SHOULD THE HEADS of warning, ch should the dead bodies be strug up from trees by their ankles?

This philosophical problem is posed in Get Ye Up Into The. High Mountains" by Reverend Dallas Roquemore, a "guerrilla warfare" manual of arms, being circulated by a supposedly legislative lobby of the "respectable right" - the Liberty Lobby whose propaganda work has had the-cooperation of Senator Karl -Mundt (R-S.D.), Senator Thomas Dodd (D.-Conn.) and Senator John L. McClellan (D.-Ark.).

Reverend Roquemore's book deals as well with eye-gouging, the use of poisons, and lesser methods of "terrorizing of the enemy."

"Get Ye Up Into The High Mountainss" is brutally frank. In its instructions to the rightlst guerrillas is says: "When it is necessary to kill an enemy, it is also necessary to leave a good impression for other enemies to see."

Commenting on the effectiveness of the chopping off of heads this ghoulish manual of arms of the ultra-right casually notes:

"The dead body did not care whether it had a head or not, bat psychologically the individuil faced with such a sight can see himself in the same decapitated condition and the heart is

filled with terror. Therefore, such a principle should be adopted by guerrillas for just such a ma-e Communists be cut off and the son. Not that we need a trophy, "headless corpse" be left as a but we might terrorize the linbut we might terrorize the linvading enemy, always leaving. the bodies with some mark which would be universally understood throughout the guerrilla fighting force."

> "For instance, the dead bodies could be suspended from trees by their legs," the book goes on to say, "or any other suitable showmanship for an example to the enemy." (My emphasis MN)

Ordained as a Baptist minister Reverend Roquemore offers this advice in the cause of "Christianity" and in the name of "Christ." "This Book is written to the saints of the Most High God," he says.

The Liberty Lobby, in fact, began selling this treaties on head-hunting in its "Christmas gift" list, just before Christmas, last year.

THOSE WHO MAY be squeamish about head-hunting are offered several alternative methods of terror.

Reverend Roquemore writes with enthusiasm of "the Japs (who) used such methods as placing a red hot stone in the bend of a prisoner's arms and tying the arms that way." Then there were "the Assyrian armies," of old (who) would gouge out eyeballs and use other tortuces! even worse. They led their prisquers down the street with a book in his nose or jaw to show the conquered people."

He reluctantly admits that "This is truly the height of cruelty," but, he counsels; "It 94-58868



The Head-hunting manual comes from the anti-semitic (Soldiers of the Cross" in Englewood, Col., but it bears the official label of the Liberty Lobby.

"Get Ye Up Into The High Mountains" is not wholely devoted to torture however. In considerable documentation the book deals with how to bury and hide guns, how to make ammunition, how to use bows and arrows, how to use poisoned stakes, how to live in the wilderness, how to build a fallout shelter.

It is written, as are all such rightist "guerrilla manuals," in the guise of a "survival plan" for the day when the foreign armies of the "Communist conspiracy" invade the USA. The target date is this time given as 1970. Such too was the method used by the Birchite "John Franklin Letters," which is recommended reading for Birch Society members where the target date is also 1970.

And the manuals of The Minuteman, that private army of an estimated 25,000 ultras, use the same disguises.

There is however nothing ambiguous in the detailed directions that this Liberty Lobby "Christmas gift" book offers:

\* Guns must be kept "in a safe hiding place;"

\* "Either you can purchase an abundant supply (of ammunition), or you can buy a reloading kit and reload your am-

munition as you use it.;"

\* "You need a bullet mold for your calibre gun. Such a kit can be purchased for about \$25.

A gun is the most important part of your preparation;"

\* "Each troop should also learn to clean and care for its weapons in the dark. Every person should carry his weapon in his arms when he sleeps;"

• ". . . play war each and every minute, so that when the actual moment comes you are conditioned to it. Learn to hide and camouflage yourself;"

\* A good bok of the highest quality should be purchased

and practiced with for use at such time when annutation for your gun might be wasted" for "many shots, whether in battle or in hunting, would be at close range."

WHO IS THIS Baptist Minister who so blithely exhorts his disciples in the art of head-hunting?

Reverend Roquemore is "Soldier of The Cross."

The "Soldiers of the Cross" are a quasi-military, ultra-right outfit that are led by Kenneth Coff. Goff is a rabid anti-semite, who was trained as "Youth Leader" to Gerald L. K. Smith, and whose, favorite cry is "The United Nations is as Jewish as Coney Island." Lately, in keeping up with the times, Goff has donned the frayed toga of a "Communist expert" and has been featured as a lecturer and teacher for Dr. Schwartz's "Anti-Communist Crusade Christian in California.

Goff's assistant in his nefatious work has been Reverend Dallas Roquemore. In his hearty introduction to the "guerrilla warfare" manual Goff, as National Director of the "Soldiers of the Cross," writes:

Dallas Roquemore has worked with our cadet groups for several years and had developed a corps of young people who can exist in the mountains under the most hazardous conditions.

Thus this false prophet of terror does at least practice what he preaches. One wonders how many caches of guns and ammunition the leader of the "cadet groups" of the "Soldiers of The Cross" might by now have hidden in the Rocky Mountains, his recommended spot for "guerrilla warfare?" How many lectures on head-hunting might he have given?

LIBERTY LOBBYISTS, who ordered this book for Christmas giving, were perhaps shocked to receive it not from the Liberty.

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Lobby hut directly from the terroristic "Soldiers of The Cross." (see illustration).

What tie-in is there between a legislative lobby of the "respectable right" and an openly anti-semitic and terrorist vigilante outfit? The Liberty Lobby has the support of a number of Congressman and Senators. On the oard of Policy of the Liberty Lobby are such rightwing leaders as Rev. Harges (of the Christain Crusade); Generals Sumter Lowry and George Stratemeyer; former governor Brasken Lee of Utah, and Taylor Caldwell. Moreover, its legislaitive conferences, that boast they are the organizing center of the "Conservative 'Coalition" Northern Republicans and Dixlecrats, have been participated in by such men as Congressman E. Y. Berry (Rep. So. Dak.) and Congressman N. J. B. Dorn (Dem So. Car.).

Yet, this is not stranger than the fact that its nationwide propaganda program, "Congress Calling" has featured such speakers as Senators Karl Mundt, Thomas Dodd, John L. McClellan, Frank Laushe, Frank Carlson, and Willis Robertson.

Nor it is any stranger than the fact that "Get Ye Up Into The High Mountains" was offered on the Christmas book list just below Senator Barry Goldwater's "A Conscience of a Conservative." Goldwater is, needless to say, the Liberty Lobby's favorite Senator.

Incidentally, this book lists also a sordid collection of racist propaganda such as: "The Hybrid Race Theory" by Dr. Hubbard, "Race and Reason" by Carleton Piknam, "What Price Integration?" by A. E. Burges, and

"Race and Social Revolution" by Hyram Campbell; among others. There was besides the twelve books offered as "One Dozen Candles," the Birch Society's own "Christmas gift" books and, of course," The Life of John Birch" by Robert Welch.

Curious reading material for a legislative lobby! But no more curious surely, than the selling of a manual of head-hunting and "guerrilla warfare" by a group that is theoretically devoted to parliamentary government and the processes of democracy!

Or is the Liberty Lobby, perhaps, planning to do its future lobbying by means recommended in the Reverent Roquemore textbook on terror that it is selling? If so, the Congressional committees whose job it is to concern themselves with lobbying legislation might become somewhat curious, in turn, about this rather odd "lobby" of the "respectable right," and its strange notion of how democracy works.

It is true that the spokesmen of the ultra right have spoken of the uses of violence before. But not quite like this . . . William Buckley, Jr., in his

William Buckley, Jr., in his "Up From Liberalism," speculates on what point it becomes advisable to consider whether it "is worth the price of using force," and Senator Goldwater, in his statement "On Foreign Policy" that appeared in the "National Review" is hardly averse to the use of "guerrilla warfare;" or other types of war.

The testimony of General Edwin Walker was similiarly based upon an attack on what he called the "no win" (that is, peace) policy, and an exhortation for a "win" (that is, war) policy.

Buckley's "National Review" in commenting on Walkers's beliefs, on this score, says bluntly that this is what "National Review has been saying from the moment of its inception." April 24 1962) "Respectable right" and "crazy right" seem to stand stoulder to shoulder on this use of warfare as a weapon of international politics.

However Reverend Roquemore's "guerrilla warfare" manual adds a new note to the war chorus.

"Get Ye Up Into The High Mountains" is not an advocacy of "guerrilla warfare" in Viet Nam, Laos, the Congo, or along the Berlin, wall. The Liberty Lobby's "Christmas gift" is aimed at the training of guerrillas here at home.


It is in the hills of Pennsylvania and in the mountains of Maine, on the Kansas prairie and Jersey wood and the forests of Oregon, that the head-hunters of the ultra right are to be trained They are, in fact, now in training.

Summer, which usually sees the weekend hunters take to the woods, will this year witness the vigilantees of the right stalking not deer, but the human spectres of "Communism," as they prepare for "der Tag."

The marching orders of the would-be head-hunters trumpet forth from the Liberty Lobby, within gunshot of the Department of Justice, within nose-rubbing distance of the FBI, within the shadow of the Subwersive Activities Control card; but these gentlemen are too has for peace of the suspicious pleas for peace of the people to har the cries for "guerrilla warfale" of the ultras.

My dear Mr. Wadsworth:

Because I am a well-known novelist, my friends insist that a communication from me to you might receive some serious attention.

There has been a great deal of discussion about the removal of Japanese and American-Japanese away from strategic areas along the west coast, a discussion sprinkled with revilings such as "dirty Japs," "filthy little yellow men.". Much suspicion has been directed against Japanese-Americans, and their loyalty doubted. - However, if, after due investigation, it seems best to remove these people from strategic areas, it must be done.

But it must be remembered that the Japanese attacked us on express orders from Berlin. It is foolish to hate the gun and not the holder of it.

If Japanese are to be removed, what about German and Italians also? I live in the suburb of Buffalo, N.Y. which is the third largest munitions center in the United States. This city has a huge German and Italian population. The German-Americans of Buffalo and vicinity, and especially in this German suburb, are vicious Mazis. I know this from personal observation and long residence here. Until only very recently, the German-Americans had a large Bund camp at East Aurora, about 20 % miles from Buffalo, with all the trappings and the swastikas. The Hanlian Americans had vociferous Pasoist societies, whose doings were admiringly reported in local papers. It is fathous to believe that Pearl Harbor caused a sudden and passionate revulsion in the hearts of these murderous enemies of American democracy.

Across the street from our house, for instance, lives a German-American, one Chester Brost, the largest distributor of Chrysler cars in this dection. Until very, very recently, he decorated his ground with swastikes, and a relative of his, who works on the grounds, has threatened us with predictions of what Hitler will do when he arrives here. This whole suburb, which is only a mile from the airport and the largest Curtiss plant, is crawling with such German-Americans. Yet, no one suggests that these creatures be removed from this defense center, and only Westbrook Pegler has had the courage to demand that Bundists be interned for the duration. If Jeps, why not German and Italian people of American citizenship but foreign origin and foreign devotions?

Worse, it was just reported to me by a foreman at one of the largest Curtiss plants, that these plants employ humbers of German and Italian-Americans, and freely speak their subversive minds to the other workers. An attempt by employers to refuse to employ people of German and Italian names resulted in a howl of "racial discrimination" which has been heard as far as Washington. This howl was led by Roman priests, who perhaps have a very good reason for this.

A few days ago I was attending a moving picture show, and whom Hitler's face was flashed on the screen, a man nearby booed. Imm diately, his neighbor stood up and loudly threatened him. Nearby members of the audience smiled their approval.

So, this is Buffalo, the third largest defense area. And we talk about removing Japs from the West Coast! During a trial black-out in Buffalo on December 28th, a German-American refused to put out his lights, and when an air raid warden insisted, he was foully insulted. Nothing, of course, was done, by the FeB.I. or the local police in this matter, nor in the matter of hundreds of other similar instances.


Buffalo papers wint anti-United Nations letters from the public, and are none too lavish with printing replies. For instance, the Buffalo Courier-Express published a letter from one Marquerite Gelson of Lewiston, N.Y., in which she vociferated against America for lecturing war against the Axis, and defended the Axis in its attack on the world. — This, of course, is irrevant, but it shows the general attitude of German-Americans in this city, dreatures who are employed in our vitial munitions industries.

From personal experience, only recently, I discovered the it is dangerous to denounce the Axis in Buffalo. One of the rund going around, and believed seriously, is that the planes that attacked Pearl Euror were British planes piloted by Jews!

Then, there is New York, smack on the Eastern seaboard. It is afflicted with "Yorkville," where 85,000 German-American Nazis live. In pursuit of good German cooking, while I was in that city, I passed a restaurant in Yorkville. Two men were speaking together near the doorway, in German, and when they parted, they muttered "Heil Hitler!" Why not remove these enemies from the eastern seaboard, too?

American sentimentality and flabbiness are great dangers. We've got to get tough. We've got to understand that freedom of speech does not extend to allowing our German-Italian-American enemies undermine and destroy us. Few of them are loyal; I know I've talked to many of them. Intern them; remove them from vital areas; order that munitions manufacturers refuse to employ them. What if they suffer? It will be good for them, intimidate them, protect all of us. By suffering them, we give them good grounds to believe we are weaks and sometimes I think Hitler is quite right about the flabbiness of our government officials and people generally. Perfectly good Americans of my acquaintance have sat or stood by with sickly smiles when German Nazis; have openly declared the Jews started the war, and we ought to coopers with Hitler against "Jewish Russia."

Dear Mrs. Reback:

I am sorry to hear you are not feeling well, and hope the coming spring will bring you strength again.

I spoke to your husband this afternoon and he suggested I write to you concerning the matter of free speech and particularly free speech for Commun-Everyone knows both from your writings and your recent award, that you are strongly anti-Communist; therefore your attitude on freedom of speech is particulably important.

It is in connection with the local Smith Act case of John Noto that am writing. After his recent arrest here he was charged not with conspiracy of anything of that sort, but merely with being a member of the Communist Party. As the Wall St. Journal points out (see enclosed fact-sheet), under the current thought-control laws anyone can be charged with this "guilt by association," or by agreement. Mrs. Roosevelt of course has come out in opposition to the S mith Act, calling for a halt to all Smith Act trials. Your own stand on thi question would be even more clear-cut, as your opposition to Communism itself is well-known.


I am sure you remember how in Hitler Germany attacks against the Constitutional rights of Communists, spread to Jews, to Labor and liberals, and the Church itself. Pastor Niemoeller's famous words are quoted in the enclos It is my feeling that we should defend the civil rights of all. The local American Civil Liberties Union has taken a stand on John Noto's case, helping him secure counsel etc.; and the national ACIU has called for the repeal of the entire Smith Act. I would very much appreciate an opportunity to discuss the question with you, or if you do not feel up to a talk, perhaps you would write me something of your opinions.

The attacks agains the Negroes in the South, against the trade unions and the various legislative attempts to prevent unions expressing their politi cal opinions - the Goldwater-Curtis bill for instance - are to my mind fright eningly akin to Hitler's methods. If these are to be stopped, your attitude and that of other outstanding citizens will be decisive. It is for this reast that I hope you will be able to give the matter your most serious consideration
