

Recommendation

During the past month, informant has had to testify before the Federal Grand Jury, Montgomery, Alabama, and the State Grand Jury, Lowndes County, Alabama, and it is anticipated that his testimony will be required at additional proceedings.

By letter dated 5/21/65 Miss Gandy advised Mr. Ross that his proposal would be brought to Mr. Rowe's attention. This is being done. At 2:35 p. mr today Hal Ross telephoned from Los Angeles and talked to Wick. He referred to the receipt of Miss Gandy's letter and asked whether there had been any change in the situation and whether it would be appropriate for him to press further in attempting to contact Rowe. He said his company did not wish to take any action which might jeopardize the future trial in the murder case, but he did want it known that his company is very much interested in securing the rights to Rowe's story which ultimately will be told.

Mr. Ross was told there had been no change in the situation but that his inquity would be maintained as a matter of record.

All Agents maintaining contact with Klan sources have been asked to immediately report any information that would indicate that the Klan is aware of subject's relocation area and it is felt that if any known members of the organization leave the immediate Birmingham area we will be immediately aware of their destination and purpose of their trip.

Inspector James L. McGovern and ASAC Thomas Jordan of the Mobile Office have advised the Bureau had less than one hour to conduct a check of members of the jury panel for Assistant Attorney General John Doar. They advised that the case which was to proceed instant case fell through and the Klan conspiracy case would be the first case in court.

After 10:20 a.m., Montgomery time today, the Agents were given the names of 59 individuals who had been summoned for jury duty. One of the individuals under subpoena was the Identification Officer of the Montgomery, Alabama, Police Department. ASAC Jordan advised that when this officer is subpoenaed there is no way of checking the records at the Montgomery Police Department. Twenty of the 59 persons subpoenaed were from Montgomery County, Alabama.

As of 11:20 a.m. the box of trial jurors had been filled. The Agents at the request of Doar had concentrated on the first 30 names on the jury list and were able to furnish to the Departmental attorneys the results of a check of the office indices, information available through Agents' personal knowledge, and other local checks. Eleven of the 30 resided in Montgomery and we were not able to check the records of the Montgomery Police Department inasmuch as the Identification Officer was under subpoena and was at the Federal court.

At 1:57 a.m., 11/28/65, Mr. Robert Owen, Department Attorney, called from Montgomery, Alabama, advising he was preparing captioned case for trial. He advised that SA Harold F. Charron, presently assigned to WFO, took eight photographs on 3/21/65 at a Klan motorcade in Montgomery and will be needed to testify on Monday, 11/29/65 regarding the photographs. Each photograph has the initials HFC and the 3/21/65 on the back, and Mr. Owen is interested in knowing positively if these are SA Charron's initials.

Mr. Owen wants SA Charron to call either Department Attorney James Turner or St. John Barrett in Montgomery at 9 a.m., 11/28/65, (10 a.m. Washington time) at 205-263-3136 regarding these photographs.

SA Charron is expected to testify on Monday, 11/29/65, or at the latest Tuesday, 11/30/65. Owen advised Charron not needed until afternoon, 11/29/65, and suggested he take a Delta flight from Washington National Airport leaving 7:30 a.m. and arriving in Montgomery, Alabama, about ll a.m.

Inspector James L. McGovern has telephonically furnished the following information. Gary Thomas Rowe, our informant, finished cross examination at 3:10 p.m., Washington, D. C., time, subject to recall. His testimony was essentially that given by him in the two previous state murder trials of Collie Wilkins and the defense attorney, Art Hanes, was unsuccessful in his efforts to shake the informant.

As was done by the late Mat Murphy during the state murder trial of Wilkins, defense attorney Hanes introduced the factor that the informant had violated his Klan oath in disclosing information concerning the Klan and for that reason his testimony was not worthy of belief.

Inspector McGovern stated that it is believed that this tactic was unsuccessful and could backfire on the defense since the Departmental attorneys in refutation were able to introduce the entire Klan oath which provides that Klan members should cooperate with duly constituted law enforcement agencies, particularly in relation to crimes such as treason and murder.

### **ACTION:**

The Mobile Office is continuing to follow the trial closely and will keep the Bureau advised of all pertinent developments.





Mrs. Viola Liuzzo was shot near Selma, Alabama, on the evening of 3/25/65, while engaging in the transportation of civil rights workers between Montgomery and Selma. One of the defendants Collie L. Wilkins has been tried twice in State Court in Hayneville, Alabama. The first trial ended in a mistrial, the second in acquittal.

The three defendants were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury setting in Montgomery, Alabama, in April, 1965, for conspiracy to violate the civil rights of the victims.

In connection with the Federal trial which began in Montgomery on 11/29/65. SAs Richard W. Flach and Marion E. Williams were called as witnesses.

SA Williams testified concerning his examination of the victim's car in Montgomery immediately following the shooting and the physical evidence which he obtained. He also testified concerning the examinations he conducted in the Laboratory which resulted in the identification of a bullet from the victim's head and two bullets recovered from the car as having been fired in the revolver recovered by Bureau Agents from a car located at the residence of Eugene Thomas, a defendant in this case.

SA Flach testified concerning his examination of glass fragments removed from the recovered bullets. These fragments were compared with known specimens obtained from the door window and windshield of the victim's car. On the basis of this examination, SA Flach was able to testify concerning which specimens passed



The Director received the attached telegram dated December 4, 1965, from the President at the temporary White House in Johnson City, Texas. The telegram reads "My congratulations to you on the successful conclusion of the U. S. vs. Eaton, Thomas, and Wilkins case. The work which you and the Bureau did in preparing this case for trial in conducting the necessary investigations, I am sure, made possible this victory for justice. Lyndon B. Johnson."

Pursuant to my conversation with the Director this morning there is attached a copy of our acknowledgment of this telegram which was approved by the Director and reads as follows "It was typically thoughtful of you to extend congratulations regarding the Eaton, Thomas and Wilkins case. I am very grateful to you for your continued faith and confidence in the FBI's handling of its responsibilities in this field. I am taking great pride in passing your fine message on to the many FBI personnel who tenaciously and patiently handled this matter. J. Edgar Hoover."

Mrs. Stegall at the White House advised that there are no facilities in either Austin or Johnson City for delivering telegrams to the LBJ ranch. She stated all telegrams sent to either of these cities are sent back to the White House and they put them on the direct line to the little White House at the LBJ ranch. She stated that this handling is much faster and accordingly, a copy of the attached telegram was delivered personally to Mrs. Stegall at approximately 10:20 a.m. and she assured that it would be sent to the President immediately.



I stated we were pretty well covered by informants and took occasion to mention to the Attorney General that I have ordered more Agents into the Charlotte area, including Inspector Joseph Sullivan. The Attorney General stated he did not know that the information he gave me re the starting of the trial is public knowledge, but we are going to have a very short time to check on the jury panel. I stated I would lay plans accordingly so we would have enough men in that office so they can respond to E.


The Attorney General inquired if I thought we would break the case in Charlotte. I stated I was not certain and he inquired if it depended upon somebody talking and I agreed, stating we have to get somebody from within.

I also took occasion to mention to the Attorney General the fact that there is coming out in the January Render's Digest a fine article on the accomplishments in the civil rights field. I stated I have found that people are amazed when I begin to tell them of the things that have been done and this article will be excellent. I commented that I had seen an editorial in a Cumberland paper which was critical of the Department for not doing more in the civil rights and organized crime fields, but we have made a substantial record in both and mentioned the case in Chicago yesterday where Murray Humphreys died. The Attorney General asked if I would send him the names of the two Agents in Chicago who made the arrest of Humphreys as he thought he might write them. I told him I would do so. (Mr. Belmont has been advised.)

The Attorney General stated that John Doar would be down there sometime Friday and be in touch with the Bureau people and if I had any farther thoughts on the matter to give him a call, but he thought Rowe would have to be toned down a bit but we can try to do most of what he wants. I stated I saw in a wire I had received from the West Coast that Rowe said he had no confidence in the attorneys of the Department but did have confidence in the FBI so we will have that leverage. The Attorney General stated he thought Doar is a calm man and I stated he is a good prosecutor and that is important because I think this case is being viewed rather as a "symbol" case.

On March 25, 1965 he was on special assignment im Selma, Alabama. In the early inighttime of that date, he was patrolling at the Dallas County - Lowndes County line vicinity, when two men, driving a Corvette convertible stopped and talked to him. He stated these men identified themselves as being attached to Graig Air Force Base, Selma, Alabama, and were cadets from some foreign country, the identity of which he does not recall. These men told him they had observed a Megre man standing in the highway about three miles back toward Montgomery on W. S. Highway 80, and the man was waving his arms, apparently attempting to stop them. They almost hit this man and had to swerve to keep from hitting him. They did not see anyone else around and suspected he might be trying to rob them, but stated there was a possibility he had been involved in an accident.

We radiced the Selma State Troopers post and furnished this information to them and then proceeded about three miles east toward Montgomery en W. S. Highway 80, but seeing nothing unusual, he returned to his post of assignment and continued patrolling in the area of the county line. In about five to ten minutes he heard a dispatch on his radic to the effect that there had been a shooting in the same general area where the men had reported seeing the Megro; therefore, he proceeded immediately to the vicinity of Craig Air Force Base, where he spotted the convertible with the two men in it and stopped them. The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent on November 22, 1965, at Selma, Alabama:

Orrville Highway, advised they knew of no possible way to verify that a 6X6 truck was located att the corner of Lawrence Street in Selma, Alabama, on March 25, 1965. They pointed out that trip tickets are only maintained a period of 60 days to show movement of vehicles in any particular area.

The trip tickets which are kept by the Armory and the National Guard units at the present time do not require detailed information as to the movement of a vehicle, and if a unit noted on the trip ticket, "to downtown area," this would fulfill existing regulations and it could mean any area in Selma.







The Department has advised that the House Committee on Un-American Activities plans to subpoens Gary Thomas Rove to appear before the Committee in Washington, D. C., probably during January of 1966. This is in connection with the Committee's hearings concerning the various Klan organizations. The Department has advised that it does not know the exact nature of the testimony desired from Rowe.

The Department has pointed out that the Committee does have the power to subpoen any individual in the United States and that the Department desires to cooperate with the Congressional Committee.

The Department has requested that the informant be contacted and it he specifically ascertained whether or not Rowe is willing to appear before this Committee.

In this regard, it is the Department's opinion that he should be made available, however, you should not in anyway jendeavor to influence the decision of Rowe either one way or the other.
