Special Agent Charles J. Hollandsworth, New York Division, telephonically contacted the Bureau on November 29, 1953, at 11:13 p.m. and talked with Supervisor R. F. McIlwain. Special Agent Hollandsworth stated that the captioned broadcast had been monitored in New York over Radio Station WABC and the following items of interest were being called to the Bureau's attention:

1. Winchell stated that an investigative committee from Washington will link a prominent instructor at Cooper Union College at New York with the Julius Rosenberg spy ring and that his initials were E.P.

Special Agent Hollandsworth stated the individual with the initials E.P. is believed to be [redacted] who is the subject of New York file [redacted]. He stated [redacted] is the husband of [redacted] who is the subject of New York [redacted].

2. Winchell stated that the next headlines on the Harry Dexter White case will break on next Wednesday. Winchell continued by stating that William Ludwig Uhlman was promoted despite objection of the FBI.

Special Agent Hollandsworth stated that William Ludwig Uhlman is [redacted].

3. Winchell in his "Reporter's Report to the Nation" referred to the following as to what Gouzenko may be able to testify.

(a) Who was secretary on the Staff of the Secretary of State Stettinius who Gouzenko said was a Soviet Agent? Was he Alger Hiss or was he not Alger Hiss? Who was he Mr. Gouzenko?

(b) The United States knows that the Russians planted a top secret agent in war time in the office of Admiral Ernest King. Our Government also knows his name but we need Mr. Gouzenko, the source of that news to say so under oath to make it

The Velde Investigating Committee will open hearings in New York next month -- another Red spy ring involving 20 new names.

Comment:

The Bureau has received no requests for name checks or other indications to support these alleged contemplated hearings by the Velde Committee.

Winchell said:

Senator McCarthy's probers will be in Erie, Pennsylvania, by Tuesday regarding alleged Reds in defense plants.

Comment:

This is apparently a continuance of the McCarthy Committee's recent investigation into the Communist infiltration of the United Electrical Workers Union at the General Electric Company plants at Schenectady, New York, and Boston, Massachusetts.

Winchell said:

Malenkou's secret police have taken over the entire command once headed by Beria. This means the top Red generals and their families will be shot for any false moves. Malenkou is giving the orders, not taking them.

As you will recall, the Bureau has received word from the Jenner Committee and the Department of Justice that [redacted] and [redacted] have been examining files of the Treasury Department in preparation for their expected appearance before the Jenner Committee.

Winchell said:

The Chrysler people in Detroit, Michigan have a very good story. A man named Hall, or Hull, using Joe DiMaggio's name -- this man's check for 3 grand bounced.

Comment:

The Bureau has received no information regarding this check. There is no positive indication that the Bureau has jurisdiction in this case, since it is not known whether the check traveled in interstate commerce.

Winchell said:

The Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico is on the march. They are plotting violence and maybe a revolution after raiding armories for their guns.

Comment:

The San Juan Office advised the Bureau, as well as the New York and Chicago Offices last week that [REDACTED]

This information was immediately disseminated to the White House, Secret Service, Secretary of Interior, ONI, G-2 and OSI. To date, no such raid or raids are known to have been effected.

Winchell said:

Dorothy Parker, the famous playwright and poet, is making a speech in New York on the 17th at a hall in Greenwich Village, probably on 12th Street, on behalf of the Communists now in American jails for conspiring to overthrow the United States.

Comment:

The Bureau has been advised by the New York Office that the Communist-sponsored National Committee to Win Amnesty for Smith Act Victims plans a mass demonstration on December 17, 1953, in New York City. [REDACTED]

Winchell said:

The Institute of Pacific Relations, investigated for two years by the McCarran Committee, is quietly planning to get away from it all--meaning quit.

Winchell said:

Fort Monmouth, New Jersey--The McCarthy Committee has summoned twenty present and former employees at this Army base. At least ten of them will use the Fifth Amendment as alibis.

Comment:

As you know, Senator Joseph McCarthy has been furnishing the Bureau transcripts of the Executive Session testimony of recent McCarthy Committee hearings at the Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, Army Base. This appears to be a continuation of those hearings and the Bureau will continue to review all such testimonies. It is obviously a speculation as to how many will invoke the Fifth Amendment.

Winchell said:

Another sensation will break next week before a Senate Committee probing Reds. The FBI reported him to the White House

As you recall, Walter Winchell, in his column in the "New York Mirror," dated November 20, 1953, said "...the next Gov't official to be accused of being a Red: - A high-placed exec. at U. S. immigration. He was also promoted by Truman after the FBI reported him." At that time the Director noted: "Do we know who this is?" A memorandum dated November 27, 1953, entitled [REDACTED] was prepared and reflects that [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is the subject of a Security Matter - C; Perjury case [REDACTED] which is pending. He was also the subject of a Loyalty of Government Employees investigation. [REDACTED] Liaison with the U. S. Bureau of Immigration reflects [REDACTED] is the only probable person to whom Winchell has reference; however, it is noted that [REDACTED] is not now employed by the Bureau of Immigration and has not been employed since February, 1948.

Winchell said:

In the New York Federal Court House, informed people expect Judge Noonan will find Red fugitive Robert Thompson guilty of contempt and sentence him to an extra three years. Thompson, a decorated war hero for our side, is a Communist chief.

Comment:

This prediction is probably based on the fact that Gus Hall, a former Communist fugitive, was apprehended in 1951 and received a three-year sentence for contempt.

Winchell said:

United Nations, New York - two new names, Americans in key positions of the United Nations, will be subpoenaed by the Jenner Committee some time next week. They are accused of membership in the Communist Party.

Comment:

You will recall that on November 6, 1953, the Senate Sub-Committee on Internal Security (Jenner Committee) requested identity and background of two or three employees of the United Nations likely to invoke the Fifth Amendment if called before that Committee to testify. A memorandum dated November 12, 1953, was prepared concerning two such individuals: [redacted] and [redacted]. A memorandum dated December 16, 1953, reflects Mr. Nichols cleared with Deputy Attorney General Rogers and then, on a strictly confidential basis, furnished the names and background of [redacted] and [redacted] to the Jenner Committee which is arranging for hearings on December 22, 1953. [redacted] and [redacted] are apparently the individuals to whom Winchell has reference.

Winchell said:

The upcoming legislation of wire tapping recommended by Mr. Brownell, which means the White House, will not only deal with Communists and subversives but all criminal elements, especially the kidnappers. By all means let's have it.

Comment:

This is probably a reference to H.R. 408 which is a bill pending in Congress that would permit the IIC agencies to wire tap and use the information obtained in evidence, not only in security-type cases but also in certain criminal cases upon authorization of the Attorney General. This bill would not require a court order to wire tap and is the bill which the Bureau would like to see enacted into law.

Winchell said:

Panama City, Florida. Jesse James Roberts, notorious jailbreaker and thief, was captured by the FBI tonight.

Comment:

Jesse James Roberts, Jr., with alias, fugitive, et al, ITSP, ITSMV, Conspiracy, was apprehended January 3, 1954, by Agents of the Mobile Division at Wewahatchka, Florida. [REDACTED]

Winchell said:

New Haven Connecticut. Federal Agents are working on attempted sabotage in and near New Haven, Connecticut. The saboteurs are known to be definitely Communists.

Comment:

ASAC Torrens, New Haven, was called at 10:20 A.M., January 4, 1954, and advised New Haven has no case of sabotage in which the subject or suspects are known to be definitely Communists. Mr. Torrens said Winchell apparently referred to the case entitled "Unknown Subject, Cutting of Electrical Wiring on M-S B-47 (Marine Sweeper) Sea Beaver Corporation, Greenwich, Connecticut, November 6-11, 1953, Sabotage" which is a current investigation. The chief suspect is [REDACTED] No information indicates [REDACTED] has any affiliation with the Communist Party. Winchell possibly heard about the case through the Office of the United States Attorney in New York City where a search warrant has been issued to search [REDACTED] residence in New York.

The most logical suspect is, of course, Alger Hiss, who occupied such a position. Neither the FBI nor the State Department has been able to identify this individual positively by name.

Winchell said:

Attention United States Intelligence. This is to tip you off to another trouble spot developing in our own backyard. A Red spy headquarters has just been set up in Honduras at Tegucigalpa. These not so very clever Red agents are travelling under Guatemalan passports although they were born in the Dominican Republic. Their names are Francisco ~~Perise~~ (phonetic), Juan ~~Ducaradré~~ (phonetic), and Gregorio ~~Perise~~ (phonetic). To the CIA in Washington - you'd better get to know these people before they get to know you.

Comment:

No record could be located in the Bureau indices based on a check made under variations of the above phonetically spelled names. Winchell specifically called the attention of the CIA to these men. He did not indicate that they are in the United States or any of its possessions nor did he state that they intend to come here. He gave no destination for their travel.

Juneau, Alaska--the Senator McCarthy investigators are backed with evidence of \$5,000,000 contracting frauds involving some Department of Interior officials.

Comment:

The Bureau received information in April, 1952, concerning the matter of [REDACTED] - Miscellaneous Information Concerning [REDACTED]

This information was furnished to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice on May 16, 1952, but no request for Bureau investigation was received from the Department. A memorandum dated October 21, 1953, from Mr. Nichols to Mr. Tolson reflects that Carmine Bellino, a former Bureau Agent who is presently employed by the McCarthy Committee, was en route to Alaska to investigate [REDACTED] under the auspices of the McCarthy Committee and the Department of Interior. The Bureau advised the Criminal Division of the Department on October 26, 1953, after referencing our letter of May 16, 1952, that Bellino was en route to Alaska to investigate [REDACTED]. To date the Criminal Division has not requested the Bureau to investigate this matter and [REDACTED] has never been investigated by the Bureau. (46-18140)

1 On December 21, 1949, Attorney General McGrath ordered the Bureau to investigate the attempted bombing of the UAW - CIO Headquarters in Detroit, Michigan, and all other phases connected with this which included the shootings of Walter and Victor Reuther a year previously. On May 14, 1952, the Bureau pointed out to the Department that over 7,000 suspects had been interrogated and close to 300 shotguns had been checked and that no information had been developed indicating a federal violation. On May 14, 1952, Department instructed the Bureau not to conduct any further investigation unless a federal violation developed. Since that time the Bureau has followed the matter closely without conducting an active investigation. Ritchie implicated [REDACTED] a Detroit hoodlum, as the trigger man in the Walter Reuther shooting. Ritchie was under police guard as the key witness in Detroit and disappeared from a Detroit hotel on Friday, January 8, 1954. Since that time he has been in contact with a Detroit newspaper and has made the statement that he was just engineering a shakedown.

Winchell said:

The Department of Justice wants to close the Ambassador John P. Davies matter. The Jenner Committee, however, will expose the whole thing if anyone tries that.

Winchell said:

Washington. Senator Welker of Idaho will make sensational charges on the floor tomorrow against American Ambassador to Korea Arthur Dean. Mr. Welker will produce a letter written in 1949 naming two of Mr. Dean's top guys on foreign affairs. The names shockingly are Owen Lattimore who was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury recently, and Lawrence Rosinger, who when questioned about alleged membership in the Communist Party sought shelter behind the well known Number 5 (Fifth Amendment).

Comment:

Arthur Hobson Dean has been special envoy to Korea to negotiate with the enemy. He was formerly the chairman of the American Council of the Institute of Pacific Relations (IPR) during the 1940s.

Owen Lattimore at present is under a seven count perjury indictment as a result of his testimony before the McCarran Committee during 1951 and 1952. Lawrence Rosinger was connected with the IPR.

The letter apparently referred to by Mr. Winchell is a letter written on April 18, 1949, by Arthur H. Dean to Mr. Clayton Lane, Executive Secretary of the American Institute of Pacific Relations, Incorporated, New York, New York. The text of this letter is set out on Page 2519, Part 8, of the printed record of the McCarran Committee hearings on the IPR.

Notes of a Newspaperman



An economy-minded Congress is ready to slash every bureau's budget to shreds . . . This is to remind them that the FBI is not only our first line of defense, but it might be our last . . . The value of uncovering an enemy agent can't be measured in dollars, because the damage a Hiss or a Rosenberg can do is counted in lives.

No one knows better than Moscow that it takes a professional to catch a professional and the happiest year Malenkov ever hoped for would be the one in which our Congress handcuffed the FBI by failing to raise its appropriations . . . Director J. Edgar Hoover is the most underpaid man in American history . . . It will be a sad day for this Republic if he ever becomes The Man Most Undermined.

Nothing tends to blur moral distinctions and obliterate simple decency as a policy of expediency. There are times, however, when expediency becomes sheer stupidity . . . Hjalmar Schacht, Hitler's financial brain, has just received permission to return to the banking business in Germany. This is another contemptuous rebuke to the memory of every American soldier who died fighting Nazism.

If Hitler and Goebbels were alive would we allow one to return to politics and the other to publish newspapers? Schacht is equivalent to Hitler and Goebbels—both as a Nazi and a criminal. He is this type of sub-human: During World War II, Schacht made a plunder survey of the Balkans, listing everything seizable in production or financial wealth. The report even shocked hardened Nazis—who pointed out he left no food for the local populations . . . Schacht exclaimed: "Oh God, do they have to eat?"

Politics is a sort of opiate. It enables some politicians to be in complete possession of the past while rejecting the present as a dim dream . . . Communist Stewart Alsop reported: "It is no secret that the Republican extremists are bitter about President Eisenhower's refusal to go back to McKinley, or even

Hoover. After the President's State-of-the-Union message, there was much muttering in the cloakrooms about 'the damn New Dealer in the White House' . . . In common with FDR—President Eisenhower would rather please the people than politicians.

The prospect of peace-loving Communists is a recurring illusion among many Americans. Primarily, peace and Communism are contradictory—since Communism means violent revolution . . . The explanation for the happy illusion is simple: It is always more pleasant to believe bright hopes than accept grim reality. During the Russian purge trials Vishinsky belatedly: "Two worlds face each other as irreconcilable and deadly enemies—the world of capitalism, and the world of socialism."

The bloody reality of that statement is represented by the 29,922 Americans who died in Korea fighting Communism.

In Jacksonville, Fla., Francis M. McHale, ex-counsel to the KKK, started an action against the Secretary of the Navy and the Atty Gen'l of the U. S. to compel them to restore segregation of races at Naval bases . . . This silly man declares that mingling whites and Negroes eventually would cause mankind to revert to simian traits. In defense of monkeys, they do not wear sheets like the KKK, though they do chatter endlessly like lawyer McHale.

The five Communist leaders going to trial are Marcus Alphonse Murphy, Robert G. Galt, William Sentner, Dorothy Forrest and Anna Louise Strong. The Civil Rights Congress has ordered the courtroom to be packed at all times, particularly on the opening day of the trial.

Winchell said:

What is Anna Louise Strong, the very left winger, doing in Guatemala, the scene of considerable Red trouble?

Comment:

Anna Louise Strong, approximately seventy years of age, has been the subject of extensive Bureau investigation. She is a writer and lecturer and for fifty years has traveled world wide espousing the Communist line. She has been known to be particularly active in countries where the possibility of Communist penetration has arisen. In 1949 she was deported from Russia, being named by the Russians as an agent provocateur. She has, nevertheless, continued her pro-Soviet, pro-Communist propaganda. She has been interviewed by the Bureau while ostensibly cooperative but has furnished little information. She has been known to the Bureau and the State Department to be active in various ways. She has had several articles printed in the press. The State Department is giving some coverage to her activities. The Department of Justice declined to register her under the Internal Security Act of 1950. She is on the Security Index.

The encouraging and the heartening news from U.S. intelligence is that our faithful ally, Brazil, will take that initiative at the Pan-American Conference. Brazil will attack the South American nations playing ball with the Reds

Comment:

Central American Governments are perennially faced with crises, both economic and political. With respect to the second point, Winchell is referring to the forthcoming meeting at Caracas, Venezuela, of the Organization of American States (OAS). There have been indications for some time that this meeting will condemn Communist interference in the Western Hemisphere as well as the failure of certain Latin American republics, such as Guatemala, to properly curtail Communists activities.

Winchell said:

Tokyo--This is the inside story on the switch over to our side of the Russian agent described as the Second Secretary of the Russian Legation at Tokyo. This Red was not really Second Secretary. That title was a cover up. He was actually the Chief of Red Intelligence. He has the same rank as Gouzenko in Ottawa but he has a lot more important information. More important, however, is that two other top Beria men are now outside the Iron Curtain and contact has been made by U.S. Intelligence.

(S)(u) [Winchell is referring to the recent defection of Colonel Yuri Alexandrovitch Rastvorov who is presently being interrogated by Army Intelligence at Tokyo. Winchell may possibly be referring to the routine arrest of subversive individuals under the Attorney General's denaturalization and deportation program. This program, which was inaugurated during October, 1952, will involve all told approximately 189 subversives, as well as 115 racketeers.

Winchell said:

A sure best seller coming out in March is McCarthy And His Enemies. The author is William Buckley of Yale University.

Comment:

Cory
William E. Buckley, who graduated from Yale during 1950 is the author of the former best seller, "God and Man at Yale," published during October, 1951. The latter book, which caused quite a sensation at the time of its publication, consists, in summary, of an attack upon the "secular and collectivist influence" at Yale.

Winchell said:

Russia is spending a quarter of a million dollars on a new building to house its UN Delegation. This indicates no break in diplomatic relations with Russia.

Comment:

The above information was incorporated in the 2-3-54, Current Intelligence Summary issued by the Bureau. It refers to the fact that during November, 1953, the Soviet Union purchased a residential building adjacent to its UN headquarters at 680 Park Avenue, New York City, spending \$150,000. It is estimated that the Soviets are spending an additional \$50,000 to combine this new building with its former headquarters as well as to refurbish both buildings.

Efforts to identify this individual have met with negative results. The names of all individuals on the Bureau's Security Index having the last name beginning with "H" were checked, consisting of approximately 1,334 names. Of these, 56 males had initials of "A. H." and whose cards were checked but failed to reflect any occupation as lawyers.

The records of the National Lawyers Guild (a cited Communist front), reflecting current national and local officers and members of national committees, were checked but revealed no one having the initials "A. H."

It appears that the most logical individual with the initials "A. H." and a lawyer by profession, who could be considered as one of the "Kremlin's Big 4 in the U. S." might possibly be [REDACTED]

"M. L....A Truman pal:"

Believed to be [REDACTED] on whom no complete investigation has been conducted by the Bureau. Information was received in 1946 from former Communist Party members [REDACTED] was among a group of high-level Government employees who, although were not "openly connected" with the Communist Party, had placed many Communists in Government positions. It has been reliably reported [REDACTED] has been affiliated with numerous Communist front groups and pro-Soviet organizations as early as 1925. An FBI undercover man will accuse a civilian worker in the Army Department before a Senate Committee some time this week as a dues-paying conspirator.

Winchell said:

Washington -- GOP chiefs will urge the President to replace Secretary Benson and Secretary of War Stevens. Stevens refused to name the Army brass who promoted the Communists. Bad for votes!

Comments:

Secretary of War Robert T. Stevens last week publicly denounced the "unfair attacks" made by Senator Joseph R. McCarthy (R-Wisc.) on Army officers. Stevens' statement was an outgrowth of McCarthy's questioning of Brigadier General Ralph Zwicker, Commanding Officer of Camp Kilmer, New Jersey, with respect to the promotion and honorable discharge of an alleged Communist, Major Irving Peress. According to Stevens, McCarthy had subjected General Zwicker to "humiliating treatment" and was undermining the morale of Army officers generally.

Winchell said:

New York City -- The United States Government has a deportation warrant for a television actor. You probably have seen him on your sets. His initials are C. K.

Comment:

The Immigration and Naturalization Service has advised that they cannot immediately identify the individual to whom Winchell is referring; however, they are checking on this item. INS would have primary interest in this matter.

Winchell said:

Oslo, Norway -- The Norwegian Intelligence has arrested a Norwegian spy ring of nineteen just as its leader turned over defense plans of Oslo Harbor to a Russian in a parked car. Norway had demanded the immediate recall of the Russian Second Secretary. The Second Secretary in all Russian Embassies is actually the chief of Russian intelligence.

Comment:

It is true that the Second Secretary of the Russian Embassy is frequently a ranking intelligence official. The Bureau has found this to be the case in a number of instances. Winchell's statement that all Second Secretaries are the heads of Russian Intelligence networks would seem to be a distinct exaggeration, however.

Winchell said:

Palm Springs, California -- I flew to this desert paradise to see Governor Knight the other day about Wesley Wells, a Negro sentenced to die in the gas chamber April 9th. The law in California condemns you to death for striking a prison guard if, if you are doing life at the time. I have been told that the prisoner was given life AFTER he struck the guard and then condemned to the gas chamber.

Comment:

Wells, a habitual criminal, has been in prison almost continuously since 1925. During March, 1942, he was sentenced to a term of 1-5 years at San Quentin prison for auto theft. This sentence was increased to 5 years to life during September, 1944, after Wells violated the prison regulations relating to the possession of weapons by inmates. In August, 1947, Wells was sentenced to death for assaulting a prison guard. During a prison fracas, he had thrown a cuspidor at the guard. ^{early in 1947.}

Winchell said:

Chicago-American -- The policeman from Cicero convicted for violating civil rights will be retried in Chicago March 30th.

Winchell is referring to the Bureau case entitled "~~Erwin Konovsky Et Al, Harvey Evans Clark Et Al, Victims, Civil Rights.~~" This case is the outgrowth of the race riots which occurred at Cicero, Illinois, during 1951, after Clark and his family moved into a previously all-white neighborhood. Konovsky, the Chief of Police at Cicero, and two others were subsequently convicted for failing to afford the victims proper protection. The Court of Appeals reversed this verdict last spring and remanded the case to the lower courts for retrial.

Winchell said:

John Edgar Hoover -- Look Magazine next Tuesday has a very wonderful article about three of your top men, Tolson, Nichols, and Ladd.

Comment:

The Bureau knows about this. In fact, Look Magazine consulted with the Crime Records Section in preparing this article in question.

Winchell said:

Detroit Times -- Senator Jenner's Investigating Committee will hold a series of explosive hearings in Detroit, Michigan, in about two weeks.

Comment:

Ed Duffy, staff member of the Jenner Committee, advised the Bureau late last week that although that Committee did plan to conduct some hearings in Detroit eventually, they had no immediate plans in that regard. Duffy indicated that the Jenner Committee would not visit Detroit until the House Committee on Un-American Activities had concluded its sessions in Detroit.

Winchell said:

Washington Post -- People representing all organizations recently listed as subversive by the government's Mr. Brownell will march on Washington, D.C., and also try to disturb the Congress March 7th and 8th.

Comment:

Winchell is probably referring to the ~~People's~~ Conference to Repeal the McCarran Act" which is being sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress on Sunday, March 7th. Plans call for a special train to transport delegates from the New York area. According to a Bureau source, efforts will be made to visit Members of Congress, the Subversive Activities Control Board, Departmental officials and other Government leaders on Monday, March 8th. This information was included in our "Current Intelligence Summary" of February 10, 1954, and we have been keeping the Department advised.

Winchell said:

New York Daily Mirror -- Mickey Ladd, the assistant to the G-man Director for 25 years will retire on the 27th.

Comment:

None.

Winchell said:

The confirmation of Earl Warren as Chief Justice has been delayed by the ridiculous stalling of Senator Langer who is paralyzing the highest court, humiliating the nation, and disgracing the Senate by his actions in this case.

South Bend, Indiana -- The student body at Notre Dame University has honored G-Man John Edgar Hoover as the patriot of the year.

With reference to the Professor at Hunter College identified as "B.J.M.," the New York Office advised that the individual in question is probably [REDACTED] a Professor at Hunter College who has been under investigation by the Board of Higher Education of New York City because of his participation in a number of front groups. He appeared in November, 1953, before the Subcommittee of the New York Board of Higher Education, admitted membership in the CP from 1936 to 1941 while a Professor at Hunter College, and that he had misrepresented his CP membership at an earlier hearing before the Rapp-Coudert Committee in New York when he denied membership in the CP. While he admitted his own membership before the Subcommittee of the New York Board of Higher Education, he refused to identify any of his associates. An investigation is being opened in the NYO concerning this man.

Mr. Nichols instructed writer to contact SAC Malone and obtain remainder of cards from Mr. Winchell. SAC Malone contacted at 9:45 p.m., and stated Mr. Winchell would be contacted and Photostats of cards furnished to Bureau. Above-mentioned [REDACTED] security index subject.

SA [redacted] immediately contacted him at which time Mr. Winchell stated that he had a number of 3x5 cards, a stack approximately 4 inches in height, sent to him by his secretary, Rose, furnished by a confidential source who obtained them surreptitiously from [redacted]. Mr. Winchell gave 12 of these cards to [redacted] with remark that their contents may be of interest to the Bureau, and he requested that they be returned on the next day.

Mr. Malone stated that the cards appear to pertain to the period of 1946.

He also stated that Mr. Winchell remarked that he has not met Mr. Malone. Therefore, SAC Malone stated he would personally return the cards to Mr. Winchell on March 1, 1946, UACB by 10 a.m., P.S.M., 1 p.m., E.S.T. of that day.

Mr. Malone stated that during contact by SA [redacted] Mr. Winchell while talking to his secretary, Rose, requested that she call Assistant to the Director L. B. Nichols concerning the cards furnished to the FBI.

Also, Mr. Winchell, during that call remarked that he wouldn't be able to call Senator Joseph R. McCarthy and requested that she call him. He remarked to her that Howard Hughes requested a favorable comment concerning his recent picture but he, Winchell, hesitates to make a direct statement in view of the Cardinal's feeling.

SAC Malone stated that SA [redacted] could not determine whether Mr. Winchell's remark in regard to Senator McCarthy pertained to the 3x5 cards.

Afore-mentioned information was furnished to Mr. Nichols by the writer. Mr. Nichols suggested file be reviewed concerning [redacted] to ascertain significance of the cards having been in his possession.

Subsequently after the 9 p.m. broadcast by Mr. Winchell, in which he reported that names of Communists were turned over to the FBI, Mr. Nichols instructed the writer to contact SAC Malone in accordance with the Director's instructions to obtain from Mr. Winchell and Photostat all of the cards.

At 9:45 p.m. the writer relayed the instructions to SAC Malone, who stated that he could do so immediately and furnish results to the Bureau.

Partial review of files on 12 names furnished failed to reveal any record on [redacted] may possibly be identical with the subject of an espionage case [redacted] who disappeared in 1946.

However, it was noted that many of the references on individuals of the same name located in New York City were proprietors of or officers in businesses which could have used the services of [redacted]

In [redacted] testified before the Jenner Committee that he left the U.S. Government Service in [redacted] and thereafter he [redacted] He refused to identify any of his clients by invoking the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution.

For record purposes, late Sunday afternoon, Rose Bigman of Mr. Walter Winchell's office called you and I took the call. She pointed out that they had bumped into something that was very interesting. They had received a letter in the mail signed "Ed," that this letter enclosed a few cards containing names and amounts of contributions on them. The letter stated that if they were interested in learning more details, an item should be put in the column stating, "Dear Eddie: We are interested." This they did.

Shortly thereafter, a man called at the office on Friday, February 26. The man claimed that he was married, had a family and did not want to get into trouble. He had a few cards bearing the date 1946 and showing contributions of \$50, \$100 and \$200. He stated that he could get more cards. He did come up with more cards and these looked to Rose like a sucker list. She then asked about more cards like the ones she had seen first showing contributions of \$50, \$100 and \$200. In about a half an hour, he returned with approximately 150 cards. Among the names which she recognized as making contributions were the names of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The man called Eddie represented that he either stole the cards or got them surreptitiously or in some way secured them from [REDACTED].

Rose noticed this man was wearing a ring with the letter [REDACTED] on it. She then remarked to him that his name was not Eddie. He admitted it was not, but that it was [REDACTED].

Rose stated that the cards had been sent to Mr. Winchell and Mr. Winchell turned the cards over to [REDACTED] of our Los Angeles Office to be photostated. Rose stated Winchell asked her to contact us and also be sure that the man known as Eddie does not get in trouble. Rose did not know what was back of the move other than the fact that Eddie indicated the cards had something to do with Communism. He wants the cards back as he must return them and he is to call Rose early this week. Rose stated that if perhaps she knew what line to take, she could get more information from Eddie.

SAC Malone of Los Angeles telephonically advised Mr. McGuire of my office this afternoon that pursuant to Bureau instructions he had personally called on Walter Winchell yesterday afternoon and obtained from him a number of 3x5 index cards which Winchell had on individuals who possibly might have Communist Party connections. Malone stated the Los Angeles was photographing these cards today.

Winchell had asked Malone to have the cards returned to his secretary in New York and suggested Malone send a cover note to Rose Bigman so she would know where he got them. Shortly thereafter, the Supervisor on duty in the Domestic Intelligence Division advised me that SAC Malone of Los Angeles had called stating Mr. Winchell had called the office and wanted to be contacted by an Agent. Agent [redacted] went by to see Winchell. Winchell had a stack of cards about four inches high. Twelve of the cards were selected from the pile and given to Agent [redacted]. Winchell stated the cards had been secured surreptitiously from [redacted]. The cards were photostated and returned to Winchell early Monday as Winchell had to return them.

Mr. Malone also advised the Supervisor on duty in the Domestic Intelligence Division that Winchell was overheard to be talking to his secretary and overheard to tell the secretary to call Joe McCarthy.

Following my conversation with the Director, I advised the Supervisor that the Director desired that Malone contact Winchell and endeavor to secure photostats of the rest of the cards so that we could then look them over.

This is a relief, I think, from the people who refuse to answer questions. I invited Mr. Ireland here tonight to meet you all and let's hear what he has to say about it. John, I have a list as it appeared in a page ad in the "Hollywood Reporter" in 1947. It contains the names of many loyal Americans out here in the movie colony and some known "Reds," attacking a Congressional Committee. John Ireland, your name is on that list. Now I do not accuse you or anyone on that list, because that would be guilt by association and I have always been opposed to that. John, have you any comment on why your name happens to be on this list?

JOHN IRELAND SAID:

I was having dinner at the Players Restaurant a few years ago and someone submitted a petition to me. I understand tonight the petition was to abolish the Un-American Activities Committee. Well I would never be a party to that. I would never sign anything that has to do with abolishing the Un-American Activities Committee whatsoever. Personally I'm not really interested in politics. I'm sorry to say I am only interested in acting and I always have been.

WINCHELL SAID:

Ok John Ireland, I hope this helps get your side of the story over.

COMMENT:

At 3 P.M. on March 3, 1954, John Ireland called the SAC, Los Angeles from Phoenix, and stated that a story had broken in the

newspaper falsely identifying Ireland as a Communist Party sympathizer. He requested that he be permitted to come to the Los Angeles office on March 8, 1954, to be interviewed concerning this matter. It was agreed that he should be interviewed there at 3 P.M. today.

At 4 P.M. March 3, 1954, Walter Winchell called the Los Angeles office and advised that he had asked Ireland to appear on his program March 7, 1954.

We have not conducted any investigation concerning Ireland. The only previous information appearing in our files which may refer to Ireland, is as follows: In the November 3, 1947, issue of the "Hollywood Reporter" there appears a full-page ad of the Actors' Division of the Progressive Citizens of America which is entitled "The Rankin Committee Must Go." The name John Ireland appears as one of the sponsors of this ad.

WINCHELL SAID:

The scoop of my life that never got on the air. Last week's script had a tip on the shootings in Washington, but I never got to it. This is the item now on the cameras confirmed so shockingly the next afternoon. Washington Post, Attention Mr. Brownell. Followers of Campos, the pardoned Nationalist beast of Puerto Rico, are expected to stage demonstrations against leading Americans in Washington, D. C.

J. E. Hoover, and FBI men may be the first target of their shots. Now get this. The Winchell broadcast of February 21, that's two Sundays ago, was even closer to the news. Listen now to the sound track of the Winchell kinescope for February 21, while I read it and weep. Listen to the last four words. "Washington Post; People representing all organizations recently listed as subversive by the Government Mr. Brownell, will march on Washington, D. C. in hopes of trying to disturb the Congress."

"And try to disturb the Congress," that's pretty close.

COMMENT:

We received information from the U.S. Secret Service in November, 1953, to the effect that an informant of unknown reliability

had stated that the ~~Nationalist~~ Party of Puerto Rico had hatched a plot to assassinate the Director of FBI, President Eisenhower, and Henry Cabot Lodge, U. S. Ambassador to the United Nations.

On February 22, 1954, the San Juan office advised that confidential informant [REDACTED]

The "march on Washington, D. C." mentioned above apparently refers to the "Peoples Conference to Repeal the McCarran Act" (PCRMA) which is sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress. The PCRMA has been scheduled to confer with Congress on the morning of March 8, 1954, and with officials of the Justice Department and the Subversive Activities Control Board during the afternoon of March 8, 1954. Details concerning this matter are set forth in your memorandum to the Director dated March 8, 1954, captioned "Civil Rights Congress, Internal Security - C."

There is no tie in between the PCRMA and the activities of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico.

WINCHELL SAID:

There are more Puerto Rican Nationalists in Venezuela than in the United States of North America.

COMMENT:

We have no information concerning this.

WINCHELL SAID:

Senator McCarthy will say tomorrow that if the Republicans attack him once more, he, McCarthy, will not speak outside Wisconsin in the Fall Campaign. McCarthy accuses his own party of using his fight on the Communists to cover up business conditions and the farm issue. "I will no longer," said Senator McCarthy, "Take the rap."

COMMENT:

Senator McCarthy is doubtlessly referring to recent criticism directed at him by President Eisenhower and other top Republicans because of the feud between McCarthy and Secretary Stevens of the Department of the Army, which grew out of McCarthy's alleged "brow-beating" of General Zwicker when the latter was testifying before the McCarthy Committee.

WINCHELL SAID:

Yesterday in Florida, Mr. Adlai Stevenson declared that the Eisenhower administration was surrounded by political plungers. Men who had wagered the life of the Republican Party on "McCarthyism" Mr. Stevenson neglected to mention, ladies and gentlemen, that the Truman administration had bet the life of the nation on Alger Hiss and Dean Acheson, and very nearly lost the nation's life in Korea. Mr. Stevenson also said that President Eisenhower's great crusade had practiced great deception. Well in my opinion that's a very timid man's way of calling the President of the United States a liar. Mr. Stevenson also neglected to mention that one of the greatest lies in our history was exposed long ago. The Truman administration's fabrication that Alger Hiss and Harry Dexter White were merely "Red Herrings." Well, many Red leaders in the United States have since been convicted and jailed and if Mr. Stevenson only realized the 1952 election convicted the Truman administration of harboring them. Mr. Stevenson, however, truthfully said when one party calls another party a party of traitors it does great damage to the nation. What Adlai Stevenson forgot to tell you, however, was the name of the author of that very generous and very wise statement. It was stated at a press conference several months ago by the President of the United States, Dwight D. Eisenhower, who considers it more important to be an American than a politician.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL SAID:

Mr. G-man, Washington, dig up the kinescope of the G.O.P. Convention. The lunatic in the shootings of Congress last Monday looks just like the Puerto Rican "gal" who led the heckling from the gallery at the G.O.P. Convention, at the wonderfully funny Puerto Rican delegate.

COMMENT:
