A Missoula Indian group will picket speeches this, week by Sen. Edward W Kennedy, D Mass., Vic Charlo a spokesman for the Indian Low Income Group for Human Treatment (Indian LIGHT), sald yesterday:

Sent. Kennedy will, be picketed because of his refusal to meet with local Indians to discuss their grievances, Mr. Charlo said He said Mr. Kennedy asserted he couldn't speak with the Indians because of "time commitments."

Sen. Kennedy will speak in the second of the Mansfield Lecture (Series at 8 p.m. Friday in the Field House: He will, also give the main address to the Kyi-Yo Indian Youth Conference at 9 a.m. Saturday in the Field House.

Mr. Charlo charged that, Mr. Kennedy should be listening to the problems of the people of Montana. He said Mr. Kennedy has "all night to talk to the people."

Dr. John Daniels of St. Ignatius wrote Mr. Kennedy last fall, de scribing problems of area Indians, according to Mr. Charlo: He said Mr. Kennedy replied that he would investigate the reports of mistreatment of Indian and inform Dr. Daniels of steps: taken to correct the situation.

Mr. Charlo: said: Mr. Kennedyhever informed them of steps that would be taken. Mr. Charlo co-authored a letterto Mr. Kennedy three weeks ago asking what progress had been made in investigating Montana Indian problems and requesting Mr. Kennedy to discuss the Indian progress when he arrived in Missoula this weekend.

Mr. Kennedy said he would not be able to speak with the group, although he was still interested in their problems.

Indian LIGHT will also demonstrate Friday at 1 p.m. at the Flathead Indian Reservation's Public Health Service Unit in St. Ignatius

Health Service Unit in St. Ignatius.
Mr. Charlo said the demonstration will draw attention to inade quate health care and shortage of federal and state funds entitled to Indians by treaty.

Public Health Service policies for I'n dian's are inconsistent throughout the state, he added. Some units, including the one at St. Ignatius, do not serve off-reservation Indians, Mr. Charlo said.

There will be a discussion of how to obtain more money from the government for health care. Mr. Charlo, sald: The group would be willing to go "all the way to washington, D.C.," if necessary, he said.

"Middle, America; has: been telling the people to talk to their representatives instead of going to the streets," he said. "Kennedy won't meet with the people; so we will go to the streets."





Indians Picket PHS In St. Ignatius

By MARGE ANDERSON Missoulian Correspondent

S. IGNATIUS—A hixed group of off-reservation Indians and LIGHT affiliates peacefully picketed the Public Health Service (PHS) in St. Ignatius for about two hours Friday afternoon.

Signs stating "The buffalo has a bigger heart than PHS" of showing a clenched red fist, set the tone of the demonstration.

After marching around the PHS building at I p.m., the pick eters made speeches from the front steps. The group protested the lack of medical and dental care for off-reservation indians and indians with incomes of a certain level. They claimed that dental care is not available to any adult member of the Flathead tribe.

The unit director of the PHS in St. Ignatius, Tom Keast; leaned against a car at the foot of the stairs and listened attentively to the remarks. Eater, he spoke to the crowd.

"I felt more discouraged two years and when there weren't any denionstrations. It's good to see people out who have enough conviction to speak up. The only thing I have to say is 'Don't stop here,' 'Keast said.'

Strong feelings were expressed about the quality of medical care received from some doctors under contract to PHS; and one person charged that some of the doctors are prejudiced against their Indian patients.

A list of "demands" was presented to Keast. The demands were that an outpatient clinic and pharmacy for both on, and off-reservation Indians be built immediately as a bridge to a fully operational hospital. The clinic, and pharmacy must be controlled by Indians who will make policy, according to the demands

They further demanded that competent. Indians set up an Indian community health organization in the community. The clinic and the pharmacy must not be controlled by the Tribal Council, they stated. The proposed outpatient clinic; which is to be phased out when a hospital is built, must include emergency facilities. They also demanded inmediate release of money to



The Massachusetts Democrat and Senate majority whip was the featured speaker, at the morning session of the Kyl-Yo. Indian, Youth Conference, which drew more than 1,000 Indians from throughout Montana and other western states.

About 1,600 persons attended the 9 a.m. lecture in the UM Field House, less than a third of the crowd that packed the Field House Friday night for Kennedy's Mansfield Lecture on Foreign Relations.

"The Great White Father and his spokesmen seem to be following the example of three centuries of American history. They continue to speak to the Indian peoples of this land.

Just a small but real commitment and relatively small amounts of money — could go a long way toward alleviating your hardships, restoring your integrity; statting your communities on the road to meaningful economic development. he said

Detailing Indian problems ranging from "drastically deteriorating" health care to "disgraceful abuses in elementary boarding houses," Kennedy said that the administration has the power to correct many of the problems:

He criticized the federal Bureau of Indian Affairs for failing the Indian and called it "notorious for its resistance to reform, to innovation and to discharging its responsibilities in a competent and sensitive fashion."

He called for its complete reorganization but sald he doubted if there could be real reform without direction from Indians and pressure from without the bureau.

"The directions must come from you," he told the Indians: "But the pressures must come from the White House." And the commitment must come from the White House."

Kennedy expanded his remarks about Indian involvement during a brief question period and advised Indians that they could get better results from Congress if they would get together and come up with a program.

"You, have to work these solutions out, and then you have to come to us," he said Kennedy quoted a remark made to him on his Alaska trip that Indians need more "expert Indians," not "Indian experts."

Reference is made to your memorandum dated May 18, 1976, which forwarded a copy of captioned letter.

Your preliminary response to Senator Kennedy in this matter was a very succinct and accurate summation of the overall situation: "Federal investigation is normally undertaken only when the parent crime is punishable in Federal court." In addition, FBI investigation of bombing matters is guided by the "investigative guidelines, Title X1, Organized Crime Control Act of 1970, Regulation of Explosives" issued by the Department of Justice and agreed to by the FBI and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (BATF).

The FBI assumed no investigative jurisdiction in the deaths referred to by Senator Kennedy since no information has been received to indicate a violation of a statute under which we have investigative jurisdiction.

For your assistance in preparing an answer to Senator Kennedy's request I am enclosing seven separate memoranda concerning the murder or attempted murder of the seven individuals mentioned by Senator Kennedy. It is requested that you utilize the information in these memoranda in the preparation of your response but that they receive no dissemination outside the Department. In addition to the above, on May 29, 1976, United Press International (UPI) Wire Service carried a news release from Miami concerning the discovery of the "bullet-riddled" body of Jesus Gonzalez-Carta, a prominent Cuban exile, in the Everglades, Southwest of Miami.

Local police are investigating the homicide and feel that inasmuch as Gonzalez has a long record of criminal activities and allegations of narcotics involvement, his murder must be related to criminal activities or revenge by an unknown person.

It is noted Gonzalez was born July 6, 1923, in Havana, Cuba, and was well documented as a gunman and political gangster in Cuba from 1945 to 1952. With a change of regimes in Cuba in 1952, Gonzalez went to El Salvador and Mexico from which countries he was expelled.

In 1956 and 1957, there were about 150 Cubans in the Dominican Republic preparing for an invasion of Cuba. Gonzalez was in the Dominican Republic and one of the leaders of this group.

In 1958, Gonzalez was reportedly in the United States on an assassination mission.

In 1959, Gonzalez arrived in the United States as a political exile after having been deported from the United States in 1956 for illegal entry.

In 1963, Gonzalez was reportedly dealing in explosives in Miami. Thereafter, he moved to New York City and in 1963, was arrested and convicted of burglary, theft and possession of a gun. His 90-day sentence was suspended.

In 1967, Gonzalez was arrested in New York for counterfeiting U. S. currency, was sentenced to five years and sent to Lewisburg Federal Penitentiary.

Assistant Attorney General Criminal Division After serving his sentence, he moved to Miami and in 1973, was associated with Miami Attorney b7C and worked as a night watchman. In 1975, Gonzalez was engaged in trying to sell modular housing to the Dominican Republic and Venezuela. Established sources and informants, as well as local police, advise that during the time Gonzalez lived in the United States, he was engaged in a variety of criminal activities and narcotics. He was not recently involved in anti-Castro Cuban revolutionary activities because he was well known in the Cuban exile community as a criminal and was completely unacceptable. Dear Mr. Attorney General:

I am writing following a request for action from leaders of the Cuban American community, regarding the recent deaths of several Cuban leaders.

They inform me that some seven individuals, all prominent in the Cuban community, have been murdered.

I am enclosing the six listed in a recent letter. Since the receipt of the letter, Ramon Donestevez was found dead, apparently murdered as well.

I would appreciate learning whether the Federal Bureau of Investigation has been involved in these investigations. whether there has been any link established between these killings and whether, if no federal involvement has yet occurred, the Department of Justice would undertake an inquiry.

1- José Elías de la Torriente; murdered April 12, 1974. Led the "Plan de Trabajo para la Liberación de Cuba." His group had been blamed by Castro for several commando attacks in Cuba. Torriente had received considerable support in the Cuban exile community. He was a member of a prestigious Cuban family. He had not been envolved in politics in the past. He traveled extensively and was received by important officials in Latin American capitals.

Shot through a window of his home. A group, until then unknown, called "zero" claimed credit for the execution.

2. <u>Rodriguez Vives</u>; murdered in New York right around the time of Torriente's murder. He had organized a revolutionary organization. Someone came to see him and they sent his wife to get something to eat. Upon her return she found him dead.

3. <u>Captain Luciano Nieves</u>; former Captain in Castro's Army. Nieves had called for "a national reconciliation" between the former revolutionaries in exile and their former allies still in Castro's government. The idea was to make an alliance and get rid of Castro. He had announced he had contacts in Cuba.

Murdered in the parking lot of a hospital in Miami.

4. Ernesto Rodriguez; murdered in Miami. Former president of the Cuban Christian Democratic Party. Supposedly killed during a robbery in his small shop. Nothing was stolen.

5. Rolando Masferrer; ex-Batista henchman. Very well known. Blown to pieces when he started his car in Miami. Although bombings are often investigated by the FBI, this one I have been told, has been left as a local matter to the Miami Police Department.

Former commander of a group that was to land during the Bay of Pigs invasion in Oriente province. After the landing at Pigs and the subsequent fiasco his ship was ordered not to land and was diverted to Puerto Rico.

Someone came to see him. He allowed this person and the "visitor's wife" into the house. She passed a gun to his visitor and he shot him. They left in a rented car, and drove to a canal where they were picked up by a boat.

Dear Senator:

This is in response to your letter of April 29, 1976 to the Attorney General describing the murder or attempted murder of seven Suban-Americans. As you know, Federal investigation is normally undertaken only when an apparent crime is punishable in Federal court. Murder is a Federal crime only when committed in the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States.

Since you asked whether the Federal Bureau of Investigation has been involved in these investigations I have referred your letter to the FBI for their review. I expect to hear from the FBI shortly and will be in further communication with you at that time.

Information Concerning the Deaths of Several Cuban Leaders

MAY 19 1976

The New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation did not conduct any investigation into the Cuban American activities of Jose Elias De La Torriente, Captain Luciano Nieves, Ernesto Rodriguez, Rolando Masferrer, or Ramon Donestevez, as none of these individuals resided in the New York City area of the United States. However, Arturo Rodriguez Vives did reside in New York City until the time of his death on April 16, 1974.

Records of the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation did contain the following information regarding Arturo Rodriguez Vives also known as Arturo Rodriguez and Rodriguez Vives. He was born on January 10, 1943, in Havana, Cuba. He was paroled into the United States in Miami, Florida, by the Immigration and Naturalization Service on August 23, 1960, and was granted indefinite parole on October 6, 1960, after the Immigration and Naturalization Service had afforded him an exclusionary hearing and ordered him deported. He signed a parole agreement containing certain restrictions, and was reparoled by the Immigration and Naturalization Serivce on October 14, 1968.

Arturo Rodriguez Vives failed to report for induction into the United States Armed Forces on August 4, 1964, and for physical examination as ordered by the Selective Service System in Newark, New Jersey. When he finally did report for induction on July 15, 1968, he was found to be unacceptable for duty in the Armed Forces of the United States. A Federal investigation conducted concerning his failure to report for induction revealed that Arturo Rodriguez had been arrested numerous times in Florida, Maryland, and New Jersey for Vagrancy, Robbery, Assault with a Deadly Weapon, Armed Robbery, Possession of a Dangerous Weapon, Larceny, and Carrying a Concealed Weapon. The United States Attorney's Office in Newark, New Jersey, declined Federal prosecution of

Arturo Rodriguez for violation of the Selective Service Act.

On September 10, 1968, Arturo Rodriguez was intereviewed by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at New York, New York, concerning the then recent series of bombings in New York City which began April 22, 1968. Rodriguez admitted he was a propagandist and until the end of August, 1968, was a spokesman for "Cuban Power" in New York City. Rodriguez denied participating or involving himself in any bombing and stated that he merely made releases concerning the bombings by "Cuban Power" then a Miami based Cuban exhile anti-Castro group.


On September 24, 1968, Rodriguez was arrested by the New York City Police Department while attending a demonstration outside the Henry Miller Theater on West 43rd Street, New York City, where the production "The Cuban Thing" was playing. Rodriguez was charged with Reckless Endangerment, Disorderly Conduct, and furnishing a false report in that he was allegedly shouting inside the theater "there is a bomb inside".

On October 23, 1968, Rodriguez was among ten individuals arrested by the New York City Police Department in connection with the bombings that had been occurring in New York City since April, 1968. At this time, Rodriguez was charged with Second Degree Arson and Conspiracy to Committ Arson, Second Degree. At this time, Arturo Rodriguez Vives' common law wife, Marilyn Rivera, 1370 University Avenue, Bronx, New York, was also arrested for Possession of a Deadly Weapon in that she was in possession of a .22 caliber automatic Selecta at the time of Rodriguez's arrest on October 23, 1968.

On April 16, 1974, Arturo Rodriguez Vives was shot twice in the head by an unknown male assailant in Vives apartment.

The New York City Police Department had not developed any information which indicated that the killer of Rodriguez Vives was a former member of the SIM (Servicio Intelligencia Militar). The police department had not developed any information indicating that the murder of Rodriguez Vives had been done for political reasons, or that it had been committed by anyone connected with the then present Cuban Government. The police department's investigation did indicate that the murder of Rodriguez Vives was probably committed by a "hit man" who in all probability had come into New York to do the killing.

TORRIENTE was born April 19, 1904 in Havana Province, Cuba. He came to the United States and graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1923. He later returned to Cuba, operated a plantation and was general manager of a Cuban airline. He went with Collins Radio in 1960 and in 1966 was Vice President of Collins Radio International and lived in Coral Gables, Florida. He was a naturalized U. S. citizen.

In October, 1969, TORRIENTE claimed that President NIXON chose him to lead the fight to overthrow the government of Cuba. TORRIENTE formed a unity organization and in February, 1970, received a donation of \$45,000 from the Cuban Medical Association in exile.

In February, 1970, he formed "Plan TORRIENTE" to liberate Cuba. He held rallies in different cities throughout the United States to collect funds, had many press interviews, appeared on national television, and said he was recruiting an army. During 1970, he traveled extensively in Latin America, the United States and Europe to raise money for an invasion of Cuba.

Recruiting and fundraising continued through 1971. In June, 1971, numerous articles appeared in the press in Miami exposing TORRIENTE as the president of a large housing development and using funds collected for personal use.

against Boca Sama two days previously and that Cuban nationals were killed and wounded. On October 18, 1971, TORRIENTE issued a press statement claiming credit for the raid.

On December 17, 1971, U. S. Marshal seized TORRIENTE's 150 ft. motor vessel at Fort Pierce, Florida under Title 18, Section 1709, U. S. Code.

The Cuban exile community in Miami then severely criticized TORRIENTE for having failed in his plan to invade Cuba.

On April 12, 1974, at 8:15 p.m., TORRIENTE was shot in the head while he was sitting in the living room of his home. The shot was fired from outside the house.

Local police authorities conducted a long, intensive investigation of this murder, with negative results. The police feel that the murder was related to TORRIENTE's misappropriation of funds.

The Miami, Florida office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation rendered considerable assistance to police authorities by conducting out-of-state investigation and examinations of evidence at the FBI in Washington, D.C.

DONESTEVEZ was born February 5, 1936, in Cuba,

He came to the United States from Venezuela and became active in Cuban exile political matters.

In October, 1965, DONESTEVEZ went to Cuba by private boat to bring back Cuban exile political prisoners. On October 24, 1965, he again visited Cuba and conferred with prisoners. In January and November, 1966, he again visited Cuba but did not bring back any political prisoners.

In August, 1967, he planned a flotilla to go to criticized by the Guban exile community in Miami.

In May, 1973, he pleaded guilty to extortion and received probation in the Florida State Court.

In September, 1974, he went to Cuba, was detained on his return to the United States and later received a jail sentence of two years and one year probation for probation violation. In April, 1975, a bomb exploded at his place of business. In October, 1975, police seized an arms cache at his place of business. State prosecution was instituted.

In December, 1975, some 77 individuals paid between \$400 and \$2,000 each for DONESTEVEZ to take them to Cuba in his boat. The boat broke down dutside the harbor and was towed back. Later, a ten pound dynamite bomb was found under this boat.

He was given seven years imprisonment by the State of Florida in December, 1975, for probation violation.

On April 13, 1976, he was found shot dead in his office at his place of business.

DONESTEVEZ was very controversial and many Cuban exiles felt he was pro-CASTRO or even an agent of FIDEL CASTRO.

Some police authorities felt that this murder was a result of his having deceived one or all of the 77 individuals who paid to go to Cuba on his boat in December, 1975. The police felt that DONESTEVEZ had no intention of going to Cuba and that the bomb later found under his boat was placed by him for publicity reasons.

RE: LUCIANO NIEVES MESTRE

NIEVES was born October 6, 1933 in Las Villas, Cuba.

In 1959, with the fall of the BATISTA regime in Cuba, NIEVES appointed himself as a captain in the army of FIDEL CASTRO. Soon thereafter, he was arrested and sent to jail for dubious economic dealings. He claimed that he had been a member of CASTRO's organization since 1955.

NIEVES was in Spain in 1963 through 1964 and arrived in Miami in December, 1965. In November, 1972, NIEVES announced that a revolutionary congress would be held in Jamaica between his group and representatives of the Cuban government to discuss peaceful coexistence. The announcement caused NIEVES to become a controversial figure in the Cuban exile community in Miami.

Other Cuban exile organizations immediately joined together to oppose NIEVES and the Cuban exile press hostilely accused him of being a communist. The meetings in Jamaica never took place.

On March 20, 1973, NIEVES was beaten in a Miami restaurant by Cuban exiles as a result of his political activity. Later, NIEVES said meetings would be held in Jamaica in July, 1973, between his group and the government of Cuba. These meetings were never held. In November, 1973, NIEVES said he was no longer active in Cuban exile political matters.

On February 21, 1975, NIEVES was shot in the parking lot of a hospital in Miami, Florida, by an unknown assailant. The Cuban exile press in Miami called his murder a political matter.

Local police authorities felt his murder was a political matter in that he was not known to have any connections with criminal activity.

RODRIGUEZ is a Cuban exile who operated a religious articles store in Miami, Florida. The store was a "botanica," dealing with both voodoo and Christian articles.

Local police advised that RODRIGUEZ, on May 11, 1974, was killed during a robbery. Suspects responsible for this murder were later killed while involved in other criminal activities relating to narcotics.

Police do not feel this robbery and murder were related to Cuban exile political activities.

RE: ROLANDO MASFERRER ROJAS

MASFERRER was born January 12, 1918 at Holguin, Cuba. He graduated from Havana University Law School in 1945, was co-owner of a newspaper published in Havana in 1952, was elected Senator in Cuba and had a private army. MASFERRER was a member of the Communist Party in Cuba from 1933 to 1945. During 1937 and 1938, he was a dedicated Marxist and served in the International Brigade in the Spanish Civil War.

In February, 1959, MASFERRER came to Miami, Florida, went into hiding and was considered a war criminal.

In June, 1959, he became active in anti-FIDEL CASTRO matters, bought airplanes and arms and planned to operate from Guatemala against Cuba.

In February, 1960, the Federal Bureau of Investigation arrested two representatives of the Cuban Government in Miami who were sent to Miami to kidnap MASFERRER and bring him back to Cuba.

In March, 1960, MASFERRER was planning to invade Cuba and U. S. Immigration and Naturalization Service ordered him to leave the Florida area.

In January, 1961, police closed down a barracks in Miami where MASFERRER was housing a small invasion group. In April, 1961, he was indicted in U. S. Federal Court for violation of the Neutrality Act. The indictment was later dismissed. A federal judge ordered MASFERRER to leave the Miami area and in August, 1961, he moved to New Jersey.

In October, 1962, U. S. Customs seized an arms shipment belonging to MASFERRER that was designated for the Bahamas.

In August, 1963, MASFERRER recruited men and obtained arms and explosives for an invasion of Haiti. He chartered a plane for the invasion, sent 120 men to the Florida Keys and then abandoned his plans. The 120 men in the Keys returned to their homes.

In October, 1966, MASFERRER formed another invasion force to attack Haiti. In December, 1966, testified at a federal grand jury

that

In January, 1967, MASFERRER assembled an invasion force of seventy men in the Florida Keys. These men were arrested by U. S. Customs and arms were seized.

In February, 1967, MASFERRER and five others were indicted for exporting munitions of war. In November, 1967, they were convicted and MASFERRER received a four year jail sentence.

In 1973, MASFERRER returned to Miami, dropped out of Cuban revolutionary activities and continued operating his newspaper "Libertad."

On October 31, 1975, MASFERRER was blown up by dynamite when he turned on the ignition of his automobile. Some members of MASFERRER's family admitted he had been engaged in extortion of the "Cuban Mafia" and narcotics dealers in Miami and that retaliation was taken against him. The police and the Cuban exile community concurred in this information. The Miami office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation cooperated with local authorities by assisting in the crime scene search and conducting laboratory examinations of evidence in this matter.







Result of examination:

Q1 and Q2 were searched through the Anonymous Letter File and were not associated with any specimens presently on record. Representative copies were added to the file for future reference.

The questioned typewritten entries on Ql and Q2 correspond to Laboratory standards for a Letter Gothic type style, measuring 2.12 mm per character, which is available on IBM, Camwil, CSA, DSG and other type sources of both foreign and domestic manufacture.

Q2 is a photocopy which was produced on a photocopier employing dry toner and the hard/soft roller fusion method. Numerous photocopier brand names of both foreign and domestic manufacture should be considered as possible sources.




