Intelligence Division, in obtaining information requested by plaintiffs, convessed all field offices concerning physical entries directed against plaintiffs and obtained documents revealing that from 1/15/60 through 7/1/66, the new York Office conducted 93 physical entries against Socialist Workers Party (SUP) and Young Socialist Alliance (YSA). New York Office possesses approximately 25 volumes of documents concerning all physical entries conducted by that office from the 1/40s through 1925. Intelligence Division advised additional information requested by plaintiffs will be available to furnish to the USA, SDNY, by 3/24/76.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. That upon receipt of information and documents from INTO concerning additional items requested by plaintiffs Legal Counsel Division correspond with USA, SDWY, and the Dapartment,
- 2. That INTO furnith pertinent information to the Department concerning our investigation of YSA and SWP in an effort to obtain an early decision concerning the effect of the new guidelines on the FBI's investigation of plaintiffs;

DATAILS:

Plaintiffs, the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), its youth group the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA), and fifteen individual plaintiffs, filed captioned civil action during 7/73, alleging that defendancs, the FEI, other Governmental agencies and officers, have denied them constitutional rights as a political party. They seek substantial damages as well as broad injunctive relief. On 1/7/75, the court in captioned civil action ordered us to produce fall files relating to everything dathered about the plaintiffs, including the results of surveillance conducted of the SWP or the YSA, and documents relating to the purpose of such surveillance. Subsequently, the Department, through the USA, SDNY, released a substantial number of FRI documents in discovery in this civil action. Items released included SFP Disruption Program documents, semi-angual national SMP and YSA resorts. investigative reports and cortain letterhead memoranda concerning individual plaintiffs and Counterintelligence Program (CCINIEIFRO) New Loft and CCINIELFRO Communist Party, USA documents concerning plaintiffs.

By letter dated 11/5/75, Thomas J. Cabill, CSA, SPNY, enclosed a list, copy attached, of 25 additional items which plaintiffs requested from the FBI in discovery in this civil action. Pocuments requested included those pertaining to any "intelligence gathering burglaries" directed adainst plaintiffs. By letter dated 12/1/75, copy attached, the Director informed Hr. Cabill which of the 26 items this Bureau is willing to produce in this lawsuit and which we object to producing on grounds of privilege or relevancy.

On 3/16/75, MUSA Steven J. Glassman, SDMY, who is handling this civil action, advised that on 3/10/76, the court entered an order in this lawsuit, copy attached, specifying that on or before 3/24/76, the Federal defendants will respond to all outstanding requests for documents and that the trial of this civil action will commence on 7/1/76. AUSA Glassman emphasized that every effort should be made to nave materials requested by plaintiffs furnished to his by the above mate. The FMI should furnish information consistent with the Limeton's letter to Mr. Cabill dated 12/1/75. Privileged and administrative date, including the names of Eureau personnel, should be deleted from the

documents we are now producing. Both a true copy of the document as it appears in Bureau files as well as a copy with deletions should be furnished to the USA, SDNY. Of course, only copies with deletions will be furnished to plaintiffs.

AUSA Glassman was informed that the Department's quidelines concerning PRI security investigations will be implemented in the near future and that these quidelines could affect the FBI's investigation of plaintiffs. Noting that the plaintiffs are attenuting to obtain an injunction in this civil action, AUSA Glassman felt it would be extremely helpful to have the Department apply the guide-lines to the investigations in question as soon as possible. If a decision has not been made by the time of trial, he stated, the court may "take it upon itself" to apply the guidelines to plaintiff organizations. From the Government's point of view, such action would be undesirable. Thes, AUSA Glassman requested that the Bureau bring the facts of the investigations in question to the Department as soon as possible.

INTO has observed that plaintiffs have requested a substantial amount of additional materials and that a great number of man hours have been and are being expended to obtain and process these items. They, however, feel that the items requested will be available to furnish to the USA, SDNY, by 3/24/76.

INTO also observed that in obtaining information requested by plaintiffs, they canvassed all FSI field offices in an effort to locate documents relating to any FBI lintelligence gathering burglaries directed against plaintiffs. Los Angeles furnished documents concerning a physical entry and picrophone installation directed against the residence of plaintiff James P. Cannon on 4/30/60. New Mayon furnished documents concerning a physical entry directed against the residence of a SSP organizer on 3/10/60. Tew York furnished documents revealing that between 1/15/60 and 7/1/66, 93 physical entries were directed against SMP and YSA offices in New York City.

New York Office, advised files of the New York Office contain approximately 25 volumes of documents reflecting information concerning all physical entries conducted by the New York Office from the 1940s through 1975, not simply those against SMP and YSA. The documents in quention are not serialized but are filed in obrenelogical order in SAC folders. Concerning each physical entry, the folders typically contain a nemorandum from a New York SA to the SAC requesting authority to conduct the entry, a handwritten note identifying the official at FBIDO who authorized the entry, and a memorandum describing the results of the entry. Agents who participated in each entry are identified.







FBI agents under investigation for allegedly committing nurginies have been ordered not to talk to their rawyers about their case un-(ii the lawyers are cleared to receive secret government information.

Justice Department sources have contirmed that the department's Civil Rights Division is investigating at least 20 FBI agents involved in intelligence-gathering burgiaries during the past five years. The probe involves possible violations of the civil rights of American efficiens.

The FPI alonts, were given the instructions about their lawyers in a teletyped message from FBI headquarters last Friday, according to Jack B. Solerwitz, an attorney representing some of the FBI men.

The restriction suggests that the Justice Department probe involves break-ins that the FBI considers sensitive national security mat-

"My clients have been told they are the targets of an investigation of surreptitious entries." Solerwitz said

in an interview Wednesday. He declined to say how many of the agents he represents or to identify them. But some are assigned to the FBI's New York office, he said

Solerwitz Said department investigators telephoned the

to inform them they were under investigation and that they would be advised of their right to keep silent and to retain an attorney.

A teletyped message from FBI headquarters June 16 advised the agents to hire private lawyers Solerwitz,

"The Justice Department has made it clear to these agents that they will not be provided counsel" by the government, he said. Under current policy, the department refuses to provide lawyers to defend employees in criminal investigations.

Solerwitz is representing the agents for free in his capacity as attorney for the Federal Criminal Investigators Association.

The FBI message June 18 instructed the agents not to disclose details of the case until their attorneys get security clearances. Solerwitz said he doesn't know how long it will take to get the clearance. Such clearances normally are processed through the FBI and the department.

"I have no doubt their investigation would not terminate with these agents," he said. "Any prosecutor would go higher."

It could not be determined which or how many prganizations or individuals may have been burglarized by the FBI during the past years.

The five year period is sig

nificant because statute of limitations precludes federal prosecutions for civil rights offenses more than five years old.

The disclosure that break ins were conducted since 1971 contradicts the FBI's insistence that burglaries against domestic targets ended in 1966. The Socialist Workers Party was one target of FBI burglaries. FBI documents released to the party in connection with a lawsuit against the bureau disclosed that agents bur glarized party offices or homes of members 94 times from 1960 through 1966.

Department sources have said that civil rights investigators examined the hundreds of burglaries con-ducted before 1966 but concluded that the statute of limitations bars any prosecutions.

In another development, department investigators have expanded their probe financial kickbacks within the FBI to include other abuses of power by past and present FBI officials, it was learned. The na-Iture of the other alleged abuses could not be deter-

Michael Shahcen, head of the department's Office of Professional Responsibility. which is conducting the probe, said he expects to deliver his findings and recommendations to Attorney General Edward H. Levi within a few weeks.

In Burglary Probe Involving FBI Men.

NEW YORK, Sept. 3-A federal judge decied a motion here today that could have jeopardized the Justice Department investigation of allegations that FBI agents committed illegal burglaries within the last five years.

U.S. District Court Judge Heory Werker demed a motion to quash grand jury subpossible for two former FBI agents involved in the probe because, he said. It was sought prematurely.

If it had been successful, the motion would have shut down our case until we could have reversed it." Assistant Attorney General J. Stanley Pottinger said after the ruling. Pottinger heads the Justice Department's tivil Rights Division, which has been conducting the eight-month investigation.

Although the motion, filed by attorney Jack B: Solerwitz, named only the two former agents, it would have applied to all agents—reportedly about 25—if it had been granted.

Solerwitz, arguing on behalf of former New York special agen's Claiborne J. Poche and Philip J. Newpher, said their appearance before a grand jury would have jeopardized national security interests.

But Werker said the contention was unfounded because agents claiming that they had committed burglaries to protect national security had several options.

Justice Department investigators could accept their assertion and allow the agents to remain silent, he said, or the government could go into a private session with the judge and the agents' lawyers to determine whether the national security argument was valid.

If the judge rules in favor of this agent, the agent may remain silent; if not, he would be compelled to testify; Werker said.

He added that The Justice Department could eliminate the need for a closed session by giving the agent immulzation to disclose matters that the agent may regard as potentially harmful to national interests. Potentially pointed out that such im-

munization would be for the act of disclosure only and not for the contents of the disclosure.

Werker also said an agent may be compelled to testify if it can be shown that the Attorney General feels that adequate safeguards have been taken to protect the confidentiality of sensitive disclosures.

Worker said the Justice Department could declassify documents that an agent or his attorneys regard as national security matters, thereby making the question of national security most.

Pottinger said he does not think that there will be a need to declassify any documents in the case because, he said no national security interests are involved.

Werker also rejected a metion by Solerwitz to appoint a special prosecutor to head the Justice Department's probe because, the judge said, he had no power to do so.

Solerwitz appealed Werker's ruling and asked for an emergency delay of the grand jury subpoenas pending an outcome of the appeal.

The U.S. Court of Appeals here is expected to rule on Solerwitz's request by 9 a.m. Tuesday.

The burglaries in the New York area were discovered as the result of a lawsuit by the Socialist Workers Party, a Trotskyite group, charging that the FBI and other federal agoncies had harassed and committed illegal acts against the party.

The federal judge hearing the suit ordered the FRI to produce every document in its possession relating to the SWP and, in the course of locating these documents, FRI agents found a file in the New York field office containing information about the burglaries.

So far none of the burglaries committed during 1972 and 1973 has been identified as having been directed against the SWP. Justice Department sources have said that most were aimed at organizations and individudals that the FBI thought might have information about fugitive members of the Weather Underground.



SURREPTITIOUS ENTRIES CLASSIFICATION MATTER

In connection with the Civil Rights Division investigation into surreptitious entries, certain Agents were subpoensed to appear before a grand jury impaneled in the Southern District of New York and the attorney for these Agents is attempting to quash the subpoense for various reasons, including the fact that members of the grand jury have not been cleared to receive classified information and the Agents are not able to reveal such classified information pursuant to national security regulations.

Special Agent has been subpoensed to appear before a grand jury in Washington, D. C., on September 3, 1976, and although his attorney attempted to defer his appearance pending resolution of the motion in New York such action was not agreed to by the Civil Rights Division.

has advised that because the Weatherman investigation has been held by the Department Review Committee to be a national security investigation, and sources and methods of intelligence related thereto are classifiable, he is requesting that you be asked to resolve the conflict between his subpoena to testify and restrictions imposed by Title 28, CFR, Sections 17.3 and 17.64 and Executive Order 11052. In view of the dilemma and after discussing the matter with his attorney, he has advised he intends to decline to testify and has furnished a copy of the statement he intends to make as the reasons for his declination.

In order that this Bureau may appropriately advise and other employees confronted with this situation, I respectfully request your early consideration of this matter.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR.

To assist you in your discussions concerning the matter of her for investigation of civil rights allegations, the following listing of istance. drawn from the various memoranda prepared by the Beputy Attorney General, Mr. Pottinger; and James P. Turner, who was acting as Assistant Attorney General, Civil Rights Division.

Issue #1: The Civil Rights Division has investigated FBI activities in New York, Denver, Portland, and Seattle which involve allegations of surreptiti entries and/or other allegations of civil rights violations which may have been committed by FBI employees. It has been indicated in Mr. Pottinger and by Turner's memorandum for the Attorney General Comper 19, 1976) that there are additional matters that may be subject to investigation is Washington Field, Bos Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Detroit, and San Diego. If the FBI is to undertake an investigation of matters not current point investigated by the Civi Rights Division, it would be useful. in the state on to furnish us sufficient facts in order to institute regard to the above-listed field div Civil Rights Division may have info

In view of this, the first issue is whether the Department will furnish the FBI facts on which we may undertake investigations we determine to be appropriate.


Issue #2: The Deputy Attorney General memorandum dated October 26, .

1976, distinguished investigations by describing those conducted by the Civil Rights Division as "criminal investigations" and those conducted by the FBI as "administrative inquiries." The memorandum from Turner of the Civil Rights Division appeared to accept the same rationale for distinguishing investigations.

Page 3, item 4, of that memorandum indicated that there are other matters of prospective but not present investigative interests to the Civil Rights Division which would not be affected by normal inspection operation of the Bureau. The same paragraph said should any of these matters require the opening of an active investigation the Bureau would be so advised at the time. Thus, Turner appears to assume that criminal investigation would be conducted by the Civil Rights Division whereas administrative inquiries by the inspection operations of the Bureau would be conducted by the FBI.

In view of the above, the second issue is whather the EEI would be authorized to conduct criminal investigations of alleger one involving FBI personnel or whether such criminal inquiries would be handled by other elements of the Department leaving only administrative inquiries to be reducted by the FBI.

Issue #3: The third issue is how the matters described above should be resolved. The memoranda indicate that the Deputy Attorney General and the Civil Rights Division have different views as to what office should decide whether the Civil Rights Division will undertake a criminal investigation. Therefore, it may be necessary for that impasse to be broken by a decision by the Attorney General. In the interim, it would be useful to have a meeting with the Deputy Attorney General and Mr. Pottinger in order to clarify their intentions and ours. If a satisfactory understanding could be reached, the problem may be solved by confirmation in writing with the Deputy and Mr. Pottinger. If an agreement could not be reached, it may be necessary for you to resolve the matter with the Attorney General.

Pursuant to your instructions, I telephoned Assistant Attorney General Pottinger for an appointment with a view toward of the Sac'y obtaining from Mr. Pottinger the identities of FBI employees, together with necessary information, upon which an appropriate inquiry might be instituted to determine whether administrative action might be warranted against these employees.

Pottinger requested that we postpone a meeting for the above purpose until the first part of the week commencing December 13.

During the conversation Mr. Pottinger referred to his meeting with you December 6, 1976, wherein it was apparent that there was some confusion on the part of the Deputy Attorney General's Office concerning his (Pottinger's) ability to furnish informating of this nature to the FBI. Pottinger said that some time ago he was asked by the Attorney General whether he could advise the Fare as to (1) what the Department could do to enable the Bureau to institute an inquiry which was not under investigation by the Department and (2) what, if anything, could be furnished to the FBI in those situations being investigated by the Department.

Mr. Pottinger advised me that during June, 1976, he was taking a very cautious approach to these investigations and that it was his feeling all along that the FRI ought to take action to the highest degree possible. He said that most of the investigation conducted by him did not involve a level of criminal activity.

He also said that the Attorney General instructed him to take a specific case in question to the Director as an example of what might be done by the Bureau. Pottinger said the Attorney General ordered him to write a letter to the FBI as to what the Bureau could do and not interfere with the ongoing investigation. said he learned today that his memorandum prepared in response to the Attorney General's orders was never received by anyone in the FBI.

Pottinger said he was attempting to arrange a meeting with the Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General the

and/or early 12/8/76 to find out why this memorandum was not sent to the FBI. Pottinger said, of course, it might be that the Attorney General for some reason or another had decided not to send the memorandum.

Pottinger referred to a contact with John Mintz, Legal Counsel, some weeks ago along the lines of determining the identities of Agents who might be subject to administrative action and where Mr. Mintz was attempting to get some type of material for this purpose. He said the memorandum prepared by him for the Attorney General covered the points requested by Mintz.

Mr. Pottinger stated he had been informed by the Director that ADIC DeBruler was to handle this matter and had the Director's complete confidence; therefore, he felt free to advise ADIC DeBruler of the above.

Pottinger said he would furnish information to ADIC

DeBruler concerning one specific FBI employee wherein the information obtained by the Department was not as a result of the Federal Grand Jury. He said there were a number of allegations that were third hand and that subsequent inquiry turned out to be "zero." He termed these as the easy matters which required no administrative action and which, in turn, he could see no reason to refer to the FBI because same might get into the files of employees, raise a question when in fact no question really existed. Matters of this nature will, therefore, not be referred to the FBI.

Pottinger also said that only a "handful" of material would be turned over to ADIC DeBruler because there was not that much information of this nature developed. Pottinger said he had instructed the New York Office to prepare an all-inclusive memorandum for him outlining the identities of Bureau personnel and the basis for possible administrative action to reach him by December 10. He said that was the reason why he believed a meeting between him and ADIC DeBruler would be more beneficial during the week of December 13. He said he would telephone DeBruler and arrange a meeting for this purpose.

The Department, upon being informed of this, sent a representative to New York who reviewed the pertinent material. Following this review and upon approval of the Department, representatives of the Inspection Division proceeded to New York 5/4/76 and also conducted review, which terminated 5/7/76. SAC Folders are maintained in the top drawer of a four-drawer locked file cabinet located in the Personnel Files Unit situated outside the office of the ADIC. The top drawer contains 27 volumes covering surreptitious entries by New York from 1954 to the last recorded entry, \$4/16/73. A review of SAC Folder #25 disclosed nine surreptitious entries, seven in 1972, two in 1973. Memoranda recording these entries also disclosed identities of Agents who performed the actual entry, as well as the identities of the Agents on the outside for security purposes. New York files reviewed disclosed seven other entries not identified in this Folder and two possible other entries. No indication on the pertinent memoranda contained in SAC Folder #25 that FBIHQ had been contacted for approval however, this does not mean that such was not the case. It is not known for sure who in fact approved the entries in New York other than possibly the individual who initialed the block stamp appearing on these memoranda. In this same file cabinet in drawer #2 there is a Folder marked "SAC Folder (C)." This Folder deals almost exclusively with the obtaining of keys from various sources, with possible intended purpose of utilizing them for surreptitious entries. The first memorandum is dated 2/5/52 and the last 7/14/72

Admittedly, there are many unanswered questions that could only be resolved through interview; however, this was not possible since prior to the Inspection Division inquiry the Department conveyed the specific request that no interviews be conducted by the FBI in connection with our review of this material.

On late Monday afternoon, 5/3/76, just prior to Inspection Division's departure to New York, Departmental Attorney Gardner who personally handled review in New York advised Supervisory Special Agent Intelligence Division, that as a result of his review he felt strongly that a criminal investigation should be conducted and he would so recommend this action to his superior, Assistant Attorney General Pottinger. He indicated at this point that there were four possible options, they being:

- 1. That an outside committee or commission is established to conduct the investigation (he appeared to cast this aside, however).
- 2. That the Inspection Division of the FBI handle the investigation but that it be headed by a representative of the Department. (He indicated he felt this was the best course of action and prohably the one most acceptable to the Bureau.)

- 3. Recommend that nothing further be done on the basis that the employees involved were acting within the scope of their employment. (He added, however, that this course would be completely unacceptable to him and if such a decision was made he would request he be removed from the case.)
 - 4. That the investigation be handled by a Special Grand Jury.

Gardner did not indicate whether he intended to present these four options to Pottinger but did state that the Bureau should know in a day or two of the Department's decision. To date, no such information has been forthcoming.

Information was recently received from our New York Office indicating that there had been some surreptitious entries by Bureau personnel in 1972 and 1973. This information was not previously known to the Bureau. The Department was appropriately informed, and Mr. William L. Gardner, Departmental Attorney, proceeded to New York during the last week in April and reviewed some of the pertinent material. The Bureau, at the request of the Department, held in abeyance any inquiry of our own pending completion of the Department's. They did agree that following their review of the material, they interposed no objection to a similar review by the Bureau. The Department, through Mr. Gardner, did convey the specific request, however, that no interviews be conducted by the FBI in connection with our review of this material.

Upon the instructions of Deputy Associate Director J. B. Adams, with the concurrence of the Director, I proceeded to New York on Tuesday, 5/4/76, accompanied by Inspectors C. E. Price and J. E. Otto. The following constitutes the results of this inquiry, which terminated 5/7/76, 9:15 AM, at New York.

SAC Folders

The SAC Folders of the New York Office are maintained in the top drawer of a four-drawer locked file cabinet located in the Personnel Files Unit situated on the 10th floor outside of the office of the Assistant Director in Charge (ADIC). The label on the outside of the top drawer states "SAC Personnel Folders Sec. 1-." According to the secretary to the ADIC, the SAC Folders have been maintained in this cabinet in this ocation since September, 1959.

The individual memoranda contained in these Folders are not serialized. It was determined there were approximately 188 memoranda in Folder #9. This would appear to be the average number of items in the other Folders, with the exception of Folder #25, which contains approximately 65 separate memoranda. Each memorandum does not necessarily represent a single surreptitious entry. On the contrary, sometimes one memorandum will pertain to several entries and in other situations there are multiple memoranda concerning one entry.

As noted previously, this Folder contains information regarding surreptitious entries from 7/1/66 - - to the last recorded surreptitious entry by the New York Office. This, of course, is the important Folder and the one which discloses nine surreptitious entries covering portions of the years 1972 and 1973. Xerox copies of these nine memoranda were furnished to the Departmental Attorney who reviewed same in New York.

Moreover, it was also determined that on a New York communication of 10/20/72 reference was made to the development on 10/19/72 of a highly sensitive anonymous source at Brooklyn, New York. It is possible that this contact was actually a forerunner of the establishment of on 12/11/72. This is based on the fact that the subject of these entries fugitive Bernardine Rae Dohrn, moved from the address to the address sometime probably in October, 1972. Also, in a New York communication of 11/14/72 reference was made of a highly sensitive anonymous source at this address Supporting documents relative to these additional contacts are marked as Exhibit B.

A review of pertinent files in New York failed to disclose any other additional entries.

With regard to the nine entries listed in SAC Folder #25, as can be seen, each memorandum identifies the inside crew in well as those Agents who were outside for security and surveillance purposes. In the past, in the 1950s and 1960s, the majority of the memoranda coveries surreptitious entries.

showed the authorizing authority for same at FBIHQ. As noted, these nine do not show whether any authority had been received from FBIHQ. It is possible that the New York official whose initial appears in the block stamp on each of these memoranda may have been the approving authority; however, this is merely speculative and is not known to be a fact. It has been determined with a relatively high degree of certainty that the initials appearing in the block stamp on those memoranda relating to entries on 3/7/72, 3/23/72 and 4/4/72 are those of former Supervisor EOD 7/7/47, retired 6/20/72.

There is no initial in the block stamp of the memorandum regarding the entry on 6/5/72, but the initial at the top right is that of former now retired. His initial also appears in the block stamp regarding the entry of 6/12/72.

initials appear in the block stamp for the entry of 12/11 and 20/72. The identity of the individual initialing the block stamp for the entry of 2/14/73 is not known.





Subsequently, pertinent portions of these files were made available to Assistant Attorney General Pottinger who confirmed that they were indeed live informants.



With further reference to captioned Folder, Departmental Attorneys were particularly interested in, and in fact requested and were furnished, copies of what amount to the top six serials in this Fo Copies of these are attached as Exhibit C.

As noted earlier, this Folder deals almost exclusively with obtaining keys from various sources with the possible intended purpose of utilizing them for surreptitious entries.





Another enclosure discloses what appears to be a large number of keys obtained 11/29/71 relative to the building then occupied by the VVAW. There is no indication in this memorandum as to where these keys were placed.

Another enclosure discloses that a key was obtained on 11/29/71, again pertaining to the VVAW, and was maintained on hook #20 of the Tel-Kee cabinet.


Another enclosure discloses obtaining a key on 12/14/71 regarding which was maintained on hook #21 of the Tel-Kee cabinet.

The last enclosure shows that a survey of keys in the above Tel-Kee cabinet was made in July, 1972, and those keys no longer of value were destroyed.


The Tel-Kee cabinet maintained by the SAC of the Security Division was examined by Mr. Gardner and according to information received by the Inspection Division from pertinent personnel, he was satisfied that the aforementioned keys were not maintained as indicated. In fact, all of the keys now maintained are pertinent solely to the New York Office itself.

Miscellaneous

As noted previously, the last supportitious entry detected occurred on 4/18/73. At least insofar concerned it would appear that April, 1973, was the last month of such contact. This is based on the following:

In reviewing this file, periodically it was noted that the case Agent prepared a handwritten memorandum to the file setting orth the date that physical surveillances had been conducted a sidence. In each instance mention was also made of recontacts or attempted contacts with the symbol number designated for surreptitious entry to residence at her address) allowever, be inning in May, 1973, and thereafter, such handwritten memoranda contain no reference whatsoever to this informant, but merely made mention of the dates that physical surveillances had been conducted.



There was one memorandum in this file that upon first glance would indicate that surreptitious entries had been made through 1973; however, it is felt that it was merely a choice of words. Specifically, by airtel of 1/24/74from New York to the Director, New York was taking the position that would not be productive. As part of their justification for taking this position their communication stated in part the following: "New York investigation over the past three years concerning clandestine methods of communications utilized that she has received 'drop mail' on a few occasions. The so-called 'drop' would be identified, if at all, on the letter itself have so advised." The first two informants were symbol numbers designated for surreptitious entries at the residences of the last was the symbol number designated for a residence in which she previously resided.

Admittedly, there are many unanswered questions that could only be resolved through interview; however, as indicated previously, this was not possible since the Department conveyed the specific request that no interviews be conducted by the FBI in connection with the Inspection Division review

On late Monday afternoon, 5/3/76, just prior to Inspection Division's departure to New York, Departmental Attorney Gardner, who personally handled review in New York, advised Supervisory Special Agent Intelligence Division, that as a result of his review he felt strongly that a criminal investigation should be conducted and he would so recommend this action to his superior, Assistant Attorney General Pottinger. He indicated at this point that there were four possible options, they being:

- 1. That an outside committee or commission be established to conduct the investigation (he appeared to cast this as c., however).
