On May 16, 1961 that his files reflect the Office, NASA, advised SA applicant was granted a "Top Secret" clearance by the Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, Alabama, based on a background investigation by the Third Army, completed December 29, 1954.

On June 27, 1960, NASA granted the applicant a "Top Secret" clearance based on the foregoing investigation which clearance he currently holds.

On May 11, 1961, Personnel Office, National Academy of Sciences - National Research Council (NAS - NRC), advised SA that her records reflect the applicant is not a member of NAS - NRC.

Security Office, NAS - NRC, advised SA her files contain no record on the applicant.

stated that during this period he was certain the applicant was not politically active and that he only did what his position required him to do as part of the government insofar as political matters were concerned. He stated there is no question whatsoever in his mind concerning the applicant's character, associates, reputation or loyalty and that he would recommend him, without hesitation, for a position of trust and confidence.

advised SA that he had briefly met the applicant whom he described as a great man, however, he did not know him well enough to furnish any additional comments or make any recommendation.

On May 2, 1961, Security Files, Washington Area Security Operations Office, Germantown, Maryland, advised SA that the applicant's security file WA-114136 contains no additional pertinent information.

The files of the Passport Office, Department of State, reviewed on May 11, 1961, by SE reflect the applicant was issued Passport Number 261392 on December 7, 1956, for a two-week trip to Puerto Rico and possibly the Virgin Islands, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Jamaica, and other Caribbean Islands on official business for the United States Navy in San Juan. He listed his birth date as March 23, 1912, at Wirsitz, Germany.

On August 20, 1959, the above passport was renewed for travel to France, Germany, and England on official business for the Army Ballistic Missile Agency.

On July 20, 1960, the above passport was amended to show the applicant as proceeding abroad on official business for NASA.

On October 17, 1960, the applicant was issued Passport Number 2462083 for travel to Germany, Austria, France, England, Sweden, Switzerland, Italy, and Norway for pleasure. The file contained no additional pertinent information.

Effective 2/14/56, transferred from Ordnance Missile Laboratory, RSA, to ABMA as Director, Development Operations Division. Effective 7/1/60, named Director, MSFC, MASA. Access to top secret granted 9/19/55, extended by MSFC. Security file, MSFC, reflects applicant was member of Hazi Party in Germany and SS Major in German Army. Never active in either. No adverse information developed by MASA Security Office. Associates, MSFC, comment favorably and recommend. Credit and criminal negative.

On May 4, 1961,
U. S. District Court Clerk's Office, advised that the records of that office reflect WERNHER VON BRAUN, 907 McClung Street, Huntsville, Alabama, filed petition #7888 on January 18, 1955, at Birmingham, Alabama, for the purpose of becoming naturalized. She further advised the records reflect he was naturalized in Huntsville, Alabama, on April 14, 1955, and was issued Certificate of Citizenship No. 7297683.

further advised that WERNHER VON BRAUN was born March 23, 1912, in Wirsitz, Ponsen, Germany, His wife, MARIA LOUISE VON BRAUN, was born in Berlin, Germany, and they were married February 1, 1947, in Landshut, Germany, and have two children, IRIS CAREEN VON BRAUN, born and MARGURITE CECILE VON BRAUN, born at Huntsville, Alabama.

The records of U. S. District Court Clerk's Office further reflect that WERNHER VON BRAUN had lawful admission for permanent residence; that he was at El Paso, Texas, on November 2, 1949, and his Citizenship Certificate #7297683 was signed by DAN STRONG, Deputy Clerk, U. S. District Court, Northern District of Alabama.

AT HUNTSVILLE, ALABAMA

Personnel Office, GEORGE C. MARSHALL SPACE FLIGHT CENTER (MSFC), NATIONAL AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION (NASA), made available for review applicant's personnel file maintained at the Personnel Office of MSFC. This file reflects that WERNHER MAGNUS MAXIMILIAN VON BRAUN was born March 23, 1912, at Wirsitz, Germany. This file reflects that from May, 1930, to November, 1932, applicant was employed by the Rocket Field Reinickendorf, Berlin, Germany; from November, 1932, to April, 1937, he was employed at the Army Proving Ground, German Ordnance Department, Kummersdarf, Germany; from April, 1937, to May, 1945, by the Army Rocket





Center, German Army Ordnance Department, as Technical Director, at Peenemuende, Germany; from September, 1945, to May, 1950, employed as Project Director, Research and Development Division, Sub-Office (Rocket), for the U.S. Army, Fort Bliss, Texas. From May, 1950, to February, 1956, he was employed by the U.S. Army as Technical Director at REDSTONE ARSENAL, Huntsville, Alabama, assigned to the Guided Missile Development Group. Effective February 14, 1956, he was transferred from the Ordnance Missile Laboratory, REDSTONE ARSENAL, to the Army Ballistics Missile Agency (ABMA) as Director of Development Operations Division. On July 1, 1960, he was transferred from ABMA, as Director of Development Operations Division, to MSFC as Director of MSFC. He is still employed by NASA as Director of MSFC. This file reflects that as of July 1, 1952, applicant was appointed as an Aeronautical Research, Development and Design Engineer under Civil Service status. All employment prior to that time was under a contract basis.

This file reflects that a background investigation was completed by the U.S. Third Army on December 29, 1954, and that secret clearance was granted on July 11, 1955.

Applicant's personnel file contains no derogatory information but does contain numerous letters of commendation for outstanding performance of duties.

On May 12, 1961,
Security Section, MSFC, advised that a resume of applicant's security file maintained by the Security Section, MSFC, reflects that applicant received his U. S. Citizenship on April 14, 1955. Final clearance (security) was granted by REDSTONE ARSENAL, Intelligence and Security Division, on July 26, 1955, based upon a favorable background investigation completed in December, 1954, by U. S. Army. Access to top secret information was granted on September 19, 1955, and was extended by MSFC on July 1, 1960.

Applicant's security file reflects that he was a member of the SS Horseback Riding School in Germany from 1933 to 1934. He was a D.L.V. pilot in 1933; was a member of the



from 1934 to 1935, and member of KSDAP (Nazi Party) from 1939 - 1945. He was an SS Major in the German Army, 1940 to 1945. His service in the SS was not active, but rather an honorary commission. He was arrested in March, 1944, and jailed for two weeks for Anti-Nazi utterances. He was released for lack of proof and necessity of his con timing on the job with B2 Rockets for the German Army!

This file reflects that a security evaluation the Director of Intelligence, Department of Army, did not consider applicant a war criminal, nor did evidence exist that he was an ardent Nazi. The only derogatory information developed was that he had been a member of the MSDAP and a Major in the 88 Group. No evidence of political activity or an active member of the SS was developed. The SS Commission was an honorary commission and accepted upon the advice of his superior. During the investigation of applicant, fiftyeight sources reported favorably and no information was developed reflecting adversely upon applicant's character, integrity, discretion or loyalty.



Doctor von Braun is one of the German scientists and missile experts brought to this country under the protective custody and control of the Joint Intelligence Objective Agency in 1945. Bureau files reflect that a background investigation was conducted in 1948 at the request of Mr. Peyton Ford, then Assistant to the Attorney General, with emphasis on the security aspects of the immigration of Dr. von Braun into the United States for permanent residence. That investigation was favorable. Copies of reports in this investigation will be furnished to AEC. An investigation is being ordered to the field in this case with instructions to bring the previous investigation up to date. The field is also being instructed that this case should be assigned to experienced agents and that it will not be necessary to conduct a neighborhood investigation. the applicant received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the Institute of Technology in Berlin, Germany in 1932, and that during a period in 1931, the applicant attended the Technical Institute in Switzerland. the applicant received his degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Physics from the University of Berlin in 1934. during the time applicant was studying at the Institute of Technology in 1931, the applicant assisted Professor OBERTH in writing a book concerning the possibilities of constructing liquid-fired rockets. He said applicant shortly thereafter founded his own private rocket development business in Berlin and that among his experiments was a 25 pound rocket fired by gasoline and liquid oxygen. in 1932, the applicant was connected with the German Army, his duties having been concerned with basic missile research and weather data experimentation. He said the German Government financed the applicant's building of test stands and facilities for experimentation in Darmstadt, Germany. said that in 1939, applicant became a technical advisor at Peenemunde Proving Ground located on the Baltic Sea, adding that the Commanding Officer at Peenemunde was

the applicant continued his guided missile work throughout the war and met with ADOLPH HITLER on several occasions, being decorated by HITLER twice. He said one of applicant's decorations consisted of the Iron Cross. He said he had seen pictures of the applicant receiving this Iron Cross decoration from HITLER.

learned that HITLER had instructed the SS Troops to gas all the technical men concerned with the rocket development. He said upon hearing this the applicant commendeered a train and along with other technical men fled to some location in the mountains located in South Germany. He said the applicant, along with many others, chose to leave this location in the mountains and flee to the American lines.



The following investigation was conducted on May 23, 1961, by SA

National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), advised he has known and been acquainted with applicant since approximately when applicant was in charge of the V-2 Rocket Center in Peenemuende, Germany. He stated he worked for applicant at the Peenemuende Center. He said that during the time they were together in Germany, applicant was, in all probability, a member of the German National Socialist Workers Party (NSDAP) (Nazi Party), but he was never active in the Nazi Party and his membership was through necessity rather than by choice. He was also a member of the Schutzstaffel (SS) and held a commission in the SS. advised applicant was not active in the SS and his commission was more of an honorary commission than an actual commission.

stated applicant's primary interest was in the field of scientific work and because of his position as a leader in rocket research, the Nazi Party and SS more or less left him alone; however, at one time applicant was arrested by the Gestapo and held for several weeks, but was subsequently released.

advised he considered applicant to be completely loyal to the United States Government and a man whose character, reputation and associates were above reproach. He stated he highly recommended him for a position involving trust and confidence.

MSFC, NASA, advised he has known and been associated with applicant since He stated he worked under applicant's supervision at the V-2 Rocket Center, Peenemuende, Germany. He said that although applicant was probably a member of the Nazi Party in Germany and also held a commission in the SS, he was never active in either. He advised he never knew applicant to make any political speeches

or to engage in politics in any way. He stated applicant was a devoted scientist and his membership in the Party (Nazi) was merely so he could continue his scientific work at the V-2 Center.

said applicant, in fact, was the driving force in moving the group of scientists from the Peenemuende Center to the West, rather than to the Eastern Zone of Germany immediately after World War II. He stated applicant realized the effects of working for the Russian Government and was extremely instrumental in causing the group of scientists who came to the West rather than remain in Peenemuende and be taken over by the Russians, to do so.

commented favorably concerning applicant's character, reputation, associates and loyalty to the United States Government, and stated he would highly recommend him for a position of trust and confidence.

WISFC, NASA, advised he has known and been associated with applicant since at which time he went to work under applicant's supervision at the Rocket Center, Peenemuende, Germany. He stated applicant was a member of the Nazi Party in Germany and was also an officer in the SS; however, he was never active in either. He said although applicant was the Director of the Rocket Center, he never encouraged the employees to attend Party meetings and never issued any memorandums or orders suggesting any of the employees attend Party meetings. He said applicant appeared to be completely divorced from all political activities and was only interested in his scientific work. He advised he only saw applicant in uniform on one occasion and that was on a special day when everyone had to appear in uniform if they were a member of the SS.

applicant was extremely instrumental in steering a number of the employees of the Peenemuende Rocket Center to the Western Zone at the end of World War II, rather than allowing them to remain at the Rocket Center and be absorbed into the Russian Zone. He stated applicant realized what would happen to them if they remained in Peenemuende and their only opportunity would be to move into the Western Zone. As a result, a number of the

scientists from the Peenemuende Center moved into the Western Zone and were subsequently brought to the United States.

cant since he has been in the United States and considers him to be a man of the highest type. His comments concerning applicant's character, reputation, associates and loyalty were entirely favorable and he highly recommended him for a position of trust and confidence.

MSFC, NASA, advised he has known and associated with applicant both in Germany and the United States since He stated he worked under applicant at the V-2 Rocket tenter, Peenemuende, Germany, during World War II, at which time applicant was chief of the rocket center. He said that although applicant was a member of the Nazi Party and also an officer in the SS, applicant was active in neither. He advised that to his knowledge he never saw applicant in his SS uniform. He stated applicant never engaged in political speeches for the Nazi Party and had no interest in Party work. He said applicant was strictly a scientist and devoted his entire thinking to science rather than to any activity in the Nazi Party.

VON BRAUN was very cooperative with his group and they were successful in getting the scientists and their families away from the Russians.

VON BRAUN was an officer in the German SS troops. While VON BRAUN was technical director of the German guided missile program, he had received several invitations to become an SS officer. He declined the offer. but was advised eventually that it would be wise for him to join the SS, which VON BRAUN did. VON BRAUN related this to him at one time who now lives in the United States, confirmed this. Because of VON BRAUN's high position in Germany at the time, it was expected of him to join the SS. It is his estimation that VON BRAUN was a member of the SS for about 18 months to two years. He does not believe that VON BRAUN was active or had any interest in the SS.

BRAUN in the uniform of an SS officer

Concerning VON BRAUN's membership in the Nazi Party, he is aware that VON BRAUN was a member of this Party and he assumes that he was a member for a long time. All individuals who were in a position of responsibility in Germany, with very few exceptions, were expected to be members of the Nazi Party. Membership in this Party, as well as membership in the SS, was necessary to further their professional careers.


VON BRAUN has never indicated that he is interested in political matters and he does not believe that VON BRAUN was concerned with political philosophy. His main interest in life has always been his work in guided missiles and any political activity he may have engaged in was a means to an end to provide him with the necessary freedom to conduct his experiments.

He believes VON BRAUN mentioned at one time that the SS had put him in jail for a short time because he had expressed the view that he was interested in rockets only for space purposes and not for military use.

VON BRAUN is truly grateful for the opportunities this country has given him to continue his professional interests and VON BRAUN feels that he has been exceedingly well treated in the United States. VON BRAUN returned to Germany in 1947 to get married, returned to this country, and is now naturalized.

He considers VON BRAUN to be a person of excellent moral character and habits and a good family man. VON BRAUN is a loyal American and he recommends VON BRAUN for a position of responsibility associated with the Government. His only concern about VON BRAUN is that if sometime in the future a powerful and militant Germany should again come in conflict with the United States, he does not know to what side VON BRAUN would throw his allegiance. He said VON BRAUN is a German and will always remain so. This opinion concerning VON BRAUN is true of any German. In view of the current international situation, he has no reason to question VON BRAUN. He is certain VON BRAUN has no interests in Communism and would never do business with the Russians.

suggested that von BRAUN, or someone else having a similar name, had been actively connected with German intelligence activities in Rome, Italy.

"2. The report continued as follows: 'Von BRAUN was a frequent visitor at the Japanese Embassy. During the fall of 1943, there were indications that WEISZAECKER (German Ambassador to the Holy See) was attempting to form a Vatican information service under the direction of von BRAUN and that von BRAUN may have been involved in certain fifth column activities in Rome. It is possible that both WEISZAECKER and von KESSEL (German First Secretary to the Holy See), or at least von KESSEL, regarded von BRAUN as a member of the SD whose duty it was to checker the activities of other members of the Embassy, as well as on the other German services in Rome. It may be that von BRAUN did carry out such activities at some other point in his career when he was serving in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia).

"3. This office wishes to note that, according to the above report, General WEISZAECKER and Colonel von KESSEL were, at the time of the report, actively engaged in attempting to make an arrangement with the Allies under which Generals GUDERIAN and von RUNDSTEDT might have surrendered their armies to the Allies, or that assistance might have been given to the German Army by the Allies to help the German Army liquidate the Nazis in Italy. As such, WEISZAECKER and von KESSEL were acting at this time as strong anti-Nazis."

ALLEGED TECHNICAL SABOTAGE OF U.S. SPACE PROGRAM

According to the source, the Air Porce budget for the development of this engine was out off in 1958 when the responsibility for space efforts was given to the Estimal Aeronautics and Space Administration (EASA).

The source commented that until recently Yes Braus and his associates refused to have saything to do with the "gi" recket engine and desired to go along with the equipment they developed.

CAL-VAL MESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

According to the source, the CAL-VAL company developed a sound suppressor device recently which amounted to a unjer advance in combating vibrations and heat emanated by a rocket at the time of take-off. Source alleged that CAL-VAL has been at the transfer arranging for appropriate tests of this sound hard pressor by EASA as a result of the obstructionism of Yen Brune group at Euntaville, Alabama.

The source alleged that CAL-VAL was resented in Huntsville and that their arguments concerning the petential value of a sound suppressor were first refused by the Germans who later reluctantly agreed to test the device.
