Today I talked to Assistant Director AL BELMONT who advised that the Bureau is extremely interested in the full utilization of all investigative techniques, including those of "bag jobs."

He stated that it is the responsibility of the SAC, ASAC, or the Supervisor in Charge to advise the Assistant Director involved and request authority for this investigative technique. He said briefly set out the facts of the case and the potential value of the operation and be sure there is no fishing expedition. We should be satisfied that proper planning has been put into effect in that the individual in the field who is making this recommendation is fully assured of complete security.

when such technique is used an informal memo should be filed in the SAC's office which will be available to the inspection staff, after which they can be destroyed. The same information should be sent to the Bureau in order that the proper officials can become cognizant.

Only stable and dedicated agents should be utilized on this type of technique.





On July 28, 1976, in connection with a recent INTD-initiated survey of all field offices to determine whether or not their respective informant symbol number indices contained numbers assigned to surreptitious entries, the New York Office consulted INTD as to the identity of certain symbol numbers which that office could not identify. The following INTD search located a reference to the main file, "Security Informant Program." (X)

A review of the New York Division main case sub-file "Security Informant Program," showed a number of memoranda showing assignment of informant symbol numbers to "highly confidential sources." This review was made on July 30, 1976. No symbol numbers for New York were located in this file which fall within the scope of your inquiry, or which have not been previously furnished to you. (%)

The standard filing procedure for memoranda dealing with highly sensitive confidential sources calls for filing in the "JUNE" section of the main case file. As mentioned above, the "JUNE" section of "Security Informant Program" was reviewed on April 30, 1976. To insure that our search for memoranda dealing with "highly confidential source" symbol numbers was thorough, on August 2 and 3, 1976, an in-depth review was made of the "Security Informant Program" main case file for all other offices. This review failed to disclose memoranda showing assignment of symbol numbers to "highly confidential sources," however, one symbol number was located which falls within the scope of your inquiry. The program was first initiated in New York and was later expanded to Washington, D. C.; Seattle, Washington; Los Angeles, California; and to Detroit, Michigan. It was suspended in all offices except New York and Washington, D. C., in 1963 and was discontinued there in July, 1966.

INTO conducted reviews of numerous files, indices and other material over the past 12 months for information concerning entries and no information has been located indicating the Birmingham Office ever communicated to FBIHQ a request to conduct an entry against any group.

A review of FBIHQ file (66-2542-3) dealing with confidential informants, showing assignment of symbol numbers to all types of informant coverage including "anonymous sources" and "highly confidential sources," failed to show the assignment by the Birmingham Office of any symbol number to activity which could be interpreted as possibly involving surreptitious entry

A review of informant symbol number indices maintained by the CI-5 Section of the INTD which records the assignment of symbol numbers to sources other than live sources (predominantly electronic surveillance matters) failed to locate any informant symbol number card for the Birmingham Office which could possibl be interpreted as referring to a surreptitious entry. Informant symbol number cards for the Birmingham Office in this file begin as early as 1943.

Fieldwide surveys of March 18, 1976, and April 13, 197 for SAC knowledge of entry activity and for documents pertaining to entry activity, respectively, met with negative responses fro the Birmingham Office.



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

### Acted as Head Of FBI Office In Birmingham

FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley, while serving as special agent in charge of the Birmingham, Ala, field office in the late 1950s, requested authorization from Washington head-quarters for at least one break-in, according to a knowledgeable source.

The source, who formerly held a high position in the bureau, said that Kelley approved the request for authorization that went to headquarters, based on a recommendation from the agent heading the investigation.

The source said he could not recall the investigative reason for the surreptitious entry request from the Birmingham office. But he said it was made between December 1957 and November 1960 when Kelley was special agent in charge there.

ONE REASON FOR the request, a bureau official speculated yesterday could have been that in 1956, about a year before Kelley took over the Bir mingham office, the FBI initiated its controversial counterintelligence operation, Cointelpro. Its first targe was the Communist party-U.S.A. and the official speculated that the Birmingham office might have been investigating a Communist group it the area. The FBI was also active against the Ku Klux Klan during that period.

Break-ins were among the investigative techniques used by the bureau during Conintelpro — a concerted effort to harass, discredit and disrup organizations that were considered threats to the country. Cointelprivas ended in 1971.

Kelley, through a bureau spokes man, did not deny the source's asser tion yesterday, but said he could "no recall" requesting a surreptitiou entry while serving in Birmingham But, Kelley emphasized, "If I did have a recollection I would have no hesitancy in admitting it."

At the time of the alleged request the source said, Kelley was "whole heartedly in favor" of break-ins a an investigative technique in intelligence investigations. "He was

traditionalist. He never objected to those techniques when he was a SAC."

The source said that, during his time in the bureau, "there never was a special agent in charge who didn't understand and approve of surreptitious entries. No one ever complained, they all approved. Kelley was fully cognizant of those operations and he approved."

THE ASSERTION by the former bureau official concerning Kelley's past activities is the first that links the director to the past abuses instituted and authorized by the late FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

Hoover ostensibly ended the use of surreptitious entries in 1966, but the Justice Department is now probing break-ins carried out by agents in 1972 and 1973.

For the period prior to 1966, few if any seconds are believed to exist that could prove or disprove Kelley's alleged involvement in requesting authorization for a break-in.

Standard procedure at the time was to destroy all documents relating to surreptitious entries within a year. Within that year, according to findings of the Senste Intelligence Committee, the "Do Not File" procedure called for holding the records in the office safes of special agents in charge.

A bureau official, discussing the source's assertion that Kelley requested a break-in, said:

"In those days, prior to 1968, all of the people in the field (including Kelley) felt that if Hoover authorized it (break-ins), he got authority from higher up, such as an attorney general. They (agents) thus felt it to be a legal and valuable technique."

The Senate Intelligence Committee concluded that there was no indication that any attorney general was informed of the so-called "black bag jobs."

WITH KELLEY identified as having allegedly requested approval for a break-in, the two top officals of the

beleagured bureau have been linked to what are considered to be the wrongful past abuses of power authorized during the Hoover reign.

Richard G. Held, named by Kelley last month as the bureau's No. 2 man, headed the Minneapolis field office in the late 1960s and early 1970s when that office targeted Cointelpro activities against groups there

activites against groups there.

As a result of news reports concerning those activities, Held issued a statement accepting responsibility for all actions "good or bad" that flowed from the office. But Held emphasized that, "I was not in any decision-making positions when this program was instituted, nor did I direct it while the program (Cointelpro) was active."

He laid the blame for any possible wrongdoing on headquarters officials who "instituted and directed" Cointelpro and contended that "it was our responsibility to implement" it.

It was understood yesterday that Kelley, who was said to have approved Held's statement, takes a similar view for any such activities in which he was involved while serving in the field for 21 years before retiring from the bureau in Oct. 1961. After serving as chief of the Kalsas City police department, he returend to the bureau as director in 1973, a year after Hoover died.

KELLEY HAS NEVER acknowl-

edged participating in break-ins while serving in the field. "I'm not saying that Clarence Kelley engaged in such activities or did not engage in these activities," he said at a July 14 press conference.

But Kelley characterized the areas in which surreptitious entries were used prior to 1968 as those involving counterintelligence or national se-

Earlier this year Kelley publicly apologized for past FBI misdeeds and subtly criticized Hoover for allowing the abuses. But Kelley did not list the activities he considered wrong.

Kelley consistently maintained until the 1972-73 break-ins came to light that such activities ended with Hoover's 1966 directive. Earlier this month, however, Kelley charged that he had been deliberately "deceived" by aides who withheld from him knowledge of the later break-ins.

- a. The "Chicago Report", so-called. More specifically, a report compiled by the Chicago Office of the F.B.L. detailing the relationship of members of The Weatherman organization and foreign governments or agents.
- b. Any and all wiretaps or electronic surveillance conducted by any Government agency including, but not limited to, the U.S. Armed Forces, the National Security Agency, F.B.L., C.I.A., and Department of State, and more specifically, a wiretap or interception by C.I.A. or National Security Agency agents or any other Government agency of one William Ayers, which tap or interception indicates contact with the Government of North Vietnam.

It would appear that classified national security material and information, including that of a sensitive compartmented character, may become subject to disclosure in this matter. In accordance with Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 17.55, I am reporting this possible compromise of classified material to you and, by a copy of this memorandum, to the Chairman of the Department Review Committee. (3)

Since Sensitive Compartmented Information originating with the National Security Agency may become subject to disclosure, you may desire to consult with that Agency regarding necessary clearance procedures. Also, you may desire to afford former Special Agent Kearney and his counsel, Hubert J. Santos, clearance for access to information classified by this Department and to secure their agreement to abide by the Department's regulations concerning access to, security of and disclosure of classified information. 



ADDENDUM BY LEGAL COUNSEL


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This memorandum was referred to me for comment at 9:34 a.m. on June 10, 1977, by Mr. Revell, Executive Assistant to the Associate Director.

Title 28, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 17.55, provides for a report to be made to the Security Officer of the Division (FBI); to the Security Officerof the Department; and to the Department Review Committee concerning possible compromise of classified national security information or material. There is no provision in that section calling for specific notification of the Attorney General of possible compromise of such information or material. Further, the three items described in the memorandum (Ayers case; Chicago memo 8-20-76; and Kearney's Discovery Motion) apparently have been made available to the Department previously. My opinion is that if this memorandum is intended merely to comply with the provisions of 28 CFR 17.55 it need not be addressed to the Attorney General in order to accomplish that purpose. If the memorandum has some other purpose which justifies it being sent to the Attorney General, such other purpose could be more clearly expressed in order to avoid pessible misconstruction by the Attorney General.






