson revealing all information in his possession concerning this matter.
- 3. Advise Pearson briefly what Richardson has told us and develop additional information from that point.

5. Cover this material only. Do not engage in any other discussions with Pearson involving controversial issues.

Hits 'Forgery of McCarthy

Ex-FBI Man Claims Senator Used False Document on Floor

Senator McCarthy once used a forged document on the senate floor when he was making charges of Communists in the government, the former chief inspector of the FBI charged here Sunday night.

McCarthy also gave active sunport to "the most notorious American Communist of our generation" when he helped Earl Browder win acquittal on a charge of contempt of congress, Edward P. Morgan of Washington, D. C., said.

Morgan appeared on a WTMJ-TV program to urge votes for Thomas E. Fairchild, Democratic

candidate for McCarthy's senate seat. The program was a paid political broadcast in which Fairchild made a closing campaign speech after Morgan appeared.

An FBI man from 1939 to 1947, when he resigned to enter private law practice, Morgan was J. Edgar Hoover's top aide on Communists and other subversive groups during World War II.

It appeared to be an official document of one of our security accencies, and as McCarthy read from it, senators who had doubted its charges said. The former FBI officer said he had come to Wisconsin at his own expense "to help warn Wisconsin voters of McCarthy methods—how he accuses fellow Americans of treason, the highest crime, with no evidence, with half truths, with distortion and even with false documents."

Mo. an said he was lecturing to FBI classes and touring the hation "alerting America to communism at a time when the junior senator was running a divorce mill at Appleton and getting help of Communists to win his nomination as senator."

[In 1946, when McCarthy was a circuit judge at Appleton, it was revealed that he had approved "quickie" divorces for political friends. In the 1946 campaign for the senate nomination, Wisconsin Communists denounced Senator La Follette, McCarthy's rival, after La Follette criticized Soviet Russia.]

"This junior senator of yours, instead of fighting communism, has been the voice of fascism and the secret weapon of communism in America," Morgan told the television audience.

Tells of Plea by McCarthy

"I know the history of his charges of Communists in the state department because he came to me and asked my help. I called a friend in New York, got him to Washington to help McCarthy, and then heard that man come back from the absolutely no evidence to suffic these charges he is

Then a representative of McCarthy came to my office. He said, Ed, you were the FBI's top expert on Communists; won't you give us the name of one pinko in the state department?"

Morgan said he was shocked at that request, and had answered that McCarthy had claimed to have 201 or 57 names

have 201 or 57 names.

"The senator's man answered. That was just talk for public consumption; you give us one name and we'll build him into a second Alger Hiss." Do you wonder, people of Wisconsin, why I say this man has hurt the investigative agencies of government?"

Notes Hoover Staying on Job

With high praise for Hoover, FBI director, Morgan said:

McCarthy claims that our government has been soft tow rd communism. Do any of you believe that John Edgar Hoover, my frend and a reat patriotic Amendan, would stay for one minute in any

Yet Browder won acquittal without even taking the stand. The one witness for him was Senator Joseph McCarthy. I knowbecause I was a witness against Browder."

[Margan was chief counsel for the sellate (Tydings) committee investigating Communists in government. That committee found McCarthy's charges 'a fraud and hoax on the American people.

[At Browder's contempt trial, McCarthy said Browder had been a co-operative witness at senate hearings.]

"The way McCarthy served the most notorious Communist of our generation aided communism more than any one he has charged with Communist activities," Morgan declared.

Urges Vote for Fairchild

Morgan said that Wisconsin residents who want to fight communism "will serve their country best by voting for Tom Fairchild, who has been a United States attorney and kingws that we have laws and agencies to control this danger to our nation without throwing freedom and decency out the window."

Fairchild, whose family was with him for the telecast, used his final speech to summarize his campaign. He quit his pleasant work as federal attorney for western Wisconsin, he said, to fight "a hysteria that has the capacity to destroy our freedom."

"It has become clearer and clearer that our junior senator would ruthlessly destroy our American principles of freedom in his cold blooded drive for power," Fairchild said, adding that McCarthy had refused to discuss campaign issues "while telling people of other states how to vote."

Points to Hitler, Stalin

"Measuring the meaning of my words, I point out that Hitler and Stalin came to power in the same way, and once in power they used the brutal methods of the secret police, the suppression of the free press, and ruthlessly destroyed every vestige of democratic opposition," Fairchild said.

"The parallel with the junior senator is disturbingly clear. Can you doubt that racial intolerance and religious bigotry are next on his list? This is more than a political campaign. It is a moral struggle for decency, tolerance, fair play and freedom itself."

He closed by calling for votes that would show the world "these United States can triumph over

ommunism and preserve free-

[Commenting on Morgan's talk, McCarthy called the Fair-child backer "the head of the whitewash team of the Tdyings committee." McCarthy said: "The principal question to ask Morgan is why he is a former FBI man. He certainly doesn't represent the clean cut, upright, anti-Communist young men in the FBI."]

"Unprecedented" Response Noted

Morgan said that he had left the FBI "because I could earn more money and support my family better in private law practice." He said his resignation was "entirely voluntary, no matter what McCarthyism questions may be asked." He left here immediately after the broadcast to speak to a Democratic rally in Sioux City, Lowa.

WTMJ-TV reported an enthusiastic "unprecedented" response to his speech. Normally, telephone callers object to political speeches, but calls after the broadcast were all favorable.

William Proxmire, Democratic candidate for governor who is conducting a 30 hour marathan broadcast from the studios of WCAN in the Towne hotel, also had telephone calls about Morgan's speech. Some callers asked for a rebroadcast. Others sought to discredit Morgan.

In connection with the broadcast of Ed Worgan in Milwaukee, while we have not as yet secured the text of the broadcast, from newspaper accounts and information furnished me by SAC Murphy of Milwaukee, Morgan alleged that the FBI Laboratory examined a document which Senator McCarthy offered on the floor of the Senate purporting to be a communication from the Civil Service Commission and the FBI examination disclosed the date stamp to be a phoney.

SAC Murphy informed me this morning that in his broadcast, Morgan stated that two Agents had informed him that this document was a phoney and this was the basis of his information.

we will, of course, have to run this down, but I think we should have the exact text of Morgan's remarks before engaging in any lengthy research project on this score.

The document which Morgan undoubtedly was referring to was a mimeographed document which Senator McCarthy issued at the time he made his speech on the Senate floor on July 25, 1950. (The Tydings Subcommittee investigating the McCarthy charges, of which Morgan was Counsel, was functioning in the early Spring and Summer of 1950)

The document purported to be a summary of the investigation of


The Bureau Laboratory examined the questioned document and in a report submitted to the Washington Field Office dated August 15, 1950, concluded that it could not be determined whether the Civil Service Commission date stamp on the original was made from an actual rubber stamp or was made by some other process.


The reports submitted in the investigation, pursuant to the Attorney General's instructions, were furnished to the Attorney General, although they were not furnished to the Civil Service Commission since the investigation was based upon the broad premise of removal of government property and the purpose of our investigation was to determine how McCarthy got the information,

The Bureau was advised by Colonel James E. Hatcher of the Civil Service Commission that the document produced by McCarthy was an evident forgery inasmuch as no such document exists in the files of the Civil Service Commission, and further that the document had numerous discrepancies of form from that of a genuine report.



For that reason and despite the fact that I regret the transcendence of some delicacy in this situation in referring to my background, upon which I do not want to capitalize, I must apologize to my great, dear friend, J. Edgar Hoover, for doing this.

But this situation, this problem of McCarthism, transcends matters of personal delicacy and for that reason I would like to make a few observations about my background. For a number of years, it was my great privilege to be the chief Inspector of the FBI. I supervised Communist

investigations for the FBI all over the United States. I

lectured to FBI Agents and police officers from all over the

world concerning the menace of Communism, Nazism, Fascism

and the other totalitarianisms. Upon leaving the FBI a few

years ago I felt that the American people were not sufficiently

alert to the menace of Soviet imperialism and the danger of

world Communism and, therefore, I set about making speeches

over all the United States, largely at my own expense, seeking

to alert the people of this country to this menace,

Yes, my friends, I was fighting Communism at a time, if I might point it out brutally, at a time when the Junior Senator from Wisconsin was running a divorce mill at Appleton, was accepting, in fact, the aid of Communists in his first race for the United States Senate. And this man has the colossal effrontery to present himself to the people of Wisconsin and of this country as a fighter against Communism. You may say to yourself and I am going to tell you some things tonight that have never been told before, because I have promised myself I would keep them to myself, and you may well say, why have I waited this late to speak upon this issue. I will tell you very simply, I know what it is to fight McCarthism. I know the vicious, vile forces that set out to destroy anyone that opposes him and, therefore, I said to myself, I will not set about exposing this man for fear of reprisals to my own family. Yet, last Monday night

I saw that man on a nation-wide telecast, and I saw the distortions, the untruths, the half truths projected through—out the length and breadth of this land to influence the people of America and to capitalize upon the honest fear that we all have of Communism, and I could contain myself no longer, as a result of that fact, and so I am here tonight, my friends, to say to you that this man, this Junior Senator of Wisconsin, instead of fighting Communism, has been the voice of Fascism in America and has been the secret weapon of Communism in this country.

Now, I want to tell you a few things, as I say, that have never been told. When he made his charges originally in February of 1950, charging that he had in his hands the names of a great many individuals who were members of the Communist Party, I listened with great interest, because I had been fighting Communism and it was not long after that that he called me and asked me to lend my assistance to him. I called a friend of mine from New York City and asked him to come down to Washington to help Senator McCarthy in this fight and I thought it was an honest fight. This friend of mine was, and still is, fighting Communism. He went up and stayed with the Senator for a few brief hours and came back to my office and he said, believe it or not this man has made these charges and he has absolutely no evidence with which to back them up. I am going back to New York.

In a matter of two days, a representative from Senator McCarthy's office came to my law office and sat down and he said to me, in effect, Ed, we understand and know that you have fought Communism and have supervised it and we are asking you, the Senator, to give us the name of one Communist, or one pinko as he said, in the State Department of this Government. I was shocked and I said, but the Senator has said that he has the names of 205 Communists or 57, at any rate great numbers, and this representative of the Junior Senator said to me, oh, that was just for public consumption, we want you to give us the name of one, and listen to this, give us the name of one and we will build him up to another Alger Hiss, and for two years fanned by distortions, fanned by a wave of bias, fanned by evil influences of Fascism and serving the cause of Communism. this man has gone on, and on, and on, to the point that someone, somewhere, must stop him and cry out against this evil thing that he does and is doing.

I say again that he has been aiding the Communists.

He has confused us on the issue of Communism. He has hurt

investigations of the intelligence agencies of Government.

He has unnecessarily exposed their methods and techniques for

protecting the security of this country. But most important

of all is the fact that he has not exposed a single Communist,

not one of the individuals that he charged, not one was not known to me as an individual who long before had been investigated by the security agencies of our Government. Why has he gotten away with this? Let me tell you. For the first time this has been told, how he gets away with it.

One day he presented to the Senate of the United States a thick document which had upon it the symbol and stamp of one of our intelligence agencies. He went upon the Senate floor and presented that to the United States Senate as proof positive to support his case. It appeared to be an official file and report of one of our intelligence agencies. I heard Senators, who had doubted the man's veracity, say now this appears that he has something. About three weeks later there came to my office, and I thought I would never say this and I promised myself that I never would but, as I say, this is Two Agents of the FBI bigger than all matters of delicacy. came to my office and they had this document in their hands and there told me that the FBI Laboratory had established that this document was an out and out forgery and the FBI was seeking to determine who and where it had been forged. That is the type of false information that this man has been using to project his idea of a fight on Communism.

My friends, Tom Fairchild, the fine candidate for the United States Senate, has been a United States Attorney. He knows how to fight, fight Communism within the law, and preserve inviolate our greatest of all concepts of Government of laws and not of men. The evil that is McCarthism does violence to everything that is honorable and decent.

You know, my friends, that in those years when I went over this country trying to point out the menace of Communism, I said to myself, I pray to my God that the time will not come when some demigod will come along and seek to exploit the honest fear which you, yourself, may be creating concerning Communism for selfish advantage.

I remember Mussolini when he marched on Rome in October of 1922. He said I have come to do what, to save the Italian people from Communism and yet he impressed upon them a system as vicious and <u>inviolative</u> of human rights as Communism itself.

How did Hitler come into being? It was in our generation. Have we forgotten? Have we forgotten how he capitalized upon the Communist uprising in Munich and the Communist mutiny in the German navy as an excuse to spread a Fascist, Nazi system upon the people of Germany. Why, my friends, there has always been an unscrupulous individual who has sought to seize upon this issue of Communism for his selfish purposes and to impose processes and methods violative of our freedoms.

Why, my friends, the fight on Communism, the building of the strength and economy of this nation and the rebuilding of the military might of this free world, these are the great fights on Communism.

The FBI has long since anticipated the Communist Party in this country and that great patriotic American, John Edgar Hoover, has just recently assured us that the FBI is able and ready to take care of this situation.

When McCarthy says this Government has been soft on Communism and that this Government has been overrun with Communists, think, people of Wisconsin, think. I ask you one simple question. How can a man like J. Edgar Hoover, who knows more about Communism than anyone else in America, remain

identified with the Government if it were overrun by Communism as this man, McCarthy, says. And knowing Mr. Hoover and knowing his patriotism, I can say to you that he would not, for one minute, stay in any Government that would harbor one Communist and yet he has been with this administration and the previous one for over twenty years.

General Bedell Smith, the head of the other intelligence agency, the other day testified that this country had nothing to fear if the next President fights Communism as vigorously as has the present President.

Why, my friends, wake up. This is an assault upon decency. It is an assault upon freedom. This man has aided (the Communists. I heard him testify in the District Court of the District of Columbia as the only defense witness for the most notorious Communist of our generation, Earl Browder. How do I know that? Because I was the prosecuting witness against Browder. Last year. Browder was cited for contempt of Congress on the basis of questions he defiantly refused to answer propounded by Senator McCarthy's own colleague, Senator Hickenlooper of Iowa. He was cited for contempt, this defiant Communist. He went before the court and jury. He did not take the stand on his own behalf, in his own defense. Government presented its evidence and Browder called one witness in his defense and that witness appeared and Browder was acquitted and that man was Joseph McCarthy who testified for Earl Browder.

Now. I do not suggest by this that this man is a Communist, but I do say this, that the fact that he went out of his way voluntarily to aid the most notorious Communist of our generation is more evidence of Communist proclivities and connections than any fact or facts that he has presented concerning anyone that he has charged with being a Communist. This man, to the oppressed people of Europe, has sought from time to time to exploit their fears. This man says he is fighting Communism, yet he voted for that vicious bill. the McCarran Bill, which would prevent this country being a sanctuary to millions under Communist dictatorship in Europe. The gallant Poles, for example, as I understand that McCarran Bill for which he voted, will not be admitted in this country until the year 2000. He has voted crippling amendments to every measure in Congress that would be designed to build the strength of the free world and he has hurt the fight against Communism. I hate his techniques and methods. I hate something else. I hate the results because the results are un-American. He has exposed no Communists. He has prostituted Americanism and, my friends, when the least of us in this great land are destroyed without the protection of the most glorious thing we have, our marvelous Bill of Rights, when that happens, when these rights are taken from us. America dies a little, for what shall it profit us if we

....

gain the whole world and lose our own freedom and this man, this man, is the anti-Christ of freedom. If you would repudiate him, my friends, you will send to the Senate a gallant, clean, able Senator of Wisconsin, that fine man who can represent you in the finest traditions of Americanism and not totalitarianism, Tom Fairchild.

Means and Ends

The resignation, er expulsion, of Miss Miriam de Haas from her post as an examiner for the Civil Service Commission's Loyalty Review Board a few weeks ago was a mandatory consequence of her responsibility for the leakage of confidential documents belonging to that agency. Having been suspended for refusing to answer questions about the incident, Miss De Haas made a full confession in the form of an apologia or self-justification—published as a newspaper advertisement.

"Observing the courageous fight of Senator Joseph McCarthy," Miss de Haas declared, "I have seen to it that pertinent information was made available to him as well as to other members of Congress." What she made available included confidential reports of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the minutes of ecret meetings of the Loyalty Review Board to which

the had access because she was a trusted employed. She appears to regard herself as something of a martyr because she was suspended, haled before a grand jury and, after due investigation and hearing, given notice of dismissal. But her confession makes it abundantly clear that she violated the law, the regulations of the agency in which she worked and the trust reposed in her. It makes it clear also that Senator McCarthy was disingentious, to say the least, when he asserted two months ago that Miss de Heast positively gave me no information."

The explanation offered by Miss de Haas is curlously like that submitted several years ago by Henry Julian Wadleigh, a former State Department employs who gave classified material to foreign agents in the 1930s. "Technically," he said, "I was giving out some of the secrets of my own Government to agents of a foreign country. However, I did not regard my action as contrary to the interests of the United States, but definitely the opposite." Miss de Haas' apologia is equally "patriotic":

Yes, my fellow Americans. I have given out information concerning the infiltration of Communists into the Government of our beloved country as a last desperate expedient of alerting the citizenry. I gave it out deliberately, hopefully and prayerfully, of my own volition, without request, pressure or acknowledgment from anyone. I am glad that I was in possession of information that might help our country and grateful that it has been made public. My only regret is that I have not been able to do more to arouse you to the danger our country is in. "If this be treason, make the most of it."

Perhaps Alger Hiss and Judy Coplon indulged in the same rationalization. Like the Senator she served, Miss de Hass apparently subscribes to the doctrine that the end justifies the means. It is, basically, a Communist doctrine. Those who adhere to it should certainly not occupy positions of trust in the United States Government. Source of Small of Tele. Rm. Holloman J. Grady J. On July 25, 1950, the Attorney General requested the Bureau to conduct an investigation to determine the source from which Senator McCarthy obtained the above summery, indicating in his request that there may have been a violation of Title 18, Sections 641 and 2071, United States Code.

Considerable investigation conducted by the Bureau disclosed that the summary distributed by Senator McCarthy was apparently not an authentic copy of any document prepared by the Civil Service Commission, the State Department or the Loyalty Review Board. Reports reflecting the results of the investigation mentioned above were submitted by the Washington Field Office on August 10, and 15, 1950. Senator McCarthy was interviewed in commetion with this case by Assistant to the Director D. M. Ladd, at which time he refused to disclose his source of information. These reports were sent to the Attorney General by memorandum dated August 16, 1950. By memoranda dated September 19, and 28, 1950. Mr. Payton Ford, Deputy Attorney General, requested further investigation in this matter which included interview with Mr. Seth W. Bichardson, Confront of the Loyalty Review Board.

Reference is made to your memorandum of March 23, 1954 to the ittorney General regarding the captioned matter in which you state that no information canbe located in the files of the Bureau concerning certain information furnished by Alfred Kohlberg as set forth in your letter. This had to do with his receipt in 1950, 1951 and 1952 from a source unknown to him at the time of material containing levalty and security data of the Loyalty Review Board some of it consisting of FEI reports which he said he later turned ever to deab-counities of the Senate Committee on the Judiciary.

An examination of our files indicates that on James 11, 1952 you first advised the Criminal Division that Mirion M. de Haas, an employee of the Presidential Loyalty Review Board, was suspected by the Board of having given out classified information and that on January 22, 1952 the Grininal Division requested that a full investigation be made. The file further reflects that on Jamary 25, 1952 by memorandum you asked that the request for an investigation be reconsidered, pointing out that the Givil Service Commission was already sonducting on investigation.

On Pebruary 5. 1952 mother memorandum was sent to you reiterating the mood for a thorough investigation. However, according to the file so investigation was conducted by you on the authority of Mr. A. Devitt Vamech, then Deputy Attorney General. In the absence of a Bureau investigation, it was decided to institute a grand jury inquiry into the matter. This fact become public knowledge at the time of de Raas' suspension by the Civil Service Commission in the summer of 1952.

Nothing in the file discloses that this Division knew saything of the involvement of Alfred Kohlberg in this sees until Kirim de Rass was interrogated before the grand jury in Vashington, D. C. There is no indication that Mr. Kohlberg was interviewed other than before the grand jury. Apparently your possible p interest in information of this kind was everlooked at the conclusion of the grand jury proceedings. It would seem that this information might have been made available to you at that time. I have no way to account for this omission on the part of my predecessor. There is nothing in our file to show whether this onission was due to inedvertence or may have been due to a belief that you are sware of the < facts which were made of general motoriety and appeared in the general pressection

The Department on January 22, 1952, requested that the Bureau conduct an investigation of this matter and was informed by memorandum dated January 25, 1952, that this Bureau had been informed that the Civil Service Commission had conducted an extensive investigation in this matter which included an interview of de Mans. was pointed out that this Bureau had conducted no investigation but had made available the facilities of our Laboratory. Department by memorandom dated February 5, 1952, again requested an investigation. The matter was discussed with Gus Vanech of the Department who stated he thought it would be better for the Civil <u>Service Commission to conduct this investigation.</u>

reflect she also appeared before the grand jury en April 8, 1952, in connection with an inquiry into leaks of confidential information from the Loyalty Review Board. Federal Judge Matthew F. McGuire refused to open for inspection by the Civil Service Commission the minutes of the Federal Grand Jury investigating leakage of Loyalty Review Board information. The Civil Service Commission gave de Mans a five days notice of dismissal and she resigned on November 3, 1952. There was considerable newspaper publicity concerning this matter. For example, the "Times-Revald" for November 2, 1952, contained an open letter of de Maas: "To My Dear Fellow-Americans" in which she admitted that she had

endeavored to bring information concerning the Communist conspiracy in our Government "to the attention of our representatives in Congress" and had seen to it that pertinent information was made available to Senator McCarthy as well as to other members of Congress elthough Senator McCarthy had no reason to know the source of his information. There was no indication from a review of newspaper articles in the de Haas matter that de Haas had admitted sending information to Kehlberg. (121-35707)

In accordance with the Director's instructions, a memorandum dated March 23, 1954 (121-35707-65) was sent to the Atterney General with copies for the Deputy Atterney General and Verren Olney III setting forth results of the interview of Kohlberg and referring to the Department's files on Kohlberg and de Hass. The Department's attention was called to the fact that the results of the interview of Kohlberg were being sent to Mr. Kimbell Johnson, Chief, Investigations Division, V. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C. The Department was informed that no information could be located in the files of this Bureau concerning the information furnished by Kohlberg as set forth above. The Department was asked to advise the Bureau of information available in the Department's files concerning this matter.

A letter dated March 23, 1954, was sent to Mr. Kimbell Johnson furnishing him the results of the interview of Kohlberg for his confidential information and consideration concerning the de Mass matter. (121-35707-69)

The letter of March 23, 1954, was delivered to Kimbell Johnson via Limison, on March 24, 1954, at which time Kimbell Johnson stated that this was quite a shock to the Civil Service Commission as they had no indication of this in the past. Johnson advised that he had personally interviewed de Haas at the time she was charged with removing files from the Loyalty Review Board and she had refused to answer any questions. He related that the Civil Service Commission had no indication from its files or from any of the individuals familiar with the de Haas matter of the information furnished by Bureau letter of March 23, 1954. Mr. Johnson added that the Civil Service Commission had no information soncerning the grand Jury testimony. (121-35707-70)

DEPARTMENT MEMORANDUM OF MAY 27. 1954

A memorandum of Warren Olney III dated May 27, 1954, after referring to the fact that the Bureau did not conduct any

The Director has inquired as to what action was taken by the grand jury concerning Miriam de Maas, a former employee of the Loyalty Review Board (LRB), Civil Service Commission (CSC), who has admitted furnishing confidential information from files of LRB to individuals outside the Executive Branch of the Soverment. Miriam de Maas testified on March 15, 1952, and April 5, 1952, before a Federal Grand Jury in District of Columbia, which was inquiring into the "unanthorised disclosu of confidential information." Confidential transcript covering this grand jury investigation which was made available by Dept. of Justice reflects grand jury adjourned April 5, 1952, without any action having been taken. de Maas resigned from LRB 11/3/52. No investigation conducted by PBI although facilities of PBI Laboratory made available. Investigation was conducted by CSC.

BACKGROUND:

Miriam de Mans, former employee of LRB, CSC, was investigated by CSC because she was suspected to be the source of Senator McCarthy! information for his press release in January, 1952, containing excerpt from confidential minutes of a LRB meeting on Pebruary 13-14, 1951, which disclosed criticism of the manner in which the State Department had conducted its Loyalty Review Program. The Bureau conducted mo investigation concerning the de Mass incident although facilities of our Lab made available and fingerprints of do Essa identified by Lab on the revised transcript covering this meeting of LRB. Griminal Division of Department has been furnished complete information received by Bureau in connection with de Mass. Department, on 1/22/52, requested Bureau conduct investigation of this matter and informed by memo of 1/25/52 that this Bureau had been informed CSC had conducted extensive investigation in this matter which included interview of de Mass. It w pointed out that Bureau had conducted no investigation but had made available facilities of our Lab. Letter to Department concluded "you w desire to obtain from CSC the results of its investigation in this matt Total . . reconsider your request for an investigation. . . Departme y meno dated 2/5/52, again requested an investigation. Matter discuss th Ous Vanech of Department who stated he thought it would be better holor CSC to conduct this investigation.

csc gave de Eass five days' notice of dismissal and she resigned 11/3/52. There was considerable publicity concerning this matter in local newspapers. "Times Herald" for 11/2/52 contained open letter of de Hass: "To my dear fellow-Americans" in which she admitted that she had endeavored to bring information conserning the Communist conspiracy in our Covernment "to the attention of our representatives in Congress" and had seen to it that pertinent information was made available to Senator McCarthy as well as other members of Congress although McCarthy had no reason to know the source of his information. She gave praise to "our wonderful FBI" and concluded this open letter with the statement "If this be treason, make the most of it."

It would appear that to ascertain the facts in this matter it would be necessary to review minutes of Loyalty Neview Board meetings for the year 1949 inasmuch as the month in which this meeting was held is not known and it is questionable whether any further inquiry into this matter would be productive of any useful results taking into consideration that this reported meeting was held/six years ago.




