PREDOMINANTLY JUVENILES, JAMMED COW PALACE TO SEE PERFORMANCE. CROWD
WHICH WAS GENERALLY ORDERLY, BECAME EXTREMELY NOISY AND EXCITED ON
APPEARANCE OF BEATLES. NUMEROUS SPECTATORS TREATED FOR FAINTING,
EXHAUSTION AND MINOR INJURIES. SAN MATEO COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE
AND DALY CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT HANDLED MINOR LOCAL VIOLATIONS AND
ISSUED TWO JUVENILE CITATIONS FOR DRUNK AND SWITCHBLADE KNIFE.
BEATLES PERFORMANCE ENDED APPROXIMATELY TEN P.M. BEATLES DEPARTED
SAN FRANCSICO IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING PERFORMANCE, REPORTEDLY ENROUTE
LAS VEGAS. NO INCIDENTS WITH RACIAL RAMIFICATIONS OBSERVED OR
REPORTED TO SAN MATEO COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

The San Francisco and Los Angeles Divisions were on August 18, 1964, alerted to the fact that the thousands of teenagers gathering for the appearances of "The Beatles" in Los Angeles and San Francisco could be a perfect vehicle for riots if racial elements or organization, subversive or otherwise would decide to capitalize on this vehicle. Los Angeles and San Francisco were instructed that in this connection they should very carefully determine whether any element or organization, either local or from the outside, might be present endeavoring to create a disturbance.

SAC San Francisco has advised that "The Beatles" arrived via Pan American Airways at about 6:35 p.m., West Coast Time, August 18, 1964. They were brought by limousine to an awaiting crowd estimated by the San Mateo Sheriff's Office as over 5,000. The crowd consisted mostly of teenagers and younger, some accompanied by mothers. Although conduct was generally orderly, several persons were injured, and arrests of at least eight persons were made by the Sheriff's Office for disorderly person, disturbing the peace, and molesting.

San Francisco has advised that no racial or subversive overtones were observed in the crowd.

ACTION:

We will continue to be alert for elements which may endeavor to capitalize on the emotional pitch of crowds of teenagers in connection with this appearance tour in view of the potential of such a situation.

Reference is made to prior memorandum dated September 3, 1964.

Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department informed on the afternoon of September 17, 1964, that no additional information has been received specifically indicating any possible violence involving racial aspects in connection with the appearance of the Beatles, a quartet singing group on tour from England, at Municipal Stadium said that a few the right of September 17, 1964. apparently baseless and unverifiable rumors had come to his attention suggesting that one or two Muslims or ex-Muslims, unidentified, had been overheard to say "some trouble might occur" at the stadium in connection with the appearance of the Beatles. said that his inquiry had indicated that these rumors were disconnected, were untrue and no credence should be given to them. He said, however, that police security measures at the stadium, including assignment of 350 police officers, cover any potential for, or actual violence.

the Kansas City FBI Office had been alerted to any possible potential for violence involving racial and Muslim aspects and these sources not only had no information as to any potential for violence, but definitely understood that no Negro or Muslim organization or individual will be involved in any demonstration or incident in connection with the Beatles appearance.

Late on the night of September 17, 1964, informed that the appearance of the Beatles at Municipal Stadium had terminated that night without incident.



Kansas City, Missouri, Police Department, informed on September 2, 1964, that possibly 40,000 persons may crowd the Kansas City, Missouri, Municipal Stadium at 8:00PM, September 17, 1964, where the Beatles, a quartet singing group on tour here from England, are to perform at 9:25PM under contract to Charles O. Finley, owner of the Kansas City Athletics (baseball club). said all leave for Kansas City, Missouri, police officers has been cancelled to enable assignment of 350 officers in and about the stadium and about 100 officers elsewhere to cover the Municipal Airport, Hotel Muehlebach, and other places, respectively, arrival, sojourn and travel points and areas of the Beatles in Kansas City, Missouri.

stated there has been no indication violence will occur that will involve racial aspects; however, since the ball park (Municipal Stadium) is located in a Negro residential neighborhood, the possibility of Negro involvement in any spontaneous action is recognized and Police Department plans cover this possibility.
