



It appears that some Yale Professors made a hush-hush report to Mr. Truman making that charge ...... While all of us on the papers and radio withheld secrets of the atomic bomb, the Government gave permission to publish a book on how to make one. It is entitled "The Smythe Report," published by Princeton. The formerd of thanks in it to the author for explaining to you, the people, was written by General Groves. Only two short years ago, the Administration issued official reports which enlightened not only Americans but our Russian enemies. It was the one that assured you 42 airdromes were enough because 70 would mean rationing and price ceilings.

To keep the Russians thoroughly up to date, Senator Lodge only last Tuesday told the United States Senate that the Joint Chiefs now demanded 140 air groups by expansion of the Tactical Command. The Tass Agency

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reporters from Russia didn't need to read the New York I Times on Wednesday because the Tass reporters heard it with their own ears in the Senate gallery the day before. The intelligence officers will tell you that the President's statement itself is the worst kind of breach of security because Russia now knows that we know that she knows our secret.

PURPOSE:

This memorandum is in response to the <u>Director's</u>
inquiry in connection with the <u>Winchell</u> broadcast of October
21, 1951, as to what distribution we have made of the information outside of the <u>Bureau regarding</u> Gus Hall's changed,
appearance and the fact <u>Amy Tiesler</u> was with him when arreste
in <u>Verico</u> City.

DETAILS:

The Bureau distributed no information concerning Hall's changed appearance or the identities of the individuals with Hall when arrested in Verico City to anyone outside the Bureau. As a matter of fact we have furnished no information to anyone outside the Bureau other than what appeared in the press release regarding his arrest and in a memorandum to the Criminal Division, Department of Justice, of October 10, 1951. This memorandum to the Criminal Division merely advised that Hall had been taken into custody at Laredo, Texas, on October 10, 1951, and placed in the Federal Correctional Institution at Texarkana, Texas.

The New York Office was instructed to consult with the United States Attorney's Office to ascertain whether additional sentence could be given Hall for his Jatlure to surrender on July 2, 1951, to start serving his sentence. In view of that, I spoke to ASAC Whelan in New York today concerning this matter and asked him specifically whether the United States Attorney's Office is New York had been furnished with the identity of the four persons, including Amy Tiesler, who were with Hall in Mexico City. He said this information had not been furnished to the United States Attorney. I inquired whether Hall's altered appearance had been discussed with the United States Attorney. Wr. Thelan said that this question had some up incompand as the United States Attorney was interested in any disquise on the part of Hall as a part of contempt proceedings now contemplated; however, the details of the altered appearance of Hall have not yet been furnished to the United States Attorney, according to Wr. Thelan. Wr. Thelas further

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added that the New York Office is receiving telephone calls concerning the matters mentioned by Winchell and he advised that the police officials on Long Island had immediately identified the woman referred to by Winchell as Amy Sidney Fieller. According to Ur. Whelan, this identification by the police officials was immediately brought to the attention of the New York Office.

### OBSERVATIONS:

It is observed that the leakage of this information may have a very deleterious effect on our contemplated action under the harboring statutes. The Long Island police were able to identify my liesler through this disclosure on winchell's broadcast and certainly fiesler, if she received information that her name had been mentioned on this broadcast, would know to whom Winchell was referring and foresee that she might be prosecuted for harboring. Likewise, it might make the other individuals who were with Hall when arrested feel that they too would be prosecuted for harboring and would make their location more difficult.

### RECOMMENDATION:

Inasmuch as we did not disseminate this information to anyone outside the Bureau and the disclosure of this and other information might be prejudicial to our harboring prosecutions, it is suggested that Wr. Minchell be contacted to determine the source of his information.

ACTION:

If you approve. New York will be instructed to contact Walter Winchell and ascertain the source of his information.



Elizabeth, N.J.: The death toll in that Miami-bound plane was 56 not 53. That makes it the second worst plane crash in the United States.

New York: No passenger list is . ready yet on the crash. The only name we have at this time is the pilot--Captain Alvin C. Lyons of Miami.

#### COMMENT :

The Newark Office advised that plane belonged to an independe airlines -- namely the Miami Airlines Inc. The plane a two engine C-46 left Newark airport at 3:05 P.M. and orashed five minutes later in Elizabeth River, in the vicinity of Vestfield Avenue and Golden Avenue, Elizabeth, New Jersey. The plane struck one or more homes or buildings. A man, occupant of one of these buildings was reported injured. According to present information there were 47 adults, two children, two infants and five crew members on board, and all were killed. Identities of dead are not known. Newark Office is maintaining liaison with investigating groups through Chief Lombardi of Elizabeth, New Jersey Police Department. No evidence of sabotage developed thus far. A Civil Aeronautics Board spokesman indicated to press that records of plane will be checked to determine if plane was overloaded.

#### WINCHELL:

New York City: Gus Hall, the Communist leader who jumped bail and escaped to Merico can expect a Christmas present from the Federal Judge; an extra term in jail.




