Office Memorandum • United State Governme The Director SUBJECT: VINCENT ASTOR SAC Conroy telephonically advised that Vincent Astor was in the New York City Office on January 16th. Mr. Conroy talked to him over the telephone on January 17th on which day he left for Phoenix, Arizona, Miss Mr. Quina T where he will be on three months sick leave. His address there is Jakaka Inn, which is located about eleven miles out of Phoenix. He asked Mr. Conroy to write a letter to SAC Duffey at Phoenix so that he could get in touch with him. Astor also knows Agent Jack Minor at Phoeni Mr. Conroy stated what Astor apparently tried to do was to secure a sort of suspended state for a period of three months while he could take care of the arthritis which has been bothering him for a long time past. The Navy advised him this could not be done legally, therefore he was placed on sick leave for qinety days. He has signed over his pay for this period to the Navy relief. After the expiration of this three-month period, he is to return for another physical examination which he hopes he can pass and remain in the Navy. However, Astor mentioned that if he doesn't pass this physical, he will be forced out.
