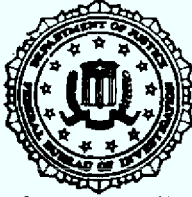

b7c [redacted] Marshal of the U. S. Supreme Court, on June 19, 1954, furnished the attached letters which were received in the same envelope postmarked Harlan, Kentucky, Mo., 19, 1954, 6 P.M. The letters read as follows:

"Dear Sirs,

"I hate your 'stinkin' decision about making the nigers going to school with us. You are a stupid bunch of 'crumbuns'. I hate you for this. We don't care if we are violating the 14th amendment. You are crazy 'dats'. If you like nigers you are crazy. All the people hate nigers down here and get in fights all the time. You better not go through with this or we will cut your throats.

"Bye-bye for now you 'stinkin' niger-lovers.

"The Niger-Haters of the South

"Save your 'confederate money boys for the south's gonna rise again."

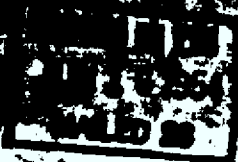

The following investigation was conducted in an effort to determine the identity of individuals using the names STONSWALL JACKSON, ROBERT E. LEE and JEFFERSON DAVIS, who mailed the extorting letters to the Supreme Court Justices of the United States, these letters being post marked Earlan, Kentucky, and dated May 19, 1954.

[REDACTED] Earlan High School advised that she had no suspects in this case, however, it was felt that it is quite possible that these letters might have been written by a student or students of this school, due to the fact that in the past there has been some difficulties between the students of Earlan High and students in the community. **[REDACTED]** felt that the reference

In one of the letters stating "They have a decision of your walks and the sidewalk" might be significant is that both the Harlan High School and the colored High School are located very close to each other and the students pass each other going and coming from school and during the early part of the year there were some difficulties in that respect that reached school authorities that the colored and white grade school students were pushing each other off of the sidewalk. [redacted] could furnish no specific names concerning these incidents. [redacted] recalled that these pushing incidents happened between girls and she did not feel that the letters written in this case are the type that would be written by eighth grade girls. [redacted] has heard nothing about the students who were [redacted] anyone written letters to the Supreme Court of the United States.

[redacted] and stated that at the present time he would be unable to determine if any of the Harlan High School students has written the letter since school is no longer in session. He stated that there were approximately 120 students in High School and 200 in grade school and he had no names in mind who might have written such letters. He felt that if a check were taken he might be able to ascertain who had written these letters and he further suggested that during the course of tests at this school a question could be included in such tests on racial segregation and possibly it might be determined if any of these students had written such letters. He also suggested that if the extortion letters in [redacted] were [redacted] they might be shown to different school teachers who would start [redacted] and the writing on these letters might be compared with the work of the teachers. SYNOPSIS OF FACTS

Two anonymous letters, postmarked MAY 10, 1954 at 6:00 P.M. Harlan, Kentucky, were received in an envelope addressed to Supreme Court, Washington, District of Columbia. Contents of both letters refer to Supreme Court decision relating to segregation, and one contains a statement that, "You better not go through with this or we will see your threats." The laboratory examination reflected that a positive comparison could not be reached as to whether all of the questioned writing on the envelope and letters was prepared by the person. No identification was made in the anonymous letter file. Fingerprint examination produced one latent fingerprint of value for comparison on each of the letters. Marshall, U. S. Supreme Court, advised that he is taking necessary precautions. MPD 100-15500

On June 11, 1954 [REDACTED] advised that he had taken all necessary precautions at the Supreme Court as a result of having received these letters.

Chief of Police ROBERT MURRAY, Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., was advised of the receipt of these letters by the U. S. Supreme Court.

The FBI Laboratory furnished the results of an examination concerning instant letters by communication dated June 14, 1954 which reflected that the writing on the two letters and the envelope were searched through the appropriate section of the Anonymous Letter File but no identification was made. The envelope was described as a white envelope having no water mark, measuring approximately 6.5 x 3.5 inches. The address on the envelope was written in script handwriting with a medium lead pencil. One of the letters was written on a sheet of ruled notebook paper which contained five holes on the left margin. This paper contained no water mark, it measures approximately 8 x 10.4 inches and is ruled on both sides with twenty-seven blue lines spaced about 0.2 inches apart. The front and reverse sides of this paper have red vertical lines spaced 1.2 inches from the left edge of the sheet. The other letter is a sheet of paper similar in physical respects. The message of one letter is written in script in blue-black ink and a portion in blue-green ink, whereas the writing on the other letter is written in script with blue ink. Due to distortion, a positive conclusion was not reached by the FBI Laboratory as to whether all of the questioned writing was prepared by one person.

One latent fingerprint of value for comparison was developed on each of the two letters.

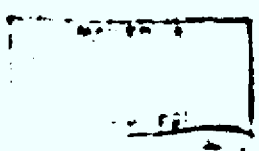
