In connection with its ongoing investigation into investigative matters of the FBI which involved surreptitious entry, the Civil Rights Division forwarded on 4/21/76 a memorandum requesting: review of a number of Headquarters and field files relating to entry activity in Arab terrorist and black extremist matters; review of a number of files relating to Socialist Workers Party (SWP) candidates, members, organizers, and a campaign worker; review of Detroit, Michigan, records regarding certain alleged SWP bur-

glaries or break-ins; an investigative report pertaining to access to review "each and every Bureau file" pertaining "in any way possible" to the SWP and the Weather Underground Organization (WUO); review of the "SAC Folders" recently discovered in the New York Office, as well as a canvass of all field offices for similar materials; information as to whether or not the Bureau was conducting or contemplating conducting an investigation by the Inspection Division into the surreptitious entry question, particularly four entries recently discovered at New York which occurred two in 1972, and two in 1973; and, copies of communications between Headquarters and field offices f garding efforts made to ascertain the scope of entries against the SWP and WUO. 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DETAILS:

In connection with its continuing investigation into investigative matters involving surreptitious entry, the Civil Rights Division forwarded on 4/21/76 a request for certain material and access to review a voluminous number of files.

Category A of the 4/21/76 request appears to relate almost exclusively to Arab terrorist matters. The attached copy of the request notes the subject of files we have been able to identify to date.

Category B of the request concerns the SWP, its members, candidates, and officials. The request does not specify the reason as to why the files are being requested for review. It is presumed that the Department has some indications that the individuals named were past targets of surreptitious entries.

Ouestion 9, Category B, asks that we review Detroit, Michigan records for information relating to alleged burglaries of the SWP in Michigan from 1970 to 1973. Fulfilling this request obviously depends on the cooperation afforded the Bureau by the

It is not clear why this particular question has been posed, unless the Department expects to discover break-ins that may subsequently be attributed to Bureau activities. We propose to attempt to clarify this question with Mr. Gardner prior to taking the requested action.

New York, by attached nitel, is being alerted to the requests in Questions 1, 2, and 4, Category C. With respect to Question 3, we initiated a survey of all field offices in a communication of 4/13/76. When the results are assembled, we will immediately notify the Department.

Question 4, Category C, asks the Bureau to furnish "each and every Bureau file pertaining in any way possible to the Socialist Workers Party and the Weather Underground Organization," including JUNE files, etc. This request includes Headquarters and field office files (all field offices). We are quite literally speaking of thousands of sections of files, and what amounts to a logistical problem of huge proportion.

Mr. Gardner indicated subsequent to his written request that he does not expect each and every file to be on hand in any one location for his immediate review, but that we should be prepared to furnish at his request and within a reasonable period of time the files he might wish to review. For example, on his visit to New York to review the SAC folders and the SWP and WUO files, he would expect to have the SAC folders immediately available for review. Should a file within those folders come to his attention that he feels necessary to review, he would expect the file to be made available at that time. The same would apply to the SWP and WUO files: that the organization files be on hand for ready review (for instance, sections 1 - 50 initially, then on request sections 51 - 100, and so forth). Where additional files are noted as being pertinent to his review. Mr. Gardner will request same and would like to have them made available.

Since Gardner's review will amount to a rather wide-ranging inquiry into our files, all offices will be instructed to record accurately what information and material is made available.


With respect to Question 5, Category C, whether or not the Bureau was conducting or contemplating conducting an internal investigation of the surreptitious entry question, particularly two entries in 1972, and two entries in 1973, contact with Mr. Pottinger's office by our office of the Deputy Associate Director (Investigation) on 4/22/76 resulted in the determination that Mr. Pottinger's assistants would conduct first review of these matters at New York.

To set forth our proposed action with respect to Question 5, page 4, of a 4/21/76 request of the Civil Rights Division (copy attached).

SYNOPSIS:

62-117166-X108 In a 4/21/76 request, the Civil Rights Division asked whether our "Inspection Division currently has any investigations underway or contemplated regarding surreptitious entries by Bureau personnel, including, but not limited to, two entries in 1972 and two entries in 1973 into residence of alleged WUO (Weather Underground Organization persons." Information concerning these entries was recently transmitted to Headquarters from New York, and resulted from a review there of SAC folders. On learning of this material, particularly the entries within the Statute of Limitations, the Director indicated that the documents should be reviewed. On 4/22/76, Mr. James Turner, Deputy to Assistant Attorney General Pottinger, was contacted about our intention to have the Inspection Division examine this matter. We communicated our concern that our prior review of the documents might jeopardize, interfere with, or disrupt the Departmental review. Mr. Turner contacted Mr. Pottinger who indicated he would prefer that Civil Rights Division have first review of the documents in question. Mr. William L. Gardner, Departmental Attorney handling the Civil Rights Division's inquiry, was advised on 4/23/76 of our decision not to conduct a review of this material until his review is completed.

DETAILS:

In a 4/21/76 request, the Civil Rights Division asked whether or not our Inspection Division had any investigations underway or contemplated regarding surreptitious entries performed by Bureau personnel, particularly, but not limited to, two entries performed in 1972 and two entries in 1973, all against "alleged WUO persons."

Information concerning the four specific entries mentioned by the Civil Rights Division, as well as information about numerous other entries which occurred since January 1, 1966, was furnished to Headquarters following. New York's review of 25 volumes of SAC folders discovered in that office.

On learning of the discovery of this material, Director Kelley indicated that the documents in question should be reviewed, especially that material showing entries falling within the Statute of Limitations.

Prior to any action in this regard, we received on 4/21/76 a Departmental request. Since a review of this material by our Inspection Division might conceivably jeopardize, or act at cross purposes to the Civil Rights Division's inquiry, a decision was made to speak with Assistant Attorney General Pottinger for his views.

On 4/22/76, Mr. Pottinger's Deputy, Mr. James Turner, was contacted by Mr. Adams, and the areas of possible conflict as regards this review by the Bureau and Department were discussed with him. Mr. Turner communicated our views to Mr. Pottinger, who was then out of town, and Mr. Pottinger

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

indicated he would prefer to review the pertinent materials in advance of any internal investigation by the Bureau. Detroit Office regarding this matter. FBIHQ may or may not have advanced information regarding any contact of the Detroit Office regarding this matter. Nevertheless, Detroit should be prepared to cooperate in the event of such contact. An accumulation of files in anticipation of such a contact is unnecessary. However, a list of files in response to this request should be prepared in order that necessary files can be readily obtained if such contact occurs.

By "available for review" Mr. Cardner has indicated he would like to have sufficient number of files on hand to insure a continuous review. As he reviews the SWP files, he expects to be able to have within a reasonable amount of time additional files (June, informant, subs, enclosures, etc.) which he identifies from the main case file as being pertinent to the inquiry.

The voluminous amount of material being sought for review will result in some limitation on the time available to conduct an adequate review of substantive files to insure concealment of informants. If informant files are called for review by the Departmental Attorney, such files are not to be made available. Immediately refer the matter to FBIRQ for consideration.

The method by which the files are supplied is left to your discretion. However, it is expected that every effort be made to avoid unnecessary delay in furnishing files to him.

You should resolve any question as to whether or not a particular file should be provided by contacting appropriate substantive desk at FBIRQ.

You should also insure that personnel assigned to assist in obtaining material for review are not connected with those entry matters which are to be reviewed. You should also be aware that Departmental Attorneys do not desire to speak with personnel involved in any aspect of the matters which they are to review.
