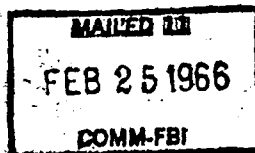

[REDACTED] TODAY ADVISED SA [REDACTED] THAT KORSHAK TOLD HIM HE HAD CONTACTED [REDACTED] SHERIFF, CLARK COUNTY, LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, AND INFORMED [REDACTED] THAT IF HE COULD NOT HANDLE THE TAXI CAB STRIKE IN LAS VEGAS, KORSHAK WOULD SEND IN OUTSIDE STRIKEBREAKERS AND SETTLE THE SITUATION. SOURCE ADVISED KORSHAK WENT TO CHICAGO ACCOMPANIED BY [REDACTED] WHILE MRS. KORSHAK IS VACATIONING IN ACAPULCO, MEXICO WITH [REDACTED] also known as [REDACTED] AKA. [REDACTED] KORSHAK HAS PREVIOUSLY INDICATED TO SOURCE THAT HE LOOKS AFTER THE ITALIAN INTEREST IN LAS VEGAS. KORSHAK WAS REPORTEDLY IN LAS VEGAS FOR ONE DAY AND RETURNED TO LOS ANGELES FEBRUARY 24, INSTANT.

Pursuant to the Director's inquiry with reference to [redacted] resignation from [redacted] for his refusing to endorse Korshak for political office, the following is submitted:

Sidney Korshak, an attorney, was born in 1907 and admitted to the practice of law in Illinois in 1930. He maintains law offices at 134 North La Salle Street, Chicago, Illinois, and has residences in Chicago, Los Angeles, Las Vegas and Paris, France. He is involved in other operations, including parking facilities and labor union activities. He has been described as one of the highest priced attorneys in the country and as having personal wealth amounting to several millions of dollars.

His brother, Marshall Korshak, is a graduate of the John Marshall Law School, Chicago, and is a well-known attorney in Illinois. Marshall has held a position as state senator in Illinois and has also been a successful candidate for the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago. Sidney and Marshall are associated with each other in legal activities in Chicago. Marshall has been rumored as possibly taking over for United States Senator Douglas in the event Douglas is re-elected.

In 1955, Sidney Korshak and Murray Humphreys (former notorious Chicago hoodlum, now deceased) were subjects in a possible Labor Management Relations Act of 1947 violation involving the Goldblatt Brothers, Inc., Department Store, Chicago, Illinois. The facts developed in this investigation were presented to the Department and prosecution was declined in November, 1955.

In 1962, the New York State Liquor Authority was investigating the activities of one [redacted] Chicago, Illinois. [redacted] was alleged to have exercised

control over certain officials of the State Liquor Authority in New York and of the Illinois State Liquor Control Board in Chicago. An informant advised that [REDACTED] was a close associate of both Sidney and Marshall Korshak and was reported to be the contact man between the Korshaks and [REDACTED]

In addition to his association with Humphreys, Bureau files reveal Sidney Korshak's association with other well-known hoodlums, including [REDACTED] and Jake Freedman (now deceased), at one time head of all gambling operations in Houston, Texas.

Sidney has cultivated association with nationally-known movie personalities, such as Tony Martin, Dinah Shore, George Montgomery and Cyd Charisse. In 1962, he was described as one of the biggest persons in the country who had a pipe line right to the Government in Washington, meaning that Korshak was friendly with high-placed Federal officials. In confirmation of this, it was established that he enjoyed a close relationship with former Vice President Alben Barkley, former Secretary of Labor Arthur Goldberg and Jacob Arvey, Illinois Democratic committeeman.

Sidney reportedly represents Chicago hoodlum interests in Las Vegas gambling casinos and has been associated with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of [REDACTED]. He is associated with James Riddle Hoffa and has been reported to be the "man behind the scenes" in a number of major labor disputes and the center of labor rackets in Chicago.

Sidney Korshak, according to informants, received \$100,000 a year retainer from Walter O'Malley, owner of the Dodger Baseball Club for allegedly settling a labor dispute involving parking facilities at the new Los Angeles Dodger Stadium.

Marshall Korshak is currently a candidate for Cook County Treasurer on the Democratic ticket.

Our files do not disclose that we have an arrest record for Sidney or his brother, Marshall.

[REDACTED] called me from Chicago at 4:20 p.m. this afternoon. He stated that 20 minutes before his call he had submitted his resignation to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] had called him in [REDACTED] and had asked him point-blank whether or not [REDACTED] should accede to the pressure in endorsing one Sydney Korshak for a political office. [REDACTED] stated that Korshak was a corrupt politician, was closely tied into hoodlums, and that if such endorsement should take place he, [REDACTED] would submit his resignation immediately.

b7c [REDACTED] called [REDACTED] back in this afternoon and stated that [REDACTED] would have to endorse Korshak for political office. [REDACTED] stated that under the circumstances he would not work [REDACTED] that would bow to such corrupt pressure. He therefore submitted his resignation.

While we do not know both sides of the story, [REDACTED] is a very honest, forthright individual and it would appear that he did resign because of the above action. He indicated he hopes to line up employment with [REDACTED]

THIS INFORMANT STATED THAT KORSHAK'S ASSISTANT IS A PERSON NAMED MURRAY "THE CAMEL" HUMPHRIES, A NOTORIOUS CHICAGO HOODLUM WHO CONSUMMATES THE PAYOFFS TO UNION OFFICIALS FROM KORSHAK AND WHO FURTHER, BY STRONG ARM METHODS, PREVENTS ANY LABOR DIFFICULTIES FROM EFFECTING [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] THIS INFORMANT STATED THAT AN EMPLOYEE OF [REDACTED] NAMED [REDACTED] AFTER ATTEMPTING TO FORM A UNION AT [REDACTED] PCI FURTHER STATED THAT IN HIS OPINION THIS CASE, TOGETHER WITH THE CHICAGO RESTAURANT ASSOCIATION, CONSTITUTE TWO OF THE BIGGEST LABOR RACKETEERING SETUPS IN THE CHICAGO AREA. IT IS NOTED THAT THIS PCI FURNISHED RELIABLE AND HIGHLY IMPORTANT INFORMATION CONCERNING

[REDACTED] provided the writer with figures on all money paid to KORSHAK which shows at the present time he is paid \$10,000 annually. [REDACTED] denies any money paid to KORSHAK or any other person for the purpose of paying off union officials to lay off. This investigation is predicated upon information furnished by [redacted] of known reliability. [redacted] advised that [redacted] consisting of approximately [redacted] in the Chicago area, has for a number of years been paying off to Attorney SIDNEY KORSHAK in Chicago for the purpose of preventing [redacted] from becoming unionized and also for the purpose of preventing labor or other troubles affecting the above store.

[redacted] stated that KORSHAK's assistant is a person named MURRAY "THE CAMEL" HUMPHRIES, a notorious Chicago hoodlum, who consummates the pay-offs to union officials for KORSHAK and who further by strong arm methods prevents any labor difficulties from affecting [redacted]

[redacted] stated that an employee of [redacted] named [redacted] was killed in 1933 after attempting to form a union at [redacted]

[redacted] President of [redacted] was interviewed in his office by SA [redacted] and the writer. [redacted] was advised of his rights that he did not have to answer any questions by the agents and that he had the right to have a counsel present.

[redacted] agreed to answer pertinent questions that he could and did not avail himself of counsel.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] operates [redacted] located in Chicago. He stated that the company is at the present time in the process of building [redacted]

With regard to SIDNEY KORSHAK [redacted] stated that he is retained by [redacted] as a labor consultant and is paid by the company on a retainer basis. However, he stated that [redacted] of Fritsker and Fritsker, attorneys, was the company's regular labor relations

attorney and that SIDNEY KORSHAK is called in primarily when a stalemate is reached.

[redacted] indicated that he was personally acquainted with SIDNEY KORSHAK and that their families have social contacts, and he also indicated that his wife and the wife of SIDNEY KORSHAK had a common interest [redacted]

[redacted] stated that, to the best of his recollection, he met SIDNEY KORSHAK approximately in 1949 at some social gathering. It was [redacted] recollection that at this time he mentioned to SIDNEY KORSHAK that he was having some labor trouble and requested SIDNEY KORSHAK to look into the matter. [redacted] at the time of interview, did not recall the specific matter but it was his recollection that SIDNEY KORSHAK handled this matter very expediently, and [redacted] then offered to pay him and eventually paid him on a retainer basis.

b7c [redacted] stated that, to his recollection, Pritzker and Pritzker, their regular labor relations attorneys, had been in the past paid in the neighborhood of \$35,000 per year, but this amount had been decreased in the last few years to about \$20,000, and SIDNEY KORSHAK, who was first paid on a retainer basis about three or four years ago, has been increased from approximately \$2,000 to \$9,000.

[redacted] called his comptroller, [redacted] and through [redacted] furnished the exact figures paid to Mr. KORSHAK which are as follows: [redacted] explained to the writer that [redacted] are on a thirteen period year and that the following payments were made:

1st period, 1950, to MARSHAL KORSHAK - \$250.00
2nd period, 1950, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$2,000.00
4th period, 1950, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$2,000.00
13th period, 1950, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$2,000.00
March 26, 1951, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$2,000.00
December 28, 1951, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$4,000.00
May 19, 1952, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$2,000.00
January 31, 1953, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$5,000.00
April 24, 1953, to SIDNEY KORSHAK and ROTHMAN, \$5,000.00

January 8, 1954, to SIDNEY KORSHAK - \$10,000.00

[redacted] noted that the payment of January 8, 1954, was for the calendar year 1954 in advance.

With regard to Mr. KORSHAK's activities for him, [redacted] stated that SIDNEY KORSHAK is primarily a labor attorney representing the labor unions. However, he stated that he has been helpful in certain instances and others he has been unsuccessful in doing anything for [redacted]

[redacted] stated that in dealing with the Butchers Union, which is operated by a man by the name of [redacted] negotiations with them are direct and KORSHAK is not used.

[redacted] felt it was unfair to be forced to accept the terms of a contract that were negotiated by union with some other employer and therefore, had KORSHAK negotiate to get [redacted] off the so-called industrial list.

With regard to the money paid to SIDNEY KORSHAK, [redacted] stated that the retainer paid to him was for his services performed but none of the funds were intended

b7c [to be passed on to any other person to influence the labor relations or for the purpose of making pay-offs to union officials to lay off of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he would estimate that the number of unionized people in [REDACTED] was approximately 5 per cent, and that the bulk of the employees, consisting of clerks and office employees, are not unionized.

With regard to MURRAY HUMPHRIES, [REDACTED] stated that he believes at one time during the JACK MC GURN days he may have met MURRAY HUMPHRIES, but he denies knowing the man or that he is used by KORSHAK to strong arm any labor difficulties [REDACTED] might have.

It is to be noted that these figures furnished by Mr. SIDNEY KORSHAK are in agreement with the figures furnished by [REDACTED] as to the amount paid to SIDNEY KORSHAK and his associates.

Mr. SIDNEY KORSHAK stated that although he receives a retainer fee from [REDACTED] legal services, he does not handle labor matters for them with the exception of one instance. Mr. SIDNEY KORSHAK stated that [REDACTED] of the firm Pritsker, Pritsker and Clinton, did the labor work for [REDACTED] and he has not participated in these negotiations except in 1952 or 1953 when he sat down with [REDACTED] of the Teamsters Union of Gary, Indiana. Mr. SIDNEY KORSHAK stated that these negotiations, consisting of two or three meetings, took place at Schmidt's Restaurant,

[REDACTED] was unable to offer any evidence of the above allegation other than to say that SIDNEY KORSHAK was an attorney who never appeared in court and to [REDACTED] knowledge, never did anything for his clients that warranted the large fees that were paid to him. [REDACTED] is therefore of the opinion that the fees paid to SIDNEY KORSHAK were for the purpose of making some kind of pay offs and inasmuch as [REDACTED] understood SIDNEY KORSHAK was paid a substantial fee by [REDACTED] it was his belief that such fee was to be used at least in part for some type of pay off.

[REDACTED] alleged that SIDNEY KORSHAK was the center of a ring of attorneys who always sprang to the defense of Chicago hoodlums when they became involved in trouble and he named as other attorneys in this ring, [REDACTED]

This, according to [REDACTED] together with the fact that SIDNEY KORSHAK had been seen around Fritzell's Restaurant in Chicago with MURRAY HUMPHREYS indicated SIDNEY KORSHAK's connection with the hoodlum element. [REDACTED] referred to the fact that during the Kefauver hearings, SIDNEY KORSHAK's name was connected with various underworld characters in Chicago, and that sometime in September, 1951, a person by the name of LESTER LIEVEY (PH), wrote a series of articles for Colliers Magazine on KORSHAK's hoodlum connections.

[REDACTED] also stated that it was possible that [REDACTED] made payoffs to hoodlums and union officials by placing orders for their food department through local firms that were controlled by persons who [REDACTED] described as undesirable.
